## Warrant for Annual Town Meeting.

### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

{ L. S. }

*To the inhabitants of the town of Lebanon qualified to vote in town affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said town, on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

*First.* To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

*Second.* To choose three Selectmen, Overseer of the Poor, Collector of Taxes, Highway Agent, and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

*Third.* To see if the town will vote to have a Liquor Agent the ensuing year.

*Fourth.* To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges the ensuing year.

*Fifth.* To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to repair highways and bridges the ensuing year.

*Sixth.* To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repair and construction of sewers and sidewalks the ensuing year.

*Seventh.* To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the improvement of the cemeteries of the town, or act thereon.

*Eighth.* To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the proper observance of Memorial Day or act thereon.

*Ninth.* To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three hundred dollars, to provide for a free bed at the Mary Hitchcock Memorial Hospital for the ensuing year or act thereon.

*Tenth.* To see what sum of money the the town will vote to raise for the purpose of restoring the Old Records of the town.

*Eleventh.* To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three hundred and ten dollars to reimburse the Committee for the balance due them on seats furnished for the Town Hall.

*Twelfth.* To see how much money the town will raise for the support of a Brass Band for the year 1903, in said town, and to pass any vote relating thereto.

*Thirteenth.* To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of a Brass Band at West Lebanon, or act thereon.

*Fourteenth.* To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise as an annual appropriation for the benefit of the Lebanon Public Library.

*Fifteenth.* To hear the report of the Auditors and Town School Board.

*Sixteenth.* To determine the division of the school money.

*Seventeenth.* To take the sense of the qualified voters whether the alterations and amendments of the constitution proposed by the Constitutional Convention shall be approved.

*Eighteenth.* To see if the Town will accept the bequest of Carlos D. Scott, late of Lebanon, relating to the building of a Trout Pond or Reservoir on Colburn Park, or act thereon.

*Nineteenth.* To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to construct and maintain a public sewer from the intersection of Mascoma and Mechanics streets, thence westerly through said Mechanics street to a point opposite the house of Jonathan Lindsay, and thence to Mascoma river, and raise money therefor, or act thereon.

*Twentieth.* To see if the town will appoint a Committee to consider the advisability of making an addition to the Memorial building for the enlargement of the Public Library, or act thereon.

## Report of the Board of Health.

---

Whole number of deaths, 61; males 28, females 33. Between 70 and 80, 4; between 80 and 90, 7; over 90, 2; oldest, Abel Storrs, 94y., 7m., 25d. Prominent diseases: pneumonia, 8; consumption, 5; cancer, 9; old age, 6; brain diseases, 5. Died under 6 years, 15. There were during the year 1902 no deaths by contagious diseases, as diphtheria, scarlet fever, etc.

There was one death by typhoid fever; in this case the person was visiting away from home, where the disease was prevailing. Several suspicious cases were properly reported but they did not prove to be the disease. There were during the year a few cases of scarlet fever evidently imported, in no case were others infected.

There were during the whole year of 1902, only sixty-one deaths in the town, and that was at the rate of 12.1-5% per thousand which was a very low rate of mortality. The inhabitants of Lebanon should be thankful for the healthiness of the town.

Several complaints of nuisances were brought before the board, which were remedied so far as possible. More sewers are needed.
