# Warrant for Annual Meeting

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lyndeborough, in the County of Hillsborough in said state, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at town hall in said Lyndeborough on Tuesday, the 9th day of March next, at 9.30 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects.

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
2. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the amount of money necessary to secure state aid for permanent improvement of highways under the law passed at the January session, 1905.
3. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repair of highways and bridges in addition to that required by law.
4. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the J. A. Tarbell library in addition to that required by law.
5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.
6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for support of street lights at South Lyndeborough, or act anything thereon.
7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for cutting bushes beside the highway, or act anything thereon.
8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate money for the control of Pine Blister rust, to be spent in cooperation with the state, or act anything thereon.
9. To see if the town will vote to observe Old Home Day, or act anything thereon.
10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the money necessary to paint the interior of Citizens' Hall and make other necessary repairs, or act anything thereon.
11. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
12. To see if the town will vote to allow the selectmen to distribute inventory blanks at time of taking inventory April first.
13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to oil or tar state road beginning at Wilton line, or act anything thereon.
14. To see if the town will vote to buy a road machine, or act anything thereon.
15. To see if the town will vote to appoint a town forest committee to investigate the merits of a town forest, the same to report at the next March meeting, or act anything thereon.
16. To see if the town will vote to buy a ton truck, or act anything thereon.
17. To see if the town will vote to buy some new chairs for the town hall, or act anything thereon.
18. To see if the town will vote to accept a tract of land from the Frances H. Curtis Estate for the purpose of enlarging the Johnson Corner cemetery, or act anything thereon.
19. To see what sum of money the town will vote to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation for the same.
20. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.

### School Organization

Miss Sargent declined re-election at South Lyndeboro, and we secured Miss Elizabeth Childs, who is a graduate of Keene Normal School, class of 1925. The loss of the special music work in the schools this year has been a disappointment to a great many. I hope we may have it again next year.

The enrollment for the year 1924-1925 was fifteen less than that for 1923-1924 but the enrollment this year so far is only two less than it was last year at the same time. The attendance has improved by a little over one per cent and is only one-half of one per cent under the state average. While the average tardiness is only a little more than half as large as last year it is still more than twice as high as the state average. The Perham Corner School has the best record in respect to attendance and tardiness. The number of tuition pupils is the same as last year.

### Supervision

The statistical report following shows ninety-five supervisory visits during the school year, an increase of fifteen over the preceding year. I am trying to give an increasing proportion of my time to visiting the teachers at work and less to office work.

Standard tests have been continued and have been used as a basis for suggesting to the teachers ways of improving their teaching along certain lines. The tests are repeated at intervals of eight or ten weeks so that

the progress may be noted and further suggestions given.

### **Medical Inspection**

The usual medical inspection was made in October by Dr. Hatch and in accordance with the vote of the District will be repeated early in the spring. No nurse has been employed to follow up the inspection and so far as known no defect has been remedied.

### **Finances**

The estimated requirement for high school tuition is \$200 more than last year. The legislature of 1925 amended the law, making it permissible for a high school to charge up to the average per capita cost in that school, but not above the average per capita cost of all the high schools in the state, for the preceding year. The average cost in the state last year was \$97.65. The average cost in the Milford High School was \$79.94 and is expected to be somewhat higher this year. Their tuition rate next year will be their exact average cost for this year. The charge at the Wilton High School was not increased for the current year, although the average cost last year was \$112.66. The tuition rate next year at Wilton will be \$80.

### **Repairs and Improvements**

In accordance with your general policy of progressive improvement in the school buildings, a jacketed stove was installed last summer at Johnson Corner, and window and door screens were provided at all of the schoolhouses. The North School is now the only one not provided with a jacketed stove and that ought to be put in next year. The arrangement of the windows at the North School and Johnson Corner was mentioned in my last report. I hope it will be thought possible to remodel one of these buildings and would suggest that the condition is worse at the North School than at Johnson Corner. The chimney at Perham Corner

is giving considerable trouble and should be torn down and rebuilt; the new one should be built from the ground up and on the outside of the building.

The usual statistical tables follow this report. Again I wish to express appreciation of the loyalty and support of the teachers, school board and citizens.
