

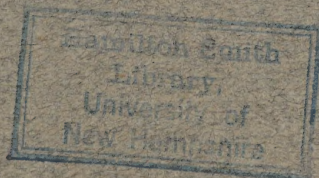

# The State of New Hampshire

---

*To the inhabitants of the town of Milton, in the County of Strafford in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said town on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.
3. To see if the town will vote to ask for Federal Aid for reconstructing the Trunk Line Highway in said town, raise and appropriate a sum of money necessary therefore, and pass any other vote or votes in relation to the same.
4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairing highways and bridges the ensuing year.
5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Trunk Line and State Aid Highways in said town, and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

6. On petition of John E. Horne and sixty-three others: To see if the town will vote to purchase a ten ton gasoline tractor and snow-plow for use upon the highways of said town, and to raise, appropriate, or hire upon notes of the town an amount of money necessary to pay for said tractor and snow-plow, and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

7. To see what method the town will vote to adopt for breaking roads the coming winter, raise and appropriate a sum of money, not exceeding four thousand dollars to pay for the same, and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of street lights the ensuing year.

9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding one hundred and fifty dollars for Memorial Day expenses.

10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay its notes and interest, and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

11. To see if the town will raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100) for the purpose of improving and maintaining the park on Main Street in front of the R. R. Station.

12. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money not to exceed two thousand dollars to be deposited in a savings bank there to remain, together



with the interest thereon, as a fund for rebuilding the Trunk Line Highway when it shall become necessary and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

13. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

## SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

*To the School Board of Milton:*

At the close of another fiscal year of the town, it is my privilege to submit to you and to the citizens my sixth annual report as superintendent of your schools. This is accompanied by the report of the school nurse and the report of the Headmaster of Nute High school.

Comparing this table with that of last year it will be seen that there is but little change in the total enrollment, average membership, and average attendance. We have made a gain in the per cent. of attendance but not in punctuality.

This roll should be considerably longer. With a little more co-operation on the part of parents, it would be.

I am pleased to be able to report that we lost only one teacher in the elementary schools at the end of the year. In the high school we lost one-half the teachers. This is our too common experience. Until we are able to pay higher salaries to the assistant teachers in our high school, we must expect to continue training teachers here for other communities to take as soon as we have given them their experience.

Nearly all the money appropriated for repairs a year ago had to be expended upon Milton Grammar School. Extensive repairs were made upon the roof, and the interior of the building was renovated. Other buildings received only the usual cleaning and minor repairs.

During the first part of the year ending Dec. 31, 1924, the health work in the schools was under the direction of Miss Eva M. Nelson, Red Cross community nurse, as during the preceding year. In September Miss Nelson was succeeded by Miss Kathryn M. Wadleigh, whose report will follow.

Milk and cracker lunches are again being provided this year at Milton Village through the interest and liberality of the Milton Woman's Club. To that organization we again extend our thanks.

It seems to be our lot to be obliged to contend with some contagious disease every year. This year we have had a short epidemic of measles at Milton Grammar School, which cut into attendance in grades I and IV rather badly. At the present writing there are a

few cases of scarlet fever in Milton Village. Every care is being taken to prevent the spread of this disease and we do not anticipate any serious epidemic. As a measure of precaution, however, we have thought it best to begin our February vacation one week earlier than we had intended to do.

The action of the district in making an appropriation at the last annual meeting to pay in part for the transportation to Nute High School of pupils living at a distance has assisted in increasing the enrollment in the high school this year. The appropriation was not large enough to give to all who were entitled to assistance the full amount authorized by the vote of the district. In order to treat all alike the committee decided to distribute the appropriation pro rata to all entitled to assistance. This will give to each pupil about \$1.80 per week for the school year.

The report of the headmaster of Nute High School will follow. I am sure that it will be of interest to all citizens.

In recent years there has been wide-spread criticism that the pupils in the high schools are weak in such fundamental subjects as spelling and arithmetic. There is some foundation for this complaint. However, this weakness is more likely to be due to the fact that these fundamentals are little used in high school than to a lack of preparation in the elementary schools.

To test the proficiency of the pupils in New Hampshire high schools in these subjects, standardized tests in arithmetic and spelling were given to second year pupils in all high schools in the State in January, 1924. Similar tests were again given in June. The table below shows the median scores of these two tests for the pupils of Nute High School.

The showing of Nute High School is very creditable, standing well above the average for the State.

In the four fundamental operations in arithmetic the number of high schools in the State having the same or better scores ranges from 2 to 22. The number of high schools having the same or better scores in spelling is 22 in both tests.

I am especially glad to be able to report that of the 25 pupils who completed the eighth grade last June, 22 were enrolled last September in high schools or academies. Most of these are in Nute High School. This is a much better showing than usual.

The pupils in each school are weighed every month when weather permits, and inspected for pediculosis, skin, and contagious diseases.

The school lunch of milk and crackers will be furnished (at Milton Grammar School) the same as last year by the Woman's Club.

Better care of the teeth should be taken by the children. Many of them are their permanent teeth and need attention at once. Through the Red Cross and Woman's Club I hope to arrange a dental clinic in the Spring. This will save expense both to the parents and for conveyance to the dentist by the Red Cross. Each child with consent of the parents will



have a chance to have his teeth filled and cleaned at a minimum price. With co-operation from the Red Cross, Woman's Club, and parents I think this can be made satisfactory to all.

I wish to thank you for your co-operation and interest during the past year.

## REPORT OF HEADMASTER OF NUTE HIGH SCHOOL

### *To the Trustees of Nute High School:*

I herewith submit my first annual report as headmaster of Nute High School.

School opened this year with an enrollment of sixty-eight, showing an increase of twenty over the previous year. Of this number nine are seniors, seven are juniors, seventeen are sophomores, and thirty-five are freshmen. This is one of the largest classes that has ever entered Nute High School. The number of tuition pupils has increased also, this year there being twenty-five out-of-town pupils. From this source the school realizes approximately \$1,200. Up to the time of this report, only two students have left school through loss of interest, while two more have moved out of town, and I believe that this number will not be added to for the remainder of the year.

The school offers two courses, Academic and Commercial. The Academic Course prepares pupils to enter college, majoring in four years of Latin. The Com-

mercial Course tends to give a more general education, specializing in commercial work. However, by taking an extra subject, one can enter most of the state universities from this course.

The High School is ranked by the State Department of Education as a four-year, Class A school, and has also recently been given the certificate privilege for a period of three years by the College Entrance Examination Board.

I am a firm believer in athletics in moderation, and here again I believe Nute has made a very creditable record, especially in basket-ball. I wish to take this opportunity to thank the trustees, in behalf of the students, who so generously contributed and made it possible to have shower baths and lockers at the high school. I assure you that they are used and appreciated.

The building needs refinishing inside very badly, and the sashes, doors, etc., need to be painted.

The school has three very conscientious teachers in Miss McIntyre, Miss Payne, and Mrs. Newell.

I most earnestly recommend that the tuition be raised to at least \$60, which would be lower than the average of the State; and, a part, at least, of this money be used to increase the teachers' salaries, so that a teacher can be kept more than one year.

I wish to thank all who have helped the high school in any way during the past two years, also the Trustees and Superintendent for their co-operation.
