## EARLE W. CHANDLER

With a great deal of pride, the Town of Wilmot acknowledges the efforts of Selectman, Earle Chandler.

Earle was born on September 6, 1913, at the family farm in Bartlett, New Hampshire. In 1935, he graduated from UNH earning a B.S. in Business Administration. Throughout Earle's varied business career, he always maintained his interest in farming and lumbering. His children are: Dorothy Alice Prats, Earle W. Chandler, Jr., Charles W. Chandler, Gene G. Chandler and Mikell Mary Beyrele. He has nine grandchildren. Earle is married to the former Alice Raynor.

In Bartlett, four generations of Chandlers have served on the Board of Selectmen. Earle served the Board for 18 years; his father and grandfather also served; and his son Gene, is currently a Selectman in Bartlett. During Earle's tenure on the Bartlett Board, he was elected to the New Hampshire Legislature for four sessions where he served as Chairman of the Ways & Means Committee and as Majority Leader for the House.

He moved to Wilmot in 1965. In 1967, he took over the reins of Selectman from Donna Niles and has been a Selectman in Wilmot ever since. In recent years, he has also served in the New Hampshire Legislature. His sons, Gene, a real estate broker from Bartlett, and Charles, an attorney from Tilton, presently serve with him in the New Hampshire House of Representatives.

Earle's knowledge of woodlands and forestry, business experience and his expertise in the intricacies of State policies and procedures have made him an invaluable selectman. He has a complete knowledge of the Town and regularly tours all the roads.

Earle retires this year with 27 years of consecutive service on Wilmot's Board of Selectmen. It is with gratitude that we acknowledge Earle's commitment to the Town. He has always strived to keep taxes down in fairness to all taxpayers and to ensure that Wilmot remains "a good place to live."

**TOWN OF WILMOT WARRANT  
THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE**

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Wilmot in the (L.S.) County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Wilmot on Tuesday, the 14th of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon (the polls closing at 6:00 PM) to act upon the following subjects:

**Article 1.** To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

You are hereby further notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Wilmot the 14th day of March, next at seven of the clock in the evening to act upon the following subjects:

**Article 2.** To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same. Recommended by the Selectmen.

**Article 3.** To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell any material or equipment deemed to be surplus to the Town needs; the sale of highway material or equipment to be made with the approval of the Road Agent. Recommended by the Selectmen.

**Article 4.** To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to convey any real estate acquired by the Town by tax collector's deed either by public auction or sealed bid. Recommended by the Selectmen.

**Article 5.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$35,000 (Thirty five thousand dollars and no cents) to reclaim and pave approximately 1,900 feet of North Wilmot Road, starting where paving ended last year. Recommended by the Selectmen.

**Article 6.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$30,000.00 (Thirty thousand dollars and no cents) for the Wilmot Volunteer Fire Company, Inc. Recommended by the Selectmen.

**Article 7.** To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the amount of \$5,000 (Five thousand dollars and no cents) plus interest earned from the Capital Reserve Fund that was set up several years ago for the proposed new Fire Station and to make those funds available to the Wilmot Volunteer Fire Co., Inc. Recommended by the Selectmen.

**Article 8.** To see if the Town will vote, pursuant to RSA 154:1, III, to choose the Wilmot Volunteer Fire Company, Inc. as its form of fire department organization and, further, to choose, pursuant to RSA 154:1-bb, the form of financing and the form of property ownership of the Wilmot Volunteer Fire Company, Inc. (which are different than the requirements of RSA 154:1-a and RSA 154:1-b). Recommended by the Selectmen.

**Article 9.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750.00 (Seven hundred and fifty dollars and no cents) for the Kearsarge Area Council on Aging, an organization formed to promote, develop and reinforce programs which support and enhance the health, well-being, dignity and independence of individuals 55 years of age and older living in Wilmot and other area towns. Petitioned by Kathryn Butler and others.

**Article 10.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$18,000 (Eighteen thousand dollars and no cents) to resurface a section of Campground Road beginning at Village Road to Pancake Street. Recommended by the Selectmen.

**Article 11.** To see if the Town will vote to accept so-called Clarke Road as a Town Road, Class V, said Clarke Road having been constructed in accordance with Town specifications as reported by the Town Road Agent. Recommended by the Selectmen.

## REPORT OF THE SELECTMEN

The year 1994 can best be characterized as one of change and progress. A number of programs were initiated and/or completed this past year, and it is often easy to overlook the many positive accomplishments.

The Space Needs Committee was established as the result of a vote at last year's Town Meeting, and it was charged with the responsibility of assessing the anticipated future and current needs of the Town. This committee has done an excellent job, and they have reported their findings to the Board. We have asked them to share their findings with you at this year's Town Meeting.

We continue to move ahead on the 911 program, and we have completed naming all of the streets and roads in Wilmot. The next step is the assignment of numbers to each house. After these numbers have been assigned, you will be notified of your number. It will be your responsibility to display this number so that it is readily identifiable. Details concerning the manner in which this display should take place will be forthcoming. Our recyclables are now being taken care of by the same company that handles our solid waste, Waste Management Inc. As a result of this change, we anticipate some additional savings in our trash disposal program. The Recycling Committee continues to do an excellent job in providing oversight and making recommendations to the Board.

It is with regret that we will no longer have Anitra Griffin as Wilmot's representative on the School Board. Anitra has faithfully and competently served for seven years as a dedicated and unselfish promoter of quality education. As citizens of the Town of Wilmot, we are fortunate to have had such an outstanding representative. Thank you, Anitra. Having served for ten years as Wilmot's Transfer Station Attendant, Clayton Nowell has decided to pursue other interests. The Town is especially grateful to Clayton for his dedicated and faithful service. This position is essential to our waste management and recycling program, and over the years, Clayton has done much to make this program a success. We would also like to thank Kevin Drake for his dedicated service on the Budget Committee. We wish them all the best for the future and extend our sincere thanks for their efforts on behalf of the Town.

The Board of Selectmen wishes to publicly acknowledge with grateful appreciation the efforts of the dedicated employees of the Town, the many volunteers who serve on our various boards and commissions, and the many community-spirited citizens who come forward to work on special projects or to offer their help and support. The efforts and the positive attitudes of our citizens help make Wilmot an outstanding community.

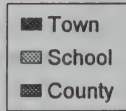
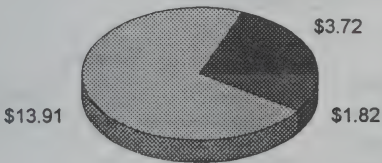


### 1993 Tax Rate

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, March 8, 1994, to act upon the following subjects:



The meeting began by the Moderator, Robert K. Minard, Jr. explaining the rules of the meeting and announcing the meeting would be taped for reference.

The moderator than gave the invocation and Keith Fleury lead the group in the Pledge of Allegiance.

ARTICLE 2: Mr Earle Chandler made the motion for the Town "To raise and appropriate the sum of \$407,599 to defray town charges for the ensuing year, any income from other sources other than property taxes to be tied into this appropriation." Motion was seconded. Mr. Chandler then reviewed the budget and answered any questions. Motion was passed.

ARTICLE 3: Mr. Nelson Chitterling made the motion to adopt Article 3 as written: "For the Town to accept the provision of RSA 33:7 providing that any town at an annual meeting may adopt an article authorizing indefinitely, until specific rescision of such authority, the selectmen to issue tax anticipated notes." Motion was seconded, discussion followed. Motion passed unanimously.

ARTICLE 4: Mr. Robert Tawney made the motion to adopt Article 4 as written: "To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell any material or equipment deemed to be surplus to the Town needs; the sale of highway material or equipment to be made with the approval of the Road Agent." Motion was seconded, discussion followed, motion passed with one in opposition.

ARTICLE 5: Mr. Nelson Chitterling made the motion to adopt Article 5 as written: "To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to apply for, accept and expend, without any further action by town meeting, money from the state, federal or other governmental unit or a private source which becomes available during the year in accordance with RSA 31:95-b, indefinitely until rescinded." Motion was seconded, discussion followed, motion passed with one in opposition.

ARTICLE 6: Mr. Robert Tawney made the motion to adopt Article 6 as written: "To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to convey any real estate acquired by the Town by tax collector's deed either by public auction or sealed bid." Motion was seconded, discussion followed. A motion was made to amend Article 6 as follows: "To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to convey any real estate acquired by the Town by tax collector's deed by public auction." Amendment was seconded. Amendment was defeated. The vote on Article 6 as presented was voted on and passed with two in opposition.

ARTICLE 7: Mr. Earle Chandler made the motion to adopt Article 7 as written: "To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to accept, on behalf of the Town, gifts, legacies, and devises made to the Town in trust for any public purpose as permitted by RSA 31:19 indefinitely until rescinded." Motion was seconded, motion passed with one in opposition.

At this time a special THANKS to Henry Patten and his highway crew for all the hard work they have done for the Town was given.

ARTICLE 8: Mr. Nelson Chitterling made the motion to adopt Article 8 as written: "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$38,000 (Thirty eight thousand dollars and no cents) to reclaim and pave approximately 3,800 feet of North Wilmot Road, starting at the intersection of Pinnacle Road and North Wilmot Road." The Motion was seconded, discussion followed, motion passed with four in opposition.

ARTICLE 9: Mr. Richard Lee, Fire Chief, made the motion to adopt Article 9 as written: "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$30,000 (Thirty thousand dollars and no cents) for the Wilmot Volunteer Fire Company, Inc." Motion was seconded, discussion followed, motion passed.

ARTICLE 10: Mr. Robert Tawney made the motion to adopt Article 10 as written: "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000 (Ten thousand dollars and no cents) for the purpose of increasing office space for the Town government." Motion was seconded, discussion followed, motion passed 44 in favor and 25 in opposition.

ARTICLE 11: Ms. Deirdre Seigerson made the motion to adopt Article 11 as written: "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750 (Seven hundred fifty dollars and no cents) for the Kearsarge Area Council on Aging, an organization formed to promote, develop and reinforce programs which support and enhance the health well being, dignity and independence of individuals 55 years of age and older living in Wilmot and other area towns." Motion was seconded, motion passed with two in opposition.

ARTICLE 12: Mr. Nelson Chitterling made the motion to adopt Article 12 as written: "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$27,000 (Twenty seven thousand dollars and no cents) to resurface a section of Village Road from the intersection of Campground and Village Road to Route 11 by the Town office Building." Motion was seconded, discussion followed, motion passed with seven in opposition.

ARTICLE 13: Mr. Robert Tawney made the motion to adopt Article 13 as written: "To see if the Town will vote to join the central New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission and discontinue membership in the Upper Valley-Sunapee Regional Commission." Motion was seconded, discussion followed, motion was passed unanimously.

ARTICLE 14: Mr. George Howe made the motion to adopt Article 14 as written: "To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provision of RSA Chapter 36-A, Conservation Commission, and to establish, in 1994, a Wilmot Conservation Commission of not less than three nor more than seven members who shall be appointed by the Selectmen as specified in RSA 36-A:3. The purpose of a conservation commission is 'proper utilization and protection of natural resources ... protection of watershed resources'. Discussion followed. Motion was defeated 41 in opposition 37 in favor.

ARTICLE 15: Was passed over since it pertained to the passing of Article 14.

Mr. George Howe then spoke about the recycling display that was available for everyone to view.

Mr. Pieter Sweet spoke concerning the upcoming school meeting, and urged everyone to attend and vote on Article 2.

There was a special THANKS to Mr. Bill Best for all his work regarding the school issue.

A special thanks was given to Jane Kenyon and Donald Hall for their poem that appears on the front of the town report.

A motion was made to adjourn the meeting and seconded, motion carried.

## In Memory of Richard H.A. Bacon

Dick was born in Union, New Jersey on March 8, 1929, the son of the late Achilles J. and Viola (Weisner) Bacon. He had resided in Florida for the past 3 years, previously living in Wilmot for over 30 years. While in Florida, Dick had been employed as a production manager for ASI Sign Systems. He owned and operated Ye Old Shavehorse Workshop while in Wilmot where he was a cabinetmaker and craftsman. He restored antiques, also owning an antique shop. For several years, Dick and Marilyn owned and operated Mountain View Oil Co. and from 1948-1959, Dick had been employed by New London Fuel Co. Dick was a U.S. Army Veteran, serving during the Korean Conflict with the Military Police. He was a former member of the Wilmot Volunteer Fire Department, a former member for over 25 years and past president of The Wilmot Community Association, one of the organizers of the Wilmot Little League in 1962, and he donated the land for the Wilmot Community Association Beach Program. For 18 years, Dick had been a selectman for the Town of Wilmot, and when he took office, he was the youngest in the state. His father, Achilles J. Bacon, died in 1988. Dick died in Concord, New Hampshire on September 8, 1994. He is survived by his wife of 44 years, Marilyn; three sons, David, Darrell, and Glenn; five grandchildren, Matthew, Ashley, Leah, Calla, and Heather, his mother, Viola; three sisters, Marilyn, Patricia and Gail; aunts, uncles, nieces, nephews, grandnieces, grandnephews, two great grandnephews, and cousins.



## FLORENCE LANGLEY MEMORIAL PARK DEDICATION Old Home Day - August 21, 1994

*The following has been excerpted from a speech given by Frances B. Wilcox at the dedication of the Florence Langley Memorial Park. Mrs. Wilcox credited Judith Walker and Florence's nephew Walter for the factual material on Florence's life and cited the many individuals who helped to make the mini-park possible.*

. . .In 1902, Aubrey and Abbie Langley moved into the Bunker house, across from Bunker Hill Cemetery; Florence was born there on September 13 of the same year. She lived there until her graduation from Proctor Academy in 1920. Our young Wilmot woman dreamed of attending Simmons College in Boston. Her father advised her to work for two years and to save for her tuition. After taking a course at Keene Normal School (now Keene State College), she taught at the Stearns School in North Wilmot from 1921 to 1923. Then, with her savings and with financial help from her parents, she was able to realize her dream. A 1927 graduate of Simmons, she taught home economics in the high schools of Lyndonville, Vermont, and Laconia and Milford. A pioneer in the fields of family and sex education, Florence developed a nationally-recognized course on these subjects.

In 1973, Florence retired and returned to Wilmot. The little white house at the junction of Pinnacle Road and North Wilmot Road was the center of her very active life. Articles published in *New Hampshire Echoes*, *New Hampshire Profiles* and *Yankee* magazines were written there. Her three books: When School Bells Rang, With Prayer and Psalm and Glimpse of the Past, all reflect a deep appreciation of Wilmot and of its history. In addition to her writing, Florence served as cemetery trustee for ten years and was a member of the town history committee from 1973 until her death. After serving as vice-president of the Wilmot Historical Society for its beginning two years, she continued to be active in this organization until illness made it impossible. A faithful member of the First Congregational Church of Wilmot, she always occupied the same pew - just in front of where I sat.

The boulder on which the memorial plaque is placed was brought from that area of Pinnacle Road along which she frequently walked. Florence Langley died June 27, 1991. Her branch of the Langley family has lived in Wilmot since the mid-1800's. She is survived by a sister, Annie Langley Walker, of South Danbury, and by a brother, Frank Langley, of Wilmot, as well as nieces and nephews.

Program growth and widespread support to the two-year-old COA confirm that we are successfully addressing important and previously unmet human needs. In 1994 our membership grew to almost 1200 individuals, and three new programs significantly expanded our services. New services include: (1) The Telephone Reassurance Program (daily phone calls). (2) The Good Day Respite Program for those with memory impairment. Financial support came from every one of the nine towns as well as from generous individuals, grateful clients, local businesses and organizations, and grants from private foundations. Volunteers (250) are the hands that reach out to their neighbors, the real backbone and essential ingredient of COA's effective presence; they represent "people support", our greatest resource.

On behalf of our older neighbors who are at the core of our mission, thank you to both our financial supporters and our volunteers (our people supporters). We look forward once more to another year of growth and service.

We anticipate an equally busy 1995. The trustees will continue their monthly meetings and remain members of the New Hampshire Library Trustees Association. The Friends will compile a Wilmot-Danbury phonebook for distribution soon. Plans for new programs are underway.

Kathi Donovan continues as our librarian extraordinaire. Without her skill and enthusiasm we might become just another library. We thank her sincerely. ## 1994 REPORT OF THE WILMOT PLANNING BOARD

While only three minor subdivisions were approved in 1994, it was a relatively busy year for the planning board. Ten public hearings were conducted during the year to act on the three subdivisions, four site plans, five re-subdivisions (annexations) and nine preliminary hearings.

The three subdivisions involved dividing existing parcels into two lots or parcels. Of the five re-subdivisions, three involved combining two lots into one. The remaining two involved altering the lot lines between two parcels.

The four site plans that were approved included the final approval for the new fire station to be built by the Wilmot Volunteer Fire Department

Included in the nine preliminary hearings was a request by Carl and Gail Olson, owners of New London FloorCraft, to relocate their business to the William Sanborn property on Route 11. They propose to construct a building to house their retail business and provide warehouse space. Their plan also includes a future retail-office building which would be built on the existing foundation. These plans will be acted on early in 1995.

The year saw the departure of Chairman Fred Griffin from his tenure on the Board. His experience and expertise were missed throughout the year. All of us, particularly the Board members, want to thank him for his contributions to the Town. The Board welcomed Deirdre Segerson as a new member and Janet Howe as the new secretary.

## 1994 REPORT OF THE WILMOT RECYCLING COMMITTEE

Recycling slowed in 1994, but was still more than 4% greater than in 1993. A total of over 81 tons of recyclables were shipped to recovery centers. However, the amount of trash jumped sharply, reversing a five-year downtrend, so recycling dropped slightly to about 17% of the total.

The Recycling Committee advised the Selectmen regarding requests for proposals for new contracts on both recycling and general trash disposal. The Town now has a three-year contract with Waste Management of New Hampshire, Inc. for recyclables and trash at rates consistent with what has been paid the past two years. In 1994, recycling saved the Town nearly \$1500.

When we learned that Clayton Nowell would retire early in 1995, we submitted to the Selectmen several qualifications for Transfer Station operator which we felt would maintain and improve Wilmot's recycling program. An important one is helping to guide residents in recycling ONLY containers acceptable to Waste Management (plastic milk jugs, plastic beverage bottles, glass jars & bottles, aluminum cans and pie plates, and tin cans) - NOTHING ELSE.

A second important task is to urge or cajole or in some other way motivate those who have not been recycling to "join the crowd"! The best way to keep the recycling momentum going is to increase participation in what residents voted was to be a mandatory program.

**REPORT OF TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN  
AND STATE FOREST RANGER**

In calendar year 1994, our three (3) leading causes of fires were no permit, children and rekindles of fire where the fire was not properly extinguished.

Violations of RSA 224:27 11, the fire permit law, and other burning laws of the State of New Hampshire are misdemeanors punishable by fines of up to \$2,000 and/or a year in jail. Violators are also liable for all fire suppression costs.

To aid your Forest Fire Warden, Fire Department and State Forest Fire Officials, contact your local Warden or Fire Department to find out if a permit is required. This also helps to prevent unnecessary response to a controlled burn.
