#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

Polls to open at 1:30 p.m., close at 7:00 p.m.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Harrisville in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Wells Memorial School in said Harrisville on Tuesday, the Eleventh day of March, next at Seven of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow money on the credit of the Town in anticipation of taxes.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Hundred Sixty Nine Dollars (\$369.00) in support of the operating cost of the Elliot Community Hospital for the year 1969.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen and the Treasurer authorization to borrow money on the credit of the town in the event of an emergency requireing the replacement of the town owned bridge on Route 137. To further authorize the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payments of such notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) to reopen 1,000 feet of the "Old Nelson Road." This road closed subject to gates and bars by vote at Town Meeting March 1960. These funds to be matched by funds donated by Mr. John Tillson.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to establish a historic district commission in accordance with the Enabling Legislation of the State of New Hampshire Chapter 31:89.

- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for a complete revaluation of all taxable property in the Township of Harrisville, N. H., this revaluation to be carried out by the State Tax Commission of New Hampshire.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) as its share of the funds required to restore the Vestry Building as a Town Library. These funds to be matched with State Aid Funds and those funds already received as contributions. Funds to be raised as follows: To raise \$2,000.00 in 1969 by taxes. The balance of \$8,000.00 to be raised by the issuance of four equal notes of \$2,000.00 each, the first note coming due in 1970 and one note coming due each year for a period of three years thereafter. To further authorize the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payments of such notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such notes as shall be to the best interest of the Town of Harrisville.
- 9. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 10. To determine and appoint the salaries of Town Officers and fix the compensation of any other agents of the Town.
- 11. To hear reports of agents, committees or officers chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 12. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

#### **TOWN MEETING MARCH 12, 1968**

The meeting was called to order at 1:30 P.M. by Moderator Ralph B. Bemis. The Warrants were read and the Polls opened under Article 1 to choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing by Australian Ballot also for voting in the Pre-presidential Primary.

Ballot Clerks: John F. Priest, Jennie Main, Arthur

Wikman and Rita Rathburn.

Business meeting called to order at 6:30 P.M. with prayer by the Rev. Mary B. Upton.

Continuing under Article 1, Ralph B. Bemis was re-

elected Trustee of Trust Funds for 3 years.

Fire Wards: Ralph Clark, Alton Chamberlain, Gordon Getty, David Schmitt, Justin Chamberlain, William Bemis.

Surveyors of Wood and Lumber: John Priest, William

House.

Fence Viewers: John Priest, Ralph Bemis.

Harrisville Beach Committee: Mary Gilman, Jacqueline Getty, Warren Thayer, Sandra Harlow.

Chesham Beach Committee: Robert Lake, Roy Wil-

iams.

Library Trustee: Elaine House was reelected for 3 years.

Article 2: To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

A motion to accept the Budget as printed on pages

12 and 13 of the Town Report passed.

Article 3: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow money on the credit of the Town in anticipation of taxes.

A motion to accept as printed passed.

Article 4: To see if the Town will vote to accept One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) received from the Edna Heald

Estate for care of cemetery lot.

A motion to accept as printed was made and an amendment was offered to accept (\$100.00) from Richard and Mary Upton for the same purpose. The amendment passed and the motion as amended also passed.

Article 5: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$367.00 in support of the operating cost of Elliot Community Hospital for the year 1968.

A motion to accept as printed passed.

Article 6: To see if the Town will vote to install two street lights on the Silver Road in Harrisville. Said lights to be located between the Town Beach and the residence of John Dunn and to appropriate \$75.00 for same. (By request.)

A motion to accept as printed passed.

Article 7: To see if the Town will vote to accept \$225.00 received from the Silver Lake Grange No. 105. Funds to be placed in a trust fund with the interest to be used to the best interest of the Town Library under the direction of the Library Trustees.

A motion to accept as printed passed.

Article 8: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to be placed in a trust fund for the replacement of town owned bridges under the provision of the Capital Reserve Act of 1943 Chapter 160 as amended.

A motion to accept as printed passed.

Article 9: To see if the Town will vote to adopt the

following ordinance:

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that the chief of police or if no chief the head of the Harrisville, New Hampshire police department is hereby authorized to act pursuant to the provisions of RSA 106–C, as inserted by Laws 1967, ch. 431, as now enacted and as may be amended;

AND without limiting the generality of the foregoing; A. Is hereby authorized to extend assistance in time of emergency to any county or municipality in the State in accordance with the provisions of RSA 106–C, as inserted by Laws 1967, ch. 431 and

B. Is hereby constituted the duly authorized representative of the police department for the purpose of mak-

ing claims under section 5 of said chapter.

PROVIDED NEVERTHELESS that the chief of police or other head of the police department may in his discretion donate said services to said county or municipality in accordance with the provisions of section 8 of said chapter and

C. Is hereby authorized to enter into agreements with counties and municipalities within the State concerning the methods by which emergency police assistance will

be rendered.

A motion to lay this article on the table passed.

Article 10: To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum not exceeding \$4,200.00 for the purpose of applying an asphalt surface to the Bonds Corner Road in East Harrisville under the T.R.A. Accelerated Program. Such sum to be raised through the issuance of notes under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 241 RSA, as amended, and to authorize the Selectmen to de-

termine the dates and place of payments of such notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such notes as shall be to the best interest of the Town of Harrisville.

A motion to accept as printed passed.

Article 11: To see if the Town will vote to accept the gift of \$1,000.00 donated by Ewen McVeagh to be used towards the expense of restoration of the town owned Vestry Building as a Town Library.

A motion to accept as printed passed.

Article 12: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to be used towards the expense of restoration of the Vestry Building as a Town Library, and to appoint a committee to administer this project. The aforementioned committee to be authorized to expend any funds made available at this meeting and any other gifts received during the ensuing year.

A motion to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 under this article was made and an amendment to accept \$500.00. A gift from the Lions Club was offered.

The amendment passed and the original motion as amended also passed. The following Committee was proposed and accepted Elaine House, Marjorie Colony, Louise Bergeron and Warren Thayer.

Article 13: To determine and appoint the salaries of Town Officers and fix the compensation of any other

agent of the Town.

A motion to raise the Fire Chiefs salary to \$200.00 was made. An amendment was offered to raise the same to \$250.00. The amendment passed and the motion as amended also passed.

Article 14: To hear reports of agents, committees or

officers chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

The Moderator called attention to the various reports of the agents, committees and officers chosen as printed in the Town Report and a motion to accept as printed passed.

Article 15: To transact any other business that may

legally come before the meeting.

A motion was made to give a vote of thanks to Ewen MacVeagh and the Lions Club for their gifts to the Library Fund and the Clerk to write a note of thanks to each passed.

Warren Thayer reported on the result of the Lydia

Wilder case that we won in court.

Considerable discussion took place over the proposed new layout of the new Route 101 as it would affect Harrisville and a map of same was placed on display by Warren Thayer.

Warren Thayer also called attention to the changes

in the Veterans Exemption Law.

Recessed at 8:00 P.M. for the School Meeting to finsh. A motion to close the polls and to recess to count the ballots came at 8:15 P.M. and passed.

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Library and Trustees of Trust Funds.

### FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets: December 31, 1967 - De-

cember 31, 1968: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1967, and December 31, 1968, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein the Net Debt decreased by \$2,900.26 during 1968 from \$5,863.35 to \$2,963 09.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)
An analysis of the change in the financial condition
of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with
the factors which caused the change indicated therein.

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures — Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-3

& A-4)

Comparative Statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fical year ended December 31, 1968, are presented in Exhibits A-3 & A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a revenue surplus of \$1,452.15, less a net overdraft of appropriations of \$1,217.46, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$234.69.

A summary Statement of receipts and expenditures

for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1968, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1968, is indicated in Exhibit B-2. Statement of Long Term Indebtedness: (Exhibit G)

A statement of the outstanding long term indebtedness as of December 31, 1968, showing annual debt service

requirements, is contained in Exhibit G.

### AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as wll as with entries in the books of records. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements and submitted by depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices. Current Surplus:

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) decreased by \$2,699.74, from \$23,936.65

to \$21,236.91 in 1968, as shown herewith:

The trustees have devoted much time this year to raising funds for the restoration of the Harrisville Vestry into a new town library. We feel inspired in this work by the ever increasing demand for learning and knowledge among our young people. Because they have to take the bus home right after school, our library is the only one available to them. The town offers little in the way of public buildings so we look forward to the new library as a cultural center for the exchange of ideas. It will be more than a place to house books. It will give space for exhibits of art, a record collection and films. In the coming electronic age the library will be the source of new devices for learning — the information center of the town in a complex, changing world.

### LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

With the feeling that the citizens of Harrisville should be informed as to what is going on in the Library, I sub-

mit the following report.

The general progress in the Library in 1968 has been "on the up." First, the circulation of Adult fiction and non-fiction in 1967 was 1,347 and 2,815 in 1968. This shows that reference materials were in greater demand and Adult reading increased. The children's fiction and non-fiction also rose from 1,493 in 1967 to 2,755 in 1968. Here again the increase in patronage is the answer. It is so gratifying to see the number of little children, accompanied by a parent, who come regularly. Some of these groups take as many as twenty books at a time and is a boost to the reading habits of the future. General patronage also showed an increase, particularly with our summer friends. This we like to see as it is one outlet for getting a return for the taxes they pay. This added demand for materials was helped, in a great measure, by the \$100 State Aid money, given for Reference Books; the 1,568 books from the Bookmobile on its four visits, plus the 15 special books directly from the State Library in Concord, which were requested for particular cases. Many requests for books were made during the year and an effort to fufill these requests was always made and carried out, through the District Office in Keene, in most cases.

The "Up" in added books is as follows: 15 Reference Books from the State Aid grant; 16 new Children's books plus the whole series of 27 Beatrice Potter Books (which are very popular); and 60 new adult books which include a number of Classics needed for school assignments, all purchased with appropriated funds. To these, we may add 215 books, some current new, and others which are not new, but very usable and fill a need. They come under both fiction and non-fiction and were donated by kind friends of the library. Also, through a donation, we purchased six late fiction. Our sincere thanks to these most thoughful people. With "fine money," six more current fiction were purchased at sale prices as it is necessary to keep up on current fiction for our patrons. Our last purchases with fine money were made for — Historic Homes of Cheshire County and Colour of Canada, both books that stay. Also, we have acquired the History of Nelson and Upper Ashuelot (Keene History) with town funds and Picasso and American Heritage Books, for the year from friends.

The magazine circulation for 1968 was 368, which

involved a supply which could be used for school assignments and adult use. Many people have been kind enough to help by giving their magazines at the time needed. In this way, the demand could be satisfied and cost to the library lessened.

Two more hours added to the existing hours and Friday seemed the best day which would enable students to obtain material for weekend assignments. This brings the total number of hours to six, which is the average

with towns of comparable population.

During the past year, the State Library Commission offered, at its own expense, two courses for Librarians -Public Library Techniques and Cataloging and Classifications. Each was a 25 hour course and I was able to attend both. As cataloging is an important part of Library work, it seems very necessary to have some knowledge in that area. Every non-fiction book has to be classified and cataloged, so the course was valuable to me. A Spring and Fall Workshop were offered in the use of Reference Materials and was beneficial to all the Librarians, as was the Workshop on Bookmending. In order for Librarians to know about new books, five book meetings are offered each year and I was able to attend three. As town delegate to the Advisory Council, which deals with all library problems within the State, I attended the four meetings for the year.

The present Library hours may be found on the Library door. They are:

Monday — 6:00 - 8:00 P.M. Wednesday — 3:00 - 5:00 P.M. Friday — 4:00 - 6:00 P.M.

### LIBRARY BUILDING COMMITTEE REPORT

At last year's town meeting a committee was appointed to restore the Vestry Building as a Town Library. The Town accepted a gift of \$1,000.00 donated by Ewen Mac-Veagh to get the project started and further appropriated \$1,000.00 to add to this fund.

Soon after the March meeting, being advised that Federal Funds were available under the Library Services and Construction Act, the committee was glad to get State Librarian, Emil W. Allen, Jr., down to look over the building. He was most encouraging and while not able to promise aid he said that it was likely that 40% of the total cost would be paid by the Federal Government if we meet the requirements which are roughly that the project must hire an architect and pay the Federal or minimum wage whichever is higher. No funds are allocated until plans are completed and town funds appropriated.

The committee engaged the services of Gordon Sherman of the firm of Monadnock Assocates of Peterborough, N. H., a resident of the town who had kindly donated his time to look into the building and advise the Trustees that it was suitable for a Library.

Mr. Sherman went over the building several times with consulting engineers but it was finally decided that the true condition of the foundation and the best possible floor system could not be determined until the inside of the building had been stripped and exposed. James Haddock of Dublin was hired to do this work at a cost of \$450.00.

It was then possible to make a thorough inspection of the existing foundations by boat! Extensive borings of the area under the building were taken.

Two separate Engineering Firms, R. R. Pestowsky, P. E. of Manchester and Arthur Rose of Golberg Assoc., also of Manchester, gave reports that came as a severe blow to the Committee. The foundation which it had been hoped was in "fair" condition was pronounced to be in a bad state of decay — apt to collapse at any time! It is estimated that the rebuilding of the foundation and a new floor frame will cost around \$8,000.00!

Even though this is almost as much as we originally envisioned as the entire cost of the job — the committee feels grateful that the project was adopted—otherwise this unique architectural landmark might have tumbled into the lake beyond repair.

Being advised by the Selectmen that the \$10,000.00 we are asking the town to raise over the next five years was the most they would recommend, the Committee launched a fund raising campaign with the gratifying results listed below with some quotes from the donor's letters.

Our first visit to a neighboring Library for ideas and advise was naturally to Marlboro and Corrine Nash where they had just completed a similar Library renovation. Mrs. Nash sternly warned us to get the project launched without delay due to the fact that building and furnishing costs rise at the rate of almost 20% per year. We were more than willing to take her advice but the Selectmen flatly refused to do more than appropriate the \$1,000.-00 last year due to the cost of the new fire engine, but promised to put an article in this year's warrant. Having received our Architect's figures of the estimated cost, we now appreciate the rightness of Mrs. Nash's advice. Everything has gone up so much, that with the \$8,000.00 for the foundation and the minimum wage rates required to qualify for Federal Aid, that the estimated total cost is now \$27,000.00.

So here is the present picture — Certainly the dual object of restoration of this valuable building and a much needed new library is appealing and worthy of the help of public spirited individuals and foundations. For this reason your committee feels certain that current efforts to raise funds will yield the balance and even hopes to reduce the town's share if our returns exceed this amount.

It is further noted that if this area of Harrisville is declared an Historic District, as we hope it will be, the future of

the Vestry is secure.

We used five hundred and eighty-three yards of gravel, also at Russell Reservoir five hundred and seven yards. During the year of 1968 the town used four thousand one hundred and thirty-four yards of gravel and seven hundred and six yards of sand, not including the TRA.

#### ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT

To The School Board and Citizens of Harrisville:

The second year of Harrisville's association with Supervisory Union 29 is well past the half-way mark. We feel that certain steps taken have improved the situation.

Our staff includes several new persons this year: Eli Mercer, principal; Dorothy FitzGerald, nurse; Larry Stone, music teacher; Tom Wentzell, teacher aide; and Mr. Packard, custodian. These people, together with Mrs. Bosworth, Mrs. Capron, and Mrs. Hewitt, have done a very good job of making the educational process more interesting and more meaningful.

The three rooms contain somewhat different grades than in the past. This regrouping was done mainly to balance the number of children assigned to any one room.

New math workbooks are in use for the first time this year in grades one and two, and new English books in grades one through four. Updating materials is a constant and costly endeavor, but one which is very necessary. The coming year's budget includes funds to continue this process.

During the Christmas holidays the boys and girls toilet rooms and the office were painted. This project will, also, be continued in the summer of 1969 when outside painting is planned.

Some unexpected problems with the heating system and the well prevented us from accomplishing as much painting as we had hoped.

The State Board of Education will be asked this summer to approve "Minimum Standards for Elementary Schools." Some of the recommendations are: a kindergarten, a full time nurse, full time guidance person, a library of 7,500 square feet, and many others.

Local property taxpayers have been bending over backwards for years in this state to support all local services with local funds, and deserve much praise and thanks for doing as well as they have. Most of the budget, probably seventy-five percent, is set for us before the school board ever reviews it. The board has no control over such items as transportation, tuition, retirement, social security, heat, lights, supervisory union expenses, and insurance. This leaves only those items such as salaries, library books, scholars supplies, and equipment — those areas which most directly affect education — for close scrutiny of those who must watch the pocketbook. This is most unfortunate, since most people are very will-


ing to recognize the need for these expenses, but feel unable to support them locally. May we urge you to plead for assistance from the State together with us. While the total budget is increasing \$13,725.00 — one item, tuition, accounts for more than \$6,300 of the total increase. Reduced revenue accounts for \$1,100 more, maintenance of plant for \$1,900, and Camp Union again next year for \$600. These four items cause an increase of \$9,900.

All of us in the Supervisory Union office genuinely feel that Harrisville is a fine place in which to work and that it does have a good school. Our thanks to the citizens, staff, and school board for their cooperation and support.




