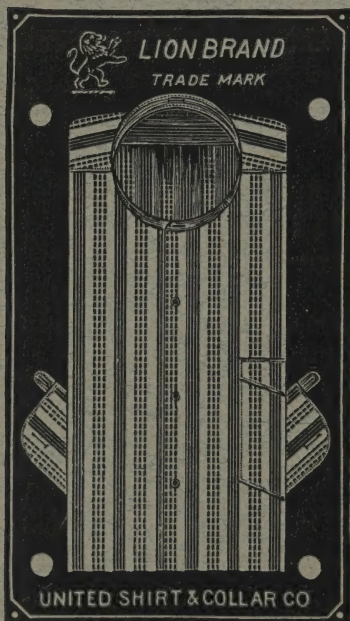

Warrant for Annual Town Meeting.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

{ L. S. }

To the inhabitants of the town of Lebanon qualified to vote in town affairs :

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said town, on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

First. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

Second. To choose three Selectmen, Overseer of the Poor, Collector of Taxes, Highway Agent, and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Third. To see if the town will vote to have a Liquor Agent the ensuing year.

Fourth. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

Fifth. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to repair highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

Sixth. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the construction and repair of sewers and sidewalks for the ensuing year.

Seventh. To see what sum or sums of money the town will vote to raise for the improvement of the cemeteries of the town, or act thereon.

Eighth. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the proper observance of Memorial Day.

Ninth. To hear the report of the Auditors and Town School Board.

Tenth. To determine the division of the school money.

Eleventh. To see what sum of money the town will vote to appropriate for the benefit of the Band, or act thereon.

Twelfth. To see if the town will vote to accept the provisions of Chapter 83, of the Session laws of 1901, having reference to Trust Funds,—the said Chapter being an amendment to Chapter 40, of the Session laws of 1899,—or act thereon.

Thirteenth. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to make a reduction in the rental of the Town Hall to Religious Societies, or act thereon.

Fourteenth. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to purchase the furniture now in the Post-office, and put in a bid and lease the rooms to the Post-office Department, for a term of five years, or act thereon.

Fifteenth. To see if the town will vote to discontinue a portion of the highway on the easterly side of Church Street, so called, near the Congregational Church, or act thereon.

Sixteenth. To see if the town will vote to maintain a free bed at the Mary Hitchcock Hospital, in Hanover; said bed to be for the benefit and use of the legal residents of Lebanon, or act thereon.

Report of the Board of Health.

VITAL STATISTICS: No. of marriages, 66; No. of births, 104; males, 63; females, 41. The girls, it appears, were in a large minority, and if the boys were confined in a choice of mates to girls of 1901, the girls would be at a premium. The number of deaths was 77; males, 35; females, 42. As to their ages—between 70 and 80, 9; between 80 and 90, 10; between 90 and 100, 0; over 100, 1 at the great age of 104. Deaths by prominent diseases—pneumonia, 10; apoplexy, 6; cancer, 6; consumption, 4. This last disease has hitherto been the great destroyer of the human race, and that only four out of a population of 5,000 should die in one year, is very remarkable. Infant mortality, under 10, 15. A number of cases of diphtheria were reported, but there were no deaths, and all of the cases proved to be very mild, and as easily managed as a common cold. Many of these cases were located at West Lebanon. The Board made a thorough examination of the premises and sewers, and school-house, which was thoroughly disinfected from cellar to attic.

Many complaints of nuisances were considered by the Board and abated as far as was in their power.

The Board hereby gives notice that the provisions of Chapter 108, Section 10, of the Public Statutes, will be enforced the coming year, so far as swine are concerned, to wit: "No pen or sty for swine, shall be erected, or continued in such place or condition, as in the judgment of the Health Officers to be a nuisance or injurious to the public health."

Cemetery Reports.

Report of Superintendent of the Village Cemetery.

The cemetery was thoroughly cleaned in the spring, and mowed twice during the season. The evergreen trees were trimmed and the roads were kept in good order. As in every previous season, some work was done in straightening and lining up headstones. A part of the fence that was in a very bad condition, was painted with two coats of paint. A small piece of land was purchased of the Worthen Estate for storage purposes. Two parties have left funds with the Selectmen, for the perpetual care of lots, and we hope many more will take advantage of the law that was adopted by the town at the last annual meeting, for the perpetual care of lots. The rules adopted by the Selectmen in connection with this law, can be found on the inside pages of the Free Press for Feb. 21.

A part of the fence on the South and West sides of the cemetery should be rebuilt the coming season.

There are no large bills against the Committee that are unpaid.

We would recommend that the same amount be raised this year as last.

Report of Superintendent of the Glenwood Cemetery.

During the past season a very much needed story and half building, 14x25 feet has been erected. A part of this building is used as an office and waiting room, and the remainder for storage purposes. A part of the road leading to the cemetery has been widened out, and about 175 feet of paved gutters have been built. More work should be done on this road the coming season. The fence on the South side should be rebuilt the coming season as a number of the posts have rotted off.

During the past season, Mr. Marston purchased a lowering device, which has been used in the two cemeteries and has worked very satisfactorily.

There are no large unpaid bills with the exception of my bill for labor, and there is enough due, that can be collected later, with the amount in the treasurer's hands to pay that.

Owing to the expense of the new building, the fund for the sale of lots has been reduced smaller than usual.

We would recommend that the same amount be raised as last year.

The Cemetery at West Lebanon.

The public interest of the past two seasons was well maintained this year.

Several lots were graded and re-seeded by the holders, and one or two more new flower-beds put in.

The whole cemetery was thoroughly cleaned up in the early spring, and the grass cut and trimmed often as practicable during the season.

By the aid of a generous public subscription, water was introduced from the village system.

Some 700 feet of pipe was laid, and 70 feet of hose procured and now, practically, the whole cemetery can be well watered whenever necessary.

A fund was also started for a fountain, which we hope to see installed early the coming season.

To Mr. Farman, our former Supt., is due the credit for engineering the water and fountain funds, and much other help.

May the good work continue.


