To the best of my knowledge and belief, I certify that these accounts and records are true and correct.

TOWN WARRANT

TO THE INHABITANTS of the Town of Nelson, in the County of Cheshire, State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town affairs: YOU ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED to meet in the Town Hall in said Nelson on Tuesday, the 10th day of March, 2009, at 11:00 am to act upon the following articles:

Polls will open at 11:00 am and close at 7:00 pm.

Business Meeting will start at 7:00 pm.

ARTICLES OF A GENERAL NATURE

1. To choose necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$295,810 to be raised by taxes. This is to defray Town charges for the year ensuing. The Selectmen recommend this appropriation.

 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$30,329 for support of the town library. (In 2008 the appropriation was \$28,387).

\$20,600 to be raised by taxes \$ 9,729 income from library memorial fund and other sources.

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,426 for support of social service agencies which provide assistance to Nelson residents. The agencies chosen to receive funds are: Home Health Care (\$550), Monadnock Family Services (\$826), The Keene Community Kitchen, Inc. (\$1,500) and Southwestern Community Services (\$550). The Selectmen recommend these appropriations. (In 2008, these same agencies received contributions from the town in the amount of \$3376).

5. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$10,000 to be added to the Town Buildings Capital Reserve Fund. No withdrawals may be made from the fund except by vote of the town. The selectmen recommend this appropriation. (The 2008 appropriation was \$10,000). The fund balance on 12/31/2008 was \$42,812. Selectmen recommend this article.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000 to be added to the Milfoil Prevention and Treatment Expendable Trust Fund. The Selectmen recommend this article. The fund balance as of 12/31/2008 was \$9,303. 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$630 used for hazardous waste collections for 2009 consisting of 12 collection dates. The Selectmen recommend this article.

8. To see if the Town will vote to establish an appointed position for a Site Plan Review Officer. This position will be funded by fees from the building permits and other related fees. This position will be responsible to the Board of Selectmen and would be filled upon passage of this article.

9. To see if the Town will allow the numerical tally of any of the selectmen's recorded votes to be printed in the town warrant next to the affected warrant article.

ARTICLES DEALING WITH SERVICE AND PROTECTION

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8787 as subsidy for ambulance service for the ensuing year, it being understood that residents will still be charged for individual calls. (The appropriation for 2008 was \$8071.53). The Selectmen recommend this article.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15,000 for the proper expenses of the Fire Department and Rescue Squad. (The 2008 appropriation was \$15,000).

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 for the purpose of fighting forest fires. This sum to come from reimbursement from the NH State Fire Warden and no amount will be raised through taxation. The Department of Revenue Administration recommends this method of accounting so as not to impact the Fire Department's operating budget.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25,000 to be added to the Fire Equipment Capital Reserve Fund, for the purpose of Fire Apparatus for the fire department. No withdrawals may be made from this Fund except by vote of the Town and upon recommendation of the Fire Chief. The fund balance as of 12/31/2008 was \$105,737.05. The Selectmen recommend this article.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500 for the proper expenses for Emergency Management.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$37,949 for the proper expenses of the Police Department. (The appropriation for 2008 was \$37,949).

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000 for the purpose of patrols performed by the Nelson Police Department for the State of NH, Cheshire County, Sheriff's Office and other authorized municipal entities. This sum to come from offsetting grants and no amount will be raised through taxation.

ARTICLES DEALING WITH ROADS

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$215,000 for the purpose of maintenance of highways and bridges for ensuing year's budget with \$37,077 coming from the Highway Block Grant with

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the remaining \$177,923 to be raised by taxes.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,000 to be added to the Road Equipment Capital Reserve Fund. It is understood that no withdrawals may be made from this fund for the purchase of road equipment except by vote of the town upon recommendation of the Road Equipment Committee. The Fund balance on 12/31/2008 was \$21,505.94. (The 2008 appropriation was \$20,000).

19. To see if the Town will vote to have the Auditor's position to be an appointed position not an elected position. This will become effective at the March 2010 Town Elections.

20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$169,658 for the construction of the Highway Salt Barn and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw \$169,658 from the Capital Reserve Fund for total expense of the Salt Barn and Storm-Water site work. The selectmen and The Road Committee recommend this withdrawal.

21. This article is to discontinue the Salt Barn Capital reserve Fund and any money left will go to the General Fund. If warrant article #20 fails, this article will be passed over.

22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$55,000 and not to exceed that amount, for the total expense of the comprehensive Nelson mapping program. This article is non-lapsing, and payments will be spread over a three year term. The first payment will not exceed \$18,333.34. The Selectmen recommend this article.

ARTICLES DEALING WITH PLANNING & ZONING

23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$727 for dues to belong to the Southwest Region Planning Commission. (\$727 in 2008)

OTHER ARTICLES

24. To see if the town will vote to establish an Expendable Trust Fund under the provisions of RSA 31:19-A to be known as the Nelson Community Project Fund for the purpose of building town-wide consensus about the town's future and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10 for this fund. The Nelson Community Project will:

- 1. Develop a town-wide, inclusive process for agreeing on common goals for Nelson.
- 2. Provide "seed money" for worthwhile projects identified by the process and

3. Be authorized to accept public, private and foundation support as additions to the Expendable Trust Fund.

It is understood that any money raised from foundations or private sources may be expended by the duly authorized representatives of the Nelson Community Project. This is a petitioned article. Not recommended by the Selectmen. 25. To see if the town will vote to add an article to the Zoning Ordinance that states:

Pursuant to RSA 674:17 j, the town may establish buffer zones or additional districts which overlap existing districts and may further regulate the planting and trimming of vegetation on public and private property to protect access to energy systems. This provision is enforceable by the selectmen after conferring with the Highway Supervisor or appropriate power authorities. This is a petitioned article.

26. To see if the Town will vote to adopt an Ordinance that states:

"If the actions of any Board or Commission elected or appointed by the Town result in legal disputes, then any funds budgeted to or under the control of that Board or Commission by utilize first for legal costs prior to any town funds being utilized." This ordinance does not place any undue burden on any Board Member or Commission Member. However, it serves to insure that discretionary funds are utilized prior to any burden to the taxpayers of the Town. This is a petitioned article.

27. To see if the Town will vote to limit the amount of revenue to \$1000 of the (Land Use Change Tax) revenue collected going to the Conservation Fund, pursuant to RSA 79-A:25 II, with any overage going to the General Fund. If adopted by the Town, the provisions of RSA 79-A:25 II, shall take effect in the tax year beginning April 1, following the vote and shall remain in effect until altered or rescinded pursuant to RSA 79-A:25 IV. (Provision was adopted in 2003, article 25) This is a petitioned article.

28. To see if the town will vote to establish an Expendable Trust Fund under the provisions of RSA 31:19-A to be known as the Nelson Community Project Fund for the purpose of building a town-wide consensus about the town's future and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10 for this fund and to see if the town will vote to appoint the selectmen as agents to expend funds from the Nelson Community Project Fund for the stated purpose of the fund. The Nelson Community Project will:

1. Develop a town-wide, inclusive process for agreeing on common goals for Nelson,

2. Provide "seed money" for worthwhile projects identified by the process and

3. Be authorized to accept public, private and foundation support as additions to the Expendable Trust Fund.

It is understood that any money raised from foundations or private sources may be expended by the duly authorized representatives of the Nelson Community Project. This is a petitioned article. The selectmen do not recommend this article.

. To transact any other business or discuss other warrant proposals as may legally be brought before the meeting.

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REPORT OF THE SELECTMEN

The completion of our new Safety Building by dozens of resident volunteers was the dominant story in Nelson this past year. The fact that costs were kept to less than \$100,000 is greatly appreciated by all of us taxpayers. About seventy people attended the ribbon-cutting ceremony and dedication of the new facility on June 21, and a beautiful reception, prepared by Town volunteers, followed the program. Rick and Betsey Church felt so deeply appreciative of the wonderful work of the building volunteers that they invited everyone to their home for a cook-out. Over seventy people attended the event on June 1.

The first big test of the value of the Safety Building came when the huge ice storm struck the town on December 12. The building provided a warm haven with water, heat, lights, games and food available to residents. The repair crews also used it as a place to get warm and enjoy hot coffee.

Another successful 2008 undertaking was the rebuilding of the Granite Lake culvert, which is vital to the operation of the dam that controls the lake water level. After a number of meetings with the officer of the Granite Lake Village District, the dam's owner, arrangements were made to accomplish the work, which came in under budget. Special thanks to our Road Agent, Mike Tarr, who oversaw Nelson's part of the project.

A major undertaking was started six months ago: to update our current land use records. As this task has progressed, it has become very apparent that the Town desperately needs a new set of maps. The Town has put off attending to this matter for years, and the Selectmen urge you to vote for the warrant article to get us on track once again. In recent years, we have seen sales of land, resulting in requests for subdivisions. It is imperative that people be taxed for what they own and that all mystery lots be eliminated.

Keeping Town buildings repaired is an ongoing task. This year, the back of the Old Brick Schoolhouse was re-clapboarded. Insulation board was put on first, and that should help keep the building warmer. With old windows and no cellar or insulation, keeping the 162-year-old structure usable is a challenge.

Being sensitive to costs, we have used inmates from the Cheshire County jail to do some property maintenance work. They did a fine job of rebuilding the stone wall between the Munsonville Fire Station and Susan Kingsbury's property. They also did excellent work mowing and raking leaves in both the Munsonville and Nelson cemeteries.

The Selectmen are always seeking new ways to provide better service to Town residents while at the same time keeping costs under control. Of course, we have no say about natural disasters. When they occur, our folks take appropriate action as soon as possible. We are especially sensitive to current economic conditions and strive to act both thoughtfully and prudently.

We wish to thank all our employees and volunteers for their exceptional contributions to the wellbeing of the Town in 2008. The position of Town Sexton ends in March 2009, as per action taken at the 2008 Town Meeting. George Warner, Sr., has held that job, or that of assistant sexton, for many years, and we are indebted to him for his dedication, hard work and loyalty. George will continue to carry out most functions of that position, for which we are very grateful.

Special thanks also to Sam Bouchie, who is leaving the Board of Selectmen. He is a very talented, hard-working fellow and has been an absolute joy to work with. We will miss him tremendously.

REPORT OF THE NELSON FIRE CHIEF

Our total number of calls for this year was 27, down from last year, which had a total of 55 calls. Previous years had averaged 40 calls. It is always good to see a downswing and hopefully townspeople are staying aware of fire prevention and keeping a safe home, especially when it comes to heating with wood during the winter season. The Fire Log continues to show that rescue calls play a major role in the department's activities.

The addition has been completed and the members of the Fire Department would like to thank all of those who participated in this building project. It has added a very comfortable and convenient place for the Department to hold meetings and host other groups, such as a monthly meeting of the greater Keene area fire chiefs. The new restrooms and shower are a real plus.

Our new computer has been installed, with high-speed Internet that we share with our Police Department. The computer has been very beneficial for us both because it allows us to manage our calls better and supports required state and federal paperwork through a new software program called "FireHouse." This is a shared program run on a server at Mutual Aid that records and manages all calls throughout the Mutual Aid system. Previously, we had to telephone Mutual Aid after each of our calls to gather information for filling out our internal reports, but now with FireHouse it is all done online,

I will mention this again as in years past: we are always on the lookout for individuals who are interested in joining the fire department, especially anyone who is or wants to become an EMT (Emergency Medical Technician). The department will support training for both firefighters and EMTs so people can become certified. Anyone interested should contact the Fire Chief or any Fire Department member.

Remember to check your smoke detectors and replace the batteries on a regular basis, at least annually. If you don't have a smoke detector, please purchase one or two. This could save your life someday. Also, be sure to call the town Forest Fire Warden, Bob West, or one of the Deputy Wardens, Bud French, Charlie Lang, Terry Mednick or myself for a burning permit. They are required even if it is raining, unless there is an inch or more of snow on the ground.

I would like to take this opportunity to welcome the new members who have joined this year, and thank all the active members for their continued effort, support and hours of volunteer service. I'd also like to thank our fellow townspeople for their support at the various emergency scenes. Remember, to report a fire or other emergency, **DIAL 911 or 352-1100**.

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT REPORT

Emergency Management planning activities have continued this past year. Our big news for 2008 was the completion of our Emergency Management Center, behind the fire station at the safety complex on Old Stoddard Road. This area has provided vital space and service in support of both the Fire and Police Departments. Also, as shown by December's ice storm, the addition has quickly proved to be a tremendous benefit to the whole town. The availability of a warm common room, kitchen, bath and shower facilities helped many residents through a period when they had no electricity or water at home. I'd also like to take this opportunity to thank all those who helped their fellow Nelson residents during the emergency.

Another project currently underway is an update to our town's Emergency Operations Plan, the first in eight years. With the assistance of the Southwest Regional Planning Commission, we are holding regular meetings to tackle this update.

In the wake of the December 2008 ice storm, the federal government has declared parts of New Hampshire a disaster area, making us eligible for Federal funds. Through FEMA, we are presently pursuing the requirements for monetary assistance to repair ice storm damages. We have filled out and submitted initial paperwork and we are now waiting for FEMA to come review our records and expenses.

We have also continued work on the All Health Hazard Mitigation plan. Our local POD (point of distribution) group, currently consisting of Sullivan, Nelson and Stoddard, continues to work together to define where and how we would respond if a public health emergency should occur. A completed plan has been published and is available to support our emergency operations. Again, thanks are due to townspeople who have assisted in developing the plan.

In sum, I'd like to express appreciation to everyone who has helped to support our Emergency Management activities this year. As we move ahead, we will continue our work, directing particular attention to completing our Emergency Operations Plan (EOP), which will better prepare us to respond to emergencies.

Your children are unique, charming and inquisitive people, and I look forward to guiding them to make good choices about safety.

The Police Department saw a definite increase in calls for service this year. It was rewarding to hear that people were pleased to know that help was there when they needed it. Also, as I said above, the new Safety Building proved to be a great asset this last December during the devastating ice storm, when parts of town were out of power for fourteen days. Many, many people utilized the Safety Building for heat, a hot shower and food or just a place to rest a weary body. Kindness spread through our town as numerous donations of hot food and supplies were left for those in need, while residents who had heat and power opened their homes to the less fortunate. For the Police Department this concluded a fantastic year here in Nelson, once again reinforcing the reason we care so much for this town and its people, and how proud we are to serve and protect.

Thank you again for your support. I look forward to another year of serving the great people of Nelson.

REPORT OF THE ROAD AGENT

As I'm sure you all remember, the 2007-2008 winter season was the second snowiest winter on record. With this, staying within budget for snow removal along with sanding and salting was close to impossible. With all of this snow that would eventually have to melt, we were lucky this past spring not to have had the heavy rainfalls that we have seen in the recent past.

At the 2008 Town Meeting, the purchase of a used back-hoe was approved. We have been using this piece of equipment for the maintenance of culverts and ditches; it has been working out well for us.

In the late summer into the early fall months, the Town of Nelson with the Granite Lake Association worked together to have the Granite Lake Dam and Box Culvert repaired. This proved to be a very big project. Many hours were spent researching, planning, and hiring the necessary engineering and construction crews. This project was completed and once again opened to public travel before this winter season.

As always, the hauling of the winter sand and preparing for the upcoming winter season took place this fall. As none of us will soon forget, winter came very early in 2008 with the December 12th ice storm that left roads and the landscape looking like a war zone, not to mention that the entire town was without power for many days. This storm will continue to keep the Road Crew busy for many months to come. With the natural disasters we have continued to have over the past few years, the Highway budget just can't catch a break.

I would personally like to thank the Selectmen, members of the Road Equipment Committee, and the other Town Officials for all of their help and support. Many thanks are also due to Nick Barrett and John Farwell for their help and their many hours of hard work.

The Highway Department does appreciate updates on road conditions in your area. The Road Crew will respond to any problems in a timely manner.

The archive is generally open on Tuesday morning and at other times by appointment.

REPORT OF THE CEMETERY BOARD

THE NELSON CEMETERY

General maintenance, including spring cleanup, mowing, leaf-raking and mulching, and straightening of headstones was conducted by Al Struthers, Cemetery Sexton. In addition, work continues on a section of the old cemetery, Section One, to establish a cremation area.

THE MUNSONVILLE CEMETERY

There were three cremations and two full burials this year. The planting of a south-facing slope with low-growing junipers and bearberries in 2007 proved to be very successful, so it was decided by the Board to extend that planting to cover the entire slope with the same material. Both plantings were under the direction of Lucy Daniels. This landscaping project has not only added to the beauty of the cemetery, it has also corrected a difficult area to maintain in grass or mow.

REPORT OF THE CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Field work on the Great Meadow Ecological Assessment was completed this year and the final report is being worked on. The Great Meadow Wetland Overlay District was to have been voted on at last year's annual town meeting, but due to a clerical error the wrong warrant article was printed in the annual report so the vote was invalid. The natural resource study remains a valuable contribution to town and state conservation efforts.

The Nelson Conservation Priority Plan of 2001 outlined seven important areas on which to focus conservation activities. One of the first areas that the NCC concentrated on was the protection of the historic Nelson Village Center from inappropriate intrusion, by surrounding it with conservation easements. This project was completed in April when five acres of town-owned land on the east side of Log Cabin Road were placed under conservation. This land adjoins the Mackenzie easement of fifteen acres on the west side that was added last year. Many thanks to Kip and Sandy Mackenzie, and to the Nelson selectmen, for their roles in bringing this important project to completion.

A successful roadside cleanup was held on the Saturday before Old Home Week with 37 volunteers, who covered most of the roads in town. Another 800 daffodil bulbs were delivered in the fall by New Hampshire the Beautiful as a reward for our efforts and the bulbs were in turn distributed to all areas of the town to be planted.

A program organized by the NCC was held during Old Home. Week in the Old Library with Steve Roberge, the Cheshire County Forester, who presented a slide show and talk on the recent New Hampshire Wildlife Plan. He felt that our Great Meadow ecological study would be of great value to the state of NH's Wildlife Plan. Steve was introduced by Wally Francis, who now owns the Old Library and would like to see it used as a conservation center.

The NCC voted to provide matching funds up to \$4000 to contribute to the Granite Lake Association's fund raising for a pollution prevention study of the lake by a professional environmental engineering firm. This is to help meet the grant requirement of the NH Department of Environmental Services for a \$15,000 match plus volunteer participation for the awarded \$50,000 grant.

The NCC continues to address conservation issues, help with conservation easements, review DES permits, and provide environmental information. We encourage residents to bring any environmental issues to our attention.

A personal note from the Chair: I would like to extend special thanks to all who care so much about conservation issues in Nelson. Nelson is a great place to live, to visit, to raise kids, to spend your summers or your whole life. Land issues bring out everyone's passion, and it is right that land discussions be approached from diverse perspectives. Any change made should be thoughtful and thoroughly analyzed so that the outcome is the very best that we as a town can create. Everyone involved in our discussions is trying to do what's best for the town, and it is important to remember that we are all neighbors and that we should treat each other with courtesy, dignity and respect. I urge everyone to continue to stay involved in the process of conservation issues, voice

Their opinions in public forums for all to hear and keep the ultimate big picture of what this town will look like for our great grandchildren in mind.

REPORT OF THE OLIVIA RODHAM MEMORIAL LIBRARY

The Olivia Rodham Memorial Library looks forward to continuing to serve the community of Nelson into the future, especially as a source of reading, be it for information, entertainment, inspiration, education or enlightenment. In a time when we have the world at our fingertips, the library is a public place that connects us to each other, as a center and a community gathering place.

CHILDREN'S LIBRARY PROGRAMS

During the summer the children had activities for six Tuesdays, based on the theme "G'day for Summer Reading 2008". On one July day children learned about wool and spinning with Julie Tilden. July 15 featured a book for all ages, Alabama Moon by Watt Key. The next week we learned about indigenous rock painting and read stories about Australia. On July 29 we read more Australian stories and created collages. August 5 and 12 welcomed back the program Book Art, with Anne Ames, with the goal of each child making a book to take home. One book looked like an alligator.

During the Summer Reading Program sixteen children read 330 books. Those completing the reading program were given official certificates to honor their accomplishments and, thanks to the Friends of the Nelson Library, a gift certificate to Toadstool Books. Incentive prizes such as small toys and paperback books were available for each book read, with ice cream certificates courtesy of Twinkletown Miniature Golf for every ten books read during the program.

At 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday, August 13, Wildlife Encounters Traveling Zoo and some of their Australian animals came to the Nelson Town Hall for a presentation of "Creatures Down Under", as a part of "G'Day for Summer Reading 2008". While here, the audience met up close, learned about, and maybe even touched Australian wildlife including birds, tree frogs, goannas, snakes and - best of all - the beautiful marsupials. This program was supported in part by a grant from the New Hampshire State Library and donations from the Bryne Foundation, CHILIS, Cogswell Benevolent Trust, and the NH Library Association. The attendance was 112 adults and children. The Nelson Librarian wrote and received the grant, Kids, Books and Arts.

The Nelson Library story time starts in October and continues through May for kindergarten through third grades. Story time includes a light snack and stories read by the Librarian or a guest reader. This Monday after school program welcomes Sara Shepherd and Sandy Ferguson, who volunteer to read and sometimes do a related activity as well.

Library enrichment programs at the library were offered four times this year to the Nelson school. The whole school attended in three groups. This happened once a month on Wednesdays during the winter and spring. The children all learned library skills, including use of the Dewey Decimal system and the card catalog, library layout, parts of a book and how to find items. A program of bringing books to the Nelson School continues. Teachers can request a topic or genre.

ADULT LIBRARY PROGRAMS

Every year the Library presents a Forum with guest speakers. This year's calendar included Frankie Brackley Tolman ("The Orchids of New Hampshire"), John Guilbert ("The Good Earth: How Early Cheshire County Folks Made Use of Their Rocks and Dirt"), David Millstone ("Is Nelson the Center of the Contra Dance Universe?"), and Allison Aldrich and Hunt Smith ("If Music Be the Food of Love, Play On! Love Songs, Murder Ballads and Beyond").

On Old Home Day, during the games on the green, the Library was open for business. An extra activity in the Library was a craft table for a make-and- take craft. The annual Book Sale, organized and run by the Friends of the Library, made sales of over \$1,750.

The adult book group meets once a month on the third Tuesday of the month to read and discuss novels, memoirs and biographies.

GRANTS

We received Kids, Books and the Arts grants to present Wildlife Encounters (see above).

We have received the "Picturing America" collection of American art reproductions. Our Library is enjoying a rotating display of the posters. This grant is from the National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH) in cooperation with the American Library Association (ALA).

The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation Online Opportunity Hardware Grant will enable us to purchase one computer each year with peripherals, and defray the cost of supporting a public access computer in the Library for four years, including set-up, maintenance and tech support. The grant amount for 2009 is \$1950 and the required match is \$650. The grant amount for 2010 is \$1300 and the required match is \$1300. The Friends of the Library have agreed to provide the matching funds.

COMPUTER

The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation Online Opportunity Hardware Grant will enable the improvements described above. The Town now has a webpage and calendar: http://townofnelson.com, and the Library now has high speed wireless from Wivalley available during Library business hours.

PERSONNEL

Kristine Finnegan is the Librarian and Jennifer Fraser and Susan Hansel are the Library substitutes. Library volunteers do many and varied tasks that suit their time and talent. Their contributions to the Library are immeasurable and are so appreciated by the Library staff. Several who run programs are mentioned above. Patrons with overdue books are called twice a month by a volunteer, Kathy Schillemat. Regular volunteers are Pamela Tolman, Betsey Church and Susan Hansel. Terry Mednick has voluntarily maintained our computers, and computer statistics programs are updated by Tom Buttrick. We thank occasional volunteers Jennifer Fraser, Liza Constable, Margaret Iselin, Jonathan Weis, Iva DeMartelly, Barbara and Jacqueline Roland and Elena Mednick, as well as Dublin School students. Volunteer hours this year totaled 341 hours. Our Library trustees this year were John Zurich, Betsy Street, Linda Cates, Lumina Greenway and Bruce McSheehy.

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DONATIONS

Donations to the Library always play a large part in updating our collection. This year we received monetary donations from Rotary Club members, The Friends of the Library, and George and Frances Alderson in memory of Bob and Hallie Robinson. Other Library funds used to purchase items for the collection were the Celia Wiechart Memorial Fund, the Elizabeth T. Hatch Memorial Fund, the Hardie Shepard Children's Book Fund, the Henry Melville Fund, the Mary Fiske Elliot Fund for Garden Books, the Nelson White Fund, the Professor William Churchill Gerrish Special Fund, the Sidney Plant Special Fund and the Henry Melville Fuller Fund. Many donations are made of actual books, audio visual materials, and magazines. Thank you to Pamela and Ethan Tolman, Susan Hansel and Bert Wingerson for their donation of current monthly magazines, to Lumina Greenway for her large donation of the latest best sellers in books, and to many others for their generosity in passing on books, DVD's and audio books on CD.

OLIVIA RODHAM MEMORIAL LIBRARY NOTES ON 2008 TREASURER'S REPORT AND 2009 BUDGET

The Library undertook two new projects in 2008. The first, the high-speed wireless internet project, had been planned for some time and was included in the 2008 budget. The implementation cost came in under budget at \$440, and the ongoing cost is \$75 per month.

The second new project developed gradually during the year as the Library Trustees discussed ways that the Library could further serve the town, specifically by providing a town calendar so that everyone could know what was going on and when. This idea grew into the <u>townofnelson.com</u> website. We contracted with Gordon Peery of Center Pond Communications to develop the website and to manage it on an ongoing basis. The implementation cost was \$300 and the ongoing cost is \$50 per month. This was not included in our budget for 2008, but after consultation with the Selectmen, we decided to proceed.

In 2009, the Library will receive \$2,600 as a Gates Grant to buy and maintain a new computer. \$1,950 will come directly from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation and \$650 will be matching funds from the Friends of the Library. This is part of a two year grant, with the funds for a second computer coming in 2010.

Our budget for 2009 is very tight. We have the additional expense of both the high-speed wireless internet connection and the town website. Nevertheless, in keeping with the current economic environment, we are asking the town for the same funding we received last year, \$20,600. We will reduce expenses elsewhere and will tap our Memorial Funds to make ends meet.

GRANITE LAKE VILLAGE DISTRICT ANNUAL MEETING: APRIL 26. 2008

10:05 a.m.: John Halter, Moderator, welcomed those present to the annual meeting, usually held in July, stating that it was indeed the annual meeting. The March 31 2008 meeting had one purpose -- to vote to change the annual meeting date to an earlier date, April 26, 2008.

He went on to define the purpose of the Village District as solely the impoundment of waters. The meeting will be recessed rather than adjourned: we cannot conclude the meeting because the business will not be concluded if we vote to postpone Article Two (bond issue). The officers will remain in office until the meeting is adjourned.

Tim Ruehr: in Marlborough officers do change during a recess according to Upton & Hatfield. We could vote to vote down Article Two and to reconsider later. It would also be a majority vote. Tom read Michelle Clark's e-mail recommendation from the State office - what John Halter had already read. Barbara Ropiecki validated what Tom had said. There was some discussion as to which is correct...will look into.

If someone would like to have a written ballot, it would require three qualified voters to say so. Only people residing on lakefront property or having a deeded right-of-way and being a registered voter in town of Stoddard or Nelson could vote in village district affairs. Mr. Halter continued by saying that we were having a public meeting first so that anyone could speak. The duty of the Moderator is to set forth the rules right up front.

John MacAllister, chief commissioner, began by giving a brief history of the problems. Sometime late last summer DOT checked the culverts and found some holes and boulders from left side of wall were displaced revealing a hole 5-6 ft. deep and scoring within. Also, there was a hole at the base of the culvert of about same size. In the 1930s the state owned the road as the road then went from West Shore Road. around the corner and over the dam. Since the road was rebuilt, the road was given up by the state.

In October 2007 they recommended that the bridge be closed when excessive water was going over. In November the road was closed. **Don Woods** said that the larger culvert (approx.1.8 times more water) under West Shore Road may lead to a higher dam classification.

In February Chuck Corliss' boss came down and told us to plan for a worst case scenario. Stoddard and Nelson's emergency planners immediately began planning and letting the residents downstream know what to do. In April the state said that the dam would have to plan to hold up to 65,000 lbs. If the road is abandoned, the price tag for dam repair would be much less. Denny Hisler (who supervised the fixing of the twin arch bridge up on Route 9) will be coming down on May 1 to take a look with Chuck Corliss. Nelson cannot act without a special town meeting or wait until next March to appropriate more money. We're between a rock and a hard place.

Tom Yocono: Closing the road has to do with what is downstream. Liability is why the road has to stay closed. Even though the road is Nelson's, the GLVD is responsible for the road. If it collapses and damages the dam, we would still be responsible.

Question: Is the GLVD able to close the road without Nelson's approval? yes

Question: Is it a money question? If we have enough money to have the road reopened? Nelson voted at its town meeting in March \$4500 to share half the estimated engineering costs and \$2,700 for its half of repairs.

The Cucchis visited the Nelson selectmen's' meeting this past Wednesday with a map and proposal of a new road bypassing the current road over his land down where the old mill was and would close the road in front of his house but to include a parking area for the church.

Jane Kirk: Nelson's selectmen are very concerned about this and are going very carefully not to run in with the DOT, whose road it is. Selectmen have been working closely with the GLVD.

Marion Frazier: The church is definitely not for closing the road in front of the church.

question: Doesn't the GLVD have the right to close the road? Commissioner said that Dan Eaton, state representative, said we did the right thing.

Tim Ruehr: Why did you have another drawdown if you knew you had an erosion problem? Phil: We had to take it way down for further inspection.

Don said we had no previous information whether the damage is old or from the 2005 flood.

Jane Kirk: please send a letter for an answer whether the state will repair the dam.

Doug Grahm: Question: Who is the District and what is the liability? The District is us, the landowners around the lake and the liability is \$1 million. Local Government Center is the insurance.

There is no report that says for sure how much effect (the metal culvert under West Shore Road) it has. There was a permit through the wetlands board. **Phil** said he hopes that the hydrology report comes back saying that it isn't that much.

Len Frazier: Has the metal culvert ever been full? Yes, on October 9, 2005 it was chock full.

John Halter began the actual meeting at 11:13 a.m.

Could we have one moment for respect for David Knight, our previous Commissioner, who was very instrumental in starting up the village district?

John Halter

Article One: To choose one commissioner for a term of three years and to see who the inhabitants of the District will elect for the offices of clerk, treasurer and moderator. Nominated John MacAllister for commissioner for three years, Sally Ripley, clerk; Barbara Ropiecki, Treasurer; John Halter, moderator, each for the term of one year.

Nomination from the floor for Bob Woods for commissioner

Moved by Tim Ruehr, seconded by Dave Costin.

John MacAllister stated that he thought each nominee should explain why he should be elected. He continued by saying he had a long-time love affair with Granite Lake and had been a long-term member of lake quality group for the Granite Lake Association and was concerned about the sand erosion due to water level of the lake. He suggested that the cove residents get a dredging permit for the cove and not keep the whole lake level high - that high water may have negative impact on sandy beach and the cove. He continued that he was disturbed about the septic systems and holding tanks leaking into the lake, and that he had occasionally had to remove boards to keep the board level at 24" at the dam.

Bob Woods: It was not my intention to keep the lake high.

It was usually Bob who kept it at the right level according to the levels on all the rocks and ledges around the lake. Bob had been commissioner three years before and resigned abruptly before the annual meeting.

Question: what was the fight about?

It was a question of the treasurer and other commissioners - that certain people wanted to keep levels low.

Tom Yocono: I didn't say we needed to replace the dam; we only needed a safer way to operate the dam.

Motion to move the question appropriately made and seconded.

Secret ballot voting took place...Dita Englund and Anita Flanigan wrote down the number for each as read by Sally Ripley, clerk.

Motion that the uncontested offices be voted by voice vote, appropriately moved and seconded. Vote was affirmative.

John Halter read the results: Bob Woods, commissioner, three years; Sally Ripley, clerk, one year; Barbara Ropiecki, treasurer, one year; John Halter, moderator, one year.

Barbara Ropiecki rose and talked about the bond issue. She mentioned various rates of interest, lengths of terms etc. She said they had told her not to go longer than twenty years as we may need another repair by then.

As we did not have all the information from Don Woods and Chuck Corliss, which we wanted to know for some concrete amount of money to borrow, it was decided to have a motion to table the article as we had thought we would need to do.

Motion was appropriately made and seconded to re-convene on May 24 at 10:00. Bond meeting must be within sixty days of the budget meeting (March 31, 2008). The vote was affirmative.

Article Three: To see if the District will vote to appropriate the sum of \$11,625 to pay for the initial permit application and engineering and hydrology studies. The money already has been raised. The Commissioners recommend this appropriation.

This money we have already in an unnamed fund which we used to call the Capital Reserve Fund but since we had no trustees to mind the money, it was not actually a CRF. There is a permitting fee of \$3000. There are at least \$4500 in engineering fees. We have not paid Don Woods, engineer, any money. So they need to be paid. Nelson has voted to share the expense of both engineering and construction work. Depending on the funding, we may not have to take out very much prematurely. Also the money for a hydrology report will need to be paid. Motion to move the question and seconded appropriately. Vote was affirmative.

Article Four: To see if the District will vote to authorize the Commissioners to borrow in anticipation of taxes. The Commissioners recommend this article. Motion was appropriately made and seconded. Vote was affirmative.

Article Five: To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4500 for operating expenses for the coming year. Breakdown summary: \$500 for church where we meet...several meetings this year due to meetings; \$2500 for legal fees - for instance, for Tom Hanna's checking out ownership of properties under and around the dam area; \$400 in dues for dam registration

fees which used to be \$100; \$70 for municipal association membership; \$1030 for our usual expenses: mailings, ads in local paper for our meetings, stamps, inks and papers. A motion was appropriately made and seconded. The vote was affirmative.

Article Six: To see if the District will raise and appropriate the sum of \$818 to purchase liability insurance for the coming year. The Commissioners recommend this appropriation. Motion was appropriately made and seconded. Vote was affirmative.

Article Seven: To see if the District will elect to establish a Capital Reserve Fund under the provisions of RSA 35:1 to work in conjunction with the Commissioners for the purpose of dam maintenance, repairing, or replacing the dam. The Commissioners recommend this article. An amendment to raise the amount to \$1500 put in each year was appropriately made and seconded. Most agreed but not voted. Wording changes were thrown around along with discussion about who would act agents. Tom Yocono pointed out that the commissioners would not be able

to withdraw in case of emergency just as happened this year. A motion to table the article until the May meeting due to the length of the meeting was appropriately made and seconded. Vote to postpone was affirmative.

Article Eight: To see if the District will accept funds from any other association or anyone. Motion was appropriately made and seconded. Vote was affirmative.

Article Nine: To see if the District will vote to have its next meeting on April 25, 2009 at 10 a.m. Motion appropriately made and seconded to have the meeting start at 9 a.m. Amendment passed. Barabara said this would be the first meeting ever in the fiscal year January-December as we finally changed it from July 1-June 30. Amendment was appropriately voted on and passed. Article was voted on and passed.

Dita asked if we could talk about any new business. Jim Wilder talked about making high speed internet for this area a reality. No voting on this issue. Postponed for more information about a relay and repeater from Pinnacle Mountain.

Motion was appropriately made and seconded to recess until May 24, 2008. at 10:00 a.m. Vote was affirmative.

NELSON TOWN MEETING MINUTES MARCH 11, 2008

On a lovely cool and crisp morning the polls were opened by our moderator, Richard Church just at the 11nth hour designated. Several people awaited to cast the first votes of the day in what proved to be a steady flow of townspeople. 180 votes were cast, representing 30% of the total registered voters The polls were closed at 7:10PM, and the business portion of the meeting began. The scouts led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance, and the usual housekeeping items and the rules of conduct for the meeting were covered by our Moderator. Non-residents Joan Bosely from Keene, Administrative Assistant to the Selectmen; Richard Pratt of Winchester, Police Chief; and Philip Hamilton of Stoddard representing the Granite Lake Village District were given permission by those present to speak on the floor when necessary.

Michael Blaudschun was recognized and spoke about the new safety building which has been built and completed. This new building will provide additional space for fire and police, and has been built almost entirely by volunteer labor and with significant donations. Mike praised the dedication, determination, and professional expertise shown by the many townspeople who participated in many different ways. The assembly rose to show their unanimous agreement and gratitude.

It was at this time that our Moderator spoke to the matter of Article #23 which was voted on by ballot. Due to a clerical error the article which was voted on and the article as it appears on the final Town Warrant differ in wording and in meaning. Mr. Church declared that the vote on that article will be considered illegal, and is therefore null and void. Mr. Church indicated that it was possible to have the selectmen call a special town meeting to consider the matter proposed under Article #23. He indicated that the Planning Board would have to hold hearings as required for a zoning change and that the special meeting would just consider the zoning issue, properly appearing on a ballot. He indicated the cost of such a special meeting would be approximately \$500. He polled the meeting to see what guidance they wished to provide the selectmen in the matter. It was the overwhelming sense of the meeting that the selectmen should not convene a special meeting prior to town meeting 2009 to consider the issue.

1. To choose necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

The following were elected:

Michael Blaudschun, Selectman 3 years Richard P. Church, Moderator 2 years Tom Buttrick, Treasurer 1 year Sexton, George Warner 1 year Elisabeth A. Street, Trustee of the Library 2 years Bruce McSheehy, Trustee of the Library 3 years John Zurich, Trustee of the Library 3 years Richard Lothrop, Emergency Management Officer 1 year

Richard Popovic, Zoning Board member 3 years Auditor, David Birchenough 1 year Edith Notman, Trustee of Trust Funds 3 years Betsey Church, Supervisor of the Checklist 6 years Troy C. Tucker, Planning Board member 3 years Kirk Dale, Road Equipment Committee member 3 years Greg Fraser, Road Equipment Committee member 1 year

2. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$209,690 to be raised by taxes. This to defray Town charges for the year ensuing. The Selectmen recommend this appropriation. The article was accepted and seconded as read. It was approved by voice vote.

3. To see if Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500, (and not to exceed this amount), for the engineering plans of the Box culvert/Spillway at Granite Lake. The article was accepted and seconded as read. Mr. Michael Tarr explained that this money will be used to pay for engineering plans. The article was approved by unanimous voice vote.

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25,000 (and not to exceed this amount), for the reconstruction work of the Box culvert/Spillway at Granite Lake. The article was accepted and seconded as read. There was quite a bit of discussion concerning the community responsibilities of Nelson, the Granite Lake Village District, and the Town of Stoddard. The article was subsequently approved by unanimous voice vote.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$28,387 for support of the Town Library. (In 2006 the appropriation was \$26,390).

\$20,600 to be raised by taxes

\$ 7,787 income from Library memorial funds and other sources. The article was accepted and seconded as read and approved by unanimous voice vote.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,376 support of social service agencies which provide assistance to Nelson residents. The agencies chosen to receive funds are: Home Health Care (\$550), Monadnock Family services (\$826), The Keene Community Kitchen (\$1,500) and Southwestern Community Services (\$500). The Selectmen recommend these appropriations. (In 2006, these same agencies received contributions from the Town in the amount of \$3,358.75). The article was accepted and seconded as read, and was approved by unanimous voice vote.

7. To see if the Town will vote and appropriate the sum of 10,000 to be added to the Town Buildings capital Reserve Fund. No withdrawals may be made from the fund except by vote of the town. The selectmen recommend this appropriation. (2006 appropriation was 10,000.) The fund balance on 12/31/2007 was 32,026.55. The article was accepted and seconded as read, and was approved by unanimous voice vote.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000 to be added to the Milfoil Prevention and Treatment Expendable Trust Fund. The Selectmen and The Conservation Commission approve this article. The fund balance as of 12/31/2007 was \$6152.32. The article was accepted and seconded as read and was approved by voice vote.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$575 used for hazardous waste collections for 2008 consisting of 24 collections per year. The Selectmen recommend this article. The article was accepted and seconded as read. There was little discussion and the article passed by unanimous voice vote.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,071.53 as subsidy for ambulance service for the ensuing year, it being understood that residents will still be charged for individual calls. (The appropriation for 2007 was \$6,565). The Selectmen recommend this article. The article was accepted and seconded as read and was approved by unanimous voice vote.

ARTICLES DEALING WITH SERVICE AND PROTECTION

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15,000 for the proper expense of the Fire Department and Rescue Squad. (The 2007 appropriation was \$12,500). The article was accepted and seconded as read, and approved by unanimous voice vote.

12. To see if the Town will vote raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 for the purpose of fighting forest fires. This sum to come from reimbursement from the NH State Fire Warden and no amount will be raised through taxation. The Department of Revenue recommends this method of accounting so as not to impact the Fire Department's operating budget. The selectmen recommend this article. The article was accepted and seconded as read and was approved by unanimous voice vote.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25,000 to be added to the Fire Equipment Capital reserve Fund for the purpose of Fire apparatus for the fire department. No withdrawals may be made from this fund except by vote of the town and upon recommendation of the Fire chief. The fund balance as of 12/31/07 is \$78803.15. The Selectmen recommend this article. The article was accepted and seconded and approved by unanimous voice vote.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500 for the proper expenses for the Emergency Management Project. This article is recommended by the Emergency Management Director and the selectmen. The article was accepted and seconded as read and approved by voice vote.

15. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$37,949.59 for the proper

expenses of the Police Department. The Selectmen recommend this article. (The appropriation for 2007 was \$33,000). The article was accepted and seconded as read. After some discussion the article was approved by unanimous voice vote.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000 for the purpose of patrols performed by the Nelson Police Department for the state of NH, Cheshire County, Sheriff's Office and other authorized municipal entities. This sum to come from offsetting grants and no amount will be raised through taxation. The article was accepted and seconded as read, and was approved by voice vote.

ARTICLES DEALING WITH ROADS

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$215,000 for the purpose of the maintenance of highways and bridges for the ensuing year's budget with \$36,080.92 coming from the Highway Block Grant, with the remaining \$178,917.08 to be raised by taxes. The article was accepted and seconded as read, and was approved by unanimous voice vote.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$50,000 for purchase of a Tractor Loader Backhoe and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw \$47,000 from The Road Equipment Capital Reserve Fund with the balance of \$3,000 to be raised by taxes. The total cost for the Tractor Loader Backhoe will not exceed \$50.000. The Road Equipment Committee recommends this withdrawal. The article was accepted and seconded as read. There was considerable discussion as to the necessity of this piece of equipment, but after much discussion the article was approved by voice vote.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,000 to be added to the Road Equipment Capital Reserve Fund. It is understood that no withdrawals may be made from this fund for the purchase of road equipment except by vote of the town upon recommendation of the Road equipment Committee. The Road equipment Committee recommends (which includes the Selectmen) this appropriation. The fund balance on 12/31/2007 was \$48,022.70. (The 2007 appropriation was \$15,000). The article was accepted and seconded as read, and was approved by unanimous voice vote.

20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25,000 to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund for the Salt Barn and Storm-Water site work, at the Town Barn on Old Stoddard Road. It is understood that no withdrawals may be made from this Fund except by the vote of the Town. The Selectmen recommend this appropriation. (The balance as of 12/31/2007 was \$141,190.46). The article was accepted and seconded as read, and was approved by unanimous voice vote.

21. To see if the Town will vote to have the Sexton's position to be an appointed position not an elected position. This will become effective at the March 2009 town election. The Selectmen recommend this article. The article was accepted and seconded as read and was approved by unanimous voice vote.

ARTICLES DEALING WITH PLANNING & ZONING

22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$727 for dues to belong to the Southwest Regional Planning Commission. (Dues was \$722 in 2007) The article was accepted and seconded as read and was approved by unanimous voice vote.

23. Are you in favor of the amendment of the Nelson Zoning Ordinances, Article 2, to include a third district, namely the Great Meadows Wetland Conservation Overlay District (GMWCOD)? This ordinance, adopted under the authority granted pursuant to RSA 674:16, Grant of Power, and RSA 674:21, Innovative Change and Use Controls, is for the purpose of protecting the public health, safety and general welfare by promoting the most appropriate use of the land and to protect the wetland ecosystem and water quality in accord with the goals and objectives of the Master Plan, as presented at the Public Hearing on January 10, 2008 and approved by the Planning Board. (By Ballot) The balloting of this article was declared null and void by our Moderator due to a clerical error.

NO 96 Ballot results are: YES 78

OTHER ARTICLES

24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,200 to purchase and install a Reverse Osmosis filter system to provide a safe drinking water for the Library and Town Hall. This system will correct the problem of high Total Dissolved Solids, high Chloride and Sodium, in order to bring the water up to EPA drinking water standards. The article was accepted and seconded as read and approved by unanimous voice vote.

25. To transact any other business or discuss other warrant proposals as may be legally brought before the meeting.

At this time Jane Kirk, Selectman Chair stepped down off the podium to present two recognition awards:

The first went to Joan A. Warner. Joan first became a member of the Supervisors of the Checklist Board when she was 21 years old. She served in that capacity until this March, over 40 years! Jane presented her with a framed copy of the 2007 Town Report cover, and gift certificates.

The second recognition was for Charlie Lang, retiring Selectman. Charlie served the Town well in his 6 years as Selectman. Charlie too received a framed copy of the 2007 Town Report cover. Charlie will be missed.

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

Minutes of the Nelson School District Meeting March 7, 2008

At 7:00 p.m., Moderator Richard Church called the meeting to order. A motion was made and seconded to waive the reading of the warrant. Wayne Woodridge, Assistant Superintendent for Towns, and Tim Ruehr, Business Manager for Towns, were in attendance from SAU 29, as well as Sheila Vara, Nelson School Principal. Approximately 30 residents of the town of Nelson were in attendance. The meeting began with a performance by 11 Nelson School children of songs and dance. Their performance received a standing ovation!

Moderator Church reminded those assembled that the voting for School District Officers would be held on Tuesday, March 11, 2008. He also shared a historical note regarding Nelson School. In 1824, the School Budget was \$450!

Article 1: To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

The motion was made and seconded that the District receive the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto. Article 1 was passed as presented.

Article 2: To see what sum of money the District will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries for school district officials and agents, for the statutory obligations of the District, or to take any other action in relation thereto.

It was moved and seconded that the District raise and appropriate \$1,499,294 for the support of schools, for the salaries for school district officials and agents, and for the statutory obligations of the District, or to take any other action in relation thereto. After a detailed discussion of the budget, Article 2 was passed by voice vote, as presented.

Article 3: To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate up to \$15,000 from its unencumbered funds, if any, remaining on hand at the end of fiscal year, June 30, 2008, to the Capital Reserve Fund established by the voters of the District at the March, 1972, District Meeting for the purpose of construction/reconstruction of buildings and/or purchase of equipment and/or the acquisition of land for school purposes, or to take any other action in relation thereto.

It was moved and seconded that the District raise and appropriate up to \$15,000 from it unencumbered funds, if any, remaining on hand at the end of fiscal year, June 30, 2008, to the Capital Reserve Fund established by the voters of the District at the March, 1972, District Meeting for the purpose of construction/reconstruction of buildings and/or purchase of equipment and/or the acquisition of land for school purposes, or to take any other action in relation thereto. The Article passed by voice vote, as presented.

Article 4: To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate up to \$15,000 from its unencumbered funds, if any, remaining on hand at the end of fiscal year, June 30,

2008, to the High School/Middle School Tuition Fund established by the voters on March 5, 1999, for the purpose of paying for future year unanticipated special education and/or middle school and high school tuitions, or to take any other action in relation thereto. If there is an insufficient, undesignated fund balance as of June 30, 2008 to fund this appropriation and the appropriation in Article 3 (Capital Reserve Fund), Article 3 will be funded first, with any additional surplus to be applied to this warrant article.

It was moved and seconded that the District raise and appropriate up to \$15,000 from its unencumbered funds, if any, remaining on hand at the end of fiscal year, June 30, 2008, to the High School/Middle School Tuition Fund established by the voters on March 5, 1999, for the purpose of paying for future year unanticipated special education and/or middle school and high school tuitions, or to take any other action in relation thereto. If there is an insufficient, undesignated fund balance as of June 30, 2008 to fund this appropriation and the appropriation in Article 3 (Capital Reserve Fund), Article 3 will be funded first, with any additional surplus to be applied to this warrant article. Article 4 passed by voice vote, as presented.

Article 8: To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Kelly French, School Board Chair, thanked Thomas Newcombe for his years of service to the Nelson School District. A resolution was read to honor him. The resolution passed unanimously.

It was moved that the meeting be adjourned. The meeting was adjourned at 8:10 p.m.

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT

Congratulations to the students from Nelson, who continue to show tremendous academic performance in reading and math on the New Hampshire state assessments released on January 20th. Congratulations and thank you to staff members, who have invested their knowledge, skills, and energies in assisting students in their learning each day. For the second consecutive year Nelson had the highest math scores among area schools. Of the 14 school districts in the region, Nelson students achieved the second highest score in reading. The improvement that has occurred in test scores should not be taken for granted. Continued progress is highly contingent upon open lines of communication between the home and school and a good understanding of what goes on in the school.

Nelson parents and school board members have set high expectations for our students, demanding not only excellent math and reading programs but also a curriculum that includes critical thinking, social skills, citizenship, health, physical education and the arts. I believe we already have quality programs in all those areas. Nelson School continues to focus on what matters most: the documented progress of each studentpersonally, socially, physically, and academically. Over the past several years, the Nelson principal and staff have worked hard to implement a comprehensive social curriculum identified as the Responsive Classroom, a central tenet of this program is to develop students' sense of connection within a community. We believe this to be essential to children's well-being. Once basic needs are met, the most significant need of children is to belong. When students feel disconnected and disassociated, they are more susceptible to making poor choices. Every 26 seconds, a child drops out of school. The more our students feel that the school community cares about them, the more likely they are to grow academically and socially. Strong student-community relationships have been linked to many positive outcomes, including an increase in learning and better behavior in classrooms.

In SAU 29 we have many great examples of programs which contribute to students' sense of belonging. School counselors from most SAU schools worked two weeks this summer revising the comprehensive guidance curriculum. One expected outcome is for students to experience a stronger sense of community.

To reinforce a sense of belonging, Keene High School has recently included aspects of the Renaissance program—a program designed to strengthen students' connections to the school community, raise the profile of academics, and make it "cool" to do well in school. Schools that incorporate Renaissance cite higher GPAs, increased attendance, improved morale, and stronger graduation rates. For example, inspired by the Renaissance program, an advisory program was successfully implemented last year for all ninth grade students. Last year, as new students came into the school for orientation, faculty lined up along a red carpet, applauding students as they walked to the auditorium. Each student had a star on the wall in the school hallway with his or her name on it. The implied message was, "If you believe in me, then I will believe in myself."

As part of this program, Keene High School formed a positive working relationship with local restaurant Olive Garden to further promote academics and scholar-athlete

achievements. Olive Garden now awards dinner for the entire Keene High School team that has the highest combined GPA for each sports season.

Programs like Renaissance and Responsive Classroom help increase our students' sense of belonging. Once again no student from Nelson was listed as a dropout at Keene High School. Just as we need to create a sense of community for students, we need to foster an educational community among Nelson community members. The Nelson community should be very proud of its students and staff.

Four Nelson seniors reported plans to attend post-secondary educational institutions last spring. These schools included: Rochester Institute of Technology, Keene State College, Southern Virginia University, Brigham Young University.

At least one Nelson student participated in each of the following Keene High School extra-curricula activities: A Cappella Choir, Band, Boys Cross Country, Boys Soccer, Boys Track, Cheshire Center Student Home Builders, Chorus, Class Council, Destination Imagination, Drama Club, Field Hockey, Football, Girls Cross Country, Girls Lacrosse, Girls Track, Girls Volleyball, Ice Hockey, Improv Club, Interact Student Rotarians, Jazz Band, Math Team, Mock Trial, Momentum, National Art Honor Society, National Honor Society, Nordic Skiing, Student Council, Students For a Free Tibet, Swimming – Diving.

The constructive working relationship between the school board and staff continues to promote continuous school improvement. This is facilitated by good communication between the staff and board and by board members' recognition of, and positive interaction with, the staff. One example of this is the recent school board/staff goal-setting retreat, which not only produced a focus around which planning and allocation of resources occurs, but also fosters an ongoing dynamic of cooperation and trust.

We invite you to visit Nelson School, attend a school-related activity, or participate in a school board meeting; we encourage you to attend the Annual District Meeting on Friday, March 6, 2009 at 7:00 PM. Thank you for your support of Nelson's children and their education.

Nelson School opened its doors for the 2008-2009 academic school year with a total of 37 students in kindergarten through grade six. This year we welcomed back to the Nelson School family community Peter Smith, Joy Birdsey, and their daughter Fallon who joins the kindergarten class. Our arms also welcomed two new families: Shannon Clark and her daughter Jade who is in kindergarten, and Rebecca King and son Hunter who joins the fifth grade class.

This year Cindy Benner is teaching a K-2 classroom, Kristin Mullins is teaching the 3/4 classroom, the one-year temporary 5/6 position is being taught by Susan Stires, and Joyce Foster continues in her role of Special Education teacher. Vicki Dowley, our inclusion tutor works with students in all classrooms and Cathy Olsen, our 1-1 tutor provides direct instruction to students in the special education program. Once again, we are fortunate to be able to offer a Title I position. Martha Silk, our most seasoned educator on staff, delivers supplemental services to students in grades K-6 in both reading and math.

Our specialists are an integral part of the program that Nelson School offers and helps to bring wellness and the arts alive! This year we are fortunate to have the majority of the support staff team remain constant. Dan Durand, our physical education teacher, continues to enrich physical education activities with rock climbing and skating. His program also offers an Open Physical Education period where students of all ages are engaged in physical activity while interacting in multi-grade configurations. Marylise Reilly continues in her dual role of Art and French teacher. The bulletin boards are adorned with student artwork thanks to her efforts, and Nelson students continue to excel in French as reported by Keene Middle School and Keene High School personnel. Matt Dillon joined the Nelson team as our new music teacher. His first winter concert was energetic and the buzz of the Nelson community for many days afterwards.

Becky Kohler, our guidance counselor, works with students on Wednesdays and has introduced a new program called Mindfulness. Karen Nickerson, our school nurse has enjoyed teaching the health curriculum to all students and is an extremely valuable resource to both parents and staff.

Kim Keating, Nelson School's secretary and jack-of-all-trades, does everything to make the school run smoothly. And last, but not least our school is kept clean by Rachel Lakin, who continues to make all of us laugh on a weekly basis.

The annual October School Board Retreat was held at the Harris Center in mid-October. Nelson School staff members had an opportunity to shine as they facilitated components of the meeting using the protocols they learned during this past summer in Critical Friends. This year school goals were divided into three categories: On-Going Goals, Focus Goals, and Board Goals.

In our quest to be accountable for student learning, comply with state mandates, and best meet the needs of Nelson students, the Nelson staff continually looks for professional development activities to provide us with the knowledge, skills, and strategies to make this happen. In this age of teacher accountability and the expectation that students will meet prescribed benchmarks to demonstrate competency and proficiency in math, reading, writing, and science. Nelson students ranked first in the region in mathematics, second in the region in reading and science! Although this is only one "snapshot" of how our children perform, it is an important one as it speaks to the expertise of Nelson teachers, as well as the programs that we use. Our longstanding partnership with Carol Tolman in the area of literacy and our continued use of the outstanding Everyday Math program have allowed our students to soar and achieve above the State averages.

As a staff, we continue to recognize and embrace the importance of an inclusive community and seek creative ways to bring children of all ages together. It is our firm belief, that when children are provided with opportunities to authentically engage with children of other ages. community, responsibility, caring and respect abound. With these tenets in mind, the lunchroom has been transformed. Nelson students now eat lunch at round multi-grade tables. Sixth grade students are responsible for serving lunch, fifth grade students are responsible for clearing tables and sweeping the floor, and lunch is enjoyed by all (staff and students) in small multigrade clusters. These simple changes have profoundly changed the atmosphere of lunch. Meaningful, authentic conversations are now happening at each table in which students of all ages are engaged. The second schoolwide initiative for Nelson children was the creation of bi-monthly assemblies. These assemblies are based upon the classroom model of Responsive Classroom and consist of a greeting, pledge and morning song, sharing, birthday celebrations, and activity.

Each year the Nelson staff re-examine past practices, activities, and programs and makes a conscious decision to continue, modify, or discontinue previous practices based upon the activity's level of success and/or the ever-changing needs of our students and families. This year's sixth grade students worked with Joy Birdsey, Mary Fish, and Earle Creasey on a summer movie night that was enjoyed by many Nelson community residents. A portion of the money raised was donated to the upcoming sixth grade trip and the remaining portion went to the PTO. This event was an enormous success and will be a repeat performance in the summer of 2009. Students also participated in a Winter Carnival the Friday before February vacation. Students were offered the opportunity to go ice fishing on Pearly Pond in Rindge, ice-skate on Center Pond, or to build snow forts and snowmen at Nelson School. At noon time all students gathered back at Nelson School for a home-made lunch, which students helped prepare, and enjoy a movie. Specials thanks to Joy Birdsey, Jessica Bigaj, Bud and Kelly French, Earl Creasey, and Don Carlisle for help in making this special day possible.

The Nelson teaching staff continues to hold in high esteem the importance of community service. Children easily and empathetically connect with animals so we chose to form a local partnership with the Monadnock Humane Society to raise money to support their work with animals. In September we kicked off this community service project by having Nelson School students and their parents read the Newbury Award book Shiloh and come together one fall evening to celebrate and watch the movie "Shiloh". This first All School Read was a monumental success and plans are already underway to host our second All School Read next year. In January, Nelson School families participated in a Pet Food Drive and collected more than 148 cans, bags, and boxes of cat and dog food, which was donated, to the Monadnock Humane Society. In early May of 2009, Nelson students will once again raise money for shelter animals of the Monadnock Humane Society by participating in the annual Walk for Animals. On a global level, 84 percent of Nelson School students participated in Trick-or-Treat for UNICEF and raised \$200.00. For the third consecutive year, staff members organized and participated in Casual Friday to raise money for charity.

Our affiliation with the Harris Center remains an integral part of our science curriculum. The students in grades K/1/2 studied geology. The students in the 3/4 classroom participated in a unit on the Ashuelot watershed, and the students in the 5/6 class focused upon forest ecology. The Harris Center for Conservation Education is dedicated to promoting understanding and respect for our natural environment through education of all ages, direct protection and exemplary stewardship of the region's natural resources and programs that encourage active participation in the great outdoors.

This year due to a generous donation from the Carlisle family, Nelson students were once again able to participate in Monadnock Music's "Lend an Ear" program, as well as grade level trips to the Colonial Theatre in Keene, New Hampshire. "Lend an Ear" is a widely acclaimed, innovative outreach program that enriches our music program by exposing students to a variety of musical instruments played by top-level professionals.

Nelson School was fortunate to be the recipient of "Picturing America", a free education resource of the National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH), distributed in cooperation with the American Library Association. Picturing America is a collection of forty images mounted on double-sided laminated posters for display and classroom use.

Thanks to the generosity of the Nelson PTO and the Trustees of the Olivia Rodham Library, Nelson students are once again able to learn library skills under the tutelage of Kris Finnegan. This year we are delighted to have Susan Hansel volunteer at the Nelson School library twice a week.

A school is only as strong as its community support, staff commitment, and volunteers. A heart-felt "thank you" to Jessica Bigaj, Joy Birdsey, and Cindy Benner for recognizing the need and importance of a vital parent teacher organization and working collaboratively together to brainstorm, organize, and execute the fundraisers necessary to fund the rich and varied programs that benefit all children at Nelson School.

Nelson School remains a great place to teach and learn because of the staff, specialists, community members, school board members, parents, administration from SAU 29, and all others who have helped create this wonderful community of learners. Together we really make a difference for the children of Nelson. Once again, thank you for your support of the 2008-2009 school budget. This year your support allowed us to purchase round tables for the lunchroom, provide a weeklong puppet and theatre residency for students, and continue to offer three after school programs.
