#### TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Hebron, in Grafton County, in the State of New Hampshire, you who are qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Community Hall in Hebron on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at 12 noon to act upon the following subjects:

#### ARTICLE:

- 1. To choose all Town Officers for the ensuing year by official ballot. The polls will open at 12 noon and close at 9:00 P.M., and the business meeting will commence at 7:00 P.M.
- 2. To see if the Town will vote to authorize a two percent discount on property taxes if paid within thirty days of the date of the tax bill. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to establish a capital reserve fund under the provisions of RSA 35:1 for the purpose of constructing a future town hall at the Rogers property, and to raise and appropriate \$20,000 to be placed in this fund. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to establish a capital reserve fund under the provisions of RSA 35:1 for the purpose of rebuilding the Hobart Hill Road, and to authorize the Selectmen to transfer \$20,000 from the fund balance. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to use the annual fire protection fee from Groton for capital reserve fund entitled Fire Department (existing). Presently \$2,500. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to transfer \$50,000 from the 1995 fund balance to the capital reserve fund entitled Cockermouth and Georges Brook Bridges (existing). (Recommended by the Selectmen)
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$84,000 to replace the one lane bridge over Georges Brook on Cooper Road and to authorize the Selectmen to expend this amount with the NHDOT, the monies to come from the capital reserve fund entitled Cockermouth & Georges Brook Bridges. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,000 for street signs for E911. (Recommended by the Selectmen)

- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000 for the purchase of approximately 1.5 acres of land from Neil and George Davis behind the town shed off Cooper Road and improvements thereto. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 for repairs to the Town Shed. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500 for the purchase of a new photocopier for the Town Office. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
- 12. To see if the Town of Hebron will be a provider of ambulance service to the Town of Groton commencing January 1, 1997 and to authorize the Selectmen to negotiate a contract therefore.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 to reimburse Peter Fortescue for the cemetery layout. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
- 14. To see if the Town will establish a joint recreation committee with the Town of Groton relative to the Hebron-Groton Athletic Association and report to the 1997 town meeting, and to authorize the Selectmen to make appointments thereto.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500 for the construction of a gazebo on the town common. (By petition) (Recommended by the Selectmen)
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000 to remove the pavement and add bank run gravel to the end of lot 15 (approximately 330 ft.) on the Indian Point Road. (Recommended by the Selectmen)
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray charges for the ensuing year.
- 18. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

#### HEBRON POLICE DEPARTMENT Annual Report for 1995

During the past year the Hebron Police Department received nearly 400 calls for services and information along with nine 911 emergency calls.

Again, our major problems were in the domestic and juvenile related matters which resulted in several arrests as well as a large consumption of man hours. Criminal activities, such as burglaries and thefts were again in the singledigit numbers as they were last year. Accidents were in the low teens, and mostly animal related on Route 3A. Violations of town ordinances resulted in summonses and fines which came back from court as income for the town.

I would like to thank the Selectmen, the citizens of Hebron, and the members of the Hebron Police Department for their support and continuous help this past year. Although we are a part-time department, we try our best to give you all full-time services. We will continue to do our best to serve you and to keep Hebron a better and safer place to live.

#### HEBRON FIRE DEPARTMENT Annual Report for 1995

In 1995, the Hebron Fire Department responded to 95 calls. This compares with 87 calls in 1994, 111 calls in 1993 and 107 calls in 1992.

The type of incidents breaks down as follows: 56 medical emergencies, 15 requests for mutual aid, 1 structure fire, 1 chimney fire, 2 vehicle fires, 3 alarm activations, 5 power lines down, 2 outside fires, 3 illegal burning, 3 fire investigations, 2 water/boat rescues and 2 service calls.

During 1995, we responded to the first mutual aid call outside of the Lakes Region system. A six person crew for our department worked an eight hour shift at the tannery fire in Pittsfield, New Hampshire. It was the largest operation we have ever participated in.

As of December 1995, our ambulance service has been on line for 14 months. We have responded to 63 medical emergencies in that period with full crews and excellent response time. We have never had to be "retoned" by Lakes Region dispatch center for any call, which means we have always been responding within five minutes.

At present, the roster stands at 24 officers and firefighters. Of the 24, 12 are state certified as Firefighter I or above, and 19 are certified as First Responders or above, and are able to provide emergency medical care.

Fire department management is always a juggling act between personnel, training and equipment. At present, we are very strong in trained personnel. But having such a good crew of people puts a strain on certain areas of equipment. At present, we do not have enough protective clothing (coats, pants, boots and helmets) for all our firefighters. We also need more pagers to alert our personnel. We have no "Personal Alert Safety Systems," PASS devices as they are called, which are now required by National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) standards for each firefighter engaged in structural fire fighting activities. Along with these items of personal equipment, we would also like to increase the amount of 4" hose we carry and replace some old  $2^{1/2}$ " hose. Since these are all expensive items, we will prioritize the needs and work within the \$3,000 set aside in the fire department budget for new equipment.

It always impresses me the amount of personal time people are willing to put into training, maintenance, meetings and planning as volunteers. Yes, our firefighters are paid when responding to alarms, but that accounts for only a fraction of the time they spend with the department. My hat goes off to them; such dedication makes the job of chief an easy one.

Finally, I want to thank the community for the support it has given the department. Our success reflects your concern for the safety and well-being of our town and its people.

#### TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND STATE FOREST RANGER REPORT

In calendar year 1995, our three (3) leading causes of fires were Children, Non-Permit fires not properly extinguished and Smoking Materials.

Violations of RSA 224:27 II, the fire permit law, and the other burning laws of the State of New Hampshire, are misdemeanors punishable by fines of up to \$2,000 and/or a year in jail. Violators are also liable for all fire suppression costs. To aid you Forest Fire Warden, Fire Department and State Forest Fire Officials, contact you local Warden or Fire Department to find out if a permit is required. This also helps to prevent unnecessary response to a controlled burn.

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#### **PEMI-BAKER HOME HEALTH AGENCY**

The Pemi-Baker Home Health Agency is entering its twenty-ninth year of operation, and increases its visits on average of 20% a year. New services are added as the need arises, and as funding permits. Care is provided to those who are essentially homebound and in need of services in their home, as opposed to an institutional setting. Many new hi-tech procedures are now done in the home, which adds another interesting and challenging dimension to the home health field.

- Many of our programs are becoming more specialized; an example is Pediatric Nursing and Psychiatric Nursing. Our parenting programs continue to grow and the free dental screenings have been increased. We are in hopes of being able to increase the number of children we see in our Well Child Program.
- The agency is now officially Medicare HOSPICE certified, and this program can
  now enhance our terminal care program. Terminal care provides both medical
  and emotional support through a team of professionals, volunteers and clergy.
- We continue to hold free blood pressure clinics, diabetic screening and immunization clinics, and, in October, cosponsored a breast cancer town meeting moderated by Heather Merrill.

#### **REPORT TO CITIZENS OF COUNCIL DISTRICT ONE**

As Executive Councilor for District One, it is a privilege for me to communicate with the citizens of this town and area, which are a part of District One of 98 towns and four cities.

The five-member Executive Council is at the top of your Executive Branch of Government. The NH House and Senate make laws and pass into law a budget. It is then the constitutional and lawful duty of the Governor and Council to carry out those laws and budget. The entire Judicial Branch of judges are all nominated by the Governor and confirmed by the Council. The Governor and Council also nominate and confirm 267 Commissioners and Directors to terms of office in the various state executive branch departments.

The Governor and Executive Council also are required by law to nominate and confirm dozens of citizens to various volunteer boards and commissions. If anyone is interested in serving, they should forward their resume directly to Governor Merrill or my office at the State House. A list of these boards and commissions may be obtained by calling my State House Office at 271-3632.

The year ahead will prove challenging in the area of town, county and state administration of the recently passed House Bill 32, which reallocates, reorganizes most of the Health and Human Services Department of NH State Government. It is extremely important that local and county officials stay in close touch with their State Senators and State Representatives. I have asked Health & Human Services Commissioner Terry Morton to appoint at least 15-20 people from each county to act as advisors to this office as commission. If any of you are interested in serving, please call his office direct 1-800-852-3345, ext. 4331, or send him a note at his office on Hazen Drive, Cóncord, NH 03301 expressing your interest.

As of this writing there is still about \$270,000 waiting to be matched by local dollars in the Economic Development Matching Grant Program, and \$275,000 waiting to be matched in the Joint Tourist Promotional Program. Both of these programs can be accessed by calling 271-2411.

Some 9 million dollars is waiting at the Office of State Planning (tel. no. 271-2155) in the Community Development Block Grant Program. A town, county, regional economic development council or other regional group is eligible to apply.

The Governor's Advisory Commission on Intermodal Transportation has submitted our recommendation to the Governor on various projects submitted to us by towns and regional planning commissions. It is now up to the Governor to submit his recommendations to the House and Senate by February 15, 1996, and then it's up to those two bodies of state government as to the final disposition of the plan. I don't look for much in the way of new highways, bridges and transportation projects, due mainly to lack of money. Hopefully, we'll be able to keep in good repair the transportation system we've got.

#### COMMISSIONER'S REPORT FISCAL YEAR 1995

The Grafton County Board of Commissioners is pleased to present the following reports and financial statements. We hope they will increase your understanding of Grafton County's finances and operations, and assure citizens that their tax dollars have been expended wisely.

During FY 1995, funds received exceeded the budget by \$163,615.52 for a total of \$14,981,914.52 in actual County revenues. This was primarily due to the receipt of Medicaid Proportionate Share Payment, given by the Federal Government to partially offset the cost of serving a disproportionate share of Medicaid recipients at the County Nursing Home.

Actual expenditures total \$14,598,041.22 which was \$220,257.78 less than had been budgeted. This includes \$378,525 paid to the State of New Hampshire to enable the County to receive \$757,050 in Medicaid Proportionate Share Payment, for a net receipt of \$378,525 which was used by the County to start a Nursing Home Capital Reserve Account in the amount of \$200,000 and the balance going to surplus to help reduce the amount to be raised by County taxes. Expenditures for Medical Referee, Dispatch Center, Grafton County Conservation District, and Outside Counsel were all a little overexpended, based on what was budgeted, but all other County departments were well under their budgeted amounts.

The bottom line for FY 1995 showed that revenues exceeded expenditures by \$383,873.30, leaving the County in a sound financial position at the end of its fiscal year. The Commissioners feel extremely proud of this financial picture, which exemplifies good management by all County department heads, both elected and appointed.

Grafton County experienced some major changes during FY 1995, one of which was the retirement of Douglas "Bum" Bigelow, who served the County with forty-four years of dedicated, loyal service. The Commissioners would also like to take the opportunity to thank former Commissioner Betty Jo Taffe for her years of dedicated service to the citizens and employees of Grafton County. The Commissioners would also like to extend their thanks to Joanne Mann for doing an excellent job as Acting Administrator of the Nursing Home through November of 1994. At that time, Mr. John Will came on board as the Nursing Home Administrator, and we would like to welcome Mr. Will and inform you he has done a superb job thus far. Last, but not least, we would like to welcome our newest Commissioners, District 3. Commissioner Panagoulis brings a great deal of knowledge and sound judgment to the Board, and has show those qualities since January, 1995. We feel Commissioner Panagoulis is a great asset to the citizens and employees of Grafton County.

FY 1995 was another busy year for the Department of Corrections. Admissions were up, although inmate days decreased slightly. The Electronic Monitoring Program continues to grow, and appears to be an excellent form of alternative sentencing, and now has expanded to include the Drug Freedom Program which is funded through a grant from the Attorney General's Office. Superintendent Bird continues utilizing many volunteers for a number of inhouse programs.

The Grafton County Nursing Home has seen changes during the past year in the following areas: computer hardware upgrades, and adding a new parttime dietary aide to help serve meals. In May, Cheryl Ridley, RN, became our new Director of Nursing, our census continues to grow, and our Staff Development Coordinator has implemented a "Quality Assurance" program in-house.

The Commissioners are extremely proud of the Whole Village Family Resource Center project, which continues on track, and hopefully will be completed by the end of the next fiscal year. We are certain it will benefit many citizens and their families in Southeastern Grafton County.

All other County departments were extremely busy during FY 1995. The County Treasurer did an excellent job investing County funds, and exceeded the budgeted interest revenue figure by \$55,177.78. The new County Attorney has done an excellent job in his office, and the number of backlog cases has been reduced drastically. Our Sheriff's Department and Dispatch Center continue to increase with activity, and remain as effective and efficient as always. Carol Elliott, Register of Deeds, and her staff also continue to be overwhelmed with work, and continue to do an excellent job and to generate a great deal of revenue for the County and the State of New Hampshire.

For FY 1995, the Commissioners concluded with preparation of the FY 1996 County Budget, which was adopted by the County Legislative Delegation in late June.

The Grafton County Board of Commissioners holds regular weekly meetings at the County Administration Building on Route 10 just north of the county Courthouse in North Haverhill, with periodic tours of the Nursing Home, Department of Corrections, County Farm and Courthouse. The Commissioners also attend monthly meetings of the Grafton County Executive Committee. All meetings are public, with interested citizens and members of the press encouraged to attend. Call the Commissioners' Office at 787-6941 to confirm date, time and schedule.

In closing, we wish to express our appreciation to all staff members, elected officials, other agency personnel, and the public for their efforts in serving the citizens of Grafton County.

#### GRAFTON COUNTY SENIOR CITIZENS COUNCIL, INC. ANNUAL REPORT 1995

The Board of Directors and staff of Grafton County Senior Citizens Council, Inc. work throughout the year to enhance the health and independence of our older citizens and to assist them to remain independent in their own homes and communities for as long as possible. Through eight locations throughout the County, including Plymouth, Bristol, Canaan, Lebanon, Orford; Haverhill, Littleton and Lincoln, older adults and their families are able to obtain services such as home delivered meals, senior dining room programs, transportation, social work services, information and referral, health and educational programs, adult day care, recreation and opportunities to be of service to the community through volunteering.

During 1995, 46 residents of Hebron were able to make use of one or more of GCSCC's programs. These older adults enjoyed balanced meals in the company of friends in a senior dining room, benefited from hot, nourishing meals delivered to their homes by caring volunteers, were transported to health care providers or other community resources by our lift-equipped buses, and found opportunities to put their talent and skills to work for a better community through volunteer service.

Services for older residents of Hebron were often important to their efforts to remain in their own homes and out of institutional care despite chronic health problems and increasing physical frailty, saving tax dollars and contributing to the quality of life of our older friends and neighbors.

GCSCC very much appreciates the support of the Hebron community for services which enhance the independence and dignity of our older citizens and assists them to meet the challenges of aging in place.

#### ROGERS PROPERTY IMPLEMENTATION COMMITTEE REPORT

This committee was formed by the selectmen and was asked to come up with a plan to implement the town's requirements as suggested by the Rogers Property Needs Committee. We would first like to thank that committee for the thorough research job they did. We agree that there is a need for improved town facilities. The present offices do not allow ample space, adequate security, privacy for meetings, sufficient parking, nor are they handicapped accessible. We also concur with the previous committee that the community hall, which is leased from the church, is becoming too small to meet the needs for large gatherings such as our town meeting. The majority of the group agreed that there are recreational needs of the town, but the general consensus was that our first priority should be a building for the town offices and hall. The current picnic/volleyball area is a suitable site for these and other sports at this time, although they may need to be moved eventually. The lower portion of the property to the right of the house would be a good location for recreational purposes in the future.

Our first recommendation is that the sheds attached to the existing structure be removed. The demolition and removal of these should involve little or no expense to the town. The kitchen area should remain intact. The committee feels that the present building is not suitable for municipal purposes, and it would be too costly to attempt to renovate it to usable standards. The majority of this committee agree that its best use might be a seasonal museum, as suggested by the Needs Committee.

After walking the property and consulting with three architects, it appears that the best location for the new structure would be to the east (or rear) and south (or left) of the existing house. The facility should be detached from, but positioned to complement the current building creating a mini-complex in keeping with the colonial character of our village.

The estimated cost of the project is in the range of \$300,000 to \$400,000. This would include site work, septic, well and the general construction of a 5,000 sq. ft. building including parking facilities. The cost of a \$300,000, ten year mortgage would run about \$0.30/thousand dollar valuation + interest (\$400,000 at \$0.40/thousand).

The committee recommends that the town vote to establish a capital reserve fund of \$20,000 to be used towards a municipal building. This would impact the tax rate by about \$0.20/thousand dollar valuation since this is amortized over only one year.
