Warrant for Town Meeting

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Boston in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said New Boston on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.
 - (a) To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid for the improvement of highways and bridges.
 - (b) For the support of schools.
 - (c) For repairing roads and bridges.
 - (d) For maintenance of the poor.
 - (e) For memorial day.
 - (f) For all other necessary town charges.
3. To see what action the town will take in regard to a fire alarm, raise and appropriate money for the same or act in relation thereto.
4. To see what action the town will take in regard to care of Soldiers' Monument, raise and appropriate money for the same, or act in relation thereto.
5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for the purpose of co-operation with the State and Federal Government in control of the White Pine Blister Rust, or act in relation thereto.

6. To see if the town will vote to purchase fire hose and appropriate money for the same, or act in relation thereto.

7. To see if the town will vote to pay for digging a well on Meeting House Hill for fire protection, raise and appropriate money for the same, or act in relation thereto.

8. To see if the town will vote to accept the "Cross Road" reflectors now installed, raise and appropriate the sum of \$110 to pay for same, or act in relation thereto.

9. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the road from the Horace P. Beals farm to the road leading from New Boston village to Hadley's mill and road leading from the farm of Isaac W. Dodge to road first mentioned, subject to gates or bars.

10. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the road beginning at junction of Jerry hill road so-called, southeast of Chancey's mill and running southeasterly to the road leading from Chestnut hill to Goffstown, known as the Eben Warren corner, thence easterly to the Mountain road corner so-called to the road from West Bedford to Goffstown.

11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100 for the purpose of improving part of the Old Cemetery, or act in relation thereto.

12. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept from any person or persons a deed or deeds of lands and forests, or both, situate in New Boston, in trust for shade or ornament upon such terms and conditions as they may deem expedient and for the interest, advantage and enjoyment of the Town of New Boston and all of its inhabitants.

13. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to hire money to meet the necessary expenses of the town, or act in relation thereto.

14. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees and other Officers heretofore chosen, or act in relation thereto.

15. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The School Board of the District of New Boston submits the following report:

The District's buildings that are now in use are in very good repair, with the exception of paint. The roofs are in passable shape for a few years.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of New Boston:

New Boston Teachers

For the work this year in High School we have been fortunate in having no change in the teaching staff. Mr. Lyons is completing his fourth year, Miss Eastman is completing her third, and Miss Dodge, her second year.

In the elementary schools there are three new teachers. At number five, Miss Constance Urquhart, a graduate of Keene Normal last June; number thirteen, Miss Elizabeth Crombie, also a graduate of Keene last June, and in the village grammar room, Miss Esther Todd, not a stranger by any means, also a Keene Normal graduate.

Enrollment

The enrollment, which will be given in detail later, has varied but little from previous years. The attendance this year has been somewhat broken on account of various ailments, but outside of these enforced absences, the attendance record has been good.

High School Cost

Almost everywhere tax payers have an idea that schools are costing more than they should, and that, because the cost seems high, now and then it may be insinuated that there are expenditures which are unnecessary, or which border possibly upon carelessness or extravagance. In order to understand better regarding school cost it may be interesting to compare the New Boston High School along with a few others about the same size. I have selected five high schools in the state in which the enrollment runs from forty-one to forty-nine as a basis for comparison. The following will give the enrollment of each high school and the cost per capita for the last year:

School number one, 41 pupils, cost per capita	\$98.61
New Boston, 43 pupils, cost per capita	\$110.00
School number three, 45 pupils, cost per capita	\$150.29
School number four, 41 pupils, cost per capita	\$194.40
School number five, 49 pupils, cost per capita	\$196.71

The median cost for this group is \$150.29. New Boston's cost is \$110 per pupil. This indicates that among schools of this size, New Boston is paying \$40 per pupil less than the average for these schools.

Reckoning with the high schools of the state, large and small, including all except the private schools, the median cost per pupil last year was \$134.53. New Boston's cost, \$110, is almost \$25 less per pupil than the state average. It should be borne in mind that New Boston, among other schools of its size, is next to the last in low cost and in the lowest 25% of all the high schools of the state. If this cost of \$110 seems unreasonable notice these per capita costs; \$209, \$224, \$290, \$341. These are actual costs in four other schools.

Elementary School Costs

For elementary schools of the state the median per capita cost was \$78.94 last year. For the elementary pupils New Boston's total per capita cost per pupil was \$63.28. This means that in the matter of elementary school cost, New Boston is in the low third, which also means that two-thirds of the two hundred and forty-seven districts in the state are paying more per pupil than is New Boston. A statement like this does not lessen school cost one cent. Only it is well to understand that as costs for food and clothing and for all lines of business, materials, supplies, wages and everything have "gone up" and remain up. School costs have "gone up" and there can be no appreciable lessening until there are lower costs in all other lines. Budgets may be reduced somewhat, but not sufficiently to make any material difference in the tax rate without seriously crippling the schools.

Four Years of Agriculture in the High School

The work of the Vocational Agricultural course is in two divisions (1) that of classroom demonstrations and study, supplemented by field trips; (2) that of practical home project work managed by the pupil under the supervision of the agricultural teacher.

There are enrolled in the agricultural course 16 boys divided by classes as follows, seniors 7, juniors 2, sophomores 3, freshmen 4. For economy of instruction these classes are in two groups, i. e., freshmen and sophomores are in one group and the juniors and seniors in another. Since the introduction of this course four years ago, only four boys have left school. Of the three graduates from the agricultural course, two are making excellent progress in preparing themselves to enter the business of farming. If this ratio could be maintained in the future, the agricultural prosperity of our town and state would be assured.

The home project, which is required each year of all pupils, has been on the whole successful. The projects in 1926 aggregated five acres of potatoes, 2,000 chickens, one acre field corn, one acre market garden, the setting of one acre of apple trees and planting of one-half acre of field beans. Each project was planned and managed by the pupil. Cost accounts were kept and the labor income computed. Items such as interest, taxes, insurance, rent and depreciation being figured as an expense. The total labor income of ten projects amounted to \$1077.64. On a potato project Everett Leavitt secured a yield of 133 bushels on one-half acre. This was a record yield for New Boston during past season. The labor income on this project was \$189 or \$3.58 per hour. An early broiler project was very successfully conducted by Horace Chandler, on which a labor income of \$127 was secured. Some other creditable results were secured by Laban Todd, \$142; Donald Byam, \$180; Leslie Tower, \$121; Harlan Brown, \$150.

The agricultural course also provides for instruction and practical application in wood and iron work, soldering, harness repairing and gas engine work. The shop at the rear of the school building, which was made by the boys by remodeling the old wood shed and toilet rooms, serves the purpose very well. However, a door large enough for the admitting of a wagon or auto should be provided.

A project of shop work financed by the Agricultural Club was the building of a Ford auto sprayer. The value and practicability of this outfit is well known to the community. During the past year, the boys sprayed over 2000 apple trees, numerous hen houses, dairy barns and several acres of potatoes. This was done at a reasonable cost to the owners and netted some profit and experience to the boys.

Interest in this sprayer has spread far and wide both in this state and outside. Many inquiries and words of praise have been received by the Agricultural Club. The Hopkinton Fair Association invited the club to exhibit the sprayer and made it a special feature of the large agricultural exhibit of that Fair. Because of excellence in their shop work and agricultural products New Boston High received a beautiful silver cup as first premium award at Hopkinton Fair.

As an aid to the co-operative idea that is being carried out in so many agricultural enterprises, the Agricultural Club was organized. In addition to the ordinary business and educational features of many organizations, it aims to give financial aid to boys who need a little money to carry on their project. In this manner the boys are getting the co-operative idea of helping each other and also learning business methods.

The agricultural course seems to be justifying its place in the New Boston High School curriculum and in the community. The benefit of agricultural information is open to all citizens. It should serve adult farm-

ers as well as school pupils. The Federal Vocational Act provides for evening schools in agriculture. One of these will be attempted in New Boston this spring.

Equipment and Books

During the past few years the endeavor has been to "fit out" the various schools as well as possible with the amount provided for books and equipment. At the present time there is a fair provision by way of necessary equipment and books. However, books and equipment do not last forever. There must be constant additions and replacements. And the work of any good teacher may be less effective if she lacks tools with which to work.

The Budget presented by the School Board for the next school year, 1927-28, is somewhat less than for this year. But it should not be forgotten nor overlooked that this budget makes no provision for some things that should be gradually taken care of. Here are three items:

- (1) Painting of school buildings.
- (2) The absolute need of new blackboards in the

village rooms. The old ones are ample enough as far as area is concerned, but much of the area is practically useless.

(3) Sanitary drinking facilities in the village building. The present arrangement, as used, is a menace to health.

These matters need not be loaded into one budget or one year—unless by “putting them off” they, later, become so imperative that they have to be handled in that way. But until these are taken care of some one item should be disposed of each year. This coming year it might be blackboards, or at least for two rooms—next year sanitary drinking arrangements—and the next year painting. The order of these matters not so much as the fact of getting at them. But the budget proposed provides not one cent for any of these, in fact scarcely takes account of necessary items of operation. If upkeep and repairs could be finally “side-stepped” by “putting them off” there would be a reason for that course. But the most ordinary business judgment suggests doing unavoidable things that need to be done—and which in the end will have to be done—as easily and as quickly as possible. These matters can be attended to without inflicting a burden upon anyone—and the children of New Boston will profit by the investment.
