TOWN WARRANT  
THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Langdon, County of Sullivan, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Langdon on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, at twelve of the clock noon, to act on the following subjects. Polls will be open from twelve of the clock noon until six P.M. Regular business meeting will be held at seven P.M.

Article 1. To choose all necessary officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum not to exceed \$60,000 for the purchase of a new fire engine with a one thousand gallon per minute mid ship pump, and a one thousand gallon tank. Money to be raised by withdrawing \$10,000 from the Fire Department Capital Reserve Fund, \$3,000 from the interest received from the Capital Reserve Fund, \$2,000 excess money from Tinker Bridge account, \$2,000 from the land account previously established by the Town, \$10,000 from Revenue Sharing Funds, \$6,000 to be raised from current year's taxes, and \$27,000 from a note for 5 years with annual payment of \$5,400 plus interest. (2/3 vote required for passage)

Article 3. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the purpose of a new fire truck.

Article 4. To see if the Town will appropriate and authorize Selectmen to use the income, estimated to be \$34,774.00 from:

a. Motor Vehicle Fees - State	\$ 1,300.00
b. Interest and Dividends Tax	2,455.00
c. Savings Bank Tax	1,009.00
d. Reimbursement Business Profits Tax	7,500.00

- Article 6. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 for the Capital Reserve Fund Previously established for the purchase of highway equipment.
- Article 7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$549.46 and apply for Class V assistance, TRA so called. The state of New Hampshire to furnish \$3,663.07.
- Article 8. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,221.00 for the Fall Mountain Visiting Nurse Association.  
(Article #8 inserted by request)
- Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$2,000 for Capital expense of the Fire Department.
- Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$1,500 for Capital expenses and replacement of disposable items for emergency medical equipment.
- Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$3,500 for the purpose of insulating and other conservation measures for the fire station building.
- Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 to the Friends of the Shedd-Porter Library for the purchase of books.

- Article 13. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed \$600 for the purchase of a set of New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated for the Town Clerk's Office.  
(Article #13 inserted by request)



Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, for use as set-offs against appropriations on the amounts indicated or take any other action hereon:

Article 17. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell property acquired by Tax Collector's deed.

Article 19. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Article 20. To allow accounts.

## REPORT OF TOWN CIVIL DEFENSE

The year 1982 was a very productive year for this department. It started off in January with me taking the Civil Defense Directors course. It was a 60 hour course of instruction teaching me how to put your local Civil Defense Office into a working department for the town.

In March, as we all know, the Fire Department had to take the Tanker OUT of Service. It had become a HAZARD to all who drove the truck. Upon the request of the Town Fire Chief and the Selectmen, I started to call the State and Federal Civil Defense Agencies. In an effort to find a suitable truck for the Fire Department of this town; not an easy task. After three days of telephone calling, I was able to come up with four possible trucks that could, on a TEMPORARY basis, fill the NEEDS for the TOWN'S WATER SUPPLY. With the Chairman of the Board of Selectmen, Mr. Bruce Cheeney, the Fire Chief, Chief Holbrook, and myself, we started to go around and check out all the possible equipment. NONE of these would fill the needs of the Town FIRE Department. I started to call around again and found that the State of Vermont had one 2½ ton, six wheel drive Army Surplus truck they were going to turn back in. With help from the NH State Civil Defense Office in Concord we were able to receive an OK to get the truck. I would like at this time to remind you that this is ONLY a TEMPORARY SOLUTION. We have this truck for FOUR years. After that I don't know if we can continue to keep it because of its age.

Also in March, with the help of all the Town department heads, we were able to put together the Town Disaster Plan. This plan is a guide to the Town officials in the event of a natural or man made disaster within the Town of Langdon. In April, 12 members of this town took the RADIOLOGICAL MONITORING course at the Town Hall. Upon completion of this course, we set up 12 teams. Each team then took charge of his/her Radiological Monitoring kit. These kits are at the homes of the team members.

Also in April, I was able to attend the Radiological Defense Officer Course in Northampton, MA for a week.

During the past year I was able to receive for the Town Fire Department some items of equipment from other town Fire Departments.

In May, this Department was able to assist the Rescue part of your Fire Department by contacting the Region EMS Office in Hanover, NH. We set up a meeting and helped finalize the Funding from EMS for some much needed rescue equipment. Also in May, upon the request of the Town, I was able to find and make arrangement with Cota and Cota Fuel Company for a tank to hold 8700 gallons of water for fighting fires within the center of Town.

I would like to, at this time, thank all the many people of the Town of Langdon that made my Department a productive part of your town.

## REPORT OF THE FIRE CHIEF - 1982

The Langdon Fire Department responded to emergencies a total of 34 times in 1982, detailed as follows:

Structure Fires - 8	Smoke Investigation - 1
Brush Fires - 2	False Alarm - 1
Chimney Fires - 5	Car Accidents - 4
Gas Wash - 1	Medical Emergencies - 11
Tractor Fire - 1	

As the above indicates, this has been a busy year for the Fire Dept. and even busier with non-emergency work. I am pleased to report that we had 13 men attend Meadowood Training Area this year, taking such courses as Protective Breathing Apparatus & Structure Firefighting. A safety course was attended by 4 men also in the Fall. I would like to thank the townspeople for paying for these courses (usually \$15 per day) and I think we should all be grateful that there are men willing to go to these classes at their own transportation, meals and time expense.

We have continued to repair the vehicles as necessary and have worked to make the Civil Defense tanker more useful. This past winter 14 men trained, were tested and passed the driving test to get their heavy commercial license with this truck(although we had to interrupt the test for repairs when it'lost it's brakes again).

We have two of our Scott Air Packs repaired and updated, and this next year we will have the last two done, which will comply with federal requirements.

You may have noticed a large tank behind the fire station. This is a 8,000 gallon tank donated by Cota & Cota, Inc. to the town for use as fire protection. With the use of pipes donated by Cushing Well Service, we intend to use this for an underground water supply. The tank will be completely buried with only these pipes above ground to which fire trucks will be able to hook up to. This will provide the town with water. We won't have to worry about drying up in summer or freezing in winter. We are very grateful and thank these two companies for helping us with these materials.

I would like to take this space to publicly thank all the men who have been active in the Fire Dept. this year. I'm afraid people don't realize what a commitment the men have made. We have a meeting, drill or work detail every Thursday night that seldom lasts less than 3 hours. Every Sunday morning we have an equipment and radio check with Mutual Aid. These, plus fund raising projects, working on equipment and going to school add up to many hours and some expense, from which the firemen receive only the self-satisfaction and pride of belonging and helping in return.

We are always looking for more help both in the Fire Dept. and the Medical Squad, and if you can make a try at this kind of commitment, please join us on a Thursday night. All ages of men and women are welcome.

This year we have also updated the town's fire maps which list all houses by number and name. All firemen now have these maps as well as Keene Mutual Aid and the surrounding towns which would be responding on Mutual Aid to help us.

We also have two new overhead doors on the station which will help us with our heat bill in the future.

The department now has smoke detectors available for \$12. If you do not have any detectore, please try to obtain one. It is a fact, "SMOKE DETECTORS SAVE LIVES".

The Medical Squad has been busy this year updating equipment, having training drills, and going to school to obtain more training and keep up with the requirements. There is currently a "CPR" course being held for firemen and the public, that 10 people are attending. We also have 3 people taking an "EMT" course in Claremont. This course is well over 100 hours, so you can see the commitment these people have taken.

As you probably have already read, we are trying again for a fire truck. We must realize our obligation to ourselves for protection and the firemen for their safety, and have equipment which will be more effective and safer to operate. The amount of money we have to raise is small in comparison to what we have set aside in the past for this purpose. The truck has been scaled down considerably but not to a point of affecting it's safety and effectiveness. I hope you will be able to support this request.

In closing, I thank the townspeople who have been good enough to support us and the men who have cared enough so that the town has a Fire Department.

FALL MOUNTAIN VISITING NURSE ASSOCIATION, INC.  
Annual Report to the Town of Langdon for 1982  
Request for Tax Appropriation Funds for 1983

In 1982 Fall Mountain Visiting Nurse Association provided 5,384 services for 926 different people in the five-town area that included Langdon. This means that 11.9% of the total population received services. Twenty-one Langdon residents received a total of 91 clinic services and home visits for skilled nursing and physical therapy.

Of the VNA's total budget less than one fourth was covered by tax appropriation dollars. Medicare, Medicaid and other insurance reimbursements paid for approximately 36%. A special grant from the N. H. Bureau of Maternal and Child Health accounted for 29%. The balance was made up by payments directly from patients and from special contributions.

Tax dollars are needed specifically to underwrite adult clinic costs and to help pay for nursing, health aide and physical therapy services needed by patients who lack funds and who are ineligible for third party reimbursement. Medicaid, for example, will pay costs for a patient for no more than thirty visits in a calendar year. This means that patients most in need of care quickly become ineligible for service. An example: Someone whose physician has ordered RN and Physical Therapist visits weekly and Home Health Aide visits twice a week will no longer have services reimbursed by Medicaid after two months. If the local community does not provide for further care that person must be institutionalized at public expense. Medicare also fails to reimburse for many of the most needy. One example: It does not pay for home services for the terminally ill.

Home health services are less expensive than nursing home or hospital care. They are the most desirable alternative for the patient who can be cared for adequately in his home. Local support is necessary if home care is to remain available to the most needy.

Fall Mountain VNA requests \$2,221 from the Town of Langdon for 1983. This amount represents a 5% increase over the 1982 appropriation, a necessary increase to accommodate the greater number of unemployed and to help meet other increasing costs. \$1,955 is for support of the basic VNA program. \$266 is for Langdon's share of the rent of the Child Health offices.
