

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Londonderry in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Londonderry on Tuesday the ninth day of March next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects :

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same. For the support of schools, for the maintainance of the Poor, for the repairs of Roads and Bridges, for Memorial Day, and for any articles embraced in this Warrant.
3. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees and all other Officers herein included and pass any other necessary articles.
4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the suppression of the Gypsy and Brown Tail Moths.

5. To see what sum the Town will vote to raise for High School Tuition.

6. To see what sum the Town will vote for State Roads.

7. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to buy a portable stone crusher and to raise money necessary to purchase the same.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$500.00 to repair the Town Hall and a Committee of three be appointed by the Moderator to do the same.

9. To see if the Town will vote to build a Fence around Pleasant View Cemetery.

10. To see if the Town will vote to sell lots in Pleasant View Cemetery to parties out of Town.

11. To see if the Town will vote to have a new appraisal of the real estate in town and elect officers for the same.

REPORT OF BOARD OF HEALTH.

Early in 1908 there were several cases of diphtheria, a few resulting fatally.

There was also quite an epidemic of measles, though but few cases were reported to the local Board. In this connection we wish again to call attention to the law requiring all cases of contagious or infectious diseases to be reported to the Board of Health, under penalty of a fine of ten dollars.

This law applies to heads of families, when no physician is called, as well as to physicians, and should be observed by every one interested, so that such measures of quarantine may be established as may be needed for the protection of the family and the community. We are expected to report to the State Board of Health, each week, all known cases of such diseases, and their progress and termination, which is an additional reason why we should be informed of every case. This includes smallpox, diphtheria, membranous croup, scarlet fever, typhoid fever, measles, also pulmonary consumption.

We have had to render some assistance to people in quarantine the past year.

In the case of the mad dog at Londonderry depot, by which one person was slightly bitten and several narrowly escaped; we sent the head to Hanover for examination and the diagnosis of rabbies was confirmed.

ANNUAL REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD.

The Board has followed the custom of past years in that each member has had three schools under their special supervision.

Schools have been maintained 33 weeks with the exception of number two which was closed at the end of 30 2-5 weeks on account of Scarlet fever in the district.

On the whole the Board have been very fortunate in the selection of teachers.

Miss Annie E. Babcock of Manchester, taught the spring term in No. 2, she is a teacher with superior qualifications. Miss Marjory H. McDougall of Manchester, taught the fall term (except the first week), and Miss Grace D. Abbott of Leominster, Mass., the winter term, this school has changed from an easy to a hard school and only teachers of experience should be engaged.

District No. 3, was taught by Miss Mina A. Boyd of Newton Center, Mass., and No. 4 by Miss Pearl A. Reid of this town, no better praise can be said of Miss Reid and Miss Boyd than we hope they can be secured for next year.

The member of the School Board having charge of Schools Nos. 1, 5, 9 and 10, feels well pleased with the faithful work accomplished in all these schools.

Districts Nos. 5 and 9 are to be especially congratulated in being able to retain the services of their teachers throughout the year.

School No. 1 was successfully taught during the spring term by Miss Frances Barndollar. It, however, was impossible to retain her services longer as she had further plans for perfecting her education. She has our best wishes for success in her life work as a teacher.

During the fall and winter terms, School No. 1 was most faithfully taught by Miss Esther Palmer, who is certainly a teacher of ability and great thoroughness.

While many of the parents made an effort to have their children regular in attendance, some did not, and we would like at this time to call the attention of all parents to the great need of constant and punctual attendance of pupils and earnestly ask your support and co-operation in this matter so that the coming year may be one of great progress.

School No. 5, was fortunate in retaining the services of Mr. George Robie during the year. With a few exceptions this is a primary school and Mr. Robie seems especially fitted for primary teaching and the progress made in this school was certainly very pleasing to all interested.

Schools No. 9 and 10 have been taught throughout the year by Miss Etta Dickey. Miss Dickey is a teacher of great experience and rare merit and too much cannot be said in praise of her work. Parents and pupils have united with her and thus have her unceasing labors and untiring efforts been crowned with success.

The school in No. 6 has been taught for the last year under the direction of Miss Hattie Magoon.

We believe her to be a conscientious and painstaking teacher; sympathetic relations to a good degree existed between pupils and teacher.

No. 7 has been somewhat handicapped by too frequent
