TOWN WARRANT

TO THE INHABITANTS of the Town of Nelson, in the County of Cheshire, State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town affairs: YOU ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED to meet in the Town Hall in said Nelson on Tuesday, the 13th day of March, 2007, at 11:00 am to act upon the following articles:

(POLLS will open at 11:00 am and close at 7:00 pm) (BUSINESS MEETING will start at 7:00 pm)

ARTICLES OF A GENERAL NATURE

- 1. To choose necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150,000 (gross budget) for the total expense of the Safety Building at the back of the Fire House, including a well and septic system and to authorize the issuance of not more than \$150,000 of bonds or notes in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (RSA 33) and to authorize the municipal officials to issue and negotiate such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon; any money received from grants and donations will be applied to this purpose. The Selectmen recommend this appropriation. (2/3 ballot vote required)
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$198,460 to be raised by taxes. This is to defray Town charges for the year ensuing. The Selectmen recommend this appropriation.
- 4. To see if the Town will sell the former Town library property, known as the Old Olivia Rodham Memorial Library (shown on the Town's tax Map 6, Lot 004-004, with an address of 5 Center Pond Road). The sale would be for \$1, but the property would be sold subject to the condition that title to the property reverts back to the Town in the future if the owner fails to maintain the property in its present condition as well as make it available for limited public use, or to take any action thereon.
- To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5099 to purchase a copier for the town offices.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,359 support of social service agencies which provide assistance to Nelson residents. The agencies chosen to receive funds are: Home Health Care (\$550), Monadnock Family Services (\$809), The Keene Community Kitchen, Inc. (\$1,500) and Southwestern Community Services (\$500).
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to modify the Veterans' Tax Credit from \$50 to \$300 per year by provisions of RSA 72:28-35 as follows: 1) Filing date is the 15th of April of the year it is to be applied, 2) Discharge form such as DD214 showing dates of service and type of discharge etc. The Selectmen recommend this article.

- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$18,500 for a suggested network computer solution for the Town of Nelson. 1) This will include a file server that will do duty as a print server, central file server and backup system. Includes LCD monitor, all software, a spare tape cartridge and a 3 year service contract. 2) 5 desktop stations, includes software, LCD monitors. 3) 2 laptops, wireless network ready, includes cases. 4) A network ready laser printer. 5) A router / firewall / WAP / 4 port switch and installation. The Selectmen recommend this article.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$28,870. for support of the Town Library. (In 2006, the appropriation was \$26,390.)

\$20,600 to be raised by taxes \$8270 income from Library memorial funds and other sources.

- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,100.pay for site plans, which have been prepared for the addition at the rear of the Center Station, on Old Stoddard Road. The Selectmen recommend this article.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$35,000, to be added to the Town Buildings Capital Reserve Fund. No withdrawals may be made from the Fund except by vote of the Town. The Selectmen recommend this appropriation. (The Fund balance on 12/31/06 was \$20,961.)
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2500 for renovation of the back room, of the Old Brick School House, for storage of files and office supplies to be used by the Town offices. The Selectmen recommend this article.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3000 to be added to the Milfoil Prevention and Treatment Fund. The Selectmen and The Conservation Commission approve this article.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$575 used for hazardous waste collections for 2007 and 2008 consisting of 24 collection dates. The Selectmen recommend this article.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the following Capital Reserve Funds with said funds with accumulated interest to date of withdrawal, to be transferred to the town's general fund.

(2/15/2006) Revaluation 2006 \$339.08 Fund #0013 (2/15/2006) 2006 Tool Shed, Cemetery \$27.39 Fund #0016 (Year 1972) School Roof Repairs \$0.00

- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6565 as a subsidy for ambulance service for the ensuing year, it being understood that residents will still be charged for individual calls. (The appropriation for 2006 was \$5824). The Selectmen recommend this article.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$12,500 for the proper expenses of the Fire Department and Rescue Squad. (The 2006 appropriation was \$12,500).
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 for the purpose of fighting forest fires, this sum to come from reimbursement from the NH State Fire Warden and no amount will be raised through taxation. The Department of Revenue Administration recommends this method of accounting so as not to impact the Fire Department's operating budget. The Selectmen recommend this article.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25,000 to be added to the Fire Equipment Capital Reserve Fund. No withdrawals may be made from this Fund except by vote of the Town and upon recommendation of the Fire Chief. The Selectmen recommend this article.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5000. to update new pagers for members of the fire department and to purchase 6" suction hose. The Selectmen recommend this article.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 for the proper expenses for Emergency Management. This article is recommended by the Nelson Emergency Management Director and the Board of Selectmen.
- 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500. as the Town's share for the development of an EOP (Emergency Operations Plan), to comply with federal and state requirements. The remaining funds needed to accomplish this work will be provided by a grant through Southwest Region Planning Commission. This article is recommended by the Nelson Emergency Management Director and the Board of Selectmen.
- 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$33,000. for the proper expenses of the Police Department. (The appropriation for 2006 was \$34,811).
- 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000 for the purpose of patrols performed by the Nelson Police Department for the State of NH, Cheshire County, Sheriff's Office and other authorized municipal entities. This sum to come from offsetting grants and no amount will be raised through taxation.

- 25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$195,000 for the purpose of maintenance of highways and bridges for ensuing year's budget with \$53,003 coming from the Highway Block Grant with the remaining \$159,997 to be raised through taxation.
- 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15,000 to be added to the Road Equipment Capital Reserve Fund. It is understood that no withdrawals may be made from this fund for the purchase of road equipment except by vote of the town upon recommendation of the Road Equipment Committee. The Road Equipment Committee (which includes the Selectmen) recommends this appropriation. The Fund balance on 12/31/2006 was \$31,425.(The 2006 appropriation was \$15,000).
- 27. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25,000, to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund for the Salt Barn and Storm-water site work, at the Town Barn on Old Stoddard Road. It is understood that no withdrawals may be made from this Fund except by the vote of the Town. The Selectmen recommend this appropriation. (The balance as of 12/31/2006 (\$110,556)

ARTICLES DEALING WITH PLANNING & ZONING

- 28. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$722 for dues to belong to the Southwest Region Planning Commission. (\$722 in 2006)
- 29. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5000 for the initial facilitation services for the Master Plan for the Town of Nelson, NH. (The Selectmen recommend this article).
- 30. Are you in favor of designating the ecologically significant wetland system commonly known as "Great Meadow" in the Town of Nelson as a prime wetland as authorized in RSA-482-A:15 and described in documents and maps filed by the Conservation Commission with the Town Clerk as required by RSA 675:3. The Planning Board recommends this adoption. (By Ballot).
- 31. Are you in favor of the adoption of zoning Ordinance Article 6:8, "The Town of Nelson shall regulate the existence of junk yards in accordance with New Hampshire RSA 236:111 129", as Proposed by the Planning Board? The Planning Board recommends this adoption. (By Ballot).

OTHER ARTICLES

- 32. To see if the town will go on record in support of effective actions by the President and the Congress to address the issue of climate change which is increasingly harmful to the environment and economy of New Hampshire and to the future well being of the people of Nelson, NH. These actions include:
 - 1. Establishment of a national program requiring reductions of U.S. greenhouse gas

emissions while protecting the U.S. economy.

- 2. Creation of a major national research initiative to foster rapid development of sustainable energy technologies thereby stimulating new jobs and investment. This is a petitioned article.
- 33. To transact any other business or discuss other warrant proposals as may legally be brought before the meeting.

REPORT OF THE NELSON FIRE CHIEF

We have had another busy year with regard to call requirements. This year has seen a jump in the number of calls compared to the previous years. Our total number of calls for this year is 56, which is considerably higher than the number of calls seen in the past few years. During that period the calls had been numbering in the mid-forties. Again, the Fire Log continues to show that rescue calls play a major role in our activities. Brush fires were also up this year due to the dry spring and summer.

We've had one challenging structure fire during the course of this year. Thanks to a strong mutual aid system, for the fire happened during the day, damage was contained to the upstairs of the home, which was able to be rebuilt. We also had a challenging brush fire up on Merricon Road. 1.9 acres of land was burnt on both sides of the road. Thanks go to the Nelson Fire Fighters, our state district ranger and to the mutual aid companies that assisted.

We finished the project at the Granite Lake Station with the installation of a cement floor in the third bay. During the process we found some foundation problems that need to be repaired and the need for replacing the two oil tanks, which were in marginal condition. The door has been adjusted, alignment stripes painted on the floor, and the tanker has been returned to this bay. Both the Tanker and Engine #1 have had additional repairs during the course of the year. Hopefully these will allow the vehicles to continue to be of service to the town for many years to come.

We have continued our radio replacement with regard to the state's interoperability program for fire and emergency radios. The goal is to allow any fire department effectively to communicate at any emergency throughout the state. The use by the State Department of Safety of additional moneys from the Homeland Security Assessment and Strategy Program has provided our department with ten (10) new multi-channel portables. This has been a big boost with all officers now having a portable and the additional ones placed at each station so fire fighters can now pick up a portable as they respond to a call with the fire trucks. Also as mentioned in last years report, two POV (Personally Owned Vehicles) mobile radios for the Chief and Deputy Chief's vehicles have been installed. These units are identical to the ones in the fire trucks, which allows for direct interaction with Mutual Aid and the department's vehicles in responding to an incident. Additional funding from this program is now going into the infrastructure in upgrading Southwest NH Fire Mutual Aid for better communication to all regions covered. The only potential additional radios we might get are for the fire stations, allowing each to communicate with Mutual Aid or the department's vehicles.

As I've continued to mention in years past, we are always on the lookout for individuals who are interested in joining the fire department, especially those who are or want to become an EMT (Emergency Medical Technician). The department will support the training activity for both firefighter and EMT so that the individual can become certified. Anyone interested should contact the fire

department.

Remember, check your smoke detectors and replace the batteries on a regular basis. If you don't have smoke detectors, the Selectmen's Office has a limited number of free ones provided by a grant through Southwest Region Fire Mutual Aid. It is still highly recommended that you purchase and install them. They may save our life someday. Also, be sure to call the fire warden, Bob West, or one of the deputy wardens, Bud French, Charlie Lang, Terry Mednick or myself for a burning permit. It is required even if raining, unless there is an inch or more of snow on the ground.

I would like again to thank all the active members for their continued effort and support, and also the supporting individuals who help and us in the background. Remember, to report a fire or other emergency, DIAL 911or 352-1100.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT REPORT

This is the first year for a report from your Emergency Management Director. A lot is happening at this time with regard to Emergency Management Planning based upon state and federal requirements. As you can see we have a couple of initial articles dealing with funding in support of the emergency planning that is underway. One article deals with funding to support our local activities. This will probably be for communication needs to inform you better about emergency preparedness. The second article deals with an Emergency Operations Plan that is required by the state. We are requesting funds to support grant funding from Southwest Region Planning Commission to allow the commission to help us develop this plan. You will be hearing more about these activities ad time continues.

A couple of years back we had a group in town work on a Mass Inoculation Plan for Smallpox. Based upon a state and federal review of inoculation plans such as this one, it was decided to revamp the requirements and come up with a better plan for Hazard Mitigation. We are working on a regional and sub-regional basis to devise a Public Health Emergency Preparedness and Responsive Plan for the Greater Keene All Hazards Region. Funding is being provided by the state to support this activity. A lot of this work is being done to be prepared for any type of emergency. Our focus at this point deals with health emergencies such as a pandemic. As we continue to learn more about dealing with these types of emergencies, more information will be provided to you. We are presently in the development stages and have a lot of work to do with regard to the regional plan. Charlie Lang, Rich Pratt and myself are the representatives for the town for the time being, working with other Emergency Management Directors and representatives from the region. Stay tuned as we learn more, develop and communicate the required plans.

Administration Expenses represents a 4.2% Cost of Living increase.

Cell Phone Expenses will remain the same.

Cruiser Expenses have increased due to the fact that the warranty on the 2004 Expedition has expired and the fact that we have a 1993 Ford Crown Victoria for everyday patrol. Using the 1993 Crown Victoria will extend the life of the 2004 Expedition.

Equipment Expenses have been increased in anticipation of the need to repair or replace current equipment.

Fuel/Gasoline Expenses have been increased to reflect the added patrol time and the anticipated increase in fuel use.

Mileage Expenses will remain the same.

Payroll Expenses reflect an increase to an average of 12 hours of patrol time per week. It is my intention to provide a sound coverage of police for the Town of Nelson and to accomplish this I feel that it will take a minimum of 12 hours per/week for patrol time plus my administrative and patrol time.

Supplies will increase to reflect the anticipated increase in cost.

Training Expenses will remain the same. I would like to point out that the State of New Hampshire requires every Police Officer, part time or full time to have 8 hours of in-service training and 4 hours of deadly force training plus annual qualification with the firearm. The amount in this line item will cover the required mandatory training and purchase of ammunition and targets to meet the state requirements.

Uniform Maintenance will remain the same.

2006 proved to be the third year in a row that Nelson has had a below-average snow fall. Again, with little snow melt, this was also the third year that the spring mud was minimal.

At last year's Annual Meeting, the Article to purchase a used dump truck was passed. This 1989 truck was purchased, outfitted with the necessary equipment for hauling materials, and put into service for the summer and fall chores.

Last year was a quiet one for special projects. In the spring and summer the Town of Nelson Road Crew focused on general road and equipment maintenance. The usual routine maintenance was performed on Town roadways. Sections of roads were graveled and graded. Roadside mowing was also completed along with brush being cut, all to help preserve the appearance and safety of our roads. Throughout the fall months, we hauled winter sand to prepare for the upcoming winter season.

On November 1st I had an unfortunate accident on the job, which took me out of work for weeks. This left Nick Barrett, our one other full time employee for the Road Crew, with a heavier workload and added responsibilities during this time. I want to send out a special thank you to Nick for the great job he did during this time and for all of the hard work that he put in throughout the entire year. This special thank you also goes out to Charlie Lang and John Farwell for the extra support and time they put in to help get me through this experience. A big thank you is also sent to the Selectmen, members of the Road Equipment Committee, the other Town Officials, and to the Town Residents for all of your care and support this past year in 2006.

The highway department does appreciate updates on road conditions in your area. The Road Crew will respond to any problems in a timely manner.

Town Archivist's Report 2006

The archives continue to be a source for genealogical and historical information and is used by both residents and visitors searching for family and local history. During the past year Rick Church and David Birchenough have undertaken an important project that will add greatly to Nelson's history. They met weekly to research the history of road building in Nelson using these records. Their study has expanded to include the locations where early settlers lived and established farms. The archives budget was able to support the purchase of aerial photos to assist in their work, which will become part of the archives when completed.

As a way of bringing historical material to the attention of those who visit the town offices, the program of placing exhibits in the History Corner continued with the display from January to May of Floppy Tolman's life and art including her constructions that she called "Confabulations". The material was kindly lent by Barry and Karen Tolman. An exhibit on the historic mill site in Munsonville at the outlet of Granite Lake was installed in June and is still in place. Dick Mackey of Munsonville generously placed some of the items for this exhibit on loan.

Residents and neighbors are encouraged to donate historical items to the archives and for use in possible exhibits. If you have something you think may be of interest please let me know and I will be happy to meet with you. There are many past events that are not represented fully or at all that would benefit from more information.

Nelson Conservation Commission Report 2006

The Commission met monthly with Jeff Littleton, conservation ecologist and director of the Great Meadow Conservation Project, to discuss the natural resource study being conducted there. It was decided to seek the state-recognized designation of Prime Wetland for this important area. We have been working with the Harrisville Conservation Commission during this study as well, since the Great Meadow lies in both towns. The Town of Harrisville voted to support the prime wetland study by funding half of the cost while the other half was supported by a donation from the Harris Center in recognition of the importance of this wetland.

At a well-attended meeting held in October, Jeff Littleton presented the findings of the prime wetland study and Sandy Crystal, DES Wetland Specialist, discussed the designation of Prime Wetland explaining how it operates and answered questions from residents. A public hearing must be scheduled before it is voted on at the next annual meeting in March. Field work for both the Great Meadow Conservation Project and the prime wetland study were completed in December.

Landowners in general have been very supportive of the Great Meadow project. We look forward to input from the entire town at the public hearing and support for this project on the ballot vote at town meeting.

The annual roadside cleanup sponsored by the Commission was held in August before Old Home Week. It had the largest participation by town residents and friends of Nelson of any held so far. There were almost fifty people who covered most of the roads in town. The reward was another 800 daffodils from White Flower farm that were planted by volunteers across a wide area of town. To date more than 3,000 daffodils have been planted.

Residents are encouraged to present any conservation issues or questions to the Commission and to discuss the options and advantages of conservation easements they might be considering.

Cemetery Board Report 2006

The Cemetery Board has had the added responsibility this year for the maintenance of both the Nelson Cemetery and the Munsonville Cemetery since it was accepted by the town last year (prior to this it was a private cemetery). Al Struthers remains the sexton of the Nelson Cemetery and George Warner has continued as the sexton of the Munsonville Cemetery. General maintenance including mowing, trimming and straightening of headstones was conducted at both cemeteries by the sextons of each.

A tool shed was constructed by Al Struthers in Section 3 of the Nelson Cemetery, across the road from the present cemetery, to house tools used in the upkeep of the cemetery. Funds for the shed were generously provided by a gift from Norman Barres. The cremation area in Section 1 (the old cemetery) was surveyed by Tom Flavin in preparation for drawing a new plan for the layout of cremation plots in this area. It is expected that lots will be available in the spring of 2007.

There was one cremation and one full burial this year.

2006 Olivia Rodham Memorial Library Town Report

Highlights at the library this year: a 10% increase in library circulation, led by an increase of 52% in books added to the collection that were donated by patrons and a 45% increase in interlibrary loan. We continue to cooperate with the school on a library skills program and regular deliveries to the school. Our summer lecture series, book group and children's programs continue to be popular with the community.

There were three summer programs for children. Activities ran for six Tuesdays, based on the theme *Treasure Reading*. We started the Summer Reading program with a kick-off party to review the treasure and pirate books and sign up for the program. Tuesday activities included stories and art activities for young buccaneers, such as painting their own treasure boxes, painting gold nuggets, making god's eyes, and creating a treasure map. During the six-week summer reading program, nineteen children read two hundred and ninety-eight books. The Friends of the Library hosted the parties and gave Toadstool gift certificates to children in the program.

This summer we launched a book group for children and adults. The age targeted was 9 and older. The two gooks read and discussed were "Flush" by Carl Hiaasen and the "Penderwicks" by Jeanne Birdsall. Several children and a couple of adults attended the discussions. On July 21st at 7 pm, Almodarr's Grand Illusion, first place winners of the 2004 and 2005 New England Magic Championship, came to Nelson. At this free event there were skillful juggling, amazing magic effects, and stunning visual illusions. Fifty-Seven adults and children attended. This event was paid for in part by a grant from the New Hampshire State Library, the Bryne Foundation, Chilis, and the Cogswell Benevolent Trust. The Nelson Librarian wrote the grant.

The Olivia Rodham Memorial Library Summer Forum consisted of four Thursday evening talks with the theme presented as "For the Art of It". Starting on July 13th Bonnie Riley spoke about "The Art of Teaching". The following forums included speaker Kirk Dale on "The Art of Song", Kip Mackenzie on "The Art of Medicine" and Buzz McLaughlin on "The Art of Film". All the trustees helped with hospitality and the coordination of refreshments served afterwards in the library. All programs were well attended.

On Old Home Day, during the games on the green, the library was open for business. Extra activities in the library were a craft activity table and a sun spot screening done by Home Health Care nurse, Darcy Bacall. The annual Book Sale, organized and run by the Friends of the Library made record sales of \$2,300. Thank you to everyone who donated books, tapes, CDs, and videos/ bought book bags; or became a member of the Friends of the Library. You made it possible to buy \$1,000 worth of books for the general library collection, to be purchased in the year 2007. Donations of books can be dropped off at the library throughout the year. Especially needed is the donation of time before, during and after Old Home Day to organize the sale. The Friends of the Library also hosted the Annual Friends meeting held in July.

Two ongoing programs remain popular with the Nelson community. The adult book group meets once a month on Tuesday mornings. The after-school story time meets on Thursdays. Story time host is Sandy Ferguson reading to the children and often leading a related activity. Nine children

attend each week.

Library enrichment programs at the library were offered five times this year to the Nelson school. The whole school, except Kindergarten, attended in three groups. This happened once a month on Mondays during the winter and spring. They all learned library skills at this time. Included in the lessons were: Dewey Decimal, library layout, card catalog use, parts of a book and how to find items. The older group had a section on the use of the World Almanac. Another program of library enrichment in the Nelson School is a once-a-month delivery of twelve to fifteen books to each classroom, from the Olivia Rodham Memorial Library. The library works with teachers on the choices that will support the curriculum, entertain during a holiday time or encourage reading for fun at every reading level.

The library collection is constantly changing and being updated. Old, tattered, and unused books are weeded out as we make room for new books. The library purchased a series of books on a variety of history and science topics geared toward school age patrons. They were "Transportation in America", "History of the U.S." series by Joy Hakim, the Bobby Kallman "life Cycle" and "Endangered Species" series and a set of books put out by Crabtree publishing on sports. The last three series mentioned are popular requests in the elementary school.

The Nelson Library receives monetary donations throughout the year. Monies from Memorial Funds supplement Town appropriations and gifts to the library. Other donations we appreciate are the current (only the present month please) periodicals that are dropped in our box. Our periodical reading corner has two comfortable reading chairs in which to peruse our selection of thirty monthly magazines.

Many people from the community helped keep the library running this year. The Trustees during 2006 were Sandy Mackenzie, Betsy Street, Steve Bigaj, Linda Cates and Donna Kidd. There were 11 meeting of the Library Trustees this year. Jennifer Fraser is the regular library substitute, with Bruce McSheehy filling in. Patrons with overdue books are called twice a month by a volunteer, resulting in a reasonable return rate for library material.

The first of these is a Homework Club that will meet on Monday afternoons in the library. Any Nelson student in grades 3-6 can come to the library, have a snack, work on homework and use library resources under the supervision of the librarian. Our hope is twofold: to provide a structure that enables children to go home with homework completed, thus allowing more relaxed family time at night; and to encourage more use of the library by families. Students will be able to take the big bus from Nelson School to the library for Homework Club. We are looking forward to Town Meeting, where we will report on the project's progress and talk about funding to continue it.

Interlibrary loan numbers continue to amaze us, up another 45% from last year! Patrons are able to request books and other materials by phone, e-mail or in person, and often have them in hand just a few days later. Although we are a small library, interlibrary loan gives us easy access to a huge array of resources.

We'd like to give a heartfelt thanks to Sandy Mackenzie, who is going off the board after nine years of service. We will all miss her enthusiasm, energy and ideas!

As always the Trustees are appreciative of the efforts of all the many volunteers, donors, book sale helpers, and of course, patrons, who together make the Library one of the highlights of living in Nelson!

REPORT OF TOWN CLERK/TAX COLLECTOR 2006

What a banner year 2006 proved to be! As with last year's report, my focus is on our interaction with computer software programs and internet access. The need for high speed internet access to perform our jobs remains paramount and unresolved. Our office enjoys much appreciated hardware upgrades provided by the State of NH, but internet access remains painfully slow.

The State of New Hampshire has implemented its Statewide Voter Checklist. We are required to enter all Nelson voter information into the Statewide Voter Checklist database through the State website set up for that purpose. This has taken many hours of work and a strong commitment to succeed. Computer proficiency is a requirement for getting the job done. Proficient use of a laptop at the polls on election day is likely to become necessary within the near future. The role of Supervisor of the Checklist has therefore changed significantly, and Joan Warner, Supervisor, deserves special mention for her dedication and determination to master the skills necessary to complete the work.

The advent of an electronic voting machine in Nelson occurred with little more than a whimper. Several poll workers tried out the new phone/fax/printer set-up, and a few townspeople braved the new system. The future will tell a more complete story.

The Municipal Agent Automated Program is working well since the State of NH installed a higher speed dedicated phone line. We appreciate sincerely the assistance we receive from the good folks in Concord who handle the Municipal Agent help lines. And please don't forget that we do register new boats and do boat renewals.

This past year we joined ranks with many of NH towns in accessing the NHVRIN system. This is the Vital Records Administration website through which we are able to produce certified copies of birth, death, and marriage certificates as well as many divorce records, no matter where in NH the record originated. We welcome you to take advantage of this new convenience.

Our transition from BMSI to the Avitar software system for assessing and billing purposes went smoothly overall. There were a few billing glitches, but we have been assured that those glitches disappeared with the turning of the calendar year. The system is very user friendly, and we are pleased with the change.

Many thanks to Edith Notman, Deputy Town Clerk/Tax Collector. Edith is a delight to work with, and it's a pleasure to have her as part of our Town Office team. Bert Wingerson continues to provide us with wonderful displays of our historic records. We are fortunate to enjoy creative displays which enliven our past.

Please don't hesitate to write or call our office with any questions or concerns you may have. We are here to help you. We will do the best we can to resolve your issue or to direct you to someone who can help.

Thank you for another year as your Town Clerk/Tax Collector.

The Board also extends our gratitude to those who have served and continue to serve on the Re:Visions Committee. Their energy and enthusiasm has contributed so much to the work of the Board. We also appreciate all town residents who come to our meetings and hearings just to be informed.

The State of New Hampshire Granite Lake Village District

The annual Granite Lake Village District began its meeting on Sunday July 9, 2006 at the Chapel-by-the-Lake in Munsonville, NH at approximately 1:00PM for the purposes of choosing officers for the upcoming year and discussing any issues that come before the board.

Article 1. To choose one commissioner for a term of three years and to see who the inhabitants of the District will elect for the offices of Clerk, Moderator, and Treasurer, each for the term of one year. Nominated: Bob Woods, commissioner; Sally Ripley, Clerk; John Halter, Moderator; Tom Yocono, Treasurer

The motion was appropriately moved and seconded. The vote was affirmative.

Article 2. To see if the District will vote to authorize the Commissioners to borrow in anticipation of taxes. The motion was appropriately moved and seconded. The vote was affirmative.

Article 3. To see if the District will raise and appropriate the sum of \$350.00 to defray Village District expenses for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

The motion was appropriately moved and seconded. The vote was affirmative.

Article 4. To see if the District will raise and appropriate the sum of \$750.00 to purchase liability insurance to cover the District.

Len Frazier asked when/if the state changed the amount required of the District. The commissioners said they would find out.

The motions was appropriately moved and seconded. The vote was in the affirmative.

Article 5. To see if the District will raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to add to the capital reserve fund for dam maintenance, repair and/or replacement.

The motion was appropriately moved and seconded. The vote was affirmative.

Article 6. To see if the District will accept funds from the Granite Lake Association, or from any other source for the purpose of maintaining, repairing, or replacing the dam.

The motions was appropriately moved and seconded. The vote was affirmative.

Article 7. To see if the District will raise and appropriate from surplus funds the sum of up to \$5000.00 to be placed in the capital reserve fund for dam maintenance, repair, and/or replacement. The motions was appropriately moved and seconded. The vote was affirmative.

Under new business: Dita Englund suggested that the Granite Lake Association may be of help to our District.

We took up the motion which was put forward in the Granite Lake Association meeting to lower the lake 5 feet starting right after Labor Day for the purpose of repairing, replacing retaining walls and beach cleanup. The water would be brought back up as soon as work was completed. Some members thought early September to be too early and the water too low for boating safety.

The District Commissioners will study the liabilities and take it under advisement.

Article 8. To see if the District will schedule its next annual meeting to follow the Granite Lake Association meeting in July of 2007.

The District discussed this and decided we were getting out too late so there was a motion to have the meeting begin at 10:30A.M. and then recess if necessary for the period of the Granite Lake Association meeting at 11:00 The motion was appropriately moved and seconded. The vote was affirmative.

Public Health Emergency Preparedness and Response Planning

The Keene All Health Hazard Region (KAHHR) planning group is planning actions so that southwest New Hampshire will swiftly and effectively respond to and recover from a public health emergency. Public Health emergencies differ from more common disasters (i.e. ice storm, flood, fire) in both scope and duration. A public health emergency is defined as an event that affects the public's health: a highly contagious disease, for example, or a natural disaster, or bioterrorism. A public health emergency could last days or months. It might affect only a specific town, or an entire country.

Every community member is equally vulnerable. We might expect worker shortages due to illness or caring for a family member. Ill patients and worried citizens might overwhelm healthcare providers. The region might open an Acute Care Center (ACC) to manage overflow from medical facilities. The region might open Points of Distribution clinics (PODs) to quickly provide medications to citizens. In addition, we might impose isolation or quarantine orders. And we might need expanded morgue facilities to process higher-than-normal numbers of deaths.

The dedicated KAHHR planning group considered each of these issues and customized a response o suit our region's needs. No single municipality has the resources to mange a health emergency by itself. The remedy is advance planning and combining resources from towns, medical, and social service organizations so that the region provides a powerful response.

The Cheshire Public Health Network coordinates the region's preparedness planning with advice from the planning team of representatives from: the Towns of Alstead, Chesterfield, Fitzwilliam, Gilsum, Harrisville, Hinsdale, Keene, Marlborough, Marlow, Nelson, Richmond, Roxbury, Stoddard, Sullivan, Surry, Swanzey, Troy, Walpole, Westmoreland, and Winchester; Cheshire Medical Center; Home Health Care, Hospice & Health Community Services (HCS); local chapters of the American Red Cross and Monadnock United Way; Monadnock Family Service (MFS); Keene State College; SAUs; employees from the NH Departments of Health and Human Services, and Homeland Security/Emergency Management; and other agencies.

TO THE INHABITANTS of the Town of Nelson, in the County of Cheshire, State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town affairs: YOU ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED to meet in the Town Hall in said Nelson on Tuesday, the 14th day of March, 2006, at 11:00 AM to act upon the following articles:

POLLS will open at 11:00 AM and close at 7:00 PM)
(BUSINESS MEETING will start at 7:00 PM)

ARTICLES OF A GENERAL NATURE

- 1. To choose necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150,549 to be raised by taxes. This is to defray Town charges for the year ensuing. The Selectmen recommend this appropriation. (\$141,975 in 2005.)
- 3. Shall the Town notify the Governor and the Commissioner of the Department of Transportation of the state of New Hampshire, that the Town has no objection to the complete discontinuance by the State of New Hampshire of that portion of class II state Highway, being the original Keene to Concord or Franklin Pierce Highway lying between Mill Pond Road and Old Route 9 along land of Cucchi and the Methodist Chapel by the lake and that if the State does discontinue said highway, the Town of Nelson will not claim, assert or accept any right, title or interest in or to said highway or its right of way; and further:

Shall the Town notify the Governor and the Commissioner of the Department of Transportation of the State of New Hampshire, that the Town approves the reconfiguration/realignment of the traffic pattern/flow from this discontinuance to the "T" intersection of Mill Pond Road and Granite Lake Road which includes widening the intersection of Mill Pond Road and Granite Lake Road by approximately five (5) feet along its easterly side from a point beginning at the Southwestern point of the triangle of land formed by Old Route 9, Mill Pond Road and Franklin Pierce Highway and extending northwesterly to a point of the intersection of Mill Pond Road and West Shore Road; and further:

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one dollar (\$1.00) towards costs associated to the reconstruction. The State of New Hampshire Department of Transportation will either perform the work or approve engineering plan and construction bids/contract. (This article is not recommended by the Selectmen.)

- 4. To see if the town will vote to make the following changes to the Town Hall Rental Policy for rentals by NELSON RESIDENTS holding alcohol free events.
 - 1) Set the Town Hall rent at \$50.00 per event.
 - 2) Require an indemnity agreement in lieu of event insurance, releasing the Town of Nelson of all liability.
 - 3) Residents will not be required to pay for police presence.

NOISE ORDINANCE

(Pursuant to RSA 47:17)

- 5. To see if the Town will vote a Noise Ordinance as follows:
- It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to make, continue or cause to be made or continued, or to allow to be continued any loud, unnecessary, unreasonable or unusual noise or any noise which either annoys, disturbs, injures or endangers the comfort of others within the limits of the Town of Nelson.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$58,000.to cover the cost of a Town wide revaluation. And to see if the Town will vote to remove the sum of \$18,626. from the Capital Reserve Fund leaving the sum of \$39,374, and not to exceed this amount, to be raised by taxes
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000 to provide high speed internet access to the Town Office. The Selectmen will appoint an Advisory Group of qualified residents to review new software and hardware requests to ensure compatibility with existing computer systems and to help in the process of developing long range planning for town computer system needs.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,358.75 support of social service agencies which provide assistance to Nelson residents. The agencies chosen to receive funds are: Home Health Care (\$550), Monadnock Family Services (\$808.75), The Keene Community Kitchen, Inc. (\$1,500) and Southwestern Community Services (\$500). The Selectmen recommend this appropriation. (In 2005, these agencies received contributions from the Town in the amount of \$3,358.75)
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to modify the exemption for the Disabled, under the provisions of RSA 72:37-b as follows: The exemption from assessed value for qualified taxpayers shall be \$27,500. To qualify, the person must be eligible under Title II or title XVI of the Federal Social security Act, must occupy the property as his principle place of abode, must own the property individually or jointly, or if owned by a spouse, they must have been married for at least 5 years, had in the calendar year preceding April 1 a net income from all sources, of not more than \$14,740 for a single person and \$22,440 for a married person, and own assets not in excess of \$38,500, excluding the value of the actual residence and up to two acres or the minimum single family residential lot specified in the local zoning ordinance. The Selectmen recommend this article. (By Ballot)
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to modify the elderly exemptions from property tax based on the assessed value, for qualified tax payers, to be as follows: for a person 65 years of age to 75 years of age, \$28,750; for a person 75 years of age up to 80 years of age, \$43,125; for a person 80 years of age or older, \$57,500. To qualify, the person must have been a New Hampshire resident

for at least 5 years, own the real estate individually or jointly, or if the real estate is owned by such person's spouse, they must have been married for at least 5 years. In addition, the taxpayer must have a net income of not more than \$23,460 or, if married, a combined net income of less than \$34,960. The tax payer can not have assets of more than \$40,825.

- 11. To see if the Town will vote to accept the gift of the Munsonville Cemetery and the financial support that accompanies said property.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$26,390, for support of the Town Library. (In 2005, the appropriation was \$25,350.)

\$18,900 to be raised by taxes

- \$ 7,490 income from Library memorial funds and other sources.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,500 to obtain site plans for an addition on the rear of the Center Station, on Old Stoddard Road. This is for the purpose of combining facilities for a Municipal Building.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000, to be added to the Town Buildings Capital Reserve Fund. No withdrawals may be made from the fund except by vote of the Town. The Selectmen recommend this appropriation. (2005 appropriation was \$2,000.) (The fund balance on 12/31/05 was \$10,465.)
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to (1) create an expendable fund under the provisions of RSA 31:19-a, to be known as the Milfoil Prevention and Treatment Fund, for the purpose of preventing and treating milfoil in Nubanusit Lake, Spoonwood Lake, Silver Lake, Granite Lake, Rye Pond, Tolman Pond, Center Pond, Woodward Pond and Ellis Reservoir, (2) raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000 (Three thousand dollars) to be placed in this fund; and (3) appoint the Board of Selectmen as agents to expend the funds after consultation with the Conservation Commission.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 to be used for mosquito treatment and prevention programs for the West Nile Virus (WNV) and the Eastern Equine Encephalitis (EEE). This is to work proactively with DHHS to mitigate this problem in 2006.

ARTICLES DEALING WITH SERVICE AND PROTECTION

- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5824. as a subsidy for ambulance service for the ensuing year, it being understood that residents will still be charged for individual calls. The Selectmen recommend this appropriation. (The appropriation for 2005 was \$4700.00.)
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$12,500 for the proper expenses of the Fire Department and Rescue Squad. (The 2005 appropriation was \$10,000.)
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500, to cover expenses

which will be reimbursed by the NH State Fire Warden, and will appear as revenue on the Budget Comparison. The Department of Revenue Administration recommends this method of accounting so as not to impact the Fire Department's operating budget.

- 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3000 to install a concrete floor in the third truck bay at the Munsonville Station.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25,000 to be added to the Fire Equipment Capital Reserve Fund. No withdrawals may be made from this fund except by vote of the town and upon recommendation of the Fire Chief.
- 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000 to update Rescue Squad Equipment to meet the latest state EMS standards.
- 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$34,811. for the proper expenses of the Police Department. (The appropriation for 2005 was \$34,647.)
- 24. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000 to cover the expense of patrols by the Nelson Police department for the State of New Hampshire, Cheshire County, Sheriff's Office and other authorized municipal entities. The cost will be offset by grants, which will appear as revenue on the budget comparison. The Department of Revenue Administration recommends this method of accounting, in order not to impact the operating budget of the Police Department.

ARTICLES DEALING WITH ROADS

25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$195,000.00 for maintenance of highways and bridges for the ensuing years budget.

\$158,238.90 to be raised by taxes

\$36,761.10 to be designated from the Highway Block Grant. (The 2005 appropriation was \$189,000.)

- 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15,000 to be added to the Road Equipment Capital Reserve Fund. It is understood that no withdrawals may be made from this fund for the purchase of road equipment except by vote of the town upon recommendation of the Road Equipment Committee. The Road Equipment Committee (which includes the Selectmen) recommends this appropriation. The fund balance on 12/31/2005 was \$35,307.85. (The 2005 appropriation was \$15,000.)
- 27. To see if the Town will vote to withdraw \$20,000 from the Road Equipment Capital Reserve Fund for a surplus truck. The Road Equipment Committee recommends this withdrawal.
- 28 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25,000, to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund for the Salt Barn and Storm-water site work, at the Town Barn on Old

Stoddard Road. It is understood that no withdrawals may be made from this Fund except by the vote of the Town. The Selectmen recommend this appropriation. (2005 appropriation was \$55,000. (The balance as of 12/31/2005 was \$81,689.81.)

ARTICLES DEALING WITH PLANNING & ZONING

29. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$716 for dues to belong to the Southwest Regional Planning Commission. (\$716 in 2005)

Nelson Planning Board Zoning Ordinance revisions for 2006

- 30. Are you in favor of the amendment of the Nelson Zoning Ordinances, Article 3:1 as follows: There shall be no new lots created that are less than two acres. Building permits for new dwelling units shall only be issued for lots that are a minimum of two acres. Building permits for dwelling units or other structures which are on lots of less than two acres must meet the conditions of Article 10- Non conforming Lots and Structures. The planning board recommends this amendment. (By Ballot)
- 31. Are you in favor of the amendment of the Nelson Zoning Ordinances, <u>Article 5:1.1</u>, as follows: 5.1.1. A building permit shall be required when changing the outside dimensions of a house, even when staying within the footprint i.e. the addition of a dormer, or increasing the height of the roof. Current Article 5:1.1 shall be renumbered 5:1.2. The planning board recommends this amendment. (By Ballot)
- 32. Are you in favor of the amendment of the Nelson Zoning Ordinances, <u>Section 5:2</u> as follows: Applications for building permits shall be accompanied by an accurate drawing showing the dimensions of the lot, the location and size (including height) of any existing and proposed structures, streets, right of ways, and streams within or adjacent to the lot. Parking areas for vehicles and any required screening shall also be shown. The planning board recommends this amendment. (By Ballot)
- 33. Are you in favor of the amendment of the Nelson Zoning Ordinances 3:7, as follows: All proposed development shall incorporate the principles of good design and land use. The amount of frontage along a Class V or better road may be less than 200 feet provided that:
 - It is a condition of the subdivision, and so stipulated on the plat, that only one dwelling unit
 may be constructed on the entire lot.
 - No more than two lots having less than 200 feet of road frontage are created, either in one subdivision, or from land which has been previously subdivided in this manner.
 - The minimum lot sizes and setbacks are provided per the table below.

Additionally, in this situation, the total area of the lot(s) which have less than 200 feet of frontage must be at least 5 acres, and it shall be stipulated as a condition of the subdivision (and on the plat) that no more than one dwelling unit is constructed on the lot.

The permitted minimum road frontage shall be determined by the combination of lot size and setback of the dwelling unit from the street line, as follows: [chart and subsequent paragraph remain the same] The planning board recommends this amendment. (By Ballot)

- 34. Are you in favor of the adoption of the Nelson Zoning Ordinances, <u>7:6.7</u> as follows: A driveway may not serve more than four dwelling units. Special exceptions may be applied for with the Zoning Board of Adjustment who may, with the recommendation of the road agent and selectmen, approve such an exception in the case of apartments or condominiums, or other situations where it can be demonstrated that such an exception represents a superior solution. The planning board recommends this amendment. (By Ballot)
- 35. Are you in favor of the amendment of the Nelson Zoning Ordinances, <u>9:2.2</u> as follows: Landowners are responsible for any types of pollution to land, air, and water which are a result of activity or negligence. Such pollution includes, but is not limited to, the burning of toxic substances, or the release of contaminants such as oil or gasoline into the ground or water. The selectmen will have the responsibility to report any polluting activity to the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services, who may require corrective action and issue penalties. The planning board recommends this adoption. (By Ballot)
- 36. Are you in favor of the adoption of the Nelson Zoning Ordinances, Article 12:2 as follows: The meeting of each of the above conditions does not guarantee that a subdivision is qualified for approval. The Planning Board must determine that such development will be superior to conventional development in preserving open space for conservation or recreation, utilizing natural features of the land, and allowing more efficient provision of public services; and at least equal to a conventional plan in other respects. The planning board recommends this amendment. (By Ballot)
- 37. Are you in favor of the amendment of the Nelson Zoning Ordinances, Article 14 as follows: Footprint: The horizontal area as seen in the plan view, measured from outside of all exterior walls and support columns. It includes residences, garages, covered carports, and accessory structures, but not trellises, patios, courtyards, and areas of porches, decks, and balconies. In the absence of surrounding exterior walls, the building footprint shall be the area under the horizontal projection of the roof. Unattached stone steps and patios are considered landscaping and are not included in the footprint. The planning board recommends this amendment. (By Ballot)
- 38. Are you in favor of the adoption of the Nelson Zoning Ordinances, Article 15 as follows: Article 15: This document makes references to Class V, and Class V or better roads. Within this document, the term "or better" refers to lower numbers (Class I IV). The term Class V does not refer to a standard of construction. The following explains New Hampshire's Highway Classification System, and is provided from A Hard Road To Travel, published by New Hampshire's Local Government Center. The Highway system in New Hampshire is broken down into seven distinct classes. They are I, II, III, III-a, IV, V, and VI. Class I, II and III highways are state highways, controlled and maintained by the New Hampshire Department of Transportation (DOT), except for the "unimproved" sections of Class II highways, which are still maintained by towns. Class I and II highways are laid out by a commission appointed by the governor and council. RSA 230:8. Class III-a highways are state boating access highways under the authority of the New Hampshire Fish and Game Department. Class IV, V, and VI are local highways. Class IV are highways within the

urban compact section of a city or town. Urban compact sections are designated by the NH DOT, and are restricted to certain cities and towns, of which Nelson is not one. Class III roads are state-controlled boating access roads. The planning board recommends this amendment. (By Ballot)

39. To transact any other business or discuss other warrant proposals as may legally be brought before the meeting.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Members of the School Board Nelson School District Nelson, New Hampshire

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the governmental activities and each major fund of the Nelson School District, which collectively comprise the School District's basic financial statements as of June 30, 2006 as listed in the table of contents. These financial statements are the responsibility of the School District's management. Our responsibility is to express opinions on the financial statements based on our audit.

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinions.

The government-wide statement of net assets does not include any of the School District's capital assets nor the accumulated depreciation on those assets; and the government-wide statement of activities does not include depreciation expense related to those assets. These amounts have not been determined. Therefore, in our opinion, the financial statements referred to above do not present fairly the respective financial position of the governmental activities of the Nelson School District at June 30, 2006, and the respective changes in financial position thereof for the year then ended in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

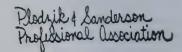
Also, in our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the respective financial position of the governmental activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the Nelson School District as of June 30, 2006, and the respective changes in financial position thereof for the year then ended in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

As described in Note 2, as of July 1, 2005, the School District has implemented a new financial reporting model, as required by the provisions of GASB Statement No. 34, Basic Financial Statements - and Management's Discussion and Analysis - for State and Local Governments.

The budgetary comparison information is not a required part of the basic financial statements, but is supplementary information required by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board. We have applied certain limited procedures, which consisted principally of inquiries of management regarding the methods of measurement and presentation of the required supplementary information. However, we did not audit the information and express no opinion on it.

The Nelson School District has not presented a management's discussion and analysis that accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America have determined is necessary to supplement, although not required to be part of, the basic financial statements.

Our audit was conducted for the purpose of forming opinions on the financial statements that collectively comprise the Nelson School District's basic financial statements. The combining and individual find statements are presented for the purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the basic financial statements. They have been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and, in our opinion, are fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the basic financial statements taken as a whole.

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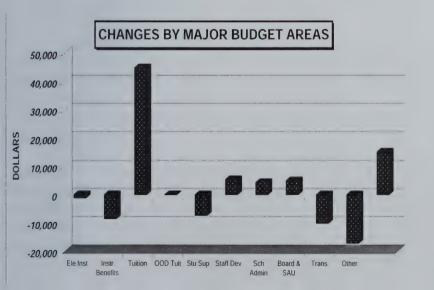

MINUTES OF THE NELSON SCHOOL DISTRICT MEETING March 10, 2006

Moderator Richard Church declared the polls open at 3:00 p.m. The business meeting was to be held at 7:00 p.m. The polls would remain open until 8:00 p.m.

At 7:00 p.m., Moderator Church called the meeting to order. A motion was made and seconded to waive the reading of the minutes. William Gurney, Assistant Superintendent, and Timothy Ruehr, Business Manager for Towns, were in attendance from SAU 29, as well as Sheila Vara, Nelson School Principal. Approximately 60 residents of the Town of Nelson were in attendance.

Article 1: To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

The motion was made and seconded that the District receive the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 1 was passed as presented.

Article 2: To see what sum of money the District will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries for school district officials and agents, for the statutory obligations of the District, or to take any other action in relation thereto.

It was moved and seconded that the District raise and appropriate \$1,391,208 for the support of schools, for the salaries for school district officials and agents, and for the statutory obligations of the District, or to take any other action in relation thereto.

After a detailed discussion of the budget, Article 2 was passed as presented.

Article 3: To see if the District will vote in favor of changing the terms of the School District Clerk, Moderator, and Treasurer from one-year terms to two-year terms; the change shall take effect at next year's regular School District Meeting, March 2007; or to take any other action in relation thereto.

It was moved and seconded that the District approve the changing of the terms of the School District Clerk, Moderator, and Treasurer from one-year terms to two-year terms; the change shall take effect at next year's regular District Meeting, March 2007; or to take any other action in relation thereto.

After a brief discussion, Article 3 passed by ballot vote.

Article 4: To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate up to \$20,000 from its unencumbered funds, if any, remaining on hand at the end of fiscal year, June 30, 2006, to the Capital Reserve Fund established by the voters of the District at the March, 1972, District Meeting for the purpose of construction/reconstruction of building and/or purchase of equipment, and/or the acquisition of land for school purposes, or to take any other action in relation thereto.

It was moved and seconded that the District raise and appropriate up to \$20,000 from its unencumbered funds, if any, remaining on hand at the end of fiscal year, June 30, 2006, to the Capital Reserve Fund established by the voters of the District at the March, 1972, District Meeting for the purpose of construction/reconstruction of building and/or purchase of equipment, and/or the acquisition of land for school purposes, or to take any other action in relation thereto.

Article 4 passed by voice vote.

Article 5: To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate up to \$10,000 from its unencumbered funds, if any, remaining on hand at the end of fiscal year, June 30, 2006, to the High School/Middle School Tuition Fund established by the voters on March 5, 1999, for the purpose of paying future year unanticipated special education and/or middle and high school tuitions, or to take any other action in relation thereto. If there is an insufficient, undesignated fund balance as of June 30, 2006 to fund this appropriation and the appropriation in Article 4 (Capital Reserve Fund), Article 4 will be funded first, with any additional surplus to be applied to this warrant article.

It was moved and seconded that the District raise and appropriate up to \$1.00 from its unencumbered funds, if any, remaining on hand at the end of fiscal year, June 30, 2006, to the High School/Middle School Tuition Fund established by the voters on March 5, 1999, for the purpose of paying future year unanticipated

special education and/or middle and high school tuitions, or to take any other action in relation thereto. If there is an insufficient, undesignated fund balance as of June 30, 2006 to fund this appropriation and the appropriation in Article 4 (Capital Reserve Fund), Article 4 will be funded first, with any additional surplus to be applied to this warrant article.

After some discussion, Article 5 passed by voice vote.

Article 6: To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate \$20,000 to be used to develop and design preliminary plans for a school renovation project which includes the addition of a community multi-purpose room, improved kitchen facilities, and additional space for special education services, said sum to be transferred from the District's Capital Reserve Fund established by the voters at the March, 1972, District Meeting for the purpose of construction/reconstruction of buildings and/or purchase of equipment, and/or the acquisition of land for school purposes, or to take any other action in relation thereto.

It was moved and seconded that the District raise and appropriate \$20,000 to be used to develop and design preliminary plans for a school renovation project which includes the addition of a community multi-purpose room, improved kitchen facilities, and additional space for special education services, said sum to be transferred from the District's Capital Reserve Fund established by the voters at the March, 1972, District Meeting for the purpose of construction/reconstruction of buildings and/or purchase of equipment, and/or the acquisition of land for school purposes, or to take any other action in relation thereto.

Anne Cucchi, School Board Member and a member of the School Facilities Committee, presented the need for improved kitchen facilities, a larger common room and space for Special Education services.

After considerable discussion, Article 6 was defeated.

Article 7: To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Kelly French, School Board Chairperson, asked that the assembled residents join her in expressions of gratitude to Karen

Almdale, who has served Nelson School as a Special Education and classroom teacher. She will be leaving at the end of this year. Kelly also asked that those assembled extend a hearty thanks to Dottie Warner who has served generations of Nelson School students as a bus driver. The round of applause was resounding.

Richard P. Church, Moderator, declared the polls closed at 8:00 p.m. At 8:00 p.m., the meeting was adjourned.

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT

Nelson students continue their strong academic performances at Nelson School, as well as Keene Middle School and Keene High School.

Improvements continue with the installation of new technology equipment. A mobile computer lab has been purchased and installed at the school. This lab will facilitate technology integration into the curriculum and allow for computer adaptive assessments at the school.

School safety has been a major priority this year for the Nelson faculty. Safety plans have been reviewed and town officials have worked closely with school administration to ensure that safety plans are adequate and alarm systems are functioning properly. Faculty members have been trained in CPR and First Aid this winter and a wellness policy has been approved by the Nelson School Board.

Nelson students continue to do well at Keene High School. The overall attendance rate for Nelson high school students was 96.6% for the 2005-2006 school year with consistently higher grade point averages than the KHS overall norm. Nelson tenth graders continue to show improvements in NHEIAP testing. In Reading and Mathematics, Nelson students' scaled scores were well above state averages and their KHS classmates.

Nelson students (17) did well on SAT subtests scoring above the state and national averages. A majority of Nelson seniors reported plans to attend post-secondary educational institutions last spring. These schools included: Keene State College, NHCTC, UNH, US Air Force Academy, Plymouth State University, Montana State University and Vermont Community College.

Thirty-three Nelson students participated in more than twenty-five extra-curricula activities including baseball, ice hockey, bowling, track, softball, FCCLA, World Language Honor Society, Salmagundi, National Honor Society, soccer, Destination Imagination, and Chorus.

The strong collaboration between administration, faculty and the Nelson School Board continues and grows stronger. The annual school board/staff retreat is a significant factor in this collaboration. As a result of the 2006-2007 retreat, the following goals were established for the school year.

- Improve student proficiency in mathematics
- Improve staff and student proficiency with technology and its integration into everyday teaching and learning
- Facilities and infrastructure improvements to meet the needs of students and staff
- Continue to promote a nurturing, welcoming, positive, safe environment for students, staff and community members

Much of the success enjoyed by Nelson students can be attributed to the dedication and support shown by Nelson residents in support of their young people. Community and parental involvement remains high and sets an outstanding example for other communities to emulate. Volunteerism at Nelson School is strong and the high quality program illustrates the willingness of the community to support its school children, financially. This spirit of volunteerism is best exemplified by the dedication of the Nelson School Board to provide every child with the means to reach his/her full potential. The many hours of volunteer support serve Nelson children well as they pursue their educational journeys.

Please join us at the annual district meeting on March 9 at Nelson Town Hall. This is your opportunity to participate in the decision-making process that will shape the quality of education provided Marlow students in the years ahead.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Nelson School opened its doors for the 2006-2007 academic school year with 53 students. We welcomed five new families to the Nelson community and, since September, our student enrollment has grown to 55.

The 2006-2007 school year once again brought many changes to the Nelson teaching and support staff. Molly Bentley, Nelson School's former Title I teacher, became the kindergarten teacher. Matthew Schmidt left sunny Florida to become Nelson School's physical education teacher and brings with him solid coaching experience. Joyce Foster now holds the dual role of Special Education teacher and Title I teacher. Joyce has 38 years of experience, 26 of which are in the field of special education.

Mandi Silk, who was Nelson School's guidance counselor several years ago, jumped at the opportunity to rejoin the Nelson team. And the last new face is that of Bob Milliken who keeps the school clean and does all the handyman jobs that need to be done. Although not new to us, Kim Keating seamlessly moved into the secretarial position.

In our never ending quest to better meet the needs of students and provide top notch instruction to Nelson students, the staff focused its professional development activities on assessment, phonology, and fluency under the guidance of Dr. Carol Tolman. This year we also analyzed our spelling program and chose a new series that better meets the needs of our students.

As a result of collaborative planning and grant money, Nelson School now has its own mobile computer lab that consists of 12 laptop computers. Through the money in this grant we were also able to purchase digital cameras, software, flash drives, a video camera, and headphones, as well as update our infrastructure for safety reasons. Now that Nelson has its own computer lab, we will be able to participate in NWEA's MAPS testing right here at Nelson School without traveling to and from Keene throughout the year.

Due to a generous donation from an anonymous Nelson resident who recognized the importance of the arts in elementary school, we were fortunate to be able to, once again, bring the incredible "Lend an Ear" program to Nelson School. This program enriches our music program by exposing students to a variety of musical instruments by top level professionals.

One of Nelson School's hallmarks has been involving students in

community service projects. Our efforts this year were Trick-or-Treat for UNICEF, winter holiday caroling at Harborside Nursing Home, making and sending cards to the troops in Iraq, and creating placemats/name cards for Health Care Community which provides hot meals and an opportunity for social interaction for members of the Nelson and Stoddard community who are 60 years or older. This year the Nelson staff created their own way of giving back by instituting Casual Friday. On each Friday, staff members may choose to wear casual clothing. If they do, they need to make a monetary donation to the Dana Farber Cancer Center.

This year the Nelson staff chose "American Pride" as its all-school theme. One winter evening in January, at Nelson School, each class wowed the audience with what they had learned. The kindergarten class recited the Pledge of Allegiance using sign language and displayed the flags they made. The students in R/1/2 sang songs and did their best to deliver jokes about each of the 50 states. The students in the 3/4 class shared their knowledge about Betsy Ross and the variations of the American flag, and the students in the 5/6 class delivered a Power Point presentation on Mt. Rushmore. It was an exciting night where teachers, children, and parents were proud of their accomplishments.

Due to the increased focus of health in schools, Nelson has developed a Wellness Committee. Matthew Schmidt, Nelson School's physical education teacher, spearheaded a new program entitled, "Be Active Across America" with the support of the Nelson staff as a way to promote daily physical activity. During recess periods, designated physical education classes, and as a home-school connection, Nelson students are moving their way across America to the Golden Gate Bridge in San Francisco. So far, we have walked 433 miles, which has brought us to the great state of Pennsylvania. We were fortunate to receive a grant from Advocates for Healthy Youth in the amount of \$720. This money will be used to buy equipment for the program such as pedometers, hoola hoops, and jump ropes.

Nelson School continues its collaboration with the Olivia Rodham Library where Nelson students learn library skills under the direct tutelage of Kris Finnegan. Without the generosity of Packersfield (our Parent-Teacher Association), this wonderful program would not be possible.

Our affiliation with the Harris Center remains an integral part of our science curriculum. This year the kindergarten children learned about salamanders. The students in R/1/2 learned about worms. The students in the 3/4 class participated in a unit called the "Land Around Us" and explored the Ashuelot and learned how the town changed, and the students in the 5/6 class focused upon geology. This year the Harris Center will work with the

instead of at various times throughout the year.

This year the staff chose the New Hampshire Dance Institute, better known as NHDI, for the students' week-long residency. NHDI will be working with the students in mid May with a performance at Keene High School on the evening of May 18th.

Nelson School now has two new traditions! The first is the Thanksgiving Feast that the children help prepare and then enjoy eating together. The second is Family Pumpkin Carving Night when families gather at Nelson School to carve pumpkins for Keene's Pumpkin Festival. This is also a wonderful way to keep in touch with former Nelson School students who return to help younger siblings carve. With the continued support and help from Nelson families and community members, we are able to provide these types of enriching, family-oriented activities.

Given the events over the last year at various schools across the country, it appeared to be an opportune time to update and refine the safety precautions at Nelson School. Richard Pratt, Nelson's Police Chief, and I worked together collaboratively using his insight, knowledge, and suggestions to update and tighten Nelson School's Emergency Safety Plan which includes plans for fire, intruders, chemical spills, bomb threats, and extreme weather conditions. As part of Nelson's ongoing security measures, the front door is locked after the last bus has arrived in the morning, a sign-in sheet is in the foyer for visitors, and visitors are expected to check in at the office before proceeding to classrooms. Each classroom has an emergency exit map posted near the phone, a list of emergency responder phone numbers, a packet of safety codes of instructions to follow in any type of emergency, and a safety kit. We currently have three established evacuation sites should we ever need them and a plan on how to release Nelson children to their parents should we ever need to evacuate. Nelson's Emergency plan is simple to understand and addresses the various emergencies that we might face.

In addition to school safety, Chief Pratt has been invaluable in his concern and interest for the students and families of Nelson. This year, Chief Pratt and his league of Nelson volunteers spent a day at Nelson School and created Child Find Cards for interested families.

The staff and students have enjoyed the kitchen renovations. The three-bay sink brings us into compliance, the commercial refrigerator keeps our food at a constant temperature, the chest freezer provides us with storage for lunch items, and our new pot rack hangs proudly over the stove and allows for storage space. With a lot of rearranging and weeding out of items that were no longer useful, the kitchen appears far bigger than it is and has begun to meet our needs.

Nelson School is a special place for students, their parents, and the staff. Although we are a small rural school, we strive to offer quality programs that meet the needs of our students and the community. We are ever thankful for the community's support and input and enjoy working together collaboratively to make Nelson the special place that it is.
