



### Forest Fire Prevention is Everybody's Business

New Hampshire faces a continuing challenge in its forest fire problem — 97 percent of all our forest fires being man-caused and preventable — a serious indictment of interest in our own welfare and that of our neighbor. Both the State and the towns are striving diligently to effectively meet the challenge through education of the public to the threat fire presents to our woodlands; by maintaining a well trained corps of wardens and deputy wardens in every community and by providing ample opportunity for all who wish to dispose of unwanted waste materials. Careless and perverseness, however, continue to be the big hurdles.

Thoughtlessly discarded lighted cigars, cigarettes and matches from moving vehicles, by hikers, hunters and fishermen; careless burning of debris during hazardous periods in dangerous locations; illegal burning; improperly extinguished debris, camp and cook fires — all result in serious loss of property disruption of industry and farm work and unnecessary expenditure of town and state funds.

To meet the challenge successfully, the state, your community and your local forest fire warden need YOUR throughful and cooperative effort — The rules are simple.

#### Fire Problems

- 1. If you do burn, be sure to secure a written permit from your local forest fire warden when the ground is not covered with snow. Permits are required for open debris fires, home incinerators, outdoor fireplaces and camp fires. Your warden is instructed to permit burning if weather conditions, site and type of burning are safe.
- 2. Be sure that all lighted material cigars, cigarettes

- and matches are completely out before discarding them. Use ash trays in automobiles.
- 3. Make certain that your debris, camp and cook fires are completely out before leaving them.
- 4. Insist that others be careful and comply with burning requirements.
- 5. Call the warden promptly when fire is detected and aid him to extinguish it.
- Remember the fire you prevent might be the one which could burn YOUR property.
- Remember Forest Fire Prevention is Everybody's Business and our Most Important Undertaking.

### REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Chichester School Board and the Citizens of Chichester:

Much is being spoken and written today about our system of education. Its weaknesses are condemned, its leaders assailed, its philosophy and methods of operation sharply criticized. Widespread differences exist as to curricula, methods of instruction, discipline, qualifications of teachers, excessive costs of buildings and administration, ultimate objectives to be attained, — in short, education is "under fire."

Whether the attack stems from revolt against socalled Progressive Education, or over-emphasis on functional learning, or the aftermath of "sputniks," the results are the same, — namely, the people have awakened to the needs of making some changes in our educational pattern.

Because of this wave of protest, this sudden burst of criticism, this tremendous interest of the people, there will be changes. Our schools are expanding in size, our people are making greater financial efforts locally, our State Department of Education is leading the way in terms of improved standards for both teachers and curricula. All these things are bound to produce changes. And this, to my mind, is good. It is good for us as a people to recognize educational weaknesses, to admit to our faults and to advance, through patient experiment, toward higher goals of human betterment.

More and more, then, we need to utilize the most competent minds; to weigh and test and measure the results of research; to spend wisely, after knowing what we are spending for; to seek and employ people who are not only well-trained, but who have real interest in promoting education.

We also need the helping hands of our interested parents, not to tell us how to run our schools, but to work along with us in the task of improving our schools.

Our school boards have much responsibility for what our schools become. They should and do work with the superintendent and teachers in a cooperative effort. They need to be men and women of good sound common sense, courageous and honest, willing to work and take responsibility.

Our teachers are our strength and bulwarks. They must be well-trained, healthy, well-balanced mentally, conscientious, hardworking people. They must be interested in working with and for children. They should be devoted to the cause of education. They should be active in social living in the school room and in the local community as much as possible. They should respect the profession of teaching and observe its ethics.

Our task, now more than ever, lies before us as a real challenge to carry on the vital work of education in a great democracy, — ever remembering that it is the little communities and their schools that help make up the great country and the great system of education of the United States of America.
