TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Surry, in the County of Cheshire, said State qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in Surry on Tuesday the fifth (5th) day of March at 7:30 p.m. in the afternoon to act upon the following articles:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
 - 2. To hear the reports of the Town Officers.
- 3. To see if the Town will authorize the Board of Selectmen and Treasurer to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to accept Trust Funds that may have been received by the town during the past year.
- 5. BY PETITION: To see if the Town will vote to accept the use of a portion of the building, called Town Hall for the Surry Kindergarten three (3) days a week, Monday, Wednesday and Friday, 9 a.m. to 12 noon.
- 6. To see if the Town will authorize the Board of Selectmen to use the Revenue Sharing Fund for the current year 1974 and to take any action in relation thereto.
- 7. To see if the Town wishes to change the selling price of the cemetery lots in the Village Cemetery from \$25.00 to \$50.00, or take any action in relation thereto.
- 8. To see if the Town wishes to set an annual salary of \$750.00 per year recommended by the Board of Selectmen and the Municipal Budget Committee for the office of the Collector of Taxes commencing with the fiscal year 1975, or take any action in relation thereto.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to become a member of the Regional Planning Commission now organized and named the Southwestern New Hampshire Planning Commission, and to which the Board of Selectmen shall appoint two (2) members.

- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$374.00 as the Town's share for the studies and operation of the Southwestern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission.
- 11. To see if the Town wants to join District 4 and use the City of Keene sanitary land fill, or take any action in relation thereto.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Budget as presented by the Budget Committee and raise and appropriate money for the same, or take any action in relation thereto.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Zoning Ordinance by combining residence and business districts and clarifying the powers of the Zoning Board of Adjustment in accordance with state statutes as proposed by the planning board under authority of Chapter 31: 63-a RSA. 1967 as amended.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to adopt Chapter 155, RSA restricted in its applicability to new schools, new halls and new public buildings; but applicable to all multi-family dwellings except owner-occupied two family dwellings; all lodging, rooming or boarding houses; all accommodations for tourists and overnight guests; all nursing homes and foster homes; all commercial and industrial buildings.
- 15. To take up any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

ANNUAL REPORT TO TOWNS GILSUM, MARLOW, NELSON, STODDARD, SULLIVAN & SURRY

The Agency has provided the services of a registered nurse on a visiting part-time basis for twenty hours per week. A registered physical therapist and a male licensed practical nurse are available by appointment on a contract arrangement. Nursing services offered include skilled care of the sick at home, health guidance and assistance in referral to other community resources.

The Child Health Conference which provides free medical supervision and immunizations to low-income families has been maintained. The clinics are held in the Gilsum Church on a monthly basis. This program has provided 36 children in 21 families with 97 doses of vaccines in 96 clinic visits.

In addition a family health discussion group has been held in conjunction with the C.H.C. All parents are invited to this informal discussion with the doctor about pertinent health topics.

It is the people of the towns who have made these services available with tax money and contributions to our membership drive. Many have helped by volunteering their time to serve on the Board, on committees, in membership drives, assisting at clinics and providing transportation. Without all of your help it would be impossible to provide these important services.
