Story behind the Cover The Trinity United Methodist Church

Methodism was first preached in the area in 1816. Reverend Moses Potter held services in the log schoolhouse. Circuit riders also held services when in the area.

The Methodist Episcopal Church was built in 1870 and dedicated in 1871 when Rev. J.H. Knott was the pastor.

With a growing congregation and the closing of the Columbia Methodist meeting house, the decision was made to renovate and enlarge the building. The Reverend Guy Roberts was the pastor during the renovations which were completed in 1908.

The word "Episcopal" was dropped from the name in 1939.

The Methodist Church has the largest seating capacity of any church in town allowing many concerts and large funerals to be held there.

The four stained glass windows on the Bridge Street side are unique. They represent four organizations: The Grand Army of the Republic, The Grange, The Knights of Pythias, and The Odd Fellows.

Affirmative Action Taken At Prior Town Meetings

1994 Town Meeting Article #30

Authorize the Board of Selectmen to accept gifts of personal property pursuant to RSA 31:95-e. Until rescinded.

1994 Town Meeting Article #31

Authorize the Selectmen to convey any real estate acquired by the Town by Tax Collector's deed, pursuant to RSA 80:80. Until rescinded.

1994 Town Meeting Article #33

Accept the provision of RSA 33:7 until specific rescission of such authority, the Selectmen to issue tax anticipation notes.

1995 Town Meeting Article #5

Library to retain all money it receives from its income-generating equipment to be used for general repairs, etc. Until rescinded. (RSA 202.A:11, 11-b)

1995 Town Meeting Article #25

Authorize the Board of Selectmen to apply for, accept and expend money from the State, Federal or other Governmental unit or a private source, until rescinded.

1995 Town Meeting Article #26

Authorize the Board of Selectmen to accept, gifts, legacies, and devises, until rescinded.

1997 Town Meeting Article #16

Adopt the provisions of RSA 202-A: 4-d, authorizing Library Trustees to accept gifts of personal property, other than money.

1997 Town Meeting Article #19

Maintain and plow, Munn Road.

Moderator Jon Frizzell declared the Annual Town Meeting opened at 7 p.m. All in attendance stood to recite the Pledge of Allegiance.

- Article 1 To bring in your ballots for the selection of Town Officers to be elected by ballot for the Town of Colebrook for the ensuing year.
- Article 2 Greg Placy made a motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,544,394.00 for General Government, as follows.

Frank Dumaine seconded the motion and it passed with a voice vote.

- Article 3 Kevin McKinnon made a motion to authorize the selectmen to enter into a five-year lease agreement for \$45,000.00 for the purpose of leasing a Plow Truck for the Highway Department, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$9,000.00 for the first year's payment for that purpose, and to sell the Chevrolet one-ton pickup to the highest bidder. The lease agreement contains an escape clause. Frank Dumaine seconded the motion and it passed with a voice vote.
- Article 4 Larry Rappaport made a motion, seconded by Greg Placy, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$35,000.00 to purchase a new Police Cruiser and to authorize the withdrawal of the said \$35,000.00 from the Capital Reserve Fund created for this purpose, and to sell the 2000 Ford Crown Vic to the highest bidder. It was noted that this would not affect the tax rate. The motion passed with a voice vote.

Article 5 Greg Placy made a motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$168,640.00 for the Capital Reserve Funds, as follows.

Frank Dumaine seconded and the motion passed with a voice vote.

Article 6 Frank Dumaine made a motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$ 777,390.00 for the Colebrook Water Works and the Colebrook Sewer Facilities, as follows. It was noted that the \$500,000 grant for the water wells was included in this article.

Larry Rappaport seconded the motion and it passed with a voice vote.

- Article 7 Greg Placy made a motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$102,348.00 for the support of the Colebrook Public Library, \$81,668.00 of which to be raised through taxation and \$20,680.00 of which is to come from other Library revenues such as book sales, donations, trust funds, non-resident fees, other communities, over due fines, book resale's, copying fees etc., such funds to be expended under the direction of the Board of Library Trustees. Larry Rappaport seconded and the motion passed with a voice vote.
- Article 8 Greg Placy made a motion, seconded by Larry Rappaport, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$70,012.00 for the operation and maintenance of the Colebrook Cemeteries, the sum of \$60,012.00 to be raised through taxation and \$10,000.00 to be raised from burials, cemetery trust funds and other Colebrook Cemetery revenues. After discussion regarding the purchase of a copier, Granvyl Hulse made a motion, seconded by Sandra Riendeau, to amend the article, decreasing the amount to be raised and appropriated to \$69,012. The amendment passed with a voice vote. The article as amended, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$69,012.00 for the operation and maintenance of the Colebrook Cemeteries passed with a voice vote.
- Frank Dumaine made a motion to create an Expendable Cemetery Trust Fund under the provisions of RSA 31:19-a, to be known as the Colebrook Cemetery Grounds Maintenance and Reclamation Fund, for the purpose of reclamation of back land and equipment for grounds maintenance and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000.00 towards this purpose. Said funds to come from December 31, 2004 Cemetery Unreserved Fund Balance. (Representing excess 2004 cemetery appropriations.) Further to name, the Cemetery Trustees as Agents to expend from this trust fund. Larry Rappaport seconded the motion and it passed with a voice vote.
- Article 10 Larry Rappaport made a motion, seconded by Frank Dumaine, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$158,312.00 for the Colebrook Dispatch Center, of which \$ 104,118.49 will be raised through taxation and the remainder to be offset by revenues raised from the participating towns. The motion passed with a voice vote.

- Frank Dumaine made a motion to authorize the Town Clerk wages to be paid through the Town's weekly payroll system instead of through fees (per RSA 41:25). All fees will be turned over to the Town to offset the expenditure. It was noted the amount of compensation for the Town Clerk in the amount of \$15,759.00 was included in the operating budget. Larry Rappaport seconded the motion and it passed with a voice vote.
- Article 12 Greg Placy made a motion, seconded by Frank Dumaine, to establish a Recreation Revolving Fund as authorized by RSA 35-B: 2 II. All revenue above the estimated budget revenue received by the town from fees and charges for recreation and park services and facilities may be deposited into this fund. The money in the fund shall be allowed to accumulate from year to year, and shall not be considered part of the Town's general surplus. The fund shall be held in the custody of the Town Treasurer, who shall pay out amounts from the funds as ordered by the Board of Selectmen and the Recreation Advisory Board for the provisions of recreation services (no further Town Meeting approval required). These funds may be expended only for recreation purposes as stated in RSA 35-B, and no expenditure shall be made in such a way as to require the expenditure of other town funds which have not been appropriated for that purpose. The motion passed with a voice vote.
- Article 13 Greg Placy made a motion to authorize the Selectmen on behalf of the Colebrook School District to convey a conservation easement on thirty (30) acres of Town-owned land held by the Colebrook Water Works (Map R-5, Lot 39.) The purpose of this easement is to provide State-required mitigation for the approximately three (3) acres of wetland being disturbed at the Colebrook School Ball Fields. Frank Dumaine seconded the motion and it passed with a voice vote.
- Article 14 Larry Rappaport made a motion, seconded by Frank Dumaine, to accept, ratify and confirm the reports of the Agents, Selectmen, Auditors and all other Town Officers.
- Article 15 To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Earlier in the evening, Library Trustee Rosalie Smith thanked Pam Bunnell for her twenty years of service as a Library Trustee. Moderator Jon Frizzell recognized Mrs. Bunnell once again.

Bruce Katz asked the Selectmen to consider placing the list of tax abatements in future town reports.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:07 pm.

Tax Collector and Town Manger's Report

Thankfully taxpayers saw a decrease in their tax rate this year. The cutoff date for the unpaid taxes listed in this book is December 31, 2005. The percentage of unpaid 2005 taxes is 8.05 percent; however 1.29 percent of those listed did pay their taxes before February 18th, 2006. The town is preparing to take tax deeds to a few properties this year. This is something that town officials do not like to do but state laws have to be followed. The homeowners will have the opportunity to repurchase their property within a certain time frame.

The abatements given during 2005 are listed in the book this year due to a request made at last year's town meeting. The auditor's transmittal letter is not in your report this year as the audit has not been completed. As soon as it is completed and the reports are received, the newspapers will be notified at a regular selectmen's meeting and anyone can come into the office to pick up a copy of the transmittal letter.

Colebrook selectmen and employees have spent many hours negotiating with the State of New Hampshire on permitting issues and with New England Waste Services on contract issues for the landfill project which will cap the old landfill, as well as treat any contaminated water on site. Public Works Director Kevin McKinnon has spent 90 percent of his time at the landfill ensuring the construction was done according to specifications and dealing with any problems as they arise.

Titus Hill was a peaceful and low traffic road before the landfill project started. Residents on Titus Hill from Skyline Drive in ersection to the Spring Street intersection are going to receive a reduction in the value of their properties until the project is completed. Colebrook officials do appreciate their cooperation and patience with the traffic problems.

Colebrook is going to do a feasibility study of the water system and how to best connect the new wells with the current system. This study will also address what funding is available through grants and loans and guide the town in how much the water rates need to be increased to support the system.

It is important to have more than one person know any given job in case of sickness, vacations, etc.; and, because of this, the following cross trainings have been instituted. Kevin McKinnon, April Hyde and David Begin are being trained to operate the water treatment system at the landfill. David Begin is training April and T.J. Rossitto to operate the water and sewer departments, including lab work.

Several EMS personnel are working to obtain one dispatch frequency to facilitate more effective dispatching methods during emergencies. Colebrook received a grant to obtain a generator to operate the dispatch center during power outages. The generator was ordered the first of January and has been shipped. The transfer switch has been installed and, as soon as the generator arrives it will be connected to the building's electrical system. This will enable dispatch, the district court, licensing and the entire town hall to have power during any power outage.

I want to close this report by thanking Colebrook employees for their dedication to their jobs and the Colebrook residents for making it enjoyable to work for you.

We have arrived at our yearly gathering yet again. I hope all is well with everyone and their families. Since we met last year the Colebrook Police Department almost lost one of our brother officers in Iraq. Corporal Joseph Caron was wounded in action last July in Ramadi, Iraq. He is currently home going through physical therapy and hopes to be back to work in the fall of this year.

During his absence Officer Bridget Jeffers went from part-time to full-time status. This is temporary until Corporal Caron can return to full duty. Officer Jeffers is currently at the police academy. Officer Timothy Stevens attended a RADKIDS instructor seminar this year. The tuition was paid for by the Key Club. Officer Stevens is hoping to have a curriculum for this childhood safety program set up to start teaching in the fall at the Elementary School. He will also continue to coach the CPAL softball team this year along with active participation in the Special Olympics through coaching and management. Officer David Radun and Officer Guthric Peet both attended the Intox School at the Academy last fall. Officer Peet will be assuming head coaching position of the CPAL baseball team.

There were two new part-time officers brought onboard last year. Officer Brendon McKeage and Officer Christopher Ladd were sworn in during 2005. Officers McKeage, Jeffers and Ladd took up a lot of the slack that was created from Corporal Caron's situation during 2005 through 2006. Their dedication is deeply appreciated, as are all of the Officers who work for the town.

I want to remind all bike riders under the age of 16 about the new law that requires helmets as of January 1, 2006. Please abide by this as it is for your protection.

Hopefully we will have everyone back by the next town meeting. Have a great 2006 and Go Pittsburgh Steelers!

Public Works Report for 2005

This has been a year of accomplishments!

We are closing our landfill, after a decade of butting heads with Concord, by using a unique methodology that will save taxpayers any increase in taxes as this project is designed to pay for itself. There was a three and a half year concerted effort by Town, State, and private sector people to receive all the necessary permits for this project to go forward. A huge thank you is in order to Governor Benson and now Governor Lynch, Commissioner Nolan, and Dr. Michael Sills from the state sector. Senator Gallus and Representative Eric Stohl were instrumental in paving the way through legislation and, of course, Councilor Burton was there for us also.

Our Selectboard and Town Manager went through countless meetings and briefings, contract negotiations, and agreements to be read, understood, and signed.

We now have an operating treatment system that is cleaning up the contamination that did exist on the site, and will treat the groundwater around the landfill itself.

In July we hired David Begin to be our foreman of the public works crew. He has done an excellent job, with the crew completing a number of projects this year. Titus Hill Road was ditched and readied for the truck traffic to the landfill. Brush cutting took place on a town wide basis. Piper Hill Road had 350' of fabric and gravel placed from the town line west. The grader was out and about during the good weather, grading a total of 120 miles of roadway. This is because roads were graded multiple times through the season. We had two men leave us this year and welcomed Daniel Lyons and Anthony Rossitto to the crew.

The sewer department had a dilemma arise this year on High Street. A main line collapsed causing replacement of the whole line. The crew fit this in between their regular duties. We can't do this kind of work as quickly as some people might like, not being a construction company. High Street also got a much needed repaving job done.

We are now testing wastewater for Groveton (Northumberland), bringing in some added revenues for the department. We welcomed April Hyde to the water and the sewer departments, as well as an operator for the landfill treatment system. April has a degree in earth sciences which has already been a big asset to the town.

I have been the resident engineer at the landfill which has been a full time job since July.

I want to thank all my crew for doing a great job this year, as they always do! These people keep our infrastructure working, and our roads safe to travel on.

Colebrook Recreation Department Report

The Colebrook Recreation Department offered several of the same programs that have been held in previous years, such as Youth soccer league, Travel team soccer, Youth basketball league, 3 & 4 grade basketball travel team, Play Soccer camp, Summer day camp, HOAP, Tennis camp, Book discussion group, Paul Hogan basketball camp, and Movie nights. These programs have continued to see success over the years. The enrollment in each program has remained at a steady level. Many of these programs have worked due to the help of volunteer coaches and parents.

There have also been several new programs added over the past year: No school day camp, Drama camp, Adult indoor soccer, Fisher Cats baseball game trip, Father-daughter dance, and a pre-school program working on physical skills called Surf & Turf. It is our hope that several of these new programs will continue throughout the current year for the community to enjoy.

September was the start of the seventh HOAP (Healthy Older Adult Program) season with a kick-off breakfast and lawn games. Membership is once again over 100 members from Colebrook and the surrounding area. To become a member, an individual must be at least 55 years in age and complete a survey packet. Being a member of the program makes you eligible for several programs at a reduced cost. HOAP is the recreation department's largest program and it is still continuing to grow. Additions to the program this year include a daily swimming program at the North Country Community Recreation Center and a Talent Fair. HOAP members have visited the theater, taken a shopping trip, held a holiday party, and gone for tea, with several activities still left to complete this HOAP season.

With the addition of the Recreation Revolving Fund for the 2005 year, we were able to purchase four portable basketball hoops to be used for the 1st & 2nd grade basketball players during the Youth Basketball League. These basketball hoops allow children to practice age appropriate skills to better prepare them for the next level.

The recreation department offered six different adult programs throughout the year, involving over 150 members of the community; while eleven various sports and art programs were offered for the children of the community serving over 500 children. This would not be possible without the help of volunteer coaches, instructors, and members of the community.

I would like to thank the Recreation Advisory Board for all of their assistance in 2005, especially those members whose terms have expired. Thank you for your time and commitment - it is appreciated.

Colebrook Planning Board Report

The Colebrook Planning Board continues to be busy. We have overseen a number of subdivisions as well as building permits. We have worked hand in hand with various state and local agencies to be accommodating and make things inviting to attract businesses to town. The board will continue to do everything within its power to work with applicants and to encourage expansion of existing businesses, as well as the start up of new business.

Normally, we meet once a month to conduct any business that may come before the board. This year, however, we met twice a month for eight months because we set internal goals of revamping our procedural policies and rewriting some of the ordinances to reflect what is happening in our community today. We continue to work on this.

The board is comprised of a group of dedicated people. They receive no stipend for their efforts. The Planning Board budget is a little confusing. We raise money through taxes to pay for newspaper ads, mailings, legal opinions and other things; most of which, however, is reimbursed by the applicants. The board's expense to the taxpayers is actually very small. We are looking to slightly raise the application fees to help offset most of the remainder of any budgetary shortfalls.

Our standard meeting schedule is the second Tuesday of the month. We invite and encourage all to attend our meetings. The board is always looking for alternate members and welcomes participation.

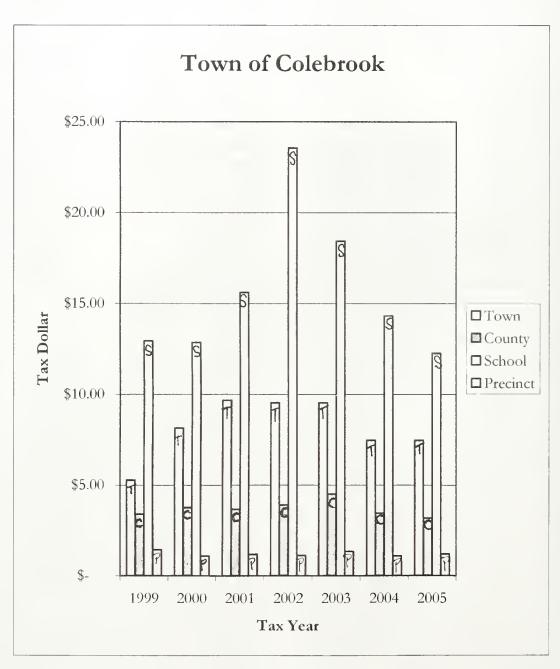

- Article 1 To bring in your ballots for the selection of Town Officers to be elected by ballot for the Town of Colebrook for the ensuing year.
- Article 2 To see how the Town will vote on the following three proposed amendments to the Colebrook Zoning Ordinance, to be voted on by official ballot. Copies of the complete proposals, as well as the current Zoning Ordinance, are available for review at the Town Clerk's Office, and will be available during the election.

Amendment # 1: Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 1 to Article IV. Section 1 as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town of Colebrook as follows:

1) No new lot shall be approved by the Planning Board unless it has at least 150 feet of frontage either on a public street or on a private street approved by the Planning Board. No building whose use requires an approved sewage disposal system under Town or State law shall be constructed on any lot without at least 150 feet of frontage on a public street or approved private street, unless that lot legally existed as a separate lot, as reflected by properly-recorded plans or deeds, prior to March 14, 2006; provided, however, that all such buildings shall be in compliance with the current RSA. (Recommended by the Planning Board)

Amendment #2: Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 2 to Article III as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town of Colebrook as follows:

2) Temporary Signs: Any sign placed outdoors for a period of time of 30 days or less. (Recommended by the Planning Board)

Amendment #3: Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment No. 3 to Article IV, Section 11 as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town of Colebrook as follows:

3) A temporary sign (one placed outdoors for 30 days or less) is allowed without a permit or fee, provided however that: (a) prior to the erection of the sign, the Town of Colebrook shall be notified of the sign, its location, and expected time of removal, using a form provided by the Town; (b) the date of sign placement shall be shown on the sign itself in letters easily read from street level; (c) no temporary sign shall violate the provision of Subsection D, "Prohibited Signs"; and (d) any temporary sign remaining in place for a combined total of more than 30 days without a permit shall be a violation of this Ordinance. REPORT ON THE COLEBROOK CEMETERIES

Colebrook has within its boundaries four cemeteries of which the trustees are responsible for three. The fourth is the private Roman Catholic cemetery on South Main Street just north of the Shrine.

The Cemetery Trustees have the responsibility of being the general overseers of the care and maintenance of the three cemeteries. However, in as much as the bulk of the money raised for the maintenance comes from perpetual trusts, the trustees of the Trust Funds of Colebrook are charged by State law with the task of insuring that the trust money is used as the original donors expected it to be.

Village Cemetery:

The Village Cemetery is located on U.S. Route 3 at the northern edge of the village. The bulk of the old cemeteries trust funds are dedicated to this cemetery.

Reed Cemetery:

The Reed Cemetery is located in East Colebrook at the junction of the Forbes and Reed Roads. With one exception the rules that apply to the burials in the Village Cemetery apply to those of the Reed Cemetery. The exception is that, due to the limited space available for future burials, only those persons with either a strong family connection to the cemetery or own their lots may be buried in that cemetery.

Titus Hill Cemetery:

This cemetery is located on Titus Hill Road, east of the village. Since there are no maps associated with this cemetery and no records exist of where the old graves are located, this cemetery, for all practical purposes, is closed to future burials.

St. Brendan's Cemetery:

This is a private cemetery under the control of St. Brendan's Catholic Church in Colebrook; with the exception that the town annually provides a sum of money to assist in its maintenance. We exercise no jurisdiction over its operation. All trust funds that were previously held by the Trustees pertaining to persons buried in this cemetery were turned over (with State approval) to the St. Brendan Trustees in the early 1980's.

Cemetery Trust Funds:

There are five different types of trust funds relating to the village cemeteries: perpetual care, cleaning of tombstones, flowers, trees and shrubs, and general maintenance.

NOTE:

It should be stressed here that the Colebrook Trustees of the Trust Funds are not bound to accept bequeaths from wills or otherwise perform tasks which they feel are not in the best interest of the Town. (e.g. further flower funds.) The Trustees may reject such bequeaths. Consequently, should lawyers or persons drawing up wills call for advice, it is strongly urged that the Trustees advise the person plainly that any bequests against Trustees policy will not be accepted.

Perpetual Care:

This is by far the largest number of trust funds held by the Trustecs of the Trust Funds. They can be divided into three types:

- **a. RESTRICTED:** the oldest and largest number of trust funds. These are set up so that the interest is used only for the maintenance of a specified lot.
- **b. NON-RESTRICTED:** in the early 1980's the wording of the perpetual care trust funds was changed to allow the excess interest accumulated from each new trust to be used for the care of the cemetery as a whole.
- c. GENERAL TRUSTS: starting in 1986, by a vote of the townspeople at the Annual Town Meeting, it was decided to do away with specific trusts. Perpetual care funds are now transferred to a general cemetery trust fund, and except for the year that the money was received, the identity of the trust is no longer kept separate. We do, however, keep a name card on file of these trusts for reference purposes.

Cleaning of Stones:

There are three trusts that contain within their instructions wording that calls for occasional cleaning of the tombstones. These instructions are to be honored as long as adequate funds are available over and above the general care and maintenance of the lots. No further trusts of this nature will be accepted, as the Cemetery Trustees have initiated a cleaning and reclamation program for the complete cemetery.

Flower Funds:

Originally there were twenty-four (24) lots for which flower funds had been established. These called for flowers to be placed on the lots each Memorial Day. These requests have been honored as long as funds were available to maintain the lots and purchase the flowers. Only nine (9) remain with sufficient funds. Annually (just before Memorial Day) the Trustees of the Trust Funds will contact one of the local flower shops and contract the placement of the flowers on the respective lots. No further trusts of this nature will be accepted.

(All lot locations are based on Nancy Dodge's register of cemetery plots and are all located in the Village Cemetery)

Trees and Shrubs:

This fund was established by Elizabeth and Nellie Young to beautify the Village Cemetery. It can be used for the purchase of trees and shrubs, perennials, etc little or nothing of the account had been used over the years, and as a result it has grown to considerable size. Presently, approximately \$500 is withdrawn each year to trim the hedges and shrubs.

General Maintenance:

Frank Leonard left money for the general care and maintenance of the Village Cemetery. The interest of this fund has been used primarily to paint the wrought iron fence.

Tibbett's Family Trust:

These funds are to be used to create and maintain the Tibbett's Memorial Park, and such other programs that will add to the beauty of the cemetery. The expenditure of these funds is to be determined annually by the Trustees of the Trust Funds in conjunction with the Cemetery Trustees.

New Cemetery Trusts:

The purchase price of a new lot includes both the costs of the lot and the perpetual care. It is paid to the Treasurer of the Cemetery Trustees, who then turns it over to the Trustees of the Trust Funds.

Colebrook Cemetery Trustees Report

On May 30th, 2006 a dedication ceremony for the new fence, plaques and flagpole was held. Representatives of the North Country Ministerium, George L. O'Neil Post #62 and Stephanie Lyons, who rendered several vocal renditions, were in attendance to help us with the dedication. This spring the plaques will be installed on the outside wall of the tomb.

In May Sheila Parkhurst became the Cemetery sexton. During the time the Cemetery was open she and her crew, Arthur Truesdale, Larry Shawney and Glenn Raymond, Jr., kept the grounds in excellent condition with several projects completed. The cemetery shed, tomb and fences were painted, stones were cleaned and the old disposal area was cleaned and made ready for closure.

When we closed for the season in October, Sheila Parkhurst presented the Board with her resignation. As there were burials that needed to be done until December 1st Arthur Truesdale took on the responsibility. We advertised in house for a new sexton and Arthur Truesdale stated his interest in the position. At our December 6th 2005 regularly scheduled meeting, the trustees present voted to offer him the position.

Several people went above and beyond to keep the cemetery a place to be proud of and we wish to acknowledge them. Before we started spring cleanup, members of the Colebrook Key Club removed all the old flags from the Cemetery. They were disposed of in the proper manner by the American Legion. Ellie Gooch and Virginia Stickney placed flowers and Christmas wreaths at the main entrance to the Cemetery. At the location of the old tomb, Frances Haynes and Jean Haynes planted and maintained flowers during the summer. Leighton (Sonny) Cree repaired several Veteran Flag Markers and drew up specifications for the closure of the old disposal area.

In January Sheldon Gray resigned as a Cemetery Trustee and the Selectmen appointed Camilla Jane Stewart to fill his term.

We all were truly saddened with the passing of the former sexton, Roland B. Martin, and wish to express our sincere sympathy to his family.

With appropriations raised a Town meeting, we were able to purchase a walk behind mower and a zero steer riding mower. The riding mower enabled us to cut down on costs as it reduced the time necessary for mowing.

Within the Colebrook Village Cemetery, lots were sold to Robert I. and Jerry Grant, Irene and Valtin Bean, Craig and Monique Washburn, Ernest Ellingwood or Frances Vitale, and Mark and Darlene Cote. Lots were purchased in the Tibbetts Memorial Park by Ronald G. and Mary Haynes and David and Betty Bellows. There were eight entombments from other towns, which we received reimbursement for, along with twenty-eight committals, seventeen full burials and eleven cremations.

Several old stones in the front portion of the Village Cemetery were repaired. This is a project we plan to continue this coming year with funds raised through our annual budget.

The Trustees feel we had a very productive year and look forward to next year. Future improvements we are committed to are:

- Repair and clean old stones
- Excavate the area of the old disposal area
- Pave the roadway to the tomb
- Pave remaining entranceways up to the fence line
- Continue with our reclamation area project
- Rebuild the existing road system

- **Article 1:** To choose by ballot and plurality vote, a Moderator for the ensuing year.
- Article 2: To choose by ballot and major vote, a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- Article 3: To choose by ballot and major vote, one Fire Warden for the ensuing three years.
- Article 4: To choose by ballot and major vote, one Fire Warden for the ensuing two years.
- **Article 5:** To choose by ballot and major vote, a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- **Article 6:** To choose all other officers and agents for the ensuing year or to authorize the Fire Wardens to appoint the same.
- Article 7: To see what sum of money the Precinct will vote to raise and appropriate for General Government for the year 2006.

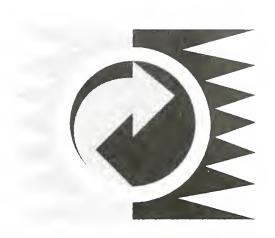
