## Warrant for Annual Town Meeting.

### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE:

L. S. To the inhabitants of the town of Lebanon, qualified to vote in town affairs:—

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town, on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1st. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 2d. To choose three Selectmen, Overseer of the Poor, Collector of Taxes, Highway Commissioners, and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
- 3d. To hear the report of the Auditors and the School Board of the Town School District.
- 4th. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.
- 5th. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for repairing highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
- 6th. To see if the town will vote to allow The Hartford Water Company to use the iron bridge at West Lebanon to convey their water pipes across the Connecticut river, or act thereon.
- 7th. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money, not exceeding three hundred dollars, for the improvement of the cemeteries of the town.
- 8th. To see if the town will vote to exempt from taxation moneys lent the town by residents of the town, as per chapter 55, section 14, Public Statutes, 1891, or act thereon.
- 9th. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the proper observance of Memorial Day, or act thereon.
- 10th. To see if the town will vote to instruct its Selectmen to make a new appraisal of all real estate in town, or act thereon.
- 11th. To see if the town will vote to buy one or more snow scrapers, or act thereon.
- 12th. To see if the town will vote to change the location of the highway opposite the residence of Elijah Burnap, or act thereon.

13th. To see if the town will vote to instruct its Road Commissioner to lower the road bed at least three feet on the hill in Eldridge street, so called, opposite the houses of Clafin and Goodrich, or act thereon.

14th. To see if the town will vote to accept of the provisions of the will of Lucy Ann Hebard in relation to the care of the Hebard burial lots, or act thereon.

15th. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the construction of sewers and sidewalks, or act thereon.

16th. To see if the town will vote to authorize its Selectmen to contract and agree with the town of Hartford in the state of Vermont as to the proportion of expense to be borne by each of said towns in the maintenance of a highway over the Connecticut river at Olcott Falls, so called, and between said towns including the maintenance of the bridge, piers and abutments in and over said river, and the approaches thereto, and also as to the proportion of expense which shall be borne by each of said towns in the payments of any damages which may happen to any persons using the highway over the said bridge, or act thereon.

17th. To determine the division of the school money for the ensuing year.

## Report of the Board of Health.

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The number of children born in the town of Lebanon for the year 1897 was 105. 59 females and 46 males, an unusual disproportion between the sexes. The number is the highest ever reached in the town in one year and is encouraging.

The number of deaths in the town was 77. 43 males and 34 females, nearly the same disproportion between the sexes as in the births. The longevity of those who died is not quite so striking as for the year 1896, but is unusual. The number whose age was between 70 and 80 years was 13, between 80 and 90, 10; over 90, one 93 years, 4 months and 27 days.

Some of the diseases were as follows:

Acute lung diseases,	10
Phthisis or consumption,	6
Liver and stomach disease,	15
Heart diseases,	4

Measles were epidemic—about 200 cases—the number of deaths following the disease was only 2, as reported. Four cases of Diphtheria were reported, of these two died here; a third recovered and left town to die of the more remote effects of the disease. The other case was mild and complete recovery ensued. These cases of Diphtheria came from outside of the town and state. A rigid quarantine was established, day and night, and at the proper time the premises received a thorough disinfection. No other cases occurred. A single case of scarlet fever occurred, also imported. It was duly quarantined and premises disinfected. Recovery was made and no other cases followed.

The experience of the Board convinces them that contagious diseases are manageable and can be limited to the places where they originate if they are known in season. The Board has listened to many complaints of nuisances, and have inspected many places, and have done the best in their power to correct them. The Board of Health regrets to report that the "Fathers of the town," have not "adjudged it necessary for the public convenience and health" to construct sewers in certain parts of the town where they are much needed.

The town is to be congratulated on its healthy condition the past year. Estimating the population of the town to be 4,500, the death rate has been about 17 per thousand, which is a very low death rate.

## The Report of Superintendent of Glenwood Cemetery.

In the past season two short lines of water pipes have been laid and two hydrants have been added. Considerable work has been done in blasting and getting out rocks and partially grading a section of lots near the tool house. The parks, roads and walks have been kept in good order. The cemetery needs three main drains to take off the surface water and for under-ground drainage. Until these are laid there are parts of the ground that cannot be used for lots. A part of the road leading to the cemetery should be graveled. The ditches were filled up with stones to keep them from washing and the center of the road has washed and worn away so much that it is lower than the ditches. The expenses during the past year have been kept about as low as possible, consistent with keeping the grounds in as good order as in the past few years, so that a fund might accumulate for the improvement of the roads and the building of drains.

I think that all the bills there are against the cemetery would not amount to more than two or three dollars, but there are several bills due for the care of lots and other work that can be collected at a later date.

In presenting our annual report we would remind our townsmen that perfection is seldom, if ever, attained. The members of the School Board do not claim that the results of their efforts have always been such as they hoped, but they do maintain that they have conscientiously striven to perform all duties in such a manner as to promote the prosperity of educational interests in their town.

While many of our schools have been conducted most successfully, achieving very marked advancement along desired lines; some have proven wanting in many of the elements necessary to successful work. This has resulted from the failure of some novices in teaching to accomplish what the Board reasonably expected of them. Some of our schools are so small and necessarily unremunerative that only teachers of little or no experience can be obtained to take them in charge.

We are again compelled to bring to the attention of the town the lack of proper school accommodations on



the West side. The need is imperative and should be met. While none of the Board are prominent as agitators, we would urge upon the town the necessity of unification, as a school district, in order to overcome the current evils of our present system and secure the larger benefits of united educational work.

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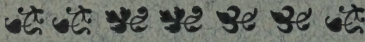

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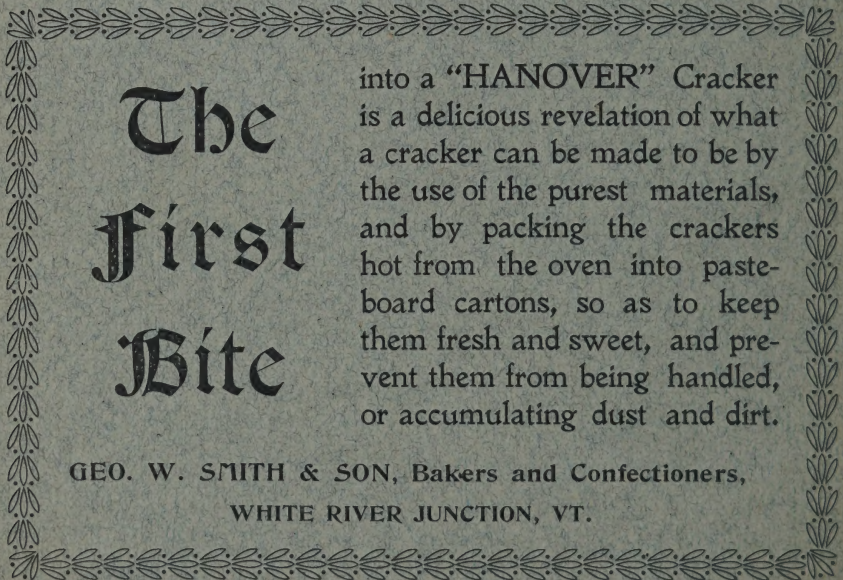
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
