1. Selectman Russell A. Ege submitted the following:
"Due to the fact that significant discrepancies existed in the Town Tax Records when I entered the office of Selectman in May 1972, and since these discrepancies have never been resolved to my satisfaction, I hereby demand that a full five year audit of the Tax Records of the Town of Raymond be conducted by official State of New Hampshire auditors. I request that this be recorded in the Town Records by the Clerk at this time and that I not be removed from office until a legal judge-

ment has been received on my responsibility in this matter.

2. Frank Wilich made a motion which was duly seconded by Rita Curtis that the Selectmen hold a public hearing on the Town Budget approximately two weeks before the first Tuesday in March beginning in 1974. Vote in Affirmative

3. A motion was made by C. K. Curtis and duly seconded by Frank Wilich that the Town of Raymond authorize the Board of Selectmen to select a professional engineering firm for the purposes of negotiating a contract to make a preliminary report on a sewerage system for the Town in conformance of Chapter 149 of the Laws of the State of New Hampshire and submit said cost to the voters of the Town for approval at a future Town Meeting before any monies are expended. Vote in Affirmative

4. A motion was made by Myron Cate and duly seconded by John Ross that the Selectmen and Planning Board bring before the Town at the next Town meeting, be it Special or Annual, a proposal for a Sanitary Land Fill Site. Vote in Affirmative

5. Camille Faucher wished to go on record as expressing his desire for the Selectmen to be more specific in the breakdown of receipts and expenditures as printed in the Town report.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned at 12:15 A. M.

DUDLEY-TUCKER LIBRARY**

Citizens visiting the library in the past months have seen a number of strange things happening to its physical structure. It is being renovated. Priority was given to finding out whether our electrical system met with safety standards and was sufficient to our needs. We learned that there were many inadequacies in both areas, and a complete re-wiring of the building was done. Another project currently underway is the painting of the interior, and the sanding of the floors. At this writing, volunteers are under-taking this venture, and our cost will be for materials only. Long overdue is the painting of the exterior of the building. Bids have already been received and very shortly our library will have a new outside look. Other physical projects under consideration are the building of a new bulkhead for the cellar entrance, and tidying up the outside grounds. Money for all these projects has come from Revenue Sharing Funds.

We are also happy to announce that a number of objectives outlined in last year's Annual Report have been accomplished. Among these are:

1. Availability of the library. The library is now open 26 hours per week, as opposed to 10 hours per week a year ago.
2. Formulation of the Friends of the Library, who will play an important role assisting the Trustees with various library needs.
3. The Children's Story Hour held last summer, proved so successful that we plan to offer it again.

We are preparing for the Bicentennial Celebration of 1976. It is our desire that the library will have met all State Standards by that time and that this facility will be a landmark for our community to appreciate and use.

**REPORT
OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN
AND DISTRICT CHIEF**

The New Hampshire Forest Fire Service is represented in every town, city or unorganized place in our state by the forest fire warden. Anyone wishing to kindle an outside fire when the ground is not covered by snow must first obtain the written permission of the fire warden. Except for cooking fires, no fire can be kindled between 9:00A.M. and 5:00 P.M. unless it is a commercial or industrial burn or it is raining. The fire warden is assisted in his work by the District Forest Fire Chief who works for the Department of Resources and Economic Development Forest Fire Service.

Fire prevention was, again this year, the most important part of the Forest Fire Warden's job. Fire statistics show the need with 72% of the fires caused by smoking, debris burning and children. Smokey the Bear is an important prevention tool, but he still needs much help from the public. Parents should warn their children of the hazards of playing with matches. Children tend to forget that a lighted match held in their hand is a potential forest fire.

This year was very good regarding the number of brush and/or grass fires, with no major fires involved, but there were 7 calls for brush or grass, 5 trips to the Town Dump. Permits issued for incinerators and open burning totaled 315.

We had 27 calls from the Lookout Towers to investigate reported smoke.

I wish to thank all my Deputy Wardens for their fine cooperation and all those citizens who abided by the regulations of the State requirements in preventing unnecessary fires.

Be certain to obtain a Permit for open burning or for your incinerator as soon as the ground becomes bare or in other words free of snow. These permits will be issued at the Fire Station, Monday through Friday 7AM--12 Noon; and from 1:00PM--4:30 PM., and 8:AM--12:00 Noon Saturdays and Sundays.

RAYMOND FIRE DEPARTMENT

The following is a brief summary of the Fire Department for the year 1973:

We had a total of 72 calls of which 34 were box or monitor and 38 still alarms, plus numerous calls for investigation.

They were as follows:

- 5 Trailers
- 6 Buildings
- 5 Car
- 7 Brush
- 5 Town Dump
- 1 animal rescue
- 1 Bomb scare at School
- 1 no school
- 7 false alarms
- 5 Mutual Aid calls
- 29 miscellaneous calls

We received Mutual Aid once each from Candia and Fremont.

The building and trailer fires involved property at an estimated value of \$724,700.00 with an estimated loss according to tax valuation of \$31,720.00.

This year we installed a new Gamewell Fire Detection System in the station with a 24 volt standby auxilliary battery which makes it operate when there is an electrical power failure.

Also, we purchased a new portable Flota-Pump that weighs only 50 lbs. with gas and all fittings, and is capable of pumping 250 G.P.M. This pump will be very useful to fill Tank Trucks or pump directly to fires that we are unable to reach by truck. A new 30 lb. class D Extinguisher was added to Eng.#2 for use on Magnesium or other similiar metals, two new Turbo-Jet nozzles were added to Eng. #2 as recommended by the Insurance Services, plus other equipment to make the control of fires more efficient.

This year we had a State training course on Pumps & Hydraulics. This course involved 30 hours with all basic pump principles and operation in all phases of pumping. There were 14 men who took this training and I am pleased to say they all did very well.

Last March the Insurance Services made a complete survey of the Town which included the Fire Department, Water Department and property around Town.

They reported the Fire Department apparatus, in service, well maintained but pumping capacity seriously deficient for any major fire in the congested area of Town.

The Insurance rates have been extended to include property 3 miles from the Station whereas before it covered property within a 2 mile radius. This means a saving of \$2.00 per thousand for property owners within this extended one mile.

In tests taken by insurance investigators recently, we found the water flow on hydrants outside the center of Town, with the exception of the new main to the Shopping Center, is about one half of what it was 16 years ago when the Underwriters ran a similar test. This is due to the build up of rust in the old mains. For example; The hydrants on Wight St., 16 years ago would deliver 800 G.P.M. whereas today the best we can do is 420 G.P.M. Therefore, we should consider purchasing some 4 inch hose to pump directly from the river or from the good hydrants in the center of town, to supplement the water supplies in these areas. One thousand feet of 4 inch hose, from a pumper, will supply sufficient water and pressure for three 2 inch lines or 750 G.P.M. Because of these conditions, there is an article in the warrant to purchase a new 1000G.P.M. pumper with equipment to meet our requirements for now and in the future.

We will welcome any interested citizen to come into the Fire Station, to see the apparatus we have now, and determine for himself why we need this new equipment.

I would like to thank the Selectmen; the Police Department; the Highway Department; the Red Phone operators, especially Mrs. Harney who operates our Monitor and Alarm System along with the Red Phone; and all citizens who cooperated in any way to help make the department run so smoothly.

As usual, the Ambulance boys are always with us to assist in any way possible. (Thanks boys.)

Finally, my thanks to all our Firemen for their sincere support and quick response even on false alarms. When 27 men answer an alarm at midnight, within six minutes, I call that response! Once again, thanks to everyone.

EXCERPTS FROM INSURANCES SERVICES OFFICE REPORT 1973

Apparatus in service was found to be well maintained, but it appears considerable reliance is placed upon 'tankers'; there being three available to the Town but only one 750gpm pumper and an obsolete hose wagon. Apparatus pumping capacity is seriously deficient, with reliance being placed on neighboring pumpers in the event of a major fire.

The amount and distribution of minor equipment, hose and master stream appliances is fairly adequate.

Response to alarms in the hydrant district is inadequate, due to a lack of apparatus. Under the present circumstances, it is not expected that the initial response of men and equipment, particularly during the day, would be able to accomplish both rescue and fire extinguishment simultaneously.

Recommended Improvement

That early consideration be given to retiring from first line service, Hose No.1 and that a new engine be acquired, constructed in accordance with NFPA Pamphlet No. 19, current edition.

That additional minor equipment be acquired for each engine company and ladder company, to meet, where applicable, the requirements of NFPA Pamphlet No. 19.

In view of the deficient fire flows which prevail in some

portions of the hydrant district, as well as the large rural area served; the size and quantity of hose carried on each engine should be sufficient to permit the piece to deliver 70% of its rated capacity at 20psi, 1000 feet distant from the water source.

CIVIL DEFENSE DEPARTMENT TOWN OF RAYMOND

This is my first annual report for the Civil Defense Department to the town of Raymond. The following being a brief resume for the year, 1973.

This is the first year in some time that there has been an active Civil Defense Department. At the present time, the department consists of approximately seventy members. There are many needs for an active Civil Defense Department--nuclear fallout, severe floods, hurricanes, severe storms, etc.

Many items, which would be beneficial to the town, may be obtained through the Civil Defense Department. Many requested items are in the process of being handled.

I would like to thank the Fire Department, the Police Department, the Ambulance Association and all interested citizens for their cooperation.

Having completed 13 years as Chief of Police for the Town of Raymond I welcome this opportunity to submit this annual report of the activities of the Raymond Police Department.

The year 1973 like every year prior to it, that the records have been kept, shows a marked increase in every service that is provided by your Police Department. As these statistics show a continuing increase then the Police Department must have the personnel and facilities to cope with these increasing demands. During 1973 an additional officer was added to the department. This was made possible by partial funding through the Governor's Commission on Crime and Delinquency. Total man-hours increased from 5703 in 1971 to 6486 in 1972 to 8083 in 1973, these man-hours are spent investigating accidents, burglaries, traffic control and Juvenile problems and many other facets of police work.

Burglaries and attempted burglaries show a slight increase, actual burglaries show a decrease and attempted burglaries show an increase. Due to economic conditions that exist throughout the entire country this could cause a great increase this year in burglaries and larcenies and could require many hours of patrol and investigation.

Motor vehicle accidents and traffic control continue to be a very time consuming task for the Police Department. The past year had a total of 99 accidents, which includes 1 fatal, 21 with personal injury and 77 with no injuries. Only by improving traffic control methods which include lights, signs, radar and marking systems can these accidents be reduced and pedestrians protected from injury. A considerable amount of time and effort has been placed in the area of the school this past year and the Departmental policy for this particular area must continue for the protection of YOUR children.

Education and Training within the department during 1973 became a very important factor due to the New Criminal Code in the State of New Hampshire that became effective November 1, 1973. Many hours had to be spent in training Seminars in order to keep the department abreast of the changes in this New Code. These Seminars will continue in 1974 and the department has tentatively scheduled four officers for this continuing Education and Training program. Two officers attended the Breath Examiner Specialist School conducted by the State of New Hampshire, both officers are Certified Operators. Upon Certification of these two officers the New Hampshire Highway Safety Agency provided the Town of Raymond with a Breathalyzer on an actual no-cost basis. Early in 1974 we anticipate having two more officers attend this school. The continuing present Education and Training program and projected plans for the forthcoming year are an absolute must if the town is to be provided with the most efficient methods of police work.

In my previous reports submitted I have touched on individual phases of your police department's work. I personally feel that even though these individual summaries are good to some extent the time has come to get to the actual facts in each of these phases and report them on a basis of man-hours spent and percent of increase or decrease to show the real cost of these services. This new method of reporting should give the taxpayer a much clearer picture of all our activities.

A recent survey of the entire operation of the Police Department was done by the New Hampshire Association of Chiefs of Police. This survey shows basically the department works well, is efficient, the communications system is adequate with up to date equipment, it recommends that the Education and Training program continue. The Committee also recommends that two cruisers are adequate for the department at this time. However, a definite replacement program, based on mileage, should be implemented in order to control costs and guarantee availability of both cruisers. The most important recommendation in my opinion, as a result of this survey, is the addition of another full time patrolman. Based on recent

meetings with school officials and the projected building forecast from the Building Inspector and the population growth, I feel that each of the recommendations should be implemented to guarantee adequate growth of the Police Department for the utmost protection of the citizens, homes, business and property.

HIGHWAY AGENT REPORT

This highway report is prepared from date beginning March 1st, 1973 to December 31, 1973.

MAINTENANCE:

We came through the year very well on our maintenance budget; the first time in many years that we closed our books with a balance of unexpended money under maintenance. There are several reasons for this: #1—is that there has been an accurate account of expenditures each month. That we have tried to do the necessary work that should be and has to be done. This in itself has kept the department busy along with our other work that the town has made appropriations for. There are many other incidentals that should be taken care of in the near future.

#2 The town has it's own dump truck to haul sand, gravel on other road projects that the town has voted on at last meeting. The patching of tar roads, again your truck was put into use first before any other truck was hired.

#3 I feel this department has hired responsible labor capable of operating and maintaining town equipment. This includes welding and repairing for the most part which I feel has been at a minimum.

We have in the month of Dec. two large maintenance bills: one bill for culverts which will be used for replacement of some of the old rock culverts which are beginning to give us problems and some of the old rusted out pipes. These culverts have increased in price by 17% from Dec. '73-Jan. '74. The other large bill in Dec. is for the crushing of a quantity of gravel at the town owned pit. I really don't think that very many taxpayers realize that when you voted to purchase the gravel land that there was a burden lifted from the town's shoulders because we had no idea as to where we were going to purchase gravel suitable for roadbuilding projects. Only a few years ago there was an abundance of quality gravel in Raymond. The situation I feel was that bad. The quality of the bank gravel has very good compaction as proved on Prevere Road and Bald Hill Road Projects. Some of the rocks in the bank are too large for complete road building, therefore, we had to invest some of

our maintenance money into crushing the larger material into finer gravel for our top gravel coat. I would like to thank the Board of Selectmen for their cooperation in these several matters.

BALD HILL ROAD PROJECT:

Much work was done on Bald Hill Road this year, cutting of trees and removal of banks, dynamiting of large stumps and their removal and the hauling off the project. We widened this road and graveled the surface. Some more work could be used to better this road at the furthest point of construction.

PREVERE ROAD PROJECT:

Blasting and removal of ledge was necessary on this road at different points in order to widen this road to meet road standards. This road was also heavily graveled and I feel should be tarred this coming year.

TOWN ROAD AID PROJECT:

This year our town road aid project took place on Harriman Hill Road. About 1,700 feet in length. This stretch of road was very narrow in meeting traffic and was much worse when plowing snow. Much dynamite drilling and blasting was done on this project. At one point a stretch of ledge about 65 feet long and 11 feet high was blown out to increase the width of the road an extra 12' and to eliminate a hidden or blind spot on the road. At least one half of our funds was needed for drilling and blasting. The other half was used to haul material on the site to use to cover the explosions of rock. The loading and hauling of this blasted material was used to a great advantage for the highway Dept. in filling in a swamp area behind our maintenance building providing more working area. This coming year's funds will be used to install drainage, gravel and tar on this project.

TARRING:

Tarring budget last year was used to seal coat the following roads: Upper and lower Main Street, Epping Street, Bill Brown Road, Lane Road, Melody Lane, Highway Garage yard, part of the Batchelder Road, Donald Road was surface mixed.

TOWN DUMP:

I feel the dump was kept in very good shape this year. There

was a lot more brush hauled in this year. Brush is supposed to be separated from the rubbish and garbage and discarded away from the main dump. When we burn the brush and bulldoze piles of brush over, there seems to be a lot of garbage among it. This is creating a rat problem. I think people should be asked to please try to keep garbage and rubbish separated and to discard each in their respective places in the dump. This will help on controlling the area of pests.

EQUIPMENT:

The highway department has to date the following: the first new piece of heavy equipment since 1939 (which was a caterpillar bulldozer) is a 1968 Hough loader with bucket and snow plow. A 1971 International Dump truck with snow plow and hydraulic wing. Plus a tank sander. This equipment is valuable to the department and has been used very efficiently for the town. All equipment is in very good condition. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Board of Selectmen for the cooperation they have given me and the department this past year. I feel this past year has been one of the best.

Another problem that the town and the department has, is this fact, that more property owners are building stone walls, erecting fences and etc. within the town right away. The town spends money for road building projects to widen roads to enable the highway department to plow snow and clear the roads so traffic can proceed without interference from snow banks not being plowed beyond the road width limit because of this problem. This could easily damage the equipment. I feel that before fences and stone walls are erected you should consult your selectmen and/or highway agent. These walls and fences within a town right-of-way are subjected to being moved.

I would like to thank the town treasurer for her continued services and the citizens for their cooperation. I further would like to thank the men who have plowed snow and kept the road cleared as much as possible along with the cleaning-up of snow on Main Street.

**RAYMOND PLANNING BOARD
REPORT FOR 1973**

The year 1973 was a very busy one for your Planning Board. Some of the areas our time was devoted to were as follows:

Holding Public Hearings on the Zoning Ordinance to explain to the voters the reasoning behind the proposed changes. After the official vote had been tallied, we then proceeded to incorporate those changes accepted into the ordinance and have the revised ordinance printed.

In the area of land subdivision, we had 28 applications for subdivisions creating 309 lots. 20 were small subdivisions of 5 lots or less and presented very few problems. We had 5 for larger subdivisions of 20 or more lots and 2 for commercial purposes. Of these, 28 applications, 19 have been approved in 1973, creating a total of 68 new building lots. 8 are still pending, which would create 241 building lots; and one was withdrawn. Abutter hearings were held on all of these applications as is required by State Law and the Subdivision Regulations. Many points were brought to our attention to be resolved.

We held meetings with the Selectmen this summer to present to them all the information we had compiled on sanitary landfill (the town dump problem) and town sewage.

We have also been monitoring the revenue generated by the new building permit fees in the Zoning Ordinance and the expenses encountered. One of these expenses, that of salary of the Building Inspector, appears to be in need of revision. After studying this situation we will propose a change to the Zoning Ordinance to be voted on on March 5 to make the salary much more fair to all concerned.

We have been working on a short, simple building code that will be also voted on on March 5.

As to the future, besides administering the subdivision regulations and monitoring the Zoning Ordinance for problem

areas, one of the projects the board will be working on is studying the feasibility of establishing commercial and industrial zones in the town. From preliminary work in this area, it appears that creation of these zones would make it easier for prospective businesses and/or industries to locate here. Also we feel the need of a street address system is great and we intend to work on one. We also stand ready to help the Selectmen with any information on planning the future needs of the town.

Effective in April the regular meeting of the Planning Board will be changed to the first Thursday of every month, at the Fire Station. All meetings are public and open to all residents.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Raymond in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Raymond High School in said Raymond on Saturday, the 9th day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

Article 2. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell at public auction any property acquired by Tax Collector's deeds.

Article 4. On petition of nineteen (19) voting residents, to see if the Town of Raymond will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 (Three Hundred Dollars) to aid Child and Family Services of New Hampshire, Seacoast Regional Office, which office makes counseling available to families in Rockingham County, including Raymond.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for the Seacoast Regional Counseling Center.

Article 6. On petition of fifteen (15) voting residents of Raymond to see if the town will raise and appropriate a sum of money for the Summer Recreation and Water Safety Program to be supervised by the Raymond Boosters Incorporated.

Article 7. To see if the Voters of the Town of Raymond will adopt the "Absentee Ballot" for election of Town Officers. If adopted the system to be in effect for the annual elections in March of 1975.

Article 8. To see if the Town of Raymond will authorize the Selectmen to apply for, contract for and accept aid relative to disasters and to expend Federal Funds without having to hold a Special Town Meeting.

Article 9. On petition of twenty-nine (29) voting residents of Raymond, to see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the support of the Ray-Fre Senior Citizens Center.

Article 10. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed Fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000.) to finance the Town Manager plan as provided in Chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes Annotated.

Article 11. In the event of Town Manager article is not adopted: To see if the voters of the Town of Raymond will authorize the Selectmen to hire an Administrative Assistant at a salary not to exceed \$15,000.00 (Fifteen Thousand Dollars) per year, and if approved will raise and appropriate monies for same.

Article 12. To see if the Town of Raymond will vote to raise the salary of the Tax Collector from \$1,000.00 (one thousand Dollars) to \$1,500.00 (One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars) and raise and appropriate the same.

Article 13. To see if the Town will accept the roads in Green Hills Estates and assume responsibility for maintenance and snow plowing as shown on the plan entitled, "GREEN HILLS SUBDIVISION", recorded in the Rockingham County Registry of Deeds, a copy of said plan being on file at the Town office of the Town of Raymond, so that said roads will be

maintained and plowed by said Town of Raymond, to the same extent and in the same manner as all other roads of said Town which are now maintained by said Town, to the end that all taxpayers and voters in said Town of Raymond will be treated fairly and equally in respect to the maintenance and snowplowing of roads.

Article 14. To see if the Town of Raymond will continue to pay the expenses for the seven street lights, located in Green Hills Estates, in the Town of Raymond.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Fire Dept. to purchase a new Motor Pumper (Fire Truck), and to Equip as deemed necessary. Said cost of Motor Pumper and Equipment not to exceed \$43,000.00

A. This unit may be authorized to be purchased and equipped from 100% Federal Revenue Sharing Funds.

B. This unit to be entirely financed through the Municipal Bond Act.

C. A combination (defined by percentage) of Federal Revenue Sharing and Municipal Bond.

Article 16. To see if the Town will donate the 1930 Maxim Fire Truck to the Raymond Historical Society, to be housed by said society as a permanent display to the citizens of Raymond and those others who wish to view it.

In the event of disbandment of the Raymond Historical Society, this Fire Engine is to revert to the Town of Raymond Fire Dept. Further; said housing and display to be other than the Raymond Fire Station.

This article is contingent upon passage and delivery and acceptance of fire equipment as outlined in Article #15.

Article 17. To see if the Town will approve the use of Federal Revenue Sharing Funds for the year 1973 in the amount of \$49,838. to be used for the acquisition, construction, or

purchase of a Multi-Purpose^b Building on a site selected by the committee formed for this purpose in November of 1973.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate out of present and future Federal Revenue Sharing Funds a sum of money for the acquisition, construction, or purchase of a Multi-Purpose Building and facilities.

Article 19. On petition of fourteen (14) voting residents of Raymond, to see if the Town will give permission to the Water Dept, to receive the sum of \$6,000.00 (Six Thousand Dollars), to help defray expenses to paint the Nottingham Road Standpipe, interior and exterior, above money to come out of The Revenue Sharing Fund.

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate Three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$3,500.) for a Police Cruiser and authorize the withdrawal of the amount required for this purpose from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 or monies raised by Taxation.

Article 21. On petition of Lyman R. Hammond, Jr. to see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to gravel and tar the two entrances to Green Hills Estates for a distance of 2500 feet.

Article 22. On petition of Lyman Hammond, Jr. and seventeen (17) others to see if the town will raise and appropriate a sum of money to tar Prevere Road, 1500 feet.

Article 23. On petition of Lyman Hammond, Jr. and sixteen (16) others to see if the town will raise and appropriate a sum of money to mix and roll the roads off Langford Road known as Merrick Road and Stoney Brook road development.

Article 24. To see if the town will vote to Widen, Gravel and Surface Seal Fordway Road from the intersection of

“Butterfield Lane” to the turn around at the end of the presently maintained section, and to raise and appropriate such sums of money as the Highway Agent deems necessary to complete the same.

Article 25. On petition of Lyman Hammond, Jr. and seventeen (17) others to see what action the town will take in regards to revising a part of the town road regulation. That before the town will accept any new road the developer or contractor will include a three inch mixed and rolled hard surface, or use a top coat of gravel at least three inches thick with no larger than 1½ inch aggregate including a ¾ gal. per sq. yd. Penetration and a final seal coat of ½ gal. per sq. yd. asphalt.

Article 26. We the undersigned voters of the town of Raymond, N.H. request you to insert the following article in the town warrant for the March 1974 Town Meeting. To see if the town will vote to take over the Raymond Water Dept. and its entirety.

Article 27. We the undersigned voters of the Town of Raymond, N.H. request that you insert the following article in the Town Warrant for the March 1974 Town Meeting. To see if the town will vote to adopt a strict policy in which no elected town official may become a paid member of any other board or department unless elected at an official Town Meeting.

Article 28. On petition of Lyman Hammond, Sr. and sixteen (16) others to see if the town will vote to accept the extension of Prospect Road a distance of 450 feet--this extension has been built to town road requirements.

Article 29. To see if the Town of Raymond will install and maintain a street light on the corner of Stoneybrook Lane and Langford Road (bus stop).

Article 30. To see if the Town of Raymond will install and maintain a light on the corner of Merrick Road and Langford Road (school bus stop).

Article 31. To see if the Town of Raymond will install and maintain a street light at the entrance of Lakeland Apts. on Route 101, Raymond, N.H.

Article 32. On petition of eleven (11) voters in the Town of Raymond request a regulation street sign for Onway Lake Road at the corner of Onway Lake Road and Langford Road, Raymond N.H.

Article 33. To see if the Town will vote to accept Lane Road, Bye Road, Nancy Lane and Darlene Road, which roads' total approximately six thousand (6,000) feet of roadway, all located in Section 1, Fordway Brook Acres, which acceptance shall become final at such time as all requirements of the Selectmen and Road Agent of the Town of Raymond shall have been met.

Article 34. To see if the Town will vote to accept the roadway located in the Clover Court Subdivision, which roadway has a width of fifty(50) feet and an approximate length of One Thousand Six Hundred and Eighty-eight (1,688) feet, which acceptance shall become final at such time as all requirements of the Selectmen and Road Agent of the Town of Raymond shall have been met.

Article 35. To see if the Town will vote to accept One Thousand One Hundred (1,100) feet of Sesame Street in the Sun Hill Subdivision, which acceptance shall become final at such time as all requirements of the Selectmen and Road Agent of the Town of Raymond shall have been met.

Article 36 To see if the Town of Raymond is in favor of a one year term for Chief of Police. If voted in the Affirmative, the one year term will begin with the March, 1975 Annual Elections.

Article 37. To see if the Town of Raymond, N.H. will change the Town Meeting to two days, instead of one.

Article 38. To see if the town will vote to officially name "The Lane" leading from Lane Road to Fordway Road as "Butterfield Lane". This "Lane" is shown on the plot plan of J. Henry Greenwood called Be-Gone-Acres. This lane has been a mail and school bus route for many years and an exhausted search of County records failed to turn up any private ownership. This "lane" has always been maintained by the town so no additional expense to the Town is involved.

This department totally funded by inspection fees.

1973 saw the upgrading of the water supply for the Green Hills area, by The Policy Water Co. Thus relieving the tension of possible water shortage in that area as had been a situation encountered several times prior to the construction program.

1973 saw the construction of 100 new state approved septic systems in Raymond.

1973 saw the repair of most reported failed systems, several are still to be repaired. In Zone I, the sewage problem should be a top priority, for near future town improvements.

This department inspected Foster Homes and Child Day Centers for the State of New Hampshire.

This department supplied water sample containers and transported many of the same to the State Agency for analysis.

The Health Officer reports that the general health of the People in Raymond is Good. That the water supply in both Zones is excellent in quality as well as quantity, with the exception of the Essex Road area and the Anderson's Trailer Park. Anderson's Trailer Park water situation is being handled now by the New Hampshire Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission. In the Essex Road Area, the heavy concentration of septic systems, in small areas, plus the very high water table threaten to contaminate the shallow dug wells in most of the Essex Road area. This department recommends a study group be appointed to investigate sanitary conditions in that development, that their findings be forwarded to proper state agencies.

REPORT OF TRUSTEES OF TRUST FUNDS

1973

The main activity of the Trustees of Trust Funds has been the maintenance of the Cemeteries using the \$850.00 Town appropriation as directed by the Selectmen and the interest earned by the several Cemetary Trust Funds. The Cemeteries involved in the above are Pine Grove, Lane, Chester Line, and Prescott. In addition we have financial responsibility for Dudley and Lovering Cemeteries by virtue of Trust Funds for these. Income and expenditure are shown in the Treasurer's report and tabulation.

We trust that our performance has been satisfactory to our Townspeople but will welcome suggestions for improvement.

During 1973 new Cemetary Trust Funds totaling \$1215.00 have been established. These very desirable additons are shown in the tabulation elsewhere in the Town Report.

Wherever possible the Trust Fund savings accounts which are perpetual, have been changed over to long term certifieates of deposit so as to earn the highest available interest, up to 7.78%. This has not been possible with those Funds which are subject to withdrawal. These Funds are Fire Dept., Equipment, Highway Equipment, Industrial Promotion, And School District Land Reserve.

To the inhabitants of the School District, in the Town of Raymond, county of Rockingham, and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in District Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the high school gymnasium in said District on the second day of March 1974 at 2:00 PM to act upon the following articles:

ARTICLE I. To choose school district officials for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE II. Shall the provisions for absentee ballot for the election of school district officials be adopted by this school district?

ARTICLE III. ARTICLE V. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

ARTICLE VI. To choose Agents and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

ARTICLE VII. To see if the district will authorize the School Board to accept on behalf of the District any Federal or State Funds designed to improve educational opportunities, further to see if the district will authorize the School Board to make application for such funds and to expend the same for such projects as it may designate.

ARTICLE VIII. To see if the School District will vote from this date forward to indemnify and save harmless from loss or damage any person employed by it, including the Superintendent of Schools and any member of the School Board, administrative staff or agencies, from personal financial loss and expense including reasonable legal fees and costs, if any arising out of any claim, demand, suit or judgment by reason of negligence or other act resulting in accidental injury to a person or accidental damage to or destruction of property if the indemnified person at the time of the accident resulting in the injury, damage or destruction was acting in the scope of his employment or office.

ARTICLE IX. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the District, and to authorize the application against said appropriations for such sums as are estimated to be received from the State Foundation Aid Fund together with other income; the School Board to certify to the Selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes of the town.

ARTICLE X. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

RAYMOND SCHOOL BOARD REPORT

TO THE CITIZENS OF RAYMOND:

For several years part of our reports to the voters have detailed the growing problem of overcrowding in our schools. It will be recalled that we proposed a building program in 1969 and again in 1970 in an attempt to keep pace with the increase in student enrollment. Having failed to gain voter acceptance of these proposals we were forced to resort to double sessions as a temporary expediency. After three years this arrangement is still in effect and the educational opportunity of our children continues to be severely curtailed. And even this arrangement with all its shortcomings will not be possible in the not-too-distant future as our growth continues.

Once again we will present a building program in March of 1974 for voter consideration. We are well aware that this is a particularly critical time to undertake a major capital expenditure with inflationary pressures affecting us all. However, our growth continues and our need of additional facilities increases proportionally.

We hope that Raymond's voters will give top priority to the educational needs of the Town's children and will support the building program at the March 2 District Meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

In the fall of 1973, the School Districts of Auburn, Candia, Hooksett and Raymond petitioned the New Hampshire State Board of Education for withdrawal from their present Supervisory Unions.

This petition was granted in October and as of July 1, 1974, these four communities will officially be organized as Supervisory Union #15.

The rationale for the establishment of this new Supervisory Union was two-fold; one being the cumbersome task of administering eight Districts each with their individual needs and secondly, the growth rate factor of the communities.

Within the framework of Supervisory Union #15 will be a Superintendent who will serve as the executive head of the public schools. His responsibilities shall consist of the planning and administering each Districts affairs subject to statutory requirements, regulations of the State Board of Education, and the policies of the local District.

The Assistant Superintendent is to provide services in support of the entire educational enterprise. His major responsibilities will be the employment of personnel certified and non-certified, and to serve in administrative capacity to principals, department heads, teachers, and students.

With the above arrangement, we feel quite confident of providing each District the needed service and it is our intention to have an "open house" within each of the school districts in the fall of 1974 to explain in detail the purpose and the operation of a Central Office.

The Raymond School District is presenting in March a Bond Issue which is of vital importance to the children of the community. We wish your support and request you vote favorably its passage.

Gentlemen:

Due to a workload in excess of the personnel resources available to this Division during the calendar year 1973, we have been unable to perform an examination and audit of the accounts and records of your School District for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1973 before the publication of the annual 1972-73 School District report.

We regret the inconvenience which this may have caused and wish to assure you that an audit of your accounts will be scheduled as expeditiously as possible.

Our current projections provide that our next examination of your School District's records shall simultaneously cover both the fiscal year which ended June 30, 1973 and the current fiscal year ending June 30, 1974.

Should this arrangement prove to be unsatisfactory to your Board, steps should be taken to petition the 1974 School District Meeting for rescission of the previous vote of the School District requesting an audit by this Division, and to choose local auditors in accordance with the provisions of RSA 197:14, which is quoted herewith:

"197:14 Officers To Be Chosen. The officers of every school district for which law does not otherwise provide shall be a moderator, a clerk, a school board of three persons, a treasurer, one or more auditors and such other officers and agents as the voters may judge necessary for managing the district affairs; provided, however, that school districts requesting an audit by the municipal accounting division of the state department of revenue administration shall not be required to choose auditors for the year covered by said audit."

It should be noted that the foregoing statute implies that such auditors shall be local residents.

To: School Boards

We are pleased to inform you that the 1973 Legislature has authorized additional positions for our audit staff. It is therefore expected that annual audits will be made on a more timely basis.

We appreciate your patience and understanding these circumstances.
