Warrant for Annual Town Meeting.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

L. S. To the inhabitants of the town of Lebanon; qualified to vote in town affairs:—

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on the second Tuesday of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1st. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 2d. To choose three Selectmen, Overseer of the Poor, Collector of Taxes, Highway Agent, and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
- 3d. To hear the report of the Auditors and the Town School Board.
- 4th. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.
- 5th. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repairs of Highways and Bridges for the ensuing year.
- 6th. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repairs and construction of Sewers and Sidewalks for the ensuing year.
- 7th. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money not exceeding three hundred dollars for the improvement of the Cemeteries of the town, or act thereon.
- 8th. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the proper observance of Memorial Day, or act thereon.
- 9th. To see if the town will vote to purchase a piece of land of F. B. Kendrick, in addition to Glenwood Cemetery, raise money therefor, or act thereon.
- 10th. To see what action the town will take in regard to the enlargement of the Cemetery at West Lebanon, raise money therefor, or act thereon.

11th. To see if the town will vote to accept the appropriation of three thousand dollars, made by the County of Grafton, for the purpose of fitting up a Court room in the Town Hall, and also to appropriate a sum of money in addition to said 3,000 dollars, to be expended in altering, repairing and improving the Town Hall building, or act thereon.

12th. To see if the town will vote to accept of the provisions of the will of Mrs. Ellen S. Rockwell, in relation to the care of the burial lot of Charles and Ellen Gibbs, or act thereon.

13th. To see if the town will vote to make a new appraisal of the real estate in town, or act thereon.

14th. To determine the division of the School money for the ensuing year.

In a Convention of the Grafton County members of the Legislature, held Feb. 22, 1899, the following resolution, offered by D. C. Remich of Littleton, was unanimously adopted :

Resolved, That for the purpose of providing better accommodations for the Supreme Court held in Lebanon, for the southern judicial district of the county of Grafton, said county hereby appropriates three thousand dollars, \$3000, to be paid to the town of Lebanon, by the treasurer of said county upon the order of the county commissioners, provided said town of Lebanon shall finish off and properly furnish suitable rooms in the Town Hall building, so called, in said Lebanon, and furnish them to said county for court purposes, so long as terms of the Supreme Court are held in said Lebanon, and provided further, that said town shall properly heat and light said court rooms during the times they are used for court purposes, free of charge to said county, said rooms to be finished and furnished in a manner satisfactory to a committee consisting of the county commissioners, George T. Cruft of Bethlehem and Harry M. Turner of Wentworth. Provided further, that said town of Lebanon pass a legal vote accepting said three thousand dollars, \$3000, for the purposes and upon the conditions herein mentioned.

Report of the Board of Health.

The health of the town during the year 1898 was very remarkable. The whole number of deaths was 55, almost equally divided between the sexes—males 28, females 27. Estimating the population of the town at 4500, this would be about twelve in a thousand, a very low rate of mortality. Each year it seems as if all the old people had died, but the next year shows that there were a goodly number left. In '98 the number between 70 and 80 was 7; between 80 and 90 5; over 90 1.

A few cases of scarlet fever were reported, none fatal, nor was there more than one in a place; yet in some of these cases there were other children in the family. If the patients are kept well anointed during the "peeling" process, the experience of the Board teaches, that there is little danger that the disease will be communicated to others.

There were no cases of Diphtheria. While Typhoid Fever was prevalent through the country, our community was remarkably free from it. Some ten cases were reported, two were fatal; in one of these there was a complication with other diseases. Four of these cases were close together, causing suspicion of a common cause. It was found that these families were using water from the same spring, a spring which had been reported as dangerous some years ago. The use of this water was wisely abandoned.

We add a brief summary of the principal diseases which caused death. Consumption, 4; Acute diseases of Respiratory organs 7; Brain diseases 8 of which 6 were from Apoplexy. The number of births in the town was 110, much the largest number ever reported before. The inequality between the sexes is not so conspicuous as for the year 1897; males 51; females 59.

The Selectmen are to be commended for relieving West Street and vicinity of its unsightliness and menace to health by the construction of a sewer. This was a difficult work on account of the numerous boulders, of a large size, in the route the sewer must take. In addition, lines were constructed on Elm and Shaw Streets. The whole amount was 1627 feet, costing \$1639.14. This shows that much can be done to complete the system of sewers at a cost, which cannot be burdensome to tax-payers, by doing some work each year.

GLENWOOD CEMETERY.

It is gratifying to your committee to be able to record that there is unmistakably a growing interest in all of our cemeteries, this is evidenced in various ways, but especially by the increased number of visitors, and by the expressions of approval and commendation of all improvements, actual and proposed.

It was but a few years ago that this cemetery was pasture land, and extremely rough at that, and it will be recalled that what has been accomplished by our predecessors, has been done with small expense to the taxpayers, who, without exception, have made good use of the funds placed at their disposal.

We feel warranted in the assertion that the grounds have never looked better, than during the last summer. This is due in large measure to the fact that owners of lots have taken more pains than heretofore to beautify them, to our minds a most hopeful sign for the future, and we may add that this sentiment is on the increase and seems contagious, another encouraging sign that will tend to make this an attractive spot, in place of the bleak and dreary aspect that pervaded it so short a time ago. We have no doubt the town will cheerfully continue to do its part to carry on all the work that can reasonably be asked for. During the year we have blasted out a considerable quantity of rocks, and made the space available for burial purposes besides materially improving the appearance of the grounds near the main entrance. The underbrush and a portion of the trees have been cut on the southerly side to advantage and more work in this line should be done in the near future.

A place for the compost heaps and other unsightly materials is very much needed, and we have bargained with F. B. Kendrick for such a lot in the rear of the tool house, for \$15.00, also for another piece of land on the brow of the hill on the northerly side for \$10.00, the latter

lot is needed to straighten the line, it can easily be converted into lots that will be salable, and we recommend that the Selectmen be authorized to purchase the land at once.

The highway leading to the cemetery needs repairs, and we hope the town will determine whether these repairs must come out of the appropriations for cemeteries, or from the highway funds.

Some sort of shelter should be provided in the cemetery for those who are caught there in the rain, probably an open pavillion large enough to accommodate an ordinary funeral party would be the most acceptable.

Several small sections must be drained before they can be sold for burial lots.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE FOR OLD CEMETERIES.

The Village Cemetery.

During the past season several large cherry trees have been cut down, adding much to the appearance of the cemetery as well as making so many less places for breeding worms. The roads and walks have been kept in good order and more space was given to flowers than in

any previous year. A section of head stones have been straightened up, and during the past five years nearly all the head stones have been straightened in the older part of the cemetery.

The tool house and a part of the fence should be painted, the coming season.

A Revolutionary War grave marker has been placed on the grave of Rev. Isaiah Potter, and a bronze 1812 War grave marker has been placed on the grave of Robert Kimball. We wish the graves of all soldiers who served in these two wars might be properly marked.

The Cemetery at West Lebanon.

This cemetery was trimmed and cleaned up and the road was repaired. We think it was put in better order than it has been for years. The fence should be repaired and painted the coming season.

The Old Cemetery. (Near Miss Alden's.)

Some improvements have been made in this very old burial place but less has been accomplished than we could wish. While we would not advise disturbing nor pruning to a great extent the old pines which abound here, the recent growth should be trimmed and some of the trees cut away entirely, and all the bushes along and around the fences cut and burned. This charming spot, that but few of our people have ever seen, has been too long neglected. The fence should be repaired and two gates erected, the road leading to it put in order, and opened to visitors. Many of the early residents of Lebanon are buried here and quaint and interesting inscriptions may be seen on the head stones.

Once put in order as suggested, the cost of maintenance would be merely nominal. To call this the "old" cemetery is not definite, for all but one of the cemeteries in town are old, and we recommend that hereafter it be designated, The Old Pine Cemetery.

In the opinion of your committee, not more than \$25.00 will be needed to carry out our plans as above mentioned.

The cemetery at East Lebanon was cared for by Mr. Luther P. Colburn.

The fence of the cemetery near Dea. Cole's should be repaired the coming season.

PARKS.

Several public spirited and generous citizens having made cash contributions for the purpose of improving the appearance and condition of Colburn and adjacent Parks, such contributions amounting in the aggregate to \$49.25; your committee, at the request of the selectmen, assumed the superintendence of the work, and probably no branch of the public work has been carried on with more publicity, indeed it has been inspected daily, and we hardly need refer to what has been done in this department during the year. The selectmen placed at our disposal the sum of \$50.00. We have top-dressed the parks with nitrate of soda and bone meal with good results, as the color of the grass was improved and the sod permanently benefitted as we believe; all of the walks have been trimmed out and edged, and a considerable stretch outside the iron fence re-turfed. We have pruned the trees of dead and useless limbs, kept the grass under the fence cut, also all public space outside the fence, besides clipping with lawn

mowers the entire surface of all the lawns, at frequent intervals.

All the settees have been painted and several of them repaired. During the year, one of the plots has been embellished with an attractive fountain, the gift of Mr. Fred G. Carter.

It is probably unsafe to count on voluntary contributions to carry on this work in the future, but we take pleasure (sentiment in which we hope the entire town joins,) in gratefully acknowledging the co-operation and generous aid of our fellow townsmen, in our endeavors to keep one of the finest parks in our state, together with its immediate surroundings, in good order.


