



Town Warrant

The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Hampton, New Hampshire, the County of Belknap in the State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the New Hampton Town House on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March 1979 at ten of the clock in the forenoon to cast your ballots for Town Officers and for the questions required by law to be on the ballots. Polls to close not earlier than 6:00 P.M.

The remainder of the warrant will be acted upon at the New Hampton Town House, Saturday, March 17, 1979 at 10:00 A.M.

1. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, and authorize the withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund established under the Provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 the sum of \$6,300.00 for the purchase of a Police Cruiser and to transfer the present Cruiser from the Police Department to the Fire Department.

3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to be put into the Capital Reserve Fund for a new Fire Truck.

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for the purchase of four inch hose for the Fire Department and authorize the withdrawal of the amount for this purpose from the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund established under the Provisions of the State and Local assistance act of 1972.

5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Maintenance and repair of Highways and Bridges.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$30,000.00 for the purchase of a new dump truck and authorize the withdrawal of \$18,700.00 from the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, also to authorize the withdrawal of \$3,120.84 from the Capital Reserve Highway Fund. The balance of \$8,179.16 to be raised by Town Funds.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,200.00 for the purchase of a Highway Plow.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of

\$3,000.00 for the purchase of Highway Department Radios.

9. To see what action the Town will take to raise and appropriate the sum of \$80,000.00 for the purchase of a new Loader. (By Petition).

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,094.19 for Town Road Aid, the State to contribute \$7,294.60 making a total of \$8,388.79.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to hire a Public Auditor to audit the Town Records as required by Federal and State regulations. This article is mandatory as long as the Town receives Federal Revenue Sharing Funds.

12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the expenditures for improvements to Seminole Avenue and raise and appropriate the sum of \$800.00 as its share of the cost, provided the Seminole Avenue Association contributes \$800.00 Said improvements to be made by private contractors under the supervision of the Selectmen. (By Petition)

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,432.80 for Regional Associations; N.A.N.A. \$2,000.00; Bristol Community Center \$730.00; Community Action Program \$746.80; Lakes Region Planning \$756.00; Lakes Region Association \$50.00; Lakes Region Family Service \$150.00.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$222.66 for the support of the Inter-Lakes Day Care Center, said sum being 3.7 percent needed as local matching money.

15. To see if the Town will vote to allow the prepayment of Resident Taxes and authorize the Collector of Taxes to accept such prepayments.

16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize that the Conservation Commission be empowered to manage the Town Forest under the Provisions of RSA 31:11 and that any proceeds as might accrue from said Forest be placed in a separate Conservation Trust Fund to be managed by said Commission.

17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Conservation Commission to retain the unexpended portion of its 1979 Appropriation. Said funds to be placed in a special Conservation Fund in Accordance with RSA 36-A:5.

18. To see if the Town will vote to accept the bequest of F. Morrill and create the Frank P. Morrill Cemetery Fund, as a Town of New Hampton Trust Fund.

19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to accept on behalf of the Town any Federal or State funds which may be made available during 1979. Further, to see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to make application for said funds and then expend the same

for the purpose designated with applicable Federal or State regulations.

20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

21. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to dispose of property acquired by Tax Collector's Deeds.

22. To see what sums of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the Health Officer, The Lakes Region Hospital, The Franklin Hospital, The Sceva Speare Hospital and The Hanover Hospital.

23. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of Cemeteries.

24. To see if the Town will vote to hear reports of the committees; (1.) to review space needs of the New Hampton Town office; (2.) the study committee on schools, and to continue with the present committees in their investigation.

25. To see what action the Town will take to sell the small cub tractor with snow blower and cab to the Cemetery Association providing the Cemetery Association agrees to keep the Town House lawn mowed.

26. To see if the Town will vote to keep all Class six roads as Class six including range roads or private ways that may have been public at one time and not previously given up by the Town.

27. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$22,000.00 for the Reassessment of the Town.

28. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the improvement of Winona Lake West Side Road as its share of the cost, provided the Winona Lake West Side Association contributes \$1,000.00. Said improvements to be made by private contractors under the supervision of the Selectmen. (By Petition)

29. To see if the Town wishes to exclude from its Social Security plan services performed by Election officials or Election workers for each calendar year in which the remuneration paid for such services is less than \$100.00.

30. To see what action the Town will take to allow the Selectmen to appoint a Road Agent and to offer a salary per week including two week vacation pay.

31. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to assist in the purchase of Emergency Medical Equipment and to help defray costs of Emergency Medical Training.

32. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of

\$300.00 for Patriotic Services.

33. To see if the Town will vote the article on Housing for the Elderly as follows: Be it resolved by the Town of New Hampton that the New Hampshire Housing Commission be and is authorized to operate in the Town of New Hampton, in the State of New Hampshire, that said New Hampshire Housing Commission is authorized to sponsor a project for elderly persons under Section 8 of the U. S. Housing Act of 1937 as amended, for the following accommodations: newly constructed housing, eight (8) dwelling units. This article does not constitute any financial expense to the Town and the Town has the right to restrict the number of units constructed on any particular site.

34. To see if the Town will vote to accept the operation of a TV Cable Corporation within the Town.

35. To see what action the Town will take relative to the acceptance of grants of lands or gifts. (By request)

36. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to dispose of surplus town property.

37. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

The New Hampton Recreation Department experienced another successful summer program for our children with Mrs. Bette Bourque as Director, Mr. James George as Assistant Director and Mrs. Eileen Curran-Kondrad as Assistant to Mrs. Bourque in swimming and in arts and crafts. Total enrollment was 99. Highest attendance was 63 for the climb on Mt. Stinson. Average daily attendance was 46. Again the improved Sanbornton Beach was used for the swimming program three afternoons each week. We thank Sanbornton for the use of their beach. Climbing Mt. Stinson, visiting the Squam Lakes Science Center and enjoying the Little Red Wagon Puppet Show were some of the fun things done. Tony Romano organized the games and pet show at Old Home Day even though the rain interfered.

Last winter programs offered were crocheting, knitting, paddle tennis, cooking and contra dance. Cooking with Mrs. Ruth Joyce was the only event that received any interest and that was of several teenagers.

In the spring an Easter egg hunt was held at the Community School with Mrs. Ruth Joyce, Tony Romano and others helping. There were approximately 150 children participating. Parents accompanied their children. Every child received something. To this date there is one plastic egg never found or not turned in.

This winter there is a skating rink at the Community School with the help of the Fire Department's flooding. The Recreation Department subsidized the ski program at Ragged Mountain to make the lessons more easily available to the children at the Community School. Approximately 60 children participated this winter.

New Hampton Police Department 1978 Report

The Police Department had a busy year investigating burglaries. Some of the highlights of these investigations included a trip to Worcester, Mass. to bring back two suspects who burglarized a home on the Old Bristol Road, and another case involved the use of a search warrant to search an apartment of an exconvict to seize the stolen property taken from a home on Straits Road, this person having broken into this same home prior to serving a prison sentence. Late this fall I investigated another series of burglaries that resulted in the arrests of three individuals who were responsible for some thirty burglaries in the Lakes Region. One other interesting arrest that was made this past year involved a man who was picked up for attempting to steal a car and later confessed to a bank robbery that he committed in Boston, Mass. There were five burglaries to private homes reported, of these two were cleared by arrests. There were five burglaries reported by businesses, four of these were cleared by arrest. The Police Department completed its fourth consecutive year without a highway accident fatality. The dispatch center recorded 1600 telephone calls to the department.

I hope to replace the 1976 Pontiac cruiser this year and would like to point out that it has cost .10 cents per mile to operate since its purchase in June, 1976 to December 31, 1978. This cost included purchase price less present value, insurance, repairs, tires, gas and oil. Once again I thank you for your cooperation and support.

New Hampton Conservation Commission

The Commission has had a busy year - we have been mostly involved in meetings and procedures leading to the acquisition of nearly 250 acres of land, including a 30 acre island in Pemigewasset Lake. This land, temporarily named New Hampton Conservation Park, consists of the bulk of the Drake Estate, and Seaver property. On September 24, 1978, the town acquired the property for conservation and recreation use, at no cost to the town. It is estimated that the administration and maintenance of the Park will continue to be at no cost to the town or taxpayers. We already have State and Federal consultants available to help us develop, maintain and administer the above property. This land could not have been acquired without the generosity and interest and guidance of J. Wilcox Brown and State Park Associates, and the tireless efforts of Pat Schlesinger and the contribution of a generous anonymous local citizen.

Membership of the Commission has been strengthened to seven members and consists of Aaron Jaffa, Chairman; Carol Brooks, Co-chairperson; William Huckins; Russell Hahn; Lorene Ballou; Richard Gallagher and William Walsh, Treasurer. The work started by Pat Schlesinger, on Sabbatical leave in Africa, has been very ably carried on by Aaron Jaffa.

Other Commission projects, such as tree planting, wet lands development, clean-ups etc., have not been forgotten.

New Hampton Planning Board

The regular scheduled meeting of the New Hampton Planning Board is held on the third Monday of each month in the Selectmen's office at the Gordon Nash Library. Board members are Joyce Marinace, Jean Vorisek, John Conkling, Chester Butcher, Walter Landry, Raymond Germ, and Richard Hallberg representing the Selectmen. Alternates to the board are Aaron Jaffa and Russ Hahn.

In addition to the regular meetings, many sessions were scheduled to provide the necessary time to develop a long overdue Zoning Ordinance for the town. We were assisted in this endeavor by the Lakes Region Planning Commission. The Board felt if they did not develop such a document and present it to the voters of this town for their consideration, they would be negligent in carrying out the responsibility assigned to them. Newsletters were sent out explaining what zoning is and how the town would benefit from such an ordinance. The first public hearing on the Proposed Zoning Ordinance was held on December 4, 1978 at the Gordon Nash Library. A second hearing was held at the New Hampton Elementary School on February 5, 1979. Members of the board made themselves available to answer questions and explain the contents of the ordinance both to individuals and to meetings of various organizations in the town.

Many subdivision proposals were reviewed and when in conformance with existing Subdivision Regulations were approved. A number of on site inspections were necessary in carrying out this function.

Report of The Town Offices Project Survey Committee

The Committee, whose active members are Lou Gnerre, Kay Underhill, Robert Seaver, Willis Ober and Aaron Jaffa, reviewed recommendations of the Town Master Plan, Growth Predictions, the impact of Routes 93 and 104 and the actions taken or contemplated by surrounding towns of comparable size and potential. We then reviewed various sites and buildings which might accommodate the projected requirements of office space and facilities. Preliminary designs of office arrangement and dimensions were prepared as guideline input. It was found that the Federal Postal Department was contemplating a relocation and Jaffa investigated the possibility of combining the Town offices and Post Office in the same structure using Federal funding for the costs involved and income from the leasing of Post office space for the maintenance of the property. It was felt that this approach was feasible and the Post Office has agreed to delay further action till our town submits a proposal. Mr. Moore, President of the New Hampton School was interviewed and expressed an interest in the possibility of the school sponsoring and owning the project. A ten page report has been filed with the New Hampton Selectmen outlining the details of procedure in each of the proposals. The committee is willing to proceed with the implementation of its directions from t the Selectmen upon request to do so.

Community Action Program

It has been my pleasure to work in the town of New Hampton for the past several months as Director of the Community Action Program Area Center. The programs that C.A.P. services to the residents of New Hampton have been successfully carried out during the past year. Our goals remain the same as in previous years: to provide extensive and comprehensive help to low-income persons through C.A.P. programs and also working with other social service agencies to reach and deliver services to New Hampton residents.

A great portion of our effort has been in information and referral and outreach to "hard-to-reach" areas. In that regard I have maintained office hours at the Gordon Nash Library on a weekly basis to better serve the citizens of New Hampton. I greatly appreciate the cooperation I have received from the library staff and employees at the selectmen's office.

Our greatest success this year was the Emergency Energy Assistance Program (EEAP). This program provided 22 households with up to \$250.00 in emergency energy assistance for fuel, clothing and other necessities due to the harshness of the winter of 1977-78.

There are several other programs which I have compiled in chart form enclosed for your review.

The need for the Community Action Program Area Center has been clearly established over the past years.

It is your support through town funding which has enabled our office to give efficient and supportive services to the Community. In order to continue and improve our services, I am submitting to you the budget for 1979. On behalf of the Meredith Community Action Program Area Center I respectfully request that an article be placed in the town warrant "to see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$746.80 for the continuation of services to low-income residents of New Hampton through the Meredith Office of the Community Action Program, Belknap-Merrimack Counties, Inc." This amount reflects the minimum costs to maintain the area office, less CSA support. It is arrived at by determining local resident participation percentage in relation to the amount of participants from other towns served by this office.

I sincerely appreciate the cooperation you have shown me in the past few months. I expect this relationship to strengthen as time goes on and know that you will give this request your serious attention in order that we may continue to bring this needed program to the citizens of New Hampton.

The Newfound Area Nursing Ass'n, Inc.

The Newfound Area Nursing Association, Inc. has had an exciting year in 1978. The free blood pressure clinics have been increased and expanded to include screenings for sight, hearing, glaucoma, diabetes, anemia and oral cancer. These additional screenings have been done with the much appreciated cooperation of the local Lions Club with their health delivery van, providing us with the use of its more than \$16,000 worth of testing equipment. The new headquarters of the Newfound Area Nursing Association at 61 Lake Street, Bristol has also provided us with space to hold these screenings as well as provide us with the additional space for our added staff needed for the new Home Health Aide Program and future programs.

The Home Health Aide Program provides another level of health care that allows a patient to return home from the hospital quicker and with less financial stress. The Home Health Aide program was certified by Medicare-Medicaid September 1, 1978. Since September 1, 1978 the Home Health Aides have made 647 visits to residents in the towns of Bristol, Alexandria, Bridgewater and New Hampton.

The Newfound Area Nursing Association, Inc. has also given over 1800 free immunization shots during 1978 in the New Hampton, Bristol, Alexandria elementary schools and the Newfound Memorial High School with the cooperation of the school nurses, Mr. Phylis Robertson and Mrs. Marilyn Noyes.

There were 2817 skilled nursing visits made in 1978 and 147 visits made by the part-time physical therapist. The growth of the Newfound Area Nursing Association could not take place without the hard working staff, the time contributed by the Newfound Area Nursing Association Board and Officers, and the support of the people in the towns of Bristol, Alexandria, New Hampton, and Bridgewater which we serve.

On behalf of the Bristol Recreation Advisory Council, I sincerely hope that we may, with a continued cooperative effort, provide a stimulating, varied and exciting program for all the people of the Newfound area in the upcoming year.
