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

**Warrant for Annual Town Meeting.**

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

L. S. To the inhabitants of the town of Lebanon,  
qualified to vote in town affairs:—

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in  
said town on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten  
o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1st. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

2d. To choose three Selectmen, Overseer of the  
Poor, Collector of Taxes, Highway Agent, and all other  
necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

3d. To see if the town will vote to have a Liquor  
Agent the ensuing year.

4th. To raise such sums of money as may be neces-  
sary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

5th. To raise such sums of money as may be neces-  
sary to repair highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

6th. To raise such sums of money as may be neces-  
sary for the repair and construction of sidewalks and  
sewers the ensuing year.

7th. To see what sum or sums of money the town  
will vote to raise for the improvement of the cemeteries  
of the town, or act thereon.

8th. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the purpose of putting additional shelves in the Public Library room, and for the general benefit of the Library.

9th. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the proper observance of Memorial Day, or act thereon.

10th. To hear the report of the Selectmen relative to the enlargement of the cemetery at West Lebanon, or act thereon.

11th. To hear the reports of the Auditors and Town School Board.

12th. To determine the division of the school money for the ensuing year.

13th. To see if the town will vote to adopt the provision of Chapter 40 of the Pamphlet laws of 1899, entitled, "An act regulating the investment of certain trust funds held by towns and cities," and instruct the Selectmen to make such rules and regulations as may be necessary by which said funds may be held, or act thereon.

## Report of the Board of Health.

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VITAL STATISTICS: No. of marriages, 62; No. of births, 105; No. of deaths, 85. Of this number, twelve were between 70 and 80; nine between 80 and 90; four were over 90, and one over 100. The number of deaths from prominent diseases were as follows: Pneumonia, 16; some form of heart disease, 13; brain diseases, 13; cancer, 10; consumption, 8; typhoid fever, 3. The small number of deaths from consumption is noticeable, that disease being held to have more victims than any other. It is not true of our own town. Cancer seems to be increasing as a disease. It is a hereditary disease, but one member of the Board believes that it may be communicated to those who have no taint in their blood, by contact with the matter produced in its progress; which suggests the necessity of great care on the part of those in attendance upon the victims of the disease, for inoculation may take place upon any abraded surfaces. Observed cases point to that conclusion.

During the fall wells and springs were very low from drought, with the result that any pollution which they might contain would be concentrated. Prevalence of typhoid fever was feared. The fear became a reality. At least 30 cases were reported; most of them were, fortunately, very light.

In the fall a large number—fourteen—cases of typhoid fever developed at Butmanville. They were confined to a small area, suggesting a common origin. Upon investigation, it was found that the families in which typhoid appeared were supplied with milk from the same source. Upon inspecting the premises the following condition was found. On one side of the house the sink water was

discharged and had formed a repulsive pool. On the other side was the water closet and the well, within ten feet of each other. One being partly over the river and the other close to the bank. Both the sink pool and the privy were up stream from the well, so that it had the benefit of both, in addition to the water of the river polluted by sewerage poured into it from the Center Village all along its course. Surely here was enough to generate disease. After a time it was discovered that there had been a case of typhoid upon the premises a short time before; one of the inmates having come home from another town with the disease. The dejections were thrown upon the ground or into the privy, carrying the germs into the well. The receptacles for milk were washed in the water from the well and so distributed the germs to those taking milk.

Five other cases were traced to use of water from a well dug a short distance from a disused privy. Two more cases were probably connected with the use of water from a well known to be contaminated. The lesson from these facts is plain. Look carefully at the sources of water used for domestic purposes, for it nourishes and conveys the germs of disease more effectually than any other agent.

It is matter for thankfulness that there was no case of those dreaded diseases, scarlet fever or diphtheria in the town during the year 1900.

## CEMETERY REPORTS.

The Committee met April 20th and organized as follows: Chairman, S. L. Farman; Secretary and Treasurer, C. E. Hildreth; Superintendent of the West Lebanon Cemetery, S. L. Farman; Superintendent of Glenwood and the other Cemeteries, A. B. Downs.

### The Village Cemetery.

The tool house and a part of the fence were painted. About the usual amount of work was done in straightening and lining up headstones. Several of the large monuments were straightened up, adding much to their appearance. A part of the fence on the south side of the cemetery should be rebuilt the coming season. The Committee would recommend the purchasing of a small piece of land of the Worthen estate for storage purposes so that the soil and dressing, used for the repair of lots, can be kept out of sight, as it makes that part of the cemetery where they are now kept very unsightly.

About sixty lots were kept lawn mowed the past year, a larger number than any previous year.

Some work was done in the other cemeteries of the town as will be seen from the Treasurer's report.

### Glenwood Cemetery.

More money was expended in fencing and grading the road leading to the cemetery than has been spent for several years. More work along this line should be done the coming season so that the road may be in as good order as possible. A bank wall was built preparatory to the erecting a building for storage purposes, which is very much needed. Over 100 lots were kept lawn mowed and I think the appearance of the cemetery was better than in any previous year.

A part of the fence should be rebuilt the coming year and the water pipes should be extended.

To those who wish to keep their lots in permanent repair I would recommend the use of burial vaults. Where the ordinary boxes are used the graves will settle two or three times.

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
