To the Inhabitants of the Town of Groton in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Groton on Tuesday, the fourth day of March, 1975 next, at 3:00 of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the Town will vote to give a two (2) percent discount for payment of taxes paid within fifteen (15) days after Tax Collector's mailing date.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to dispose of or administer any real estate acquired by the Tax Collector's deeds.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) to be placed in the Capital Reserve Fund for a new truck.

6.To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of Taxes.

7. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to apply for, contract for and accept aid relative to State and Federal disaster money.

8. To see if the Town will raise the sum of two hundred ninety-one dollars and twenty-eight cents (\$291.28) and the State to contribute one thousand nine hundred forty dollars and thirty-five cents (\$1,940.35) for Class IV and V constructions.

9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from the Revenue Sharing Fund all monies available for the purpose of reducing taxation. 10. To see if the Town will vote to continue plowing driveways at the fee of twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars per driveway.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise two thousand, five hundred (\$2,500.00) dollars for sealing the following roads:

- a. North Groton Road
- b. Sculptured Rocks Road
- c. River Road

12. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Planning Board of five (or seven) members with duties set forth in Chapter 36, N.H. Revised Statutes Annotated, to make a study of the Town's development and report to the Town appropriate recommendations for the promotions and maintenance of the Town's best development. The Board shall consist of one Selectman and four (or six) other citizens appointed by the Selectmen, as provided in Chapter 36, N.H. Revised Statutes Annotated.

13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Town Planning Board to approve or disapprove in its descretion and subdivisions and plate thereof as provided N.H. RSA Chapter 36: Section 19-29 inclusive and Section 34.

a. To see if the Town will vote to grant site plan review authority to the Planning Board in accordance with RSA 36:19s. This will provide the Town with an opportunity to review and approve or disapprove plans for non-residential development.

14. To see if the Town will authorize the Board of Selectmen to appoint a Building Inspector and fix his compensation, pursuant to N.H. RSA 156:1-5.

15. To see if the Town agrees to participate in the National Flood Insurance Program by directing the Board of Selectmen to complete the eligibility application and submit the required information to the Federal Insurance Administration.

16. (by petition) To see if the Town will vote to rescind Article 20 of last year for a 100% revaluation of the Town by the State Tax Commission or any other qualified person or persons. The sum of seven thousand five hundred (\$7,500.00) dollars that was raised last year for this article will be brought over for the 1975 taxes.

17. (by petition) To see if the Town will vote to have the Town Clerk and the Tax Collector hold office hours at the Selectmen's Office a minimum of two (2) hours a week. The time to be agreed upon by the Selectmen, Town Clerk and Tax Collector.

18. To see if the Town will raise eight thousand (\$8,000.00) dollars for the purpose of building a Town Garage on the Hutchin's property.

19. To see if the Town will vote to sell the Groton School House or make necessary repairs.

20. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of:

a. one thousand (\$1,000.00) dollars for extensive repairs on the Town House.

b. two hundred (\$200.00) dollars for new lighting for the library.

21. To see if the Town will vote to establish a permit system pertaining to all new buildings and trailers. The purpose of this permit being to allow the Board of Selectmen to know what is being built or moved into Town. Said permit to be issued by the Board of Selectmen for a fee of one (\$1.00) dollar. If this article is adopted, a copy is to be mailed with each inventory mailed March, 1975.

22. To see if the Town will vote to ordaine that no more Mobile Homes be moved into the Town of Groton, except to replace existing mobile homes at their exact same location. This article to be effective June, 1975.

23. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of a Tax Maps and raise the sum of two thousand (\$2,000.00) dollars a year.

24. To see if the Town will decide whether the sum of fourteen dollars and forty cents (\$14.40) shall be set aside for the Lakes Region Bicentennial Arts Committee for its use in coordinating the 1976 Bicentennial plans of the Lakes Region (12 cents per person)

25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred fifty-five (\$155.00) dollars to defray one-half of the Town's share (on a per capita basis) of the estimated cost of the celebration of the Bicentennial Era.

26. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

RSA 76:11 provides for delivery of the list (warrant) to the collector within thirty days of receipt of approval of the tax rate unless for good cause the time is extended by the department. The collector shall within thirty days after receipt of the warrant from the selectmen (assessors) send out the tax bills unless for good cause the time is extended by this department.

RSA 76:11-a Information Required. The tax bill which is sent to every person taxed, or his agent, if known, is provided in section 11, shall show the rate of municipal, school and county taxes separately. The 1974 rate breakdown reflects a proportionate share of the Reimbursement a/c Property Exempted by 1970 Special Session for each unit of government.

RSA 76:13 provides that if tax bills are mailed on or before November 1 interest is not charged if payment is made on or before December 1. However, if tax bills are mailed between November 2 and 15 inclusive, interest is not charged if payment is made on or before December 15. In the event that tax bills are not sent until after November 15 interest shall not be charged on taxes paid on or before December 30.

The tax bill which you mail must contain the date from which interest will be charged and this date is determined by the date you send the last bill on the list committed to you. It is also required by statute that you notify this department in writing of the date on which you send the last bill. There is enclosed a form for this purpose.

LIBRARY REPORT

Early in March, 1974, clean-up work began on the library which had been closed since the flooding early in the summer of 1973. The library was a dismal sight with piles of moldy, mildewed books stacked on every table, caked mud on the floors, cobwebs and spiders everywhere, and an overwhelming musty odor. We decided to start from the ceiling down, and with the help of many of Groton's teenagers the library received several coats of fresh paint. The next step was to remove the books which had been badly water-damaged, and for which the state was reimbursing us over \$1,000.00. Upon the advice of our state library consultant, some out-dated and badly worn volumes were also eliminated to make room for new materials. The furniture was painted, the floor sanded and sealed, and then the very time-consuming job of book ordering and processing was begun. On August 29, six months after beginning the clean-up operation, the library re-opened with a well-attended open house. Library hours have been held regularly since September, and twenty-five cards have been issued.

My thanks go to the following persons who contributed much time and labor in our community effort to reopen the library: Verna Matthews, who helped throughout the entire clean-up operation, and provided the spark which started the project; Lee Adams, Diane Albert, Paul Buck, Carol Colby, Robert Colby, Hazel Harman, Frank Hobart, Michael Hobart, Richard Humphrey, Richard Kaiser, Dana Newberry, and Terry Newberry.

Looking to the future, there are a few things that could be improved. The library shoud have additional wall plugs and lights, as the present lighting is very inadequate. The heater is also very weak, and barely takes the frost off on some of these cold winter days. As it is only on during library hours, the dampness has begun to warp some of our new books.

When the last of our 1974 book orders have arrived, and are processed and placed on the shelves, another open house will be held. There will be notices in the paper, and I certainly hope you'll be there!

PEMI-BAKER HOME HEALTH AGENCY, INC.

ANNUAL REPORT TO THE TOWN OF PLYMOUTH

The Pemi-BAker Home Health Agency, Inc. is a non-profit organization, (Inc. 7/17/67), supported in part by an annual appropriation in the budget of each member town. The Board of Directors is made up of an appointed member from each town; ministerial representative; nurses and a physician. Its purpose is to provide part-time nursing service in the home, under the supervision of a licensed physician. A Medical Advisory Committee determines and approves medical policies for nursing care and interprets the Agency's services to the public.

There is a standard fee covering each visit. Patients are expected to pay this fee if they are able to. However, under certain conditions fees can be adjusted to reflect the financial ability of the patient, by the Agency Nurse.

The scope of care by the Agency ranges from new-borns to the elderly. The Agency is equipped to handle Medicare; Blue Cross/Blue Shield '65'; Medicaid and private patients.

The Nurses work on a salary basis and all fees are turned over to the Agency. They are on duty Monday-Friday from eight to four. There are two full-time RN's; one part-time RN; and two Homemaker/Home Health Aides.

The office is staffed by a part-time secretary/bookkeeper. She is available Monday-Friday to answer any calls. The telephone number is 536-2232. For your convenience, when there is no one in the office, the Agency has installed a Codaphone to receive any messages.

Anyone living in one of the eleven member towns may ask for a visit from the Nurse. However, treatment and continuing care can be provided for a patient only under doctor's orders.

Under the supervision of the Agency Nurse, a Homemaker/Home Health Aide service is now available through this Agency. This service is a community-wide program designed to place a trained, responsible worker in the home where illness, disability or other problems may threaten normal family living. Please feel free to ask about this additional service. It has been the Agency's pleasure to serve your community.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

REPORT TO TOWNS

All open burning when the ground is not covered with snow is controlled by the Town Forest Fire Warden in cooperation with the New Hampshire Forest Fire Service. Anyone wishing to kindle a fire out-of-doors when the ground is not covered with snow must have a written permit signed by the Town Forest Fire Warden. If the fire is to be kindled on land not owned by the person kindling the fire then he must have the permission of the landowner. No outdoor fires can be kindled between 9 A.M. and 5 P.M. unless it is raining, without the additional approval of the District Forest Fire Chief.

The 1974 forest fire season was one of the worst in the past two decades. Woodlands in central and southern New Hampshire became so dry in mid August that the Governor and Council, upon the recommendation of the State Forester, enacted a partial woodlands closure in Sullivan, Cheshire, Hillsborough, Merrimack and Belknap Counties and a complete woodsland closure in Strafford and Rockingham Counties plus the Towns of Barnstead, Gilmanton and Alton in Belknap County. Through the excellent cooperation of the citizens of our State no major forest fire occurred at any time during the year.
