TO THE INHABITANTS OF THE TOWN OF NEW HAMPTON,  
NEW HAMPSHIRE IN THE COUNTY OF BELKNAP IN SAID  
STATE, QUALIFIED TO VOTE IN TOWN AFFAIRS:

You are hereby notified to meet at the New Hampton  
Town House on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next at ten  
of the clock in the forenoon to cast your ballots for Town  
Officers and for questions required by law to be on the  
ballots. Polls to close not earlier than 6:00 P.M.

The remainder of the warrant will be acted upon at the  
New Hampton Town House, Friday, March 11, 1977 at 7:30  
P.M.

1. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary  
to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make ap-  
propriations of the same.

2. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to  
raise and appropriate for the maintenance and repair of  
Highways and Bridges.

3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate  
the sum of \$6,300,000 for the purchase of a new Highway  
Department 4 wheel drive pick up truck; funds to be provided  
by authorizing the withdrawal of \$6,300.00 from the Capital  
Reserve Fund entitled Revenue Sharing Trust Fund.

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate  
the sum of \$4,300.00 for the purchase of a highway spreader  
for the Ford dump truck.

5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to  
raise and appropriate for the repair of the Hough loader.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate  
\$4,400.00 to be put into the Capital Reserve Fund for the  
purchase of new Highway equipment.

7. To see if the Town will vote to affirm the action taken by the Selectmen on December 2, 1976 relative to the disposition of the old Highway buildings.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$959.28 for Town Road Aid, the State to contribute the sum of \$6,395.21.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$5,000.00 for the purchase of a portable pump and two portable radios for the Fire Department; funds to be provided by authorizing the withdrawal of a sum not to exceed \$5,000.00 from the Capital Reserve Fund entitled Revenue Sharing Trust Fund.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,500.00 to be put into the Capital Reserve Fund for a new Fire Truck.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$9,000.00 for final payment on the contract for Tax Mapping, dated June 3, 1976 between John E. O'Donnell & Associates and the Town of New Hampton; funds to be provided by authorizing the withdrawal of \$9,000.00 from the Capital Reserve Fund entitled Revenue Sharing Trust Fund.

12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to accept on behalf of the Town any Federal or State funds which may be made available during 1977. Further, to see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to make application for said funds and then expend the same for the purpose designated within applicable Federal or State regulation.

13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to assist in the publication of the Town History and the cost of the 1977 Bicentennial observation.

14. To see if the Town will vote to approve and adopt a design recommendation of the Bicentennial Committee for a Town seal.



15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Home Day.

16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.

17. To see if the Town will vote to authorized the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to dispose of property acquired by Tax Collector's Deeds.

19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Tax Collector to accept pre-payment of taxes.

20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,222.47 for Regional Associations: Lakes Region Planning Commission - \$748.00; N.A.N.A. - \$2,000.00; Bristol Community Center - \$600.00; N.H. Humane Society - \$400.00; Community Action Program - \$474.47.

21. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of hospitals.

22. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for care of cemeteries.

23. (By Petition) "To see if the Town of New Hampton will vote to raise and appropriate \$5,000.00 to correct the drainage problem on the Village Main Street. The State will contribute \$10,000.00, making a total of \$15,000.00".

24. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

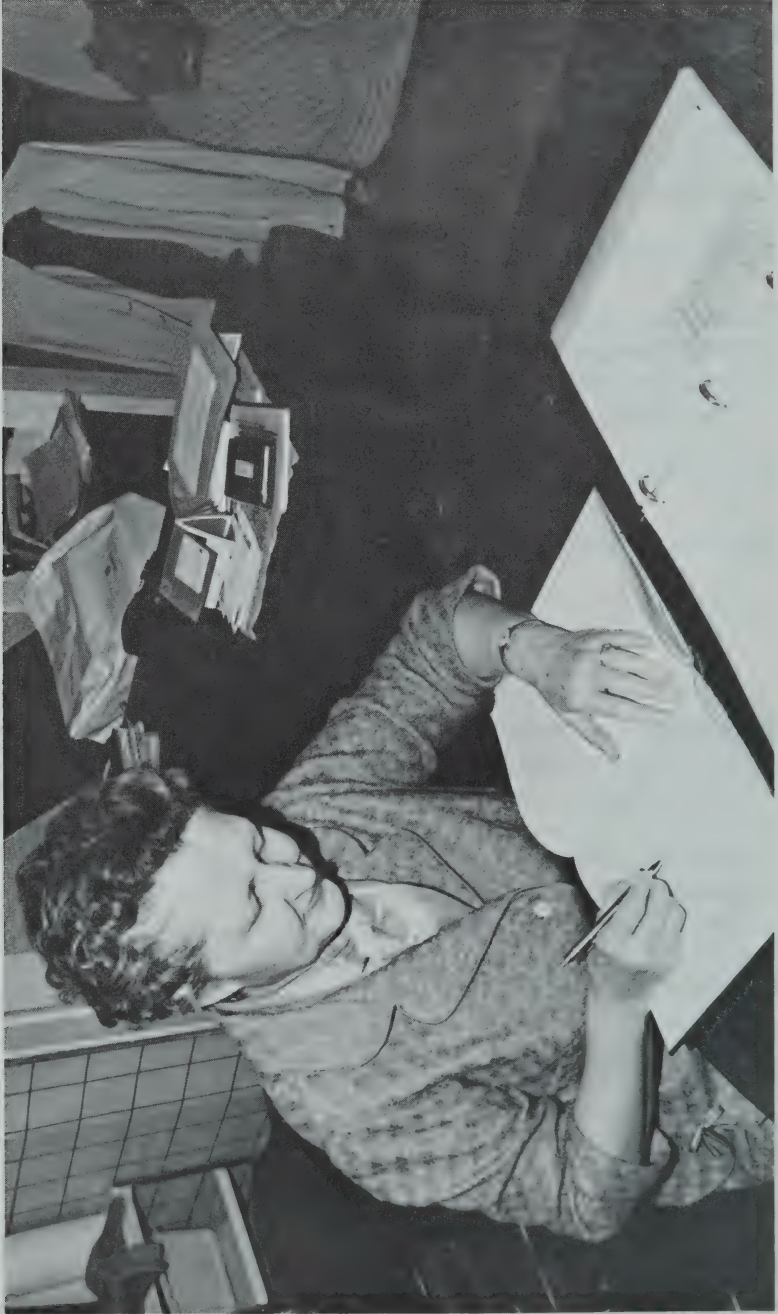

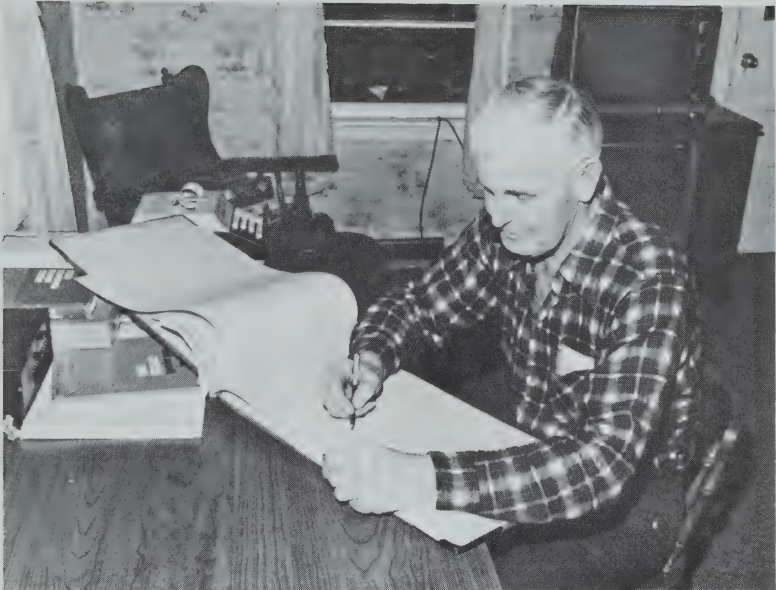

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**NEW HAMPTON POLICE DEPARTMENT****1976 Annual Report**

As the year 1976 comes to a close I am happy to report there was a decrease in the number of serious crimes committed, particularly in the number of burglaries reported. I believe this was due in part to the fact that I was able to identify and apprehend those persons responsible for a rash of crimes committed in town the year before and these persons were convicted and are serving time in jail this year. The town of New Hampton completed its second consecutive year without a highway accident fatality. We were not so lucky in the category of water safety as the Pemigewasset River claimed another life for the second year in a row. There is one area of the criminal justice system that is lacking and this is in the consideration of the victims of crime. Much can and has to be done for these victims who suffer physical and mental injuries, financial and property loses; it is time the victims' rights are considered.

The 1976 Pontiac Lemans police cruiser was put into service in June and has proven to be a very suitable vehicle for the Department's uses. As the new year begins the Department will join with other police agencies in participating in a state wide uniform crime report system. Once again I thank you for your cooperation and support.

The board will hold an open discussion of zoning regulations at the Town House on June 20th at 8 P.M. Everyone who has any interest in zoning — pro or con — is urged to attend. The purpose of this discussion is to help the Planning Board to better understand the wishes of the townspeople regarding zoning and to find out who would like to actively work toward developing zoning regulations.

## NEW HAMPTON CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Tree projects continue. Several mountain ash, a flowering crabapple and some seedling sugar maple trees were planted in the village. A linden tree (of basswood family and Concord coach fame) was planted as a living memorial to Ed Madan. The planting and presentation to Helen Madan was appropriately a part of New Hampton School's Earth Day. Contributions made this tree possible — a lovely way to remember.

Just recently a large tree fell victim to the heavy snows and a replacement will be planted this spring.

Some ornamentals have been purchased for the fire house and hopefully more than good intentions will prevail this year.

Hundreds of seedlings from the State Nursery were planted near the Town House and some others given to town residents for street planting. Not only will the roadways in future years be enhanced but the landowner will have wind protection and privacy. Anyone interested in acquiring pine, hemlock or spruce for such purposes may contact me. We are ordering a wildlife seedling packages (an assortment of animal and bird favorites) this year. Approximately 60 trees for \$10, a buy you cannot beat.

Two members visited the Plymouth Solid Waste Disposal and Recycling Project and without a doubt, that's where it is in the future.

The Soil Conservation Service has given a positive recommendation on a site for both recreation and conservation purposes and negotiations are continuing.

Pat Long, who ably served the Conservation Commission and was particularly helpful with the scenic roads project, has moved. Meredith's gain, our loss. We would appreciate hearing from anyone interested in giving some time to the commission. There are many areas of concern which we should consider.

Expenses 1976-77: Just over \$200 included New Hampshire Assoc. membership and tree projects on Main Street, plus some ornamentals for eventual planting at Fire House (currently heeled in for winter).

During the past year as in most prior years, the Con-



ervation Commission members have donated their labor, transportation, phones, postage and trucking. However, this year, in an effort to realistically plan and so that anyone will feel comfortable serving on commission, think we should provide for such in the coming years.

The first year of tree replacement approx. \$600 was spent for professional care of the Norway Spruce and the purchase and planting of ten trees. Needless to say, considerable amounts have been saved by volunteer efforts.

### 1976 Yearly Report

1976 has been a time of growth and a period of change for the Newfound Area Nursing Association. NANA has had an active year serving the people of the towns of Alexandria, Bristol, Bridgewater and New Hampton.

Due to the changing trend in health care, home health services are now more widely used. Many times patients are discharged at an earlier time with the knowledge that continued skilled nursing care can be carried on within the home setting.

The total number of nursing visits are as follows:

In June there was a change of staff personnel, including two registered nurses and a qualified physical therapist. This staff has worked together as an effective team for better nursing care.

There has been an increasing number of nursing referrals from our local physicians as well as physicians from hospitals in Franklin, Lakes Region, Hanover and Veterans Administration.

NANA is involved in discharge planning groups from Franklin Regional Hospital and Lakes Region Hospital. These groups plan ahead for nursing care of patients in the home.

Members of the staff of NANA have attended various workshops to continue education and update knowledge of trends in home health care.

Community activities in which NANA has been involved are as follows:

- Bloodmobile Drive - August
- Swine Flu Immunization - October
- Blood Pressure & Diabetes Screening Clinics - February & December.

### NEW HAMPTON BICENTENNIAL COMMITTEE

The New Hampton Bicentennial Committee consists of a representative from every organization in town; the Historical Society being the sponsoring organization. Mr. Everett Huckins is the President, Mrs. A. Lindley Lamont, Secretary, and Mrs. Bernard Merrill Treasurer of the Committee.

Meetings were held in August and September of 1975 and January, April, June and September of 1976.

The outline which was suggested by the National American Revolution Bicentennial Commission was followed as closely as possible. "Festival U.S.A." became a "Harvest Festival" with a Box Supper, Husking Bee and Square Dancing; "An American Dream" presented by the New Hampton School; a Pops Concert, "Moments in History"; "This is America", scenes, birds and flowers of U.S.A.

The category of "Horizons" introduced a Clean Up Week from April 26 to May 1. The Scouts and 4-H Hustlers participated and trucks were provided for pick-up.

Under "Heritage", a miniature replica of mills along the stream in the early days of New Hampton was on exhibit at the New Hampton Community School; a Special Memorial Day Service at the New Hampton Community Church and the Village Cemetery; Old Home Day and Old Home Day Sunday at the Dana Meeting House.

The designation of New Hampton as a Bicentennial Community was observed on February 22 at the Town House, when we had the honor of having Dr. J. Duane Squires, chairman of the New Hampton A.R.B.C. present to us the Bicentennial Flag.

Several years ago Frederick Robbins submitted six sketches to the town, indicating that perhaps one could be used for a Town Seal. A Committee was given the authority to choose the one most fitting. Their choice was one of the New Hampton Community Church.

The "Lasting Reminder" is, of course, the Town History, which has been re-written and edited from material collected by Mrs. Bernard Merrill and Dr. John Gowan in the 1930's and 1940's. This is now ready for publishing in 1977.

In retrospect I am sure that we are all proud of New Hampton and feel that the National Bicentennial helped to unite us as a nation. In that same spirit of unity we can look forward to our own Bicentennial in 1977.

## RECREATION COMMITTEE

The New Hampton Recreation Department had a successful summer program under the direction of Barbara Allard. Forty-nine children were enrolled for the six week day camp. There was an average daily attendance of twenty-six in the kindergarten through third grade group and twenty-one in the fourth grade through seventh grade group. The swim program at the Sanbornton town beach was expanded from 2 days to 3 days per week with forty-nine participants.

As you may have noted in this year's Recreation Department expenditures, there was no money paid to Barbara Allard for a salary. This savings was due to a special loan arrangement with the Bristol Community Center. Miss Allard's salary was paid through a grant from Tri-County Council. However, this salary arrangement will not be available this coming summer. Therefore, we will again need funding to cover the director's salary.

This year, in addition to a children's summer program, we expect to provide a winter sports program for townspeople—including skating and skiing. As funds will allow, we also plan to provide adult education classes in such areas as square dancing, needlework, photography and ceramics.
