Section 2-C or shall be supported by piers placed on a concrete slab no less than $3\frac{1}{2}$ " thick and no less than the outside dimensions of the unit. The topsoil will be removed and no less than 12" of approved gravel will be placed and compacted under the slab. Piers shall be placed under chassis so as to allow no greater span than 12 feet. Piers of solid masonry material no less than 120 sq. inches on top and its base to be no less at its smallest diameter than half its height. Wheels will be removed from axles and unit shall be skirted.

Vote on Article 11 to be by ballot.

Business Meeting was called to order at 7:04 P.M. with the reading of the Town Warrant by the Moderator, Clifford J. Holmes. Action was then taken on various articles as follows:

Article 2. It was moved and seconded that the article be accepted as read. The Town will appropriate and authorize the selectmen to use the income, estimated to be \$37,835.00. Also to defray Town charges, estimated to be \$53,188.00. Vote -- Yes.

Article 3. It was moved and seconded to accept the article as read. The Town will appropriate the sum of \$58,000.00 for the maintenance of highways and bridges. The State of New Hampshire to furnish approximately \$24,000.00 in State Aid. The Town will raise the remainder. (Approximately \$34,000.00) Vote -- Yes.

Article 4. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2000.00 for the Capital Reserve Fund previously establised for the purchase of highway equipment. Moved and seconded Vote -- Yes.

Article 5. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,221.00 for the Fall Mt. Branch of the Home Health Care and Community Services. Moved and Seconded Vote -- Yes.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,800.00 for the Capital Expense of the Fire Department. Moved and Seconded Vote -- Yes.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for the conversion of the mini-pumper as a combination fire and emergency medical vehicle, using the money realized from the sale of the excess fire equipment (tank from the C.D. Tanker and present body on the mini-pumper). The Town will raise the balance. Moved and Seconded Vote -- Yes.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell the body from the mini-pumper, the tank from the C.D. Tanker, and any other equipment no longer needed on either vehicle. Moved and Seconded. Vote --Yes

1984 has been a big year for the Langdon Fire Department. The year started with a testimonial supper honoring two of our members. Being recognized as honorary firemen and receiving plaques were Ben Porter and John Skowfoe. Both Ben and John have given many years to the department and are still active. We thank you both for being of service to the Fire Department and the community. Congratulations!

On January 28, 1984 the new fire truck arrived. By the afternoon it had met and passed all the pump performance tests given by independent inspectors, the men in the department had a chance to drill with it, and we had it equipped and in service that night. This sounds simple, but new trucks don't always do what they're supposed to and some don't get into service for weeks after delivery. The new truck has greatly changed our ability to quickly attack a fire by having all water and equipment on one vehicle, so we can concentrate on getting it there and getting the job done safely and effectively. It has already proved to be effective and efficient in protecting life and property. We are all very proud of this new unit in Langdon's station.

The members in the department have raised funds of their own this year through our annual Mothers' Day Pancake Breakfast and this year we tried a Fall Roast Beef Supper which was quite well attended. Our thanks for your support in our fund raising efforts.

A large thank you goes to those of you who have donated to the Langdon Fire and Rescue. These donations mean a great deal, not only monetarily, but also in knowing of the support of the community in our efforts to help serve you. Thank you again from all of us.

Fire service training was taken by a large number of men this year, not only at Meadowood, but also at the new school in Springfield, Vt. These sessions are valuable and we are fortunate to have them available.

Our EMT's were busy this year, receiving more training and attending schools and seminars to keep abreast of changes and to be certified. Every year EMT's complete many hours of training to keep their certification, and we thank them for their effort. They will come to your aid, any time, day or night, by dialing 352-1100. Langdon is fortunate to have these people and their service. Thank you all.

In the year ahead we hope to finish converting the minipumper into a combination rescue and back-up pumper vehicle which we feel will work quite well. Also, we are trying to finish off upstairs in the station to make it more presentable and workable.

In conclusion, may I say thank you to the men and women who have made it possible for there to be a Langdon Fire and Rescue. Your time and concern is greatly appreciated.

REPORT OF THE TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND STATE FOREST RANGER

Our first forest fire prevention law was enacted by our State Legislature 90 years ago. This early law set in place a cooperative forest fire prevention and suppression effort between city and town governments and State government. It simply stated that no open fire could be kindled, when the ground is free of snow, without the written permission of the town/city Forest Fire Warden. This law also stated that anyone kindling a fire without written permission shall be liable for the damage caused and subject to a \$1,000 fine.

During the past 90 years, this law has worked so well that it has remained unchanged. All open fires when the ground is not covered with snow must be authorized by the local Forest Fire Warden. Persons kindling a fire without a permit when one is required are liable for damages caused, fire suppression costs and subject to a \$1,000 fine.

This cooperative fire prevention law has contributed significantly to our nationally recognized annual forest fire loss record.

By January 1, 1986 the Planning Board has the responsibility to prepare a master plan, the sole purpose and effect to aid the Planning Board in the performance of its duties. The master plan shall include topics regarding land use, housing, recreation, conservation, and shall include among other things to provide health, safety and the general welfare of Langdon in the process of planning and growth,

The Planning Board meets in the Town Hall or the Sarah Porter School on the last Tuesday of each month. For the most part, the focus of meetings has been on the preparation of principles and objectives as a basis for developing the master plan.

In this year's warrant there is an article which, if approved, will require a minimum floor area of 600 square feet for mobile homes - the same as the requirement for conventional dwellings. An article will also allow for mobile homes to be placed on a concrete slab as an option to the current requirement of an in-ground concrete foundation. We ask your support of the articles.

Members of the planning board have been very diligent and responsible in their attendance and attending to Planning Board matters, for which I am very grateful and appreciative. Members are Rodney Campbell, Caroline Cross, Joe Holmes, Marilyn Martin, John Menton, Carroll Robbins and Fred Roentsch.

The cost of these visits was covered by your town appropriation, contributions, county funds and trust funds. The average contribution toward a visit averages less than 10% of the total cost.
