Town Warrant

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Exeter, in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs: [L. S.]

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said Exeter, on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose by ballot and plurality vote two (2) Selectmen for the term of three (3) years.
2. To choose by ballot and plurality vote one (1) Selectman for the term of one (1) year.
3. To choose by ballot and plurality vote a Town Clerk.
4. To choose by ballot and plurality vote a Town Treasurer.
5. To choose by ballot and plurality vote a Tax Collector.
6. To choose by ballot and plurality vote three (3) members of the Library Committee for the term of three (3) years.
7. To choose by ballot and plurality vote one (1) Trustee of the Robinson Fund for the term of seven (7) years.
8. To choose by ballot and plurality vote one (1) Trustee of the Trust Funds held by the Town of Exeter for the term of three (3) years.
9. To choose by ballot and plurality vote one (1) Trustee of the Trust Funds held by the Town of Exeter for the term of one (1) year.
10. To choose by ballot and plurality vote one (1) Trustee of the Swasey Parkway for the term of three (3) years.
11. To choose all other necessary Town officers, auditors or committees for the ensuing year.

12. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, and other officers and committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote pertaining thereto.
13. On petition of Richard I. LaPerle and seventy-five others to see if the Town will adopt the following: Shall the Town of Exeter adopt the Council Manager form of Government as proposed in the Revised Charter submitted to the State Legislature, 'An act to establish the City of Exeter' be adopted.
14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen and pursuant to RSA 33:7 to incur debt for temporary loans in anticipation of 1971 taxes and to issue therefor notes of the Town payable within one year after their date, and to pay or renew the same by the issue of new notes, payable within one year after the date of the original obligation.
15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell property of the Town acquired by Tax Collector's deed as the result of tax sales at public auction. Notice of said auction will be published in three (3) newspapers of general circulation once each week for two weeks giving general description of property to be sold, date, time and place of said public auction.
16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to purchase one 85' Hydrolic Ladder Fire Truck to replace the present 1941 City Service Truck.
17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) to be paid into the Fire Department Capital Reserve Fund.
18. Are you in favor of the adoption of the amendment as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town Zoning Ordinance as follows:
Amend the Zoning Ordinance for the Town of Exeter as amended by the March 1970 Town Meeting

by inserting after Article 1 and before Article 2 the following Article:

Article 1A Districts: For the purpose of this Ordinance the Town of Exeter is divided into districts, the boundaries of which are shown on the zoning map to be filed with the Town Clerk and dated February 19th, 1971, which map is incorporated by reference into this Ordinance and includes the following districts: (1) Residential; (2) Rural-Residential; (3) Commercial; (4) Industrial; (5) General.

19. Are you in favor of the adoption of the amendment to the Zoning Ordinance as proposed by petition of the voters for this Town.

Planning Board disapproves this amendment.

To see if the Town will amend the Zoning Ordinance to make size requirements for lots in the Rural-Residential Zone for residential construction acceptable to the Town with a minimum area of 18,000 sq. ft. and a minimum frontage on roads or streets of 120 feet (the aforesaid area is double that now required in the residential zone), providing that Town Sewerage is made available for housing placed on such lots.

20. On petition of Paul S. LaPerle and ten others to see if the Town will vote to repeal the Zoning Ordinance of the Town as adopted at the Special Town Meeting of May 24, 1966, and as subsequently amended.
21. On petition of Paul S. LaPerle and ten others to see if the Town will vote to revoke the creation of the Planning Board as heretofore created at the annual Town Meeting of March 9, 1965.
22. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply, negotiate and do all things necessary to obtain such Federal, State, or other assistance as may be available in the construction of a water treatment plant and pass any vote relating thereto.
23. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the raising of five hundred thirty-four thousand eight hundred dollars (\$534,800.00) for the purpose of constructing a water treatment plant and enlarging the water supply for the Town of Exeter, such sum to be

raised by issuance of serial notes on bonds under and in compliance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (NH RSA 33) and any amendments thereto, and to authorize the Selectmen to issue and negotiate such notes or bonds, the discretion of fixing the dates, maturities, denominations, the interest or discount rate, place of payment, form and other details of said notes or bonds and of providing for the sale thereof to be delegated to the Selectmen as shall be in the best interest of the Town, and to pass any vote relating thereto. The above authorization is to be used only in the event that Federal Funds are available.

24. On petition of F. Leroy Junkins and eleven others to see if the Town will vote to elect the Town Clerk for a term of three (3) years.
25. On petition of F. Leroy Junkins and eleven others to see if the Town will vote to elect the Town Treasurer for a term of three (3) years.
26. On petition of F. Leroy Junkins and eleven others to see if the Town will vote to elect the Tax Collector for a term of three (3) years.
27. On petition of Albert Cote and sixteen others to see if the Town will vote to extend the present sewer line on Court Street from its present terminus at or near the residence of Octave W. Carbonneau to a point at or near the Exeter-Kensington town line and to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred fourteen thousand dollars (\$114,000.00) for this purpose.
28. To see what sums of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the poor, for repairing highways, for repairing and building bridges, for repairing and building sidewalks, for building drains and sewers, for oiling streets, for payment of the Town debt, for lighting streets, for defraying expenses of decorating the graves of soldiers, for preventing the spread of insect pests within the Town, for the payment of firemen for the ensuing year, and for other charges arising within the Town.

29. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Town Manager's Report

To the Board of Selectmen and Citizens of the Town of Exeter:

I would like to express my sincere thanks to the Board of Selectmen, Department Heads, and all other Town employees for their support and cooperation during the past year.

The year 1970 left the Town of Exeter with a surplus in excess of \$74,000. This is the second consecutive year with a budget surplus after experiencing two years with a deficit. The Water and Sewer Departments also finished the year with excellent financial statements.

I am hopeful that the voters will approve the bond issue for expansion of the water facility. This expansion is of the utmost urgency.

Every effort has been made to keep expenses to a minimum; however, the Town is growing and with growth the demand for services also increases. The problem is that the demand for service is growing faster than our tax base.

Submitted herewith is the audit report of the Town of Exeter for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1970.

Scope of Audit

All departments of the Town Government were audited, including The Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, District Court, Swasey Parkway, Trustees of Trust Funds, Water and Sewer Departments.

Financial Statements

Exhibit A-1 is a Comparative Balance Sheet, fiscal years December 31, 1969, and December 31, 1970. The net debt at the close of 1969 was \$84,576.94. At the close of 1970 it was a net surplus of \$1,567.42; a decrease of \$86,144.36 in one year's operations.

Exhibit A-2 shows appropriations, expenditures and balances unexpended and overdrafts. The 1970 budget showed a net overdraft of appropriations of \$41,670.27.

Exhibit A-3 shows estimated and actual revenues received. The excess of actual over estimated was \$126,-162.02. This against appropriation overdraft shows a net budget surplus of \$84,491.75; a remarkable achievement for the Selectmen and Town Manager.

Departments

Exhibits B-1 through J shows activities in all Town departments, showing receipts, expenditures and proof of balances with depository banks.

Verification notices were sent out on all delinquent taxes for the current year, 1970.

General Comments

A net budget surplus of \$84,491.75 was shown for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1970. The Selectmen and the Town Manager are to be congratulated on the excellent control of the records by containing expenditures within budget appropriations.

All records were in excellent condition. Your auditor was proud of the procedure and the general control of the records shown this year.

Many thanks to all the officials who assisted me during the course of the audit.

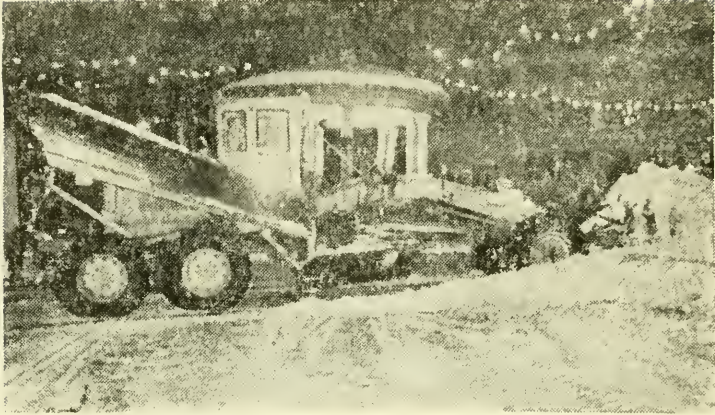

EXETER SEWER DEPARTMENT

I respectfully submit the annual report for the Town of Exeter's Sewer Department.

In 1970, Penetryn Systems, Inc., televised a major sewer trunk line finding crushed, cracked and broken pipes. Sand, roots and debris were also noted.

Six hundred feet of 18-inch sewer pipe was replaced on Winter and Park Streets. Two hundred seventy-five feet of eight-inch sewer pipe was replaced on Buzell Avenue.

Bucket machines were reactivated and removed sand, roots, etc., from one mile of sewer pipe. Six hundred and fifty storm water catch basins were vacuum cleaned.

Grit and sludge accumulations were removed from two lagoons and efforts were made towards odor abatement at the holding pond.

Three 40 H.P. electric motors, two major pumps, comminutors and holding pond sluice gate were overhauled.

Ruptured section of force main on Newfields Road was replaced.

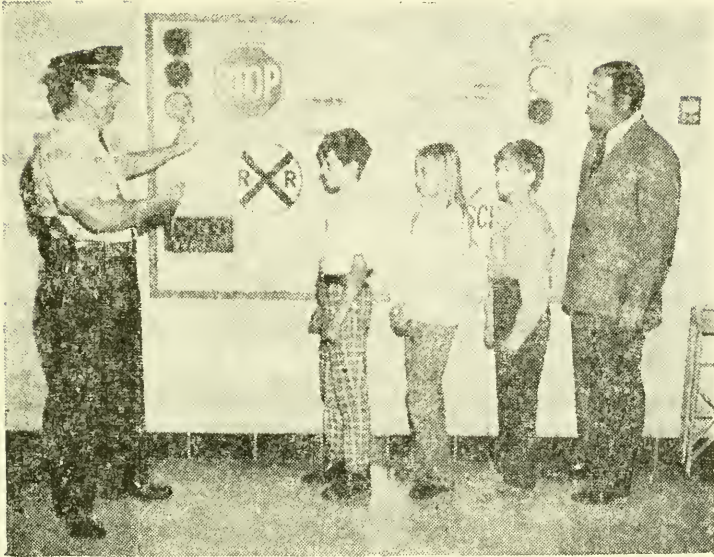

Exeter Area Visiting Nurse Association

The Exeter Area Visiting Nurse Association has continued this past year to fill the demand for home health care. The Agency includes ten towns with an office maintained in Exeter in rooms in a house rented from the Exeter Hospital and situated just behind the hospital at 21 Prospect Ave. The Agency moved to this new location on January 1, 1971, for reasons of economy and to increase its efficiency in establishing closer relations with the hospital. The Visiting Nurse is now in touch with patients about to be discharged from the hospital and in need of a nurses' service at home. In its recertification by the office of Medicare-Medicaid in October, 1970, the Agency received a commendation for the services it is providing the area.

Each town is represented on the Board of the Agency by members appointed by the selectmen of the respective towns. The number on the Board has been increased this year on a basis of population with Exeter now having three Representatives. Meetings of the board and staff are held on the first Monday of each month at the Agency office. The Agency is staffed by four registered nurses working full time — Mrs. Audrey Castle (senior nurse), Mrs. Margaret Colcord, Mrs. Dorothy Zimmerman and Mrs. Aline Black, and three part time — Mrs. Gail Chamberlain, Mrs. Charles DeStefano and Mrs. Pauline Conklin. Mrs. Barbara Haley continues as physical therapist. Our staff is continually working to upgrade itself by attending professional meetings and conferences.

Nurses work under orders from each patient's own physician. Nursing care includes such services as bed baths, changes of dressings, injections, colostomy care, help with newborn babies.

With a cutback in Medicare Funds, the Agency has been forced this year to ask for a slight increase in the appropriation of each town. It is hoped that Federal assistance will be restored in this session of Congress. Meanwhile no person shall be turned away because of inability to pay.

Staff changes in 1970 were as follows: Carolyn Colwell (Mrs. Alan Lydiard) resigned in January. Mrs. Gloria Ouellette worked during March and April as a part-time assistant. Mrs. Anne Summerfield, Children's Librarian, retired the end of September and is being replaced by Mrs. Mary Echols in the month of July. The loyal and untiring services of Mrs. Summerfield to the children has been greatly appreciated and they will miss her help to them. Miss Pamela Gjettum was appointed in December to replace me. She will begin office January 4, 1971.

The record collection has been a great success and we hope to enlarge it this coming year.

To the Library Trustees and Staff I extend my sincere appreciation over the years for their kind and loyal support in every way.

Report of Conservation Commission

The Exeter Conservation Commission was established in 1965, at which time there were some twenty others in the State. Today, there are over one hundred commissions representing as many towns and cities and a New Hampshire Association of Conservation Commissions.

One of our main objectives has been to assist in the preservation and protection of the natural environment. We are going forward with the hardwood tree nursery project and the planting of shade trees throughout the town.

Last spring, the highway department set out 30 6-8 foot sugar maples and red oaks along the streets of the town. The planting sites were designated by Roger Sloan and Patricia deLaChapelle who head up the tree planting project. Trees that were set out in 1969 for the commission were pruned and fertilized during the summer.

Plans have been finalized whereby 100 sycamores and red maples will be set out in the spring of 1971. Some of these transplants will come from the commission operated nursery. A total of 334 sugar maples, sycamores, white spruce, white birch, black gum, red oak and red maple seedlings were set out in the nursery in 1970. Many of these will be ready for transplant in 3-5 years.

Another major project has been in education. Over fifty books, guides, pamphlets have been purchased and given to the libraries of the local schools. These materials deal with the natural environment of plants, birds and animals, conservation in general and the dangers of pollution. Peter Smith and his committee on conservation education, have aided in the development

of conservation guidelines for use in the first eight grades. Commission members have also been active in helping to preserve the area behind the elementary school for nature trail use.

The commission has a plan by the county forester for the development of the 13-acre tract on the Newmarket Road. This property will be a wildlife refuge with provision for nature trails and limited recreation for Exeter residents. Last spring, 200 fruit-bearing autumn olive seedlings were set out in the refuge to attract wildlife. Plans are well underway for extensive conservation practices in 1971 in this area.

The Commission wishes to thank the selectmen and the people of Exeter for providing funds to support its projects. It is hoped that these projects will contribute toward making Exeter a better place to live in. Since the Commission is empowered to hold land in the name of the town, gifts of land that can be kept for scenic use or as a wildlife-recreation sanctuary would be well received.

Report of the Planning Board

Again this year the Planning Board had an attrition rate of over 40%. This attrition rate necessitated the appointment of three new members including your present chairman.

With the Town's acceptance last year of subdivision control, your Board had a fairly extensive and all encompassing program already preplanned for it from the beginning. It was soon evident that this Board would of necessity have to meet weekly; this they have been doing with few exceptions throughout the year.

Our program of establishing subdivision rules and regulations was initiated by a fairly comprehensive study of several of our surrounding communities. This study was then followed up by the writing of a draft copy of rules and regulations for our Town. These have been rewritten several times already. The establishment of sub-division controls that are fair to all — and in particular protective to our New England community — has been our goal from the beginning.

The status of the subdivision rules and regulations at the present time is that they are almost finalized and it is our sincere desire that we will have our first public hearing on them soon after this year's Town Meeting.

On behalf of the Planning Board, may I take this opportunity to thank the Selectmen for their support, our Town Manager, Paul Keefe, for his continued un-

selfishness, complete devotion to our Town and objective recommendations and particularly the electorate for their sound vote of confidence as demonstrated at last year's Town Meeting.

Report of Historic District Commission

The Exeter Historic District Commission was created at a special town meeting held in June. The state statute, 31:89-a, sets forth the following purposes: the preservation of structures and places of historic and architectural value is hereby declared to be a public purpose. The heritage of the municipality will be safeguarded by (a) preserving a district in the municipality which reflects elements of its cultural, social, economic, political and architectural history; (b) conserving property values in such district; (c) fostering civic beauty; (d) strengthening the local economy; (e) promoting the use of an historic district for the education, pleasure and welfare of the citizens of the municipality.

The five members appointed by the selectmen had their first meeting in August and elected as officers: Chairman, Paul Holloway; Vice-Chairman, Sumner Holbrook; Secretary, Nancy C. Merrill. The planning board representative is Wesley Thomas; Norman Morrisette represents the Selectmen.

Letters were sent to other communities who have like commissions and two members went to Concord to talk with the Planning Director and Chairman of the Historic District Commission to learn more about other commissions.

Discussions have been held on purpose, policy and procedure and areas of town that might be considered an historic district. A survey was made of two streets — Front Street from the Swasey Pavilion to the Exeter Inn and Cass Street between Green Street and Giddings Tavern on Park Street. The residents in these two areas were very interested in an historic district and wanted their neighborhoods to stay as they are.

A preliminary map of Exeter has been made with suggested historical sites indicated.

Exeter has taken for granted too long its cultural, historical and architectural heritage. For such a small community Exeter has had many famous citizens and has much to offer future generations.
