Important Warrant Article Information

American Red Cross- Article 3: This agency responds in times of emergency and supports families as they seek to restore peacefulness to their lives in cases of fire, flood, and winter storm. The Red Cross also trains area residents in CPR and First Aid. In the year 2012 the Red Cross responded to 283 disasters in New Hampshire, helping 632 people. They trained 836 students in 95 classes in medical careers and trained 18,599 people in health and safety classes. They held 1,388 blood drives.

Children Unlimited, Inc.- Article 4: This agency provides services for developmental evaluations, speech/language therapy, physical therapy, family support, and counseling. They provided services to three families living in Chatham. Total amount spent on these three children was \$9,009.00.

White Mountain Community Health Center- Article 5: This agency provides medical care for the underinsured and uninsured Chatham residence. This year they project providing services to 28 patients from Chatham.

Northern Human Services- This organization did not send a request this year.

Saco Valley Fire Department- Article 6: This agency provides fire protection services for the Town of Chatham. They responded to 6 calls.

Fryeburg Rescue- Article 7: This agency provides emergency coverage for the Town of Chatham. They responded to 36 calls.

Lovell Recreation Department- Article 8: This program provides children living in Chatham with the opportunity to participate in sport activities.

Tri-County Community Action- Article 9: This agency provides fuel and electrical assistance to low-income, elderly and or disabled people. This year they provided assistance to 19 households, 9 for fuel assistance (\$8,265), 10 for electrical assistance (\$6,058) and 3 for weatherization (\$16,944).

Eastern Slope Airport Authority- Article 10: The airport is located in Fryeburg Maine. The funds are used for operation and maintenance cost.

CASA- Article 13: Court Appointed Special Advocates for Children would like our support. They provide services for abused and neglected children in New Hampshire. CASA served 45 children living in Carroll County. This number includes children who live in our community.

Charlotte Hobbs Memorial Library of Lovell- Article 13: In 2012 there were 65 Chatham residents who held library cards.

Brownfield Food Pantry- Article 14: The food pantry has helped provide food for several families for Chatham.

Starting Point- Article 15: Starting Point provided 4 Chatham residents with services including crisis intervention, hospital advocacy, police advocacy, in-person support and numerous referrals to a variety of social service providers.

Gibson Center for Senior Services- Article 16- The Gibson Center offers programs to senior citizens that provide them with nutritious meals and transportation. They also provide social/educational programs to enable seniors to stay actively involved in their communities.

Road Agent's Report

2012 has been a productive year for road work project completion. The slopes were cleaned up and new guard-rails were installed on Little Chatham Road. The guardrails on the bridge on Weeks Brook were also repaired. The State has had these items on the necessary repair list for years. The hill on Little Chatham Rd. by the old boys camp had some reconstructive work and some ditching work to fix the recurring washout problems. Drainage and ditching work was done on other parts of the road as well as Beach Rd. and the beach parking area. Gravel was added in several locations and it was graded and shaped. Gravel was also added to Weeks, Dewing, Province Brook, and Toad Hill Roads. Drainage work was done on Butter Hill Road to address the water problem in the section between the state shed and the bridge. Gravel was also added in several areas.

The rest of the guardrail work will be done in 2013. More gravel will be added and more grading will be done to get rid of the potholes on Butter Hill and Little Chatham Roads. The grading program seems to be working pretty well. We have had heavy rains in all seasons with very little damage. As one of five members of the Executive Council, I will again take the Oath of office on January 3, 2013. I am now representing 108 Towns, four cities- Berlin, Laconia, Claremont and Lebanon spread across all or parts of seven of NH's ten Counties, - Carroll, Grafton, Belknap, Coos, Sullivan, Strafford and Merrimack. I was sorry to lose, through the redistricting process, the towns of Belmont and Charlestown.

Governor Hassan will be the tenth Governor I have served with in the last 35-36 years of public service to the 263,000 people of this large Northern Rural District. The Governor is required to nominate citizens to serve on the dozens of volunteer Boards and Commissions which the Council will vote on. 2013-2014 is the year of the 10 year NH Transportation Plan. We then submit our recommendations to the Governor by December 15, 2013. The Governor reviews and submits her recommendations of the plan to the NH House and Senate by February 15, 2014 which will become a legislative bill concluding with a new 10 year transportation plan by July 1, 2014. Report of Forest Fire Warden and State Forest Ranger

Your local Forest Fire Warden, Fire Department, and the State of New Hampshire Division of Forests & Lands, work collaboratively to reduce the risk and frequency of wildland fires in New Hampshire. To help us assist you, please contact your local Forest Fire Warden or Fire Department to determine if a permit is required before doing ANY outside burning. Under State law (RSA 227-L:17) a fire permit is required for all outside burning, unless the ground is completely covered with snow. The New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services also prohibits the open burning of household waste. Citizens are encouraged to contact the local fire department or DES at 603-271-1370 or www.des.state.nh.us for more information. Safe open burning requires diligence and responsibility. Help us to protect New Hampshire's forest resources. For more information please contact the Division of Forests & Lands at (603) 271-2214, or online at www.nhdfl.org.

Due to a record warm winter and little snow, our first fire occurred on February 4th with several more early fires to follow. Normally a large percentage of the warm windy days with low humidity occur when the ground is saturated from a long snow covered winter. By the time the surface fuels and ground dry out enough to burn, we only have a few weeks until "green up". This year however we had an extended period of these favorable spring fire conditions. Our largest fire in the state was 86 acres. The average size fire was .6 acres. Extensive summer rains kept total acreage burned to near normal levels

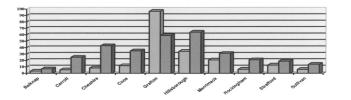
As has been the case over the last few years, state budget constraints have limited the staffing of our statewide system of 16 fire lookout towers to Class III or higher fire danger days. Despite the reduction in the number of days staffed, our fire lookouts are credited with keeping most fires small and saving several structures due to their quick and accurate spotting capabilities. The towers fire spotting was supplemented by the NH Civil Air Patrol when the fire danger was especially high. Several of the fires during the 2012 season threatened structures, a constant reminder that forest fires burn more than just trees. Please help Smokey Bear, your local fire department, and the state's Forest Rangers by being fire wise and fire safe!

CHATHAM HISTORICAL SOCIETY

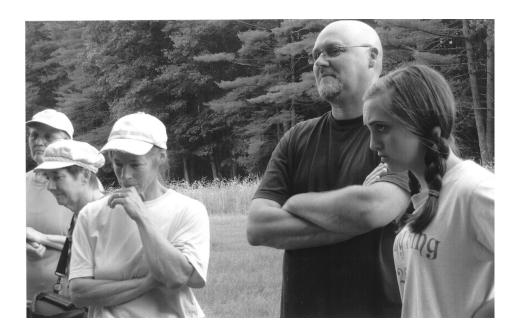
