TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hancock in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Hancock on Tuesday, the fifth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing; and, upon approval by the voters at that time, to postpone consideration of the balance of the Warrant until Saturday, the Ninth day of March next at 1:00 p.m. in the afternoon.

2. To see if the Town will appropriate a sum of money in order to purchase the Camp Guild Property on Norway Pond for recreation and conservation purposes, or other purposes; determine whether such appropriation shall be raised by borrowing or otherwise; accept any gift which may be offered; or take any other action relative thereto.

3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

4. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (five hundred dollars) \$500 for the Town History Fund, or take any other action relating thereto.

5. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (one thousand dollars) \$1000 for the Water Reserve Fund, or take any other action relating thereto.

6. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (one hundred dollars) \$100 for the Fire Hose Reserve Fund, or take any other action relating thereto.

7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (nine-hundred ninety-one dollars and twenty cents) \$991.20 to be supplemented by (six thousand six hundred and eight dollars) \$6608.00 from the State for the Town Road Aid program for this year, or take any other action relating thereto.

8. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (four hundred fifty-five dollars) \$455 to support the mental health service program of the Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service, or take any other action relating thereto.

9. To see if the Town of Hancock, New Hampshire will raise and appropriate the sum of (one thousand thirty dollars) \$1,030 to

support the services of the Monadnock Community Visiting Nurse Association, Inc. This local request for financial support is based on a \$1.00 per capita formula.

10. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (six thousand dollars) \$6,000 to continue to implement the recommendations of the Dump Study Committee to establish a sanitary landfill operation for the Town, or take any other action relating thereto.

11. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow up to (forty thousand dollars) \$40,000 to be repaid over an eight year period to purchase a loader for the combined use of the Sanitary Landfill and the Town Highway Department, or take any other action relating thereto.

12. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (five hundred dollars) \$500 for the Conservation Commission, or take any other action relating thereto, this sum to be allowed to accumulate from year to year or to be expended by the Commission or to be added to by gifts of money.

13. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (two thousand two-hundred ninety-eight dollars and seventy five cents) \$2,298.75 to cover the unpledged funds required for the completion of soil mapping, or take any other action relating thereto.

14. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate (twenty-thousand dollars) \$20,000 for a tax map for the Town, and authorize the withdrawal of (five thousand dollars) \$5,000 for this purpose from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the Provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, with the balance to be raised by taxation, or take any other action relating thereto.

15. To see if the Town will accept as a Town Road the new portion of Prospect Hill Road from Route 123 to its convergence with the present town road north of the residence of Mr. and Mrs. Willis Foote and to discontinue the old portion of Prospect Hill Road thus by-passed, or take any other action relating thereto.

16. To see if the Town will vote to designate as a scenic road, under provisions of RSA 253:17, the Middle Hancock Road, or take any other action relating thereto.

17. To see if the Town of Hancock, N.H. will authorize the Selectmen to apply for, contract for and accept aid relative to disasters declared by the State or Federal Government, or take any action relating thereto.

18. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (two hundred dollars) \$200 for the Bicentennial Committee, or take any other action relating thereto.

19. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (seventeen

hundred dollars) \$1700 to improve the communications for the Fire Department, or take any other action relating thereto.

20. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Library Capital Improvement Fund and raise and appropriate (one thousand dollars) \$1,000 for this purpose; this sum to be allowed to accumulate from year to year or to be expended by the Library Trustees or to be added to by gifts of money; or take any other action relating thereto.

21. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (three thousand dollars) \$3,000 to construct recycling bins at the sanitary landfill site under the direction of the Selectmen when the necessary transportation has been arranged and recycling is economically justified, or take any other action relating thereto.

22. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint an ad hoc committee of no less than three persons, to study the feasibility of incorporating a recycling program into the Town's solid waste disposal plan, said committee hereinafter to be called the Recycle Feasibility Committee. The Recycle Feasibility committee shall report its findings to the Selectmen on or before June 1, 1974.

23. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate a sum, not to exceed \$50.00, to cover the legitimate expenses of the Recycle Feasibility Committee in carrying out its study.

24. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to lay out and accept as a Class V Town Road with a minimum forty foot right-of-way, an extension of the Town Road known as Derby Road to the intersection of the woods road leading to Tenney Pond and the private access road to the properties on the southeast side of Lake Nubanusit with the provision that this road does not have to be plowed in the winter, or take any other action relating thereto.

25. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (five hundred and twenty five dollars) \$525 to purchase an audio system for the Town, or take any other action relating thereto.

26. To see if the Town will adopt the provisions of RSA 55:9a and RSA 55:9B which allows the Town Clerk to register new voters subject to the approval of the Supervisors of the checklist, or take any other action relating thereto.

27. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (five hundred fifty dollars) \$550 for the Recreation Committee for work on the tennis courts, or take any other action relating thereto.

28. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate (eight hundred dollars) \$800 which, together with funds from the N.H. Highway Safety Agency, will be used to purchase traffic control radar equipment for the Police Department, or take any other action relating thereto.

29. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, or take any other action relating thereto.

30. To see if the Town will accept gifts and legacies left in trust for the Town, or take any other action relating thereto.

31. To hear the reports of auditors and committees heretofore chosen, or take any other action relating thereto.

32. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

The New Hampshire Forest Fire Service is represented in every town, city or unorganized place in our state by the forest fire warden. Anyone wishing to kindle an outside fire when the ground is not covered with snow must first obtain the written permission of the fire warden. Except for cooking fires, no fire can be kindled between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. unless it is a commercial or industrial burn or it is raining. The fire warden is assisted in his work by the District Forest Fire Chief who works for the Department of Resources and Economic Development Forest Fire Service.

Fire prevention was, again this year, the most important part of the Forest Fire Warden's job. Fire statistics show the need with 72% of the fires caused by smoking, debris burning and children. Smokey the Bear is an important prevention tool but he still needs much help from the public. Parents should warn their children of the hazards of playing with matches. Children tend to forget that a lighted match held in their hand is a potential forest fire.

Also during the year 376 records were circulated.

The State Library Bookmobile visited the library three times during the year to leave us a total of 1,494 books. In addition, we borrowed 80 books from the State Library at Concord on special requests.

In November of 1973 we entered into a contract with the McNaughton Book Service whereby we received 100 basic books of current fiction and non-fiction, and each month we will receive ten new books from a list selected by us and will return ten books, on a continuous rotating basis. We believe that under this arrangement our patrons will be able to have the most recent fiction and non-fiction as soon as the publications are available.

During the year the third and fourth grade pupils visit the library with their teachers each week on an alternating basis. Harriet Hampson has a story period for the third graders, and also reads to the pre-school children who visit the library every other Tuesday morning. Doris Rogers continues to have a story hour for the first and second grades in the library each Friday afternoon.

LIBRARY TRUSTEES REPORT

What would libraries be without people? Hancock is blessed with three good, dedicated librarians, countless generous donors of books, records, and magazines, skillfull volunteer carpenters, besides all the loyal patrons whose lives have been brightened by the books they borrowed.

And this year four civic-minded talented members of the Library Space Committee who generously gave of their time and thought to aid the trustees in long-range planning. We are most grateful to one and all. For the Committee's conclusions see separate pages of this town report.

A number of improvements to the building have been made during the year including: two eight foot 'fluorescent ceiling fixtures which double the light in the middle room; copper flashing and snow guards on the roof to prevent snow from falling onto the steps; a new hot water heater on a separate electric line for greater economy; storm windows in areas where there were none; rebuilding and repainting the bulkhead; relocating the thermostat; creating colorful curbside flower gardens.

The trustees wish to publicly thank Arnold Frank and John Radcliff who built the bookshelf divider which creates a secluded reading area in the front room. Arnold also refinished the tops of tables in the children's as well as adult areas. He has also completed shelving in the basement designed to create an efficient, attractive storage area for back issues of magazines and lesser used books.

Harriet Hampson, Children's Librarian, has completed a ten-week course in children's literature given by the State Library.

A delightful story hour was presented in August by an experienced story teller, Mrs. John Esseks of De Kalb, Illinois, daughter of John and Polly Radcliff. Here on vacation, she captivated an eager audience of pre-school and primary children, as well as the adults present.

The librarians and trustees gave a tea in October for the elementary school teachers to introduce them to the library and its resources.

The by-laws and rules of the library have both been updated and copies of the rules prepared by Flora Frank for new patrons and school children.

What an amazing variety of talent Sally Hamilton, Art Director, has produced for the monthly art show on the walls of the library! Water colors, oil paintings, collages, photographs by artists from our area as well as Connecticut, Ohio and Massachusetts have

provided a colorful, interesting background for the library patrons. It is fun to discover how much Hancock people encourage their artistic bents.

The librarians have displayed many private collections in the glass case, thus drawing attention to the library's books on varied subjects. Chinese objects, Royal Doulton figurines, wood carving, old salt cellars, Japanese dolls, old plates have all increased our enjoyment of the library.

JOINT REPORT OF THE
LIBRARY SPACE COMMITTEE AND
THE LIBRARY TRUSTEES

The formation of the Library Space Committee was authorized at the 1973 Town Meeting. The Committee was given the responsibility to work with the Library Trustees "to study ways of gaining additional space for the Library and to make a report of their conclusions to the 1974 Town Meeting."

Principal Conclusions

A. To conform to generally accepted space standards for libraries and to accommodate anticipated utilization of the Library over the next 20 years, the Library will eventually require about 600 square feet of additional floor space.

B. The additional floor space can be obtained at the present site. For this and other reasons, the Library should not be relocated.

C. High on the list of current priorities are (1) more available space in the first-floor middle room for library patrons to read and study and (2) more efficient arrangement of space in which librarians can perform their administrative and supervisory responsibilities.

D. The short-range objectives noted in Conclusion C should be met within the next three to five years and could be accomplished with an expenditure of approximately \$16,000 (1973 prices, exclusive of furnishings). This renovation (Option 7 below) would not interfere with any of the other listed options, including those designed to meet the long-range needs of the Library.

E. A concerted, on-going effort should be initiated by the Library to raise as much of the needed funding as possible from private sources.

F. To encourage gifts from potential donors, the Committee strongly recommends that the Town demonstrate its support for needed improvements by authorizing an initial appropriation of \$1,000 for a Library Improvement Reserve Fund.

How Much Additional Space Is Required?

In estimating future space requirements for the Library, the Committee considered a number of pertinent factors: population growth and composition, net growth of the Library's collection and its relationship to the collections of other libraries in the region, current and possible future uses of the Library, efficiency with which current space is utilized, and space standards developed by professional librarians.

The Committee estimated that, by 1994, the Library would require a total of about 2,200 square feet, in contrast to today's 1,553 square feet. Among other things this assumes a 1994 population of 2,160 and a maximum of 12,000 — 14,000 volumes.

Currently, the Library contains about 10,000 volumes. The 12,000 — 14,000 volumes limit does not appear unduly harsh (1) in view of a Committee recommendation to more vigorously weed out under-used volumes and (2) in view of a new acquisition method whereby current books can be acquired, held for a period at the Library, and ultimately returned to the supplier. This, of course, will conserve space required for shelving.

Of immediate concern is a need for more space to permit (1) exclusive utilization of the first-floor middle room for reading and study by Library patrons and (2) well-planned rearrangement of librarian work space. Actually, these two needs are interrelated.

Currently, the middle room is used both by librarians for administrative purposes and by library patrons for a reading/study area. However, because of this dual utilization of the middle room, librarians and patrons tend to get in the way of one another, with the result that the middle room does not meet the need of anyone satisfactorily. As presently used, therefore, the middle room falls far short of its best-use potential. (study and reading) and the librarians are not provided with an efficiently organized work area.

How Is the Extra Space Obtained?

Theoretically, there are several possibilities by which to obtain extra space:(1) move the Library to a more spacious site, (2) develop a Library Branch, (3) acquire adjoining property on which to build an addition to the Library, (4) construct an addition on the property now owned by the Library, and (5) secure additional usable space by altering the interior of the existing building.

The Committee believes that, at least for the next 20 years or so, the Library's space needs can be satisfied by pursuing a combination of (4) and (5) above. Among the promising options for obtaining the needed 600 square feet (see Conclusion A above) over the next 20 years are the following:

Option 1. Partition off an area in the basement, adjacent to the furnace. Provides 283 square feet of basement space. Cost: \$8,500*.

Option 2. Construct a small addition in the jog north of the children's room and build a room in the basement under the children's room. Provides 219 square feet of first-floor space and 264 square feet of basement space for a total of 483 square feet. Cost \$26,000*.

Option 3. Build an attic room and a new stairway in existing stairwell. Provides 380 square feet of second-floor space. Cost: \$16,000*.

Option 4. Construct a two-story addition covering most vacant Library land to the east of the present structure. (Requires a bulkhead on the west side of the building and a septic tank on adjacent property.) Provides 600 square feet of first-floor space and 600 square feet of second-floor space for a total of 1,200 square feet. Cost \$50,000*.

Option 5. Build a new second floor in the old section of the present building and raise the roof. New roof would be flat. Provides 780 square feet of second-floor space. Cost: \$46,000*.

Option 6. Drop attic floor (old section of Library) 3 feet and remove chimney and fireplace. Provides 780 square feet of second-floor space. Cost: \$32,000*.

Option 7. Construct a one-story addition extending along the rear third of the east side of the building, which would contain new toilet facilities, stairway to the cellar, and excavation below. Provides 126 square feet of extra first-floor space, 126 square feet of additional basement space, and permits 112 square feet of present first-floor utility space to be converted into an efficiently organized area in which librarians can conduct their administrative and supervisory duties. Thus a total of 252 square feet of extra space is obtained, along with more profitable use of 112 square feet of existing space. Cost: \$16,000*.

*Approximate only; 1973 prices; exclusive of furnishings.

Options 1 and 7 could be considered as meeting relatively immediate needs, while 2 through 6 are possible solutions to long-range requirements. Though certainly not binding on Library Trustees, the conclusion of the Committee is that Option 7—possibly in conjunction with Option 1—appears to offer the best solution at this time to the primary current needs for a middle room used exclusively as a reading/study area and for an improved work area for Library staff. Moreover, Options 7 and 1 would not interfere with the future pursuit of the remaining options.

Regardless of the approach selected by the Trustees and Town, the important point is to avoid selecting a course of action now that will prematurely exclude desirable approaches to Library improvements in the future. In this regard, periodic review of the above options may prove helpful.

Questions of Timing and Money

Provision of a middle room exclusively for the purpose of reading and studying and rearrangement of librarian work space should probably occur in the next three to five years.

The committee recommends that as much of the needed funding as possible originate from private sources, thereby reducing the tax impact. To this end, and on-going fund-raising effort should be initiated by the Library.

However, since private financial backing is so often dependent upon a concrete expression of over-all community support, the Committee strongly urges that the Town authorize the establishment of a Library Improvement Reserve Fund and appropriate an initial \$1,000 for this purpose.

This report has attempted to outline a range of options by which additional Library space might be secured. Precise answers to the questions of when, how, and how much money remain the

responsibility of the present and future Library Trustees, who will be in a better position than this Committee to assess the impact on Library services of the many changes that are bound to affect Hancock in the coming years.

REPORT OF THE HANCOCK TOWN HISTORY COMMITTEE

During the past year, through research and tape-recorded interviews, a considerable amount of information has been compiled. Several parts of our proposed outline for the new town history are now in the process of being written. A section concerning the "Early Years" pertains to Indians, explorers, early settlers, the incorporation of the town, and a summary of the first hundred years. An interesting conclusion from some of the research has been that many of the original Scotch-Irish settlers, homesick for their native hills and valleys, left the comparatively flat land of the Massachusetts Bay Colony and came north seeking the familiar terrain of home. They were willing to suffer innumerable hardships to remain in these hills.

Research into the history of the present church building reveals that Hancock was the fourth town to build a church of this particular architecture. The original, built in 1811, was designed by Elias Carter and may still be seen in Templeton, Massachusetts. Fitzwilliam, New Hampshire, copied the design in 1816 and Dublin in 1818. When Hancock's first Meeting House was destroyed by fire in 1819, admirers of the Dublin structure requested that the new Hancock building be similarly designed.

Some of the areas still needing to be researched are town government, cemeteries, communication, illumination, industries, organizations, arts and artists, architecture, sports, armed services, and interesting people.

The town history committee is planning to take an active role in Hancock's celebration of the American Revolution Bicentennial. We are interviewing residents for information and remind everyone that if any material is found while clearing homes and buildings and settling estates which may contain pertinent bits of information relating to any phase of this history, we are anxious to borrow or receive it.

The committee has found that before any part of the history can be written, countless hours of research are necessary. Because of this we are asking for assistance from interested persons. If you would like to help, please contact the committee.

REPORT OF THE HANCOCK ZONING
BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT

During 1973 the Board held public hearings to consider two applications for variances from certain sections of the town Zoning Ordinance. The first concerned approval of a sub-division for Phylis V. Shattuck where the frontage of the parcel of land forming the sub-division was on a private rather than a public right of way. The variance was granted subject to limitations requiring full conformity with the Ordinance in the event of any further partition of the property. The second hearing involved an application by Else Cordelle for a permit to build an entry and carport on the back of her dwelling on Hosely Street. Inasmuch as the property in question is non-conforming and the addition would not reduce the existing side yard dimension, and since there were no objections by adjoining property owners, the variance was granted subject to structural limitations relative to run-off water.

There was a third applicant who wished to establish a food and novelty store in the Agricultural and Rural District but, after considerable correspondence and numerous discussions by telephone, he was finally persuaded that permission to do so would require revision of the Ordinance and that the Board thus does not have the authority to act on such a request. The appeal, therefore, was dropped and no formal hearing was set up.

HANCOCK 1973

The tempo of life quickened in 1973 as if we were rushing to get the hay in before a storm. Just how serious a storm it might be no one knew but the clouds grew darker.

"Watergate" produced a previously unknown shade of purple, Wilder's "No Gas" sign appearing on certain days in the fall was blackish and the much higher cost of food and fuel oil for the winter a weirdish red. All these bewildering developments inspired discussion at the Men's Club and elsewhere. The threatened impeachment of President Nixon was on people's tongues spiced by the actual resignation of Vice President Spiro Agnew for income tax evasion. There were rumblings from the Near East — clearly audible.

Let no future reader imagine we spent our time sitting around waiting for the world to come to an end, far from it. In preparation for things to come the Selectmen designated Doris Rogers, Eleanor Amidon, Olive Rhines and Mary Hibbard to work on the Town History for our 200th anniversary in 1979.

Working along with the coming generation teaching craft skills were, among others, Rebecca Cram and Gloria Neary. Otto Jespersen had two outstanding Boy Scouts in the Hancock troupe, Chris St. John and Ed "Chip" Smith, both becoming Eagle Scouts. Sue Perry and life guards Virginia O'Dell and Leslie Amidon made the Town Beach a learning experience.

Regardless of outside happenings year in and year out art interests many in Hancock. JoAnn Stover (Mrs. Pollaro) held an art workshop for children. Wally Tripp known for his "Paw Print" cards wrote a book and Gladys Rockhill won an important State award. Also busy as usual was the Dillon family, Barbara Williams, Marsha Amidon and others.

On the practical side also using skills was a one day refurbishment of the elementary school by the Tim Bowers, Vern Youngs, Ray Harringtons, Chris Robinsons, Betsy Wilder, Bob Keil and the Victor Stoykoviches. Also participating were Sandy Smith, Leslie and Cindy Amidon, Mary and Martha Robinson and Mark and Jeff Wilder.

It seems hard to realize, for me at least, that it was 24 years ago, in 1950, that Bob English first wrote an historical sketch for the Town Report. At that time it was felt that pending the rewriting of the interesting but outdated Town History, it would be helpful to bridge the gap, hoping thus to catch something of the flavor of the passing years.

Already the early sketches read as part of a different era. Half of those active citizens mentioned in reports of the 50's have vanished from the scene. Many others have come to take their places. Now, for instance, there are some 750 on the check list as compared with 426 in 1950. Interest and dividend taxes yielded then 17 thousand dollars, now it is 58 thousand. It is still an important source of revenue for Hancock not shared by other small towns in New Hampshire.

A quick look back to 1951 and we find that Bob Senechal shot a deer on Norway Hill weighing 294 pounds, a State record. In case you didn't know it a year later free snow plowing of driveways was ended by vote of the Town; in 1954 the High School was closed as there were next to no students and in 1955 the pipeline to Juggernaut was completed. We noted in 1956 that the ice didn't go out of Norway Pond until May 5; a year later, in 1957, the by-pass of Hancock by route 202 was a reality.

Do you remember?

Back to 1973. This year we had an earthquake on the 14th of June, a shake so mild most never felt it. Weatherwise it was mild in the early months, damp during July and completely snowless in November, with just a little sleet in December. We usually mention Town Meeting which this year was interesting and well attended. Al Lyon was chosen the new Selectman.

In July 200 attended an exhibit of handmade quilts at the Historical Society. Carita Williams was thought to have shown the oldest but other very old ones were displayed by Helen Trook and Fran Tripp. Many others took part. Some of these were Carrie Benson, Becky Johns, Marion Wells and Ruth Lessey.

Our organizations continue to flourish. For the record Else Cordelle was chosen President of the Woman's Club and Polly Watson, Vice President. The Guild selected as their President, Virginia Skinner, with Ruth Tarr and June Chandler, Vice Presidents. Barbara Caverly is to be the Recording Secretary.

Women are extra important these days but men in Town do interesting things. The Sportsmen's Club has 45 members; one of them, Bob Fish our rural mail carrier, was honored for "outstanding contributions." Bob Kierstead, the new Fire Chief, is President of the Club and John Hitchcock, Vice President. Our own extra special Joe Quinn became a TV personality in part because of his collection of antiques on display to all at his Village Farm. Their value was well attested; they were stolen.

Warren Kinney, Lou Kolb and Stuart Cooke vie for honors in raising specialties in their respective greenhouses. An interesting

husband and wife team are Pat-Glynn Wells the new owners of the more and more successful John Hancock Inn. Both came from New Jersey.

Our beautiful Meeting House presided over by a new minister, Alan Schroepfer, has been welcoming many new members. A record 28 joining in December.

So much, so much was going on as our life quickened. But let us not, for lack of space, fail to note honors paid to Irja Dreese when she retired from teaching in the elementary school and Barry Cass selection to give the benediction at the Conval graduation.

Take good care of yourselves so that twenty-five years from now you can be among those still making Hancock a living breathing town — not a polished static reproduction of what used to be.
