Tax Collector for 29 years, Town Trustee, Library Trustee, Cemetery Trustee, former member of the School Board, Town Constable for 32 years, member of Hillsborough County Commission, Deputy Forest Fire Warden, Subordinate and Pomona Deputy of the New Hampshire State Grange for 17 years, Past Master and Charter member of Naumkeag Grange, Past Master of Hillsborough County Pomona Grange, Charter member of Hill-Rock Pomona Grange, and through his efforts in Legislature, The Charles Bancroft Highway—Route 3-A—was built in town.

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TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Litchfield in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Litchfield on Tuesday, the 9th day of March, next at one of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- I. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise or appropriate \$250.00 for the Public Library.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to accept Town Road Aid for the permanent improvement of highways. Town to raise \$130.03 and the State to contribute \$866.85.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Collector of Taxes additional compensation for his services in collecting the State Head Tax and to fix the amount thereof.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow in anticipation of taxes for the year 1954.
- 7. To see what action the Town will take in regard to Memorial Day and make appropriation for same.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$50.00 (less than 1/100th of one percent of the Town's assessed valuation) to the Merrimack Valley Regional Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town in cooperation with the other 37 Communities of this Region, or act in relation thereto.

- 9. To see what action the Town will take regarding new fire equipment and what amount of money the Town will raise and appropriate for same.
- 10. To see if the Town will take any action to secure copies of the early records of the Town supposed to be in Boston and East Cambridge, Massachusetts and Concord, New Hampshire.
- II. To hear a report on and inspect the Town Map now being drawn up and to pass any vote relating thereto.
- 12. To see if the Town will take any action regarding lots of land in said Town, the owners of which are unknown.
- 13. To see if the Town will take any action towards a survey of the old and new division lines between Litchfield and Londonderry, N. H.
- 14. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting and read minutes of said meeting.

To The Citizens of Litchfield:

No major changes occurred in our teaching staff this year, a fact which is always conducive to a more smoothly running school system. In April Mrs. Arthur H. Morrill was added to the staff as a speech teacher in lieu of a singing teacher because no singing teacher seemed to be available. This fall our first Annual Prize Speaking Contest was held, an event which we hope will be continued in the future.

During the summer the plaster walls and ceilings on the first floor were repainted in restful tones of peach and green, which we hope will make these rooms more pleasant for the pupils and teachers. A larger, stronger, and more serviceable bulkhead was constructed to replace the old one ripped off by Halloween vandals.

We wish to call the attention of the citizens to the results of the 1953 school census printed in this year's Town Report. Careful observation of the estimated increase of the number of pupils in the Litchfield School in the next few years will show the necessity for providing more classroom space with a year or two at the most.

We wish to express our appreciation to the Litchfield Men's Club for their kind services in running the series of whist parties for the benefit of the school. Such thoughtful consideration on the part of its citizens helps not only Litchfield's schools, but the town as a whole.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Litchfield School Board:

I hereby submit my Fifth Annual Report on the condition of your school.

In thinking back over the past five years the thing that seems to predominate is the rapid growth in the number of school age children. In 1949 there were 68 children in grades 1-8. As of February 1, 1954 there were 70 pupils in the public school and about 20 youngsters attending private schools in Manchester. Next year will witness the first large influx of first graders with 22 pupils expected. A glance at the census report seems to show that there may be at least 104 pupils in your schools by 1960.

Rapid growth such as this presents many problems to any school district. First and foremost in our minds are the questions concerned with housing these new pupils. Should we provide new rooms for them or should we contract with some neighboring school district to provide the education for our seventh and eighth graders? If we feel that we can best care for them in Litchfield, just what type of an addition is best for our needs and what facilities, other than bare rooms can we afford?

While these questions are going through our minds, something is also happening to our school itself. It is gradually growing away from the intimate little school of two rooms that we once knew into a village type school of several rooms. It becomes more impersonal and we find that somehow or other it takes us longer, as parents and friends of the school to really know what is happening educationally to the pupils and to feel a part of the school. We find it much more difficult to get a true picture of actual conditions with many half completed stories circulating through a district afflicted with "growing pains".

Teachers also find new and different problems in a growing school. They find it very difficult to maintain that close relation with the home that is so characteristic of a smaller school. As the number of pupils increases the classrooms reach and exceed their capacity, causing an overcrowding condition which in turn taxes the emotional reactions of each child. Toilet facilities and noon lunch facilities also become inadequate. The tendency for more "horse play" and jostling becomes very apparent. Sensitive youngsters begin to feel the strain and even though the conscientious teacher is working harder than ever there is often discontent on the part of the parent and the teacher with the results that are being achieved.

As additional teachers are added to the staff it becomes necessary for parents and teachers alike to become adjusted to these new personalities, and the differences that exist between teachers as individuals becomes more apparent. It becomes necessary to realize that we can't expect our new staff members to act like the few we once had.

An answer to all of these problems and many more must be found in the very near future. Wholehearted cooperation among the parents, the administration and the teachers will be necessary if a happy solution is to be found. I feel very confident that these answers will be found and that the end result will be an educational pattern that will best provide for the needs of the Litchfield children. I have been very pleased with the attitude and the cooperative spirit of the parents and the School Board. It has helped us in our work of providing adequate educational opportunities for your children.
