



## WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING

### March 12, 1935

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Two Hundredth and Fourth Annual Meeting

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To the Inhabitants of the Town of Durham, County of Strafford, and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall at Durham on Tuesday the twelfth of March, A. D., 1935, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Town Clerk (Charles Wentworth), one Selectman for a term of three years (Perley I. Fitts), a Collector of Taxes (Esther Y. Burnham), a Town Treasurer (George D. Stevens), two Auditors (Clement Moran and Harry C. Woodworth) and all other Town Officers for the ensuing year.

2. To select one Trustee of Trust Funds for a term of three years (Frederick W. Taylor).

3. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary to obtain State Aid on the following:

State Aid Construction. (\$2,706.06)

3. To raise and appropriate funds for the repair of Town Highways and Bridges. (\$7,500.00)

5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for current maintenance expenses, including State and County taxes as required. (See budget.)

6. To see if the Town will vote to buy a tractor and snow plow and vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to pay one-third of the cost this year and authorize the Board of Selectmen to borrow the balance on a note, the note to be paid one-half in 1936 and the balance in 1937. Voted—\$2,000.00 to be taken from surplus for 1935.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to finish the work started on the wall at the Cemetery. Voted \$300.00.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of 200.00 to continue the work of White Pine Blister Rust Control. Voted.

9. To see if the Town will vote to establish a permanent Police Department and vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to pay the salary and expenses of a full time officer. Rejected.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to defray the expenses of an Old Home Day program to be held in connection with the Annual Durham Day and Picnic. Rejected.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to assist in the work of the Red Cross Chapter. Voted conditional.

12. To see if the Town will vote to install a street light on Rosemary Lane and vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to pay for same. Voted.

13. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget act. Voted.

14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Moderator to appoint a committee of ten to investigate the possibility and feasibility of remodeling, rebuilding or adding to the present Town Hall or erecting a new one, provided Federal funds can be obtained for the same, and to recommend other public projects for which Federal funds may be obtained. Said committee to be authorized to have prepared all necessary data and present the same to the proper Federal officer or officers for approval and information regarding the availability of funds. Said committee to report its findings at a special Town Meeting to be called by the Board of Selectmen at the request of the committee.

Also to see if the Town will vote to raise and appro-

priate the sum of one hundred dollars to defray necessary expenses of the above referred to committee. Voted.

15. Section 1. Resolved that the Town of Durham shall adopt the following plan for nomination and election of the following named Town Officers: Selectmen, Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, Tax Collector, Trustees of Trust Funds, Auditors, and such other officers as the Town shall designate from time to time to be chosen by ballot.

Section 2. Any person desiring to have his or her name appear on the ballot, to be used at the Town Meeting, as a candidate for any of the above offices, shall file with the Town Clerk, at least five days prior to the date of the Town Meeting, a written request, on a blank provided by the Town Clerk, that his or her name appear on the ballot as a candidate for the stated office, and pay a filing fee in accordance with the following schedule of filing fees. Fees thus collected shall be turned over to the Town Treasurer to be used toward defraying expenses of preparing the ballots.

*Schedule Filing Fees*

Selectmen,	One dollar
Town Clerk,	One dollar
Town Treasurer,	One dollar
Tax Collector,	One dollar
Trustees of Trust Funds,	No fee
Auditors,	No fee

The filing fee for any other offices that shall, by vote of the Town, be hereafter made elective shall be fixed by vote of the Town.

The name of any voter who has complied with the above provisions shall be placed upon the ballot.

Provided, however, that upon petition, signed by ten legal voters of the Town, a voter's name shall be placed on

the ballot. Such petition shall contain the name and address of the candidate and shall be signed by such persons only as are qualified to vote at the election of the candidate named in the petition. Said petition shall be filed with the Town Clerk at least five days prior to the date of the election.

Section 3. Conduct of Elections. Election of Town Officers shall be conducted in the manner prescribed by State Law for conducting State Elections insofar as said law is applicable to the election of Town Officers.

Section 4. Any legislation which is now on the Town records which is in conflict with this Article shall be hereby rescinded.

Section 5. This Article shall take effect upon its passage. Adopted.

16. To see if the Town will vote to furnish surety bonds for Town Officers as required by law. Voted.

17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow necessary money in anticipation of taxes. Voted.

18. To see if the Town will vote to allow discounts for prompt payment of taxes as follows:

2 per cent if paid on or before July 1.

1 per cent if paid on or before September 1. Voted.

19. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

## WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING

### March 10, 1936

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#### Two Hundredth and Fifth Annual Meeting

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To the Inhabitants of the Town of Durham, County of Strafford, and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall at Durham on Tuesday the tenth day of March, A.D. 1936, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman for a term of three years, a Town treasurer, a Collector of Taxes, two Auditors, and all other Town Officers for the ensuing year.
2. To select one Trustee of Trust Funds for a term of three years.
3. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary to obtain State Aid on the following:  
Fifth Class Road Maintenance: (See budget).
4. To raise and appropriate funds for the repair of Town Highways and Bridges. (See budget).
5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for current Maintenance expenses, including State and County taxes as required. (See budget).
6. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.
7. To see if the Town will adopt the policy that all roads, to be accepted in the future as public roads, shall have a minimum width of forty-five feet.
8. To see if the Town will vote to accept a section of road leading off Madbury Road at a point between the property of L. W. Hitchcock and that of E. P. Robinson and extending past the property formerly owned by E. J. Rasmussen, thence turning left at a right angle and continuing past the property of C. L. Martin.

9. To see if the Town will vote to accept the continuation of Strafford Avenue as far as the residence of Clark L. Stevens. This road to be approximately 135 feet in length.

10. To see if the Town will vote to have street lights installed on the State Road between Durham and Newmarket, the number and location of such lights to be decided by the light company and the Board of Selectmen.

Petitioned by John S. Reardon and nine other legal voters.

11. To see if the Town will vote to close a section of Road known as Bunker's Lane between the Madbury line and the property line of William A. Maillard.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the issuance and distribution of printed matter calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the town, in cooperation with other towns in the Seacoast Regional Development Association, the sum of \$146.83.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to continue the work of White Pine Blister Rust control.

14. To see if the Town will vote to set aside from our present surplus the sum of \$1,500.00 to enable the Board of Selectmen to accept W.P.A. assistance in widening and surfacing the Durham Point road.

15. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Board of Selectmen to use the bond issue of ten thousand dollars voted for sewer construction in connection with W.P.A. assistance, for town construction of sewers, in case satisfactory arrangements cannot be made with W.P.A. authorities in regard to the work.

16. To see if the Town will vote to furnish surety bonds for Town Officers as required by law.

17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow necessary money in anticipation of taxes.

18. To see if the Town will vote to allow discounts for prompt payment of taxes as follows:

1 per cent if paid on or before August 1.

19. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

## HAMILTON SMITH LIBRARY

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February 1, 1936.

To the Town of Durham:

A total of 3,278 volumes were added to the library book collection during the past year. This includes 120 volumes purchased from Durham Library Association funds, and 111 from funds appropriated for the Durham Public Library by the town. Total circulation of books for use outside the building was 44,008, including 3,047 from the children's room. Total accessioned volumes in the library collection on January 31st was 83,743.

I am convinced that greater use could profitably be made of the library by residents of the town. Book borrowing is at present confined almost wholly to those living within the village. All residents of the town should realize their equal rights to library service and take advantage of an opportunity which is not equaled by any other town in the state of this size. Distances from the village to outlying sections of the town are not great, and in this age of easy and swift transportation, when practically every family owns or has access to the use of an automobile, there should be no difficulty in getting to and from the library. Your attention is specifically called to the Library's publication *The Library Lantern*, published monthly during the college year, which lists and reviews new books of general interest. If you are not now receiving this publication, ask to have your name placed on the mailing list.

The library has cooperated with the Durham schools during the year by placing deposit collections of books for young people in the village school.

## WARRANT FOR THE DURHAM SCHOOL DISTRICT

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Town of Durham

State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the School District of Durham qualified to vote in District Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said District on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, A.D. 1936, at one o'clock in the afternoon, to act on the following business:

1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
4. To choose a member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
5. To see if the School District will vote to continue to use a check-list at future meetings.
6. To see if the School District will vote to make any alterations in the report of the School Board recommending the amount required for the support of schools and statutory obligations, and to vote necessary money to carry out its provisions.
7. To see if the School District will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) as the District's share in completing the New School auditorium.
8. To see if the School District will vote to authorize the School Board to accept in the name of and in behalf of the School District of Durham and all offers made by the United States of America, through the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works, and to execute and deliver any and all contracts or agreements necessary, proper or advisable for the purpose of obtaining a grant from the Uni-

ted States of America to offset the said Five Thousand Dollars and to make possible the completion of the new School Auditorium.

9. To see if the School District will vote to authorize the School Board to give such note or notes as may necessary to defer the total payment of said Five Thousand Dollars for such a term of years as may seem just and equitable.

10. To see if the School District will vote to authorize application, upon the approval of the State Tax Commission, to the Governor and Council for authority to exceed existing debt limitations for the purpose of taking advantage of such grants or aid as may be offered the School District by the United States Government.

11. To see if the School District will vote to authorize the School Board to borrow an amount of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) or such part thereof as may be necessary to defray the expenses of the pending Superior Court service.

12. To choose such auditors, agents and committees as the voters may deem necessary for the management of District Affairs.

13. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

# ANNUAL REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS IN DURHAM, SCHOOL YEAR 1934-1935

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To the School Board and Citizens of Durham :

I have the honor to present my seventh annual report. The statistics are for the year ending June 30, 1935, as reported to the State Department of Education. The number of visits of the superintendent was reduced because of the addition of the Milton School District to this Supervisory Union.

It was our intention, when plans were made for the school year, 1935-36, to divide the room containing grades five and six. When a new school was contemplated this plan was abandoned to save expense. Miss Dorna Mitchell was employed to teach both grades and to be assisted by Mrs. Dorothy Wilcox. This has been an improvement over past arrangements.

On the resignation of Mr. Crockett, Mr. Guy Clark was secured as principal. Mr. Clark is a graduate of the Junior High School Curriculum and is eminently qualified both by education and experience to make a successful principal.

Mr. George Wilson of Newmarket is serving very efficiently as Music Supervisor and Miss Alma Roy, who two years ago served us as Art Supervisor, is again acting in that capacity. Both supervisors make fortnightly visits to Packer's Falls.

This year no federal funds are available for free milk distribution. Quite a number of parents are purchasing milk which is furnished either as whole milk or chocolate, made from standard grade milk and both kinds are treated with the violet ray to restore vitamin B after the milk has been pastuerized. The price is three cents for a half-pint bottle.

The Good Citizenship Medal, provided by the New

Hampshire Sons of the American Revolution, was awarded last June to Harold Moran.

During the summer vacation the Packer's Falls school was painted inside and out and new window shades provided.

A good school may be had with a log, a good teacher, and a good pupil, but it would probably be uncomfortable for all concerned. Next September we hope to move a good school with good teachers and good pupils into a new and properly equipped school building and to conduct a better school therein. To do this no radical reorganization will be necessary. We only ask for continued support and cooperation from all, as we have had in the past.
