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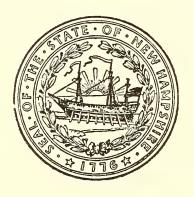

#### TOWN WARRANT

#### State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Groton in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Groton on Tuesday, the fifth day of March, 1974 next, at 3:00 of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

(Polls opened 3:00 P. M. to 9:00 P. M., business meeting begins at 6:30 P. M., and ballots will be counted after business meeting.)

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To choose one (1) delegate to the Constitutional Convention in May.
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to give a two (2) percent discount for payment of taxes paid within fifteen (15) days after Tax Collector's mailing date.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to dispose of or administer any real estate acquired by the Tax Collector's deeds.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) to be placed in the Capital Reserve Fund for a new truck.
- 7. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of Taxes.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, contract for and accept aid relative to State and Federal disaster money.
- 9. To see if the Town will raise the sum of two hundred ninety-four dollars and twenty-eight cents (\$294.28) and the State to contribute one thousand nine hundred sixty-one dollars and eighty-four cents (\$1,961.84) for Class IV and V construction.
- 10. To see what action the Town will take on its Revenue Sharing money:

(a) to rescind the last year's vote to place the money in the Savings Bank.

(b) to place all money received under Title I in a Trust Fund.

- 11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as setoffs against budgeted appropriations for the following priority purposes:
  - (a) new equipment
  - (b) new construction
  - (c) public safety
  - (d) health
  - (e) multi-purpose and general government
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to require that any Dog or Dogs owned or kept in the Town of Groton shall at all times when within the limits of the said Town and not upon or within the premises or property of its owner or keeper, be restrained from running at large. Any owner or keeper of a dog found in violation of this law, shall for each violation thereof forfeit ten (\$10.00) dollars to the Town, and said penalty may be recovered on complaint before a Municipal or District Court.
  - 13. To see what action the Town will take on the following:
    - (a) to accept the Dodge Road from the Main Road as far as Charles Matthews' home.
    - (b) to accept the Eastman Road so-called from the Town Line of Rumney & Groton to Tobey Gonnerman's residence.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from the Capital Reserve Fund the sum of four thousand (\$4,000.00) dollars to be applied towards the purchase of a new truck at the cost of ten thousand (\$10,000.00) dollars. Six thousand (\$6,000.00) dollars to be raised by taxation.
- 15. To see what action the Town will take to authorize the Selectmen to purchase the Barney Hutchins' property at the cost of two thousand, three hundred (\$2,300.00) dollars.
- 16. To see what action the Town will take upon the continued operation of the Town Library.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to continue plowing driveways at the fee of twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars per driveway.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to purchase the following new equipment:
  - (a) police radio at fifty-eight (\$58.00) dollars
  - (b) typewriter for Town Clerk at five hundred (\$500.00)
  - (c) 12 steel chairs for Selectmen's Office at one hundred (\$100.00) dollars

- (d) calculator for Selectmen's Office at one hundred (\$100.00) dollars
- (e) rake for Highway Department at one thousand, three hundred (\$1,300.00) dollars
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise two thousand, five hundred (\$2,500.00) dollars for sealing the following roads:
  - (a) North Groton Road
  - (b) Sculptured Rocks Road
  - (c) River Road
- 20. To see what action the Town will take on a 100% reevaluation of the Town by the State Tax Commission or any other qualified person or persons.
- 21. To see if the Town will act upon the following new construction or repairs:
  - (a) replacing foundation under Library and Selectmen's Office at three thousand (\$3,000.00) dollars
  - (b) repairing backwall and windows in Selectmen's Office at one thousand (\$1,000.00) dollars
  - (c) repairing chimney at Town House at five hundred (\$500.00) dollars
- 22. To see if the Town will vote to make the following changes in salaried and hourly workers:
  - a. Road Workers—from \$2.25 to \$2.75
  - b. Road Agent—from \$2.35 to \$3.00
  - c. 1st & 2nd Selectmen—from \$250.00 to \$400.00
  - d. Chairman Selectmen—from \$400.00 to \$500.00
  - e. Town Clerk-from \$100.00 to \$200.00
  - f. Town Treasurer—from \$200.00 to \$250.00
  - g. Secretary—from \$300.00 to \$400.00
  - h. Ballot Clerks—at \$2.25 (same)
  - i. Supervisors—at \$2.25 (same)
  - j. Moderator—at \$2.35 (same)
  - k. Any other salaried or hourly worker at the rate of \$2.25 with the exception of Tax Collector who is at a 1% of the Tax Warrant.
- 23. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

I found no material misstatements and all records appeared to conform with the regulations of the Division of Municipal Accounting.

## REPORT of the FOREST FIRE WARDEN and DISTRICT CHIEF

The New Hampshire Forest Fire Service is represented in every town, city or unorganized place in our state by the forest fire warden. Anyone wishing to kindle an outside fire when the ground is not covered with snow must first obtain the written permission of the fire warden. Except for cooking fires, no fire can be kindled between 9:00 A. M. and 5:00 P. M. unless it is a commercial or industrial burn or it is raining. The fire warden is assisted in his work by the District Forest Fire Chief who works for the Department of Resources and Economic Development Forest Fire Service.

Fire prevention was, again this year, the most important part of the Forest Fire Warden's job. Fire statistics show the need with 72% of the fires caused by smoking, debris burning and children. Smokey the Bear is an important prevention tool but he still needs much help from the public. Parents should warn their children of the hazards of playing with matches. Children tend to forget that a lighted match held in their hand is a potential forest fire.

# SELECTMEN'S LETTER

On June 30, 1973, Gov. Thomson declared the State of New Hampshire a disaster area. The people of Groton witnessed flooding of streams, washouts of entire roads and severe damage to property. The Thayer Road was completely washed out; Cheever Road and Sculptured Rocks extensively damaged.

The Selectmen and Secretary attended a meeting at the Plymouth Elementary School to gather information pertaining to the allocation of Federal Funds for just such a disaster. C. Denis Matthews was elected Disaster Coordinator and Wendell Gilchrist, aide. Myron Lamper agreed to be foreman of all the road projects.

The estimated damage cost, made by several teams of State employees, was \$33,776.00. To date, Groton has received \$16,888.00—about 50% of the estimated total. Rivers and streams projects are completed. Roads and buildings projects are not completed. It is the opinion of this Board, that the extensive clean-up of the Sculptured Rocks River diverted another disaster in December.

General Government, Protection of Persons and Property and Property and Interest have exceeded appropriations due to the flood costs not covered under Federal Disaster Funds.

Our sincere appreciation to the people of Groton for their cooperation, hard work and understanding during the difficult days of clean-up and restoration.

We wish to thank Earl Leavey, a former resident, for his good job done on the River Road Cemetery.

The Town House has a new coat of paint and a flag pole was erected near the Selectmen's Office and Library.

The Board has enjoyed serving the people of Groton during the past year. In spite of the flood, which was a job in itself, we have seen progress. Let us enter 1974 with the same progress in mind.
