Town Warrant

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Exeter, in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs: [L.S.]

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said Exeter, on Tuesday, the second day of March next, at eight o'clock in the forenoon, to choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year, by official ballot, and to take other action required to be inserted on said official ballot; the polls to open at eight o'clock in the forenoon and to close not earlier than eight o'clock in the evening, and thereafter to reconvene at the Exeter High School gymnasium on Monday, March 8, 1976, at seven o'clock in the afternoon for the purpose of acting upon all other matters to come before the meeting.

1. To choose by ballot and plurality vote one (1) Selectman for the term of three (3) years.
2. To choose by ballot and plurality vote three (3) members of the Library Committee for the term of three (3) years.
3. To choose by ballot and plurality vote one (1) Trustee of the Robinson Fund for the term of seven (7) years.
4. To choose by ballot and plurality vote one (1) Trustee of the Robinson Fund for the term of five (5) years.
5. To choose by ballot and plurality vote one (1) Trustee of Trust Funds held by the Town of Exeter for the term of three (3) years.
6. To choose by ballot and plurality vote one (1) Trustee of the Swasey Parkway for the term of three (3) years.
7. On petition of Caroline F. Smith and seventeen (17) others to see if the Town will adopt the following article:
"Shall we adopt the provisions of RSA 72:43-b and 43-c for expanded exemptions on real estate which provide for a resident sixty-five years of age up to seventy-five, a five thousand dollar exemption; a resident seventy-five years of age up to eighty, a ten thousand dollar exemption; a resident eighty years of age or older, a twenty thousand dollar exemption, provided that the resident owns the real estate individually or jointly with another or his spouse with whom he has

been living for at least five years as man and wife; said resident had a net income of less than seven thousand dollars or combined income with spouse of less than nine thousand dollars; and owns assets of any kind, tangible or intangible, less bonafide encumbrances, not in excess of thirty-five thousand dollars?"

8. On petition of Irene Peck and thirty-eight (38) others to see if the Town will vote to permit a qualified voter, who is absent from Town on Town Meeting Day, or who by reason of physical disability is unable to vote in person, to cast his ballot according to the laws of New Hampshire for absentee voting.
9. *Zoning Amendment #1:*
To see if the Town will vote to amend the Town of Exeter Zoning Ordinance, as proposed by the Planning Board, as follows:
Amend the Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Exeter, Article 4, Section 20, Schedule 1: Zoning Schedule of Use Controls
Delete in the RU District (Rural), under Special Exceptions, the word "stone" so that the Special Exceptions read as follows:
"Community Buildings, Social Halls, Clubs, Lodges and Fraternal Organizations. Planned Unit Development. Golf Courses and Public Swimming Pools. Essential Services. Extraction of Gravel, Sand, Topsoil. Conversions. Private Schools. Expansion of Non-Conforming Use.
10. *Zoning Amendment #2:*
To see if the Town will vote to amend the Town of Exeter Zoning Ordinance, as proposed by the Planning Board, as follows:
Amend the Zoning Map as adopted March 6, 1973, by delineating the boundary lines between districts to follow property lines, streets, rivers, and power lines as shown on the proposed map.
11. To choose all other necessary Town Officers, auditors, or committees for the ensuing year.
12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply, negotiate and do all other things necessary to obtain such Federal or State funds or other assistance as may be available for the study of, design of, and construction of a

sewage disposal system, and pass any vote relating thereto.

13. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to apply, negotiate and do all things necessary to obtain such Federal funds as may be available through the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 and pass any vote relating thereto.
14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Treasurer, with approval of the Selectmen and pursuant to RSA 33:7, to incur debt for temporary loans in anticipation of 1976 taxes and to issue therefor notes of the Town payable within one (1) year after their date, and to pay or renew the same by issue of new notes payable within one (1) year after the date of the original obligation.
15. To hear the report of agents, auditors and other officers and committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote pertaining thereto.
16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Town Treasurer, with the approval of the Selectmen, to borrow money in anticipation of revenue of the Water and Sewer Department.
17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Sixteen Thousand, Two Hundred and Forty (\$16,240.00) Dollars for the Town's participation in the expenses of the Exeter Area Youth Group Home.
18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate Six Thousand, One Hundred and Three Dollars and Eighty Cents (\$6,103.80) as its contribution to the Southeastern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission.
19. On petition of Harry G. Ford and ten (10) others to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty-Seven Hundred (\$2,700.00) Dollars for the Area Homemakers Home Health Aide Service, Inc.
20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Eight Thousand (\$8,000.00) Dollars as the Town's contribution to the Seacoast Regional Counseling Center.
21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred Fifty (\$250.00) Dollars for Seacoast Arts, Inc., a non-profit organization dedicated to the promotion of the arts in the seacoast area.
22. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Fire Department Capital Reserve Fund and to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars to be paid into same.
23. To see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to borrow funds for the construction of improvements in the Exeter Industrial Park not in excess of One Hundred Thousand (\$100,000.00) Dollars in anticipation of revenues to be received for the sale of land to new industry in the Industrial Park.
24. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of RSA 36A:5 which allows that the whole or part of any monies appropriated for the Conservation Commission in any year to be placed in a conservation fund and allowed to accumulate from year to year.
25. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept as public streets a deed from LaPerle Realty, Inc., of Michael Avenue and Alford Street so-called in Oak Haven Trailer Park and in return therefore, accept in addition, a deed of the remaining premises in said Oak Haven Trailer Park owned by LaPerle Realty, Inc., said additional premises being bound on the South by Colcord's Pond; on the West by land of Dearborn's Express; on the East by land of James Bunker and on the North by Epping Road; excluding therefrom the lots previously deeded out.
26. On petition of Daniel S. Davis and 11 others to see if the Town should authorize the Board of Selectmen to uphold the decision of the Exeter Board of Adjustment in their denial of the establishment of the rock quarry in the Oakland section of the Town and to support the residents of the Oakland section who have sought to have the Board of Adjustment denied upheld.
27. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars out of the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund to be turned over to the Bicentennial Committee to be used at its discretion toward the Town's participation in the celebration of the Bicentennial of the United States.
28. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of Twenty-Four Thousand (\$24,000.00) Dollars out of the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund for the purpose of cleaning, painting and repairing the water storage tank on Fuller Lane.

29. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of Five Thousand, Five Hundred (\$5,500.00) Dollars out of the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund for the purpose of building a salt storage shed at the new highway garage.
30. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of One Thousand, Nine Hundred and Sixty (\$1,960.00) Dollars out of the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund for the purpose of purchasing pocket pagers for the regular firemen.
31. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of Three Thousand, One Hundred and Eighteen (\$3,118.00) Dollars out of the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund for the purpose of purchasing a radio monitor alerting system for use of call firemen.
32. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of Three Hundred and Fifty (\$350.00) Dollars out of the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund for the purpose of purchasing a small boat for Fire Department rescue operations.
33. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of One Thousand, Three Hundred (\$1,300.00) Dollars out of Revenue Sharing Trust Fund for the purpose of purchasing and installing storm windows at the Community Center.
34. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of Eighty-Seven Thousand (\$87,000.00) Dollars out of the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund for the purpose of purchasing 31,817 square feet of land on Bow and Court Streets from Dorothy Ham and for making improvements thereto for the use of the Town as a public parking and green area.
35. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of One Hundred Five Thousand (\$105,000.00) Dollars out of the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund for the purpose of adding to the Capital Reserve Fund for the construction of a Public Safety Complex.
36. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of Six Thousand, Seven Hundred (\$6,700.00) Dollars out of the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund for the purpose of purchasing a safety device known as "Jaws of Life" for the emergency use of the police and fire departments.
37. On petition of James Griswold and nine (9) others to see if the Town will vote to fix the annual salary of the Selectmen at Fifteen Hundred (\$1,500.00) Dollars per year and to raise and appropriate an additional Twenty-Five Hundred (\$2,500.00) Dollars above the sum budgeted therefor.
38. To see if the Town will vote to fix the annual salary of the Tax Collector at Nine Thousand, Seven Hundred and Fifty (\$9,750.00) Dollars and to raise and appropriate an additional Seven Hundred and Twenty (\$720.00) above the sum budgeted therefor.
39. To see if the Town will vote to fix the annual salary of the Town Treasurer at Three Thousand (\$3,000.00) Dollars and to raise and appropriate an additional One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars above the sum budgeted therefor.
40. To see what sums of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the poor, for repairing and building bridges, for repairing and building sidewalks, for building drains and sewers, for oiling streets, for payment of the Town debt, for lighting streets, for defraying expenses of decorating the graves of soldiers, for preventing the spread of insect pests within the Town, for payment of firemen for the ensuing year, and for other charges arising within the Town.
41. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The annual financial report of the Town of Exeter, New Hampshire, for the year ended December 31, 1975, is submitted herewith.

Accounting System and Reports

The Town's accounting records for general governmental operations are maintained on a modified accrual basis, with the revenues being recorded when received and expenditures being recorded when disbursed. Accounting records for the Town's utilities are maintained on a cash basis.

Budgetary control is maintained by recording the appropriations approved at Town Meeting in March and the encumbrances of this appropriation with Selectmen warrants continued at the monthly Selectmen's meeting. Selectmen warrants are examined to determine they do not exceed the appropriations. Appropriations may be reclassified within the General Fund by the Selectmen.

General Governmental Functions

Exhibit A-1 is the comparative balance sheet as of December 31, 1975, 1974 and reflects the changes in accounts. Exhibit A-4, analysis of changes in fund balances, reflects the changes during the year. It discloses that the fund balance was decreased by expenditures in the amount of \$32,053.89. Exhibit A-3 discloses the reserve for encumbrances 1975 charged against surplus in the net amount of \$47,589.22.

The fund balance is in a deficit position of \$(7,330.54) as of December 31, 1975, resulting from

the recording of contingent reserves and refund liability of prior years' assessed taxes, in the amount of \$74,487.08.

Auditor's Comment

As reported in prior years, an inventory of all the fixed assets owned by the Town should be made. Records of the current year's additions are being submitted to the Town Manager. The accounts of the enterprise funds, Water and Sewerage Department, are being maintained on a modified accrual basis but reported on a cash basis. The Town should change this procedure to be completely on the accrual, reporting income when earned rather than received and disbursements when incurred rather than when disbursed.

It should be a firm policy to continually review the system of internal control over assets and funds, and to insure that all items have been accounted for. The auditors request the Town maintain all enterprise funds under complete accrual accounting for 1976. Two classifications of assets are not being reported: Fixed Assets with no disclosed estimate of value; Customer Water and Sewerage receivables, amounting to \$37,169.92 in 1975 and \$47,461.89 in 1974, less any reserve for uncollectible accounts.

It is also a further recommendation of the auditors that the clerk of Water and Sewer Department and the Recreation Director be bonded, as both individuals handle a substantial amount of money.

Acknowledgments

I should like to express my appreciation to all members of the departments who assisted and contributed to the preparation of these statements. I should also like to thank the new Town Managers, Treasurer and Selectmen for their co-operation in assisting us to complete this year's audit.

In my opinion, and subject to the paragraph above, the accompanying statements present fairly the assets and liabilities of the various funds of the Town of Exeter as of December 31, 1975, arising from cash transactions, and the revenue collected and expenditures disbursed during the year ended on a basis consistent with that of the preceding year.

Department of Public Works

EXETER HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

I respectfully submit the annual report for the Town of Exeter's Highway Department.

During the year 1975, there was a total of 23 storms with a total accumulation of approximately 76½ inches of snow and six freezing rain storms.

Summer maintenance consisted of spring clean-up, coldpatching potholes, manholes and catch basin repairs, sweeping of streets and sidewalks and trimming and grooming of roadsides.

Along with our regular summer maintenance, Chestnut Street was done under our reconstruction program. Ash Street, Morrow Street, Cottage Street, Marlboro Street, Jady Hill Circle, Woodlawn Circle, and Bonnie Drive were done under our Stone Chip program.

Park Street, Cass Street, Green Street, Summer Street, Garfield Street, Jady Hill Extension, and Chestnut Hill were done under our Overlay Program. Reconstruction, Stone Chip Mix and Overlaying was done by Bell & Flynn, Inc., with the exception of raising catch basins and manholes which was done by Town Employees.

We were only able to do 400 feet of sidewalks this year because most of the men were working on the Reconstruction of 2,200 feet of road on Beech Hill Road under the State of New Hampshire's T.R.A. Program.

Exeter Water and Sewer Departments

I respectfully submit the annual report for the Town of Exeter Water and Sewer Departments.

1975 was a year with several accomplishments and problems for Exeter's water and sewer users.

Our 1,000,000 gallon water standpipe on Epping Road was drained, cleaned by sand blasting, and re-preserved with a three-coat Epoxy paint which will last for many years to come. However, residents of Exeter experienced rusty water for a six-week period while the necessary contract work was being done.

Water, sewer and electrical services were constructed by Department crews to service Exeter's Recreational Park off Hampton Rd.

Exeter's well-known Holding Pond was cleaned of sludge deposits and other accumulated debris by Folsom Marine, Inc., improving the general appearance of the pond, banks, etc. and quality of the Squamscott River.

Exeter's water and sewer pipes were maintained in the usual manner and with as little interruption to service as necessary.

Construction of a joint Water and Sewer Testing Laboratory has begun in the old Water Department pumping station utilizing available space. The new laboratory when complete will minimize the time and cost of testing water and sewer as required by State and Federal Agencies.

Exeter Area Visiting Nurse Association

The Exeter Area Visiting Nurse Association, Inc., is a Community Health Service providing health care to individuals and families in their place of residence or in ambulatory care settings for purposes of preventing disease and promoting, maintaining or restoring health or minimizing the effects of illness or disability.

The nurse gives care and treatments as ordered by each person's physician, assists with the rehabilitation of persons of all ages, handicapped or ill with various conditions or illnesses. The nurse instructs designated persons in giving necessary care between nursing visits, teaches families and individuals good nutrition and understanding of special diets, accident prevention and how to cope with illness; advises new and expectant mothers in the care of themselves and their babies; provides Tuberculosis and psychiatric follow-up and refers when appropriate to other agencies.

The Physical Therapist establishes and supervises a program to return each person to his maximum potential, working under a plan established by each patient's own physician.

The Home Health Aide works under the supervision of the Registered Nurse or the Registered Physical Therapist. She provides personal and

unskilled care to patients, such as baths and exercises, does light housekeeping and meal preparation.

The Association provides: 1. The service of a Home Health Coordinator to the Exeter Hospital to assist in planning the continuing care of patients in their home after leaving the hospital. 2. A Well Child clinic twice monthly for physicals to infants and pre-school children of eligible families and immunizations. 3. Sponsors screening programs in cooperation with the N.H. Department of Public Health. 4. Blood Pressure clinics for Senior Citizens. 5. Flu Vaccine clinics for Senior Citizens.

The Exeter Area Visiting Nurse Association is a Medicare and Medicaid certified agency.

Department of Recreation and Parks

In 1975 your Recreation and Parks Department has endeavored to provide a comprehensive program at minimum expense to the taxpayers.

Recreation thrives in Exeter because of an active and enthusiastic public. The community benefits from the deep involvement and personal concern of people who serve as coaches, officials, aides and committee members in all phases of Recreation. This is not a "town program," it is a "people program."

For the new park on Hampton Rd., 1975 was an important year. Our 10 new tennis courts were operational for a full season, and more than 16,000 people used these courts from April 1 until October 31. We were able to give free tennis lessons to more than 300 children, and the high school tennis team also made use of the courts in the spring. Other highlights included the completion of our municipal pool for an anticipated opening in June, 1976. The softball field and two minor league fields will be open for play in the spring.

This department has grown over the years and now has more than 20 parks, cemeteries and commons plus the Community Center and the Band-

stand to maintain. Through tight operation and with your continued support, we will try our best to make you, the citizen, proud of your Recreation and Parks Department.

Many of our programs are self-supporting and have been for the past 4½ years in which I have been your director.

If you have a question about the department — programs we offer or areas we maintain — feel free to drop by the Recreation office at the Community Center. You may be surprised at what we do to serve not only the youth, but adults and senior citizens.

More than 7,000 people used the Community Center in 1975.

Recreation is my life, and I pledge to give you the best programs and facilities that the budget will allow.

Public Library Report

The year 1975 has been remarkably like 1974. Our circulation has changed by only 300; registration and resources are up a bare 1,000.

Most of the problems we had in 1974 are still here. Of course now we have a spanking-new all purpose room, exquisitely carpeted and cabineted, with stacking plastic chairs donated by the Friends of the Library and lush leather ones sold cheaply by the bank.

We are still very crowded. We still don't have quite enough books to satisfy the demand, so people have to wait weeks or months for a best seller. We haven't expanded our hours. We aren't doing much with reference service.

However, none of these things are terribly dreadful. Inflation is terribly dreadful, so until things get appreciably better we shall go on with what we have, just like everybody else, and not ask for or attempt too much more.

What we do have is surprisingly good. The 1975 New Hampshire State Library statistics showed Exeter as having the largest circulation in its size class, even edging out Hanover (though not by much) and third in its per capita circulation. We are even ahead of some libraries in the Cities Over 10,000 population class. Our holdings are nearly twice what anybody close to our size has — perhaps that just means we aren't discarding ruthlessly enough, but the figures look satisfying.

We certainly have a large, enthusiastic clientele. We have a small core of dedicated, hardworking Friends of the Library. We have a good, professional, if somewhat harried, staff. We have progressive trustees and plans for the future.

The year 1976 will probably be much like 1975. That is, it will probably be pretty good. And then when things in general get better we will too.

Report of Conservation Commission

In 1975 the Conservation Commission worked in several areas:

(1) **Tree planting** — With the customary assistance of the Highway Department, the Commission planted on town streets 35 maples and sycamores, all dug from its own Wilfred Moreau Nursery. This tree-planting program has been a featured activity since 1969, but 1975 was the first year that the Commission was able to use its own trees. Members of the Commission, with the help of Boy Scouts, also planted 500 white spruce seedlings in the sewer lagoon area, augmenting the grove it began 10 years ago. In addition, the Commission provided a flowering crab, which was planted in front of the Town Library.

Commission plans for 1976 include further tree-planting on town streets, along the road to the Industrial Park, and in the Recreation Area. During 1975 the Commission contributed to a fund being amassed to pay for sidewalk trees on Water Street; it plans to contribute again in 1976.

(2) **Land conservation** — Mr. Arthur Plouffe generously donated to the Commission a wood lot abutting on Henderson-Swasey Park. Since the Park came into town hands in 1971, the Commission has added three contiguous properties; the total area now comes to over 180 acres. In 1976 the Commission hopes to purchase still another plot, on which it now holds an easement.

Plans for Henderson-Swasey in 1976 also include a reprinting and updating of the descriptive leaflet, a revamping and extension of the trail system, and, most important of all, closer supervision of the Park, now plagued with periodic littering and with trespassing by unauthorized vehicles. We also hope to begin implementing an area master plan that has been drawn up for us by Ronald Klemarczyk and two fellow students from U.N.H.

(3) **Education** — The Commission paid part of the cost for a student to attend an Appalachian Mountain Club Winter Workshop. In addition, the Commission contributed toward the expenses of sending several classes of fifth-grade students for a week to Camp Sargent in Peterborough, an ecology camp run by Boston University. Attendance of Exeter children at this camp under the guidance of Michael Smith, a teacher at the Lincoln Street School, deserves town support as an investment that we believe will pay off in the future — in adult awareness of ecological issues.

(4) **Water supply** — According to statute, surveillance of streams, wetlands, drainage areas, and water supply in general is an important responsibility of local conservation commissions. In 1975, at the request of the Commission, agents of the N.H. Water Supply and Pollution Commission tested Exeter rivers at several points for bacterial counts and contaminating substances. One result was the discovery of a serious raw sewage discharge; with the collaboration of Harold Carbonneau, the problem was corrected. Further vigilance in this area will be needed in 1976 and beyond.

Exeter Planning Board

During 1975 the Planning Board held 39 meetings, 24 being public hearings and 15 being work sessions. Thirty-six cases were processed; 12 subdivisions, 12 non-residential site plan reviews including plans for the new industrial park and its first occupant, and 12 miscellaneous matters such as perimeter surveys or boundary changes.

Ninety-one new building lots were approved compared to fourteen during 1974. Only six multi-family units were approved but nearly 200 unbuilt units are outstanding from past approvals or court mandates.

The revision of sub-division regulations was adopted in February of 1975. A special citizens committee to propose a sign ordinance was appointed and will be heard from during 1976. The board's warrant article on this subject will be greatly guided by the work of this group. Master planning moved ahead with a citizen opinion survey, conducted with aid from the Southeastern Regional Planning Office. Our master plan design objective will be heavily influenced by this survey and key elements of the plan should be adopted during 1976 with others following more quickly once the basic objective is set.

Your board, with the support of the Selectmen, entered the compliance enforcement field during 1975 with an engineering survey of a partially completed development. The results indicated numerous weaknesses in our ability to make our ordinance and regulations afford protection in actual practice. Steps are being taken to correct this problem prior to future projects. Subsequent events concerning the particular project seem to bear out the value of the board's concern from the standpoint of protecting Exeter from bearing the cost of developers' mistakes.

The combination of enforcement weaknesses and adverse court decisions could serve to nullify the protections you seek to get by adopting ordinances, codes and regulations. The best intended regulations

are no better than their enforcement and their ability to withstand court challenge. The board will pay close attention to both concerns during 1976.

All appointed members served throughout the year with the excellent attendance and energetic contributions that have become their characteristic. Ethel Doe replaced Helen Carr Dix as Selectman representative following town meeting. The board enjoyed the support and close cooperation of departments and other boards and we look forward to a continuation during 1976.

In response to rising taxes and expanding school populations we offered warrant articles to allow slowed growth and these were defeated at the special meeting in September. The residential vs. industrial balance needed for cost effective growth needs time to develop. The growth of neighboring towns is beyond our influence, yet it affects Exeter greatly. Keeping our own development in line with our ability to accommodate is essential. In the coming year your board will make every attempt to keep you aware of our progress or lack of it in this regard.

We invite and encourage all residents to join with us in our efforts to plan and regulate for an attractive and sound future Exeter.

At present we are subsidizing 99 apartments for the elderly throughout Exeter. Our landlords have been most cooperative in making improvements and keeping the units in an attractive and desirable condition. Our tenants have often expressed their happiness in being able to maintain their own homes in comfortable and adequate housing.

Last year saw many changes. The untimely passing of Mr. Henry Shepard, Chairman of the Board of Commissioners, was a tragic loss to all. Mr. Shepard had worked long and diligently for the Housing Authority and will be greatly missed. Mr. John C. Munroe, Executive Director, resigned in September of 1975 after many years of faithful and devoted service. In December of 1975 Ms. Margaret

S. Volk, Acting Executive Director, submitted her resignation to accept another position.

The Commissioners hope that all elderly people desiring low-income housing will visit the office at 11 Pleasant Street to discuss their needs with the office staff. We will make every effort to maintain the high standards of this fine program.

A commemorative coin was designed and struck under the auspices of the Exeter Bicentennial Commission during 1975. The coin commemorates the Ladd-Gilman House which was the state treasury during the Revolutionary War on one side, and on the other Nicholas Gilman, one of the 40 signers of the Federal Constitution. The coins are available in bronze, pewter, a limited serialized edition of silver, and in limited sets of bronze, pewter and silver, also serialized.

Exeter Council on Aging

The Exeter Council on Aging is a group of Exeter citizens actively working to improve conditions for all seniors by additional programs and services for Exeter Senior Citizens.

The main project for 1975 was the establishment of the Congregate Meal program funded by the Somersworth Housing Authority and the State Council on Aging. This program is funded through June, 1976, with hope of a continuance. Thirty-five seniors are fed a well balanced meal on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays, and we are allowed one paid supervisor of service. We are all pleased with this program; its location is ideal, as it is centrally located.

The monthly blood pressure and weight clinic has been transferred to St. Michael Church and is held on the first Monday of each month from 1-3 p.m. This has been very well received with a special thanks to the Exeter Visiting Nurse Association.

The taxi program is subsidized by the town and is also very highly regarded, and is the only one of its kind in the country to our knowledge. This provides

transportation for shopping, medical, dental and recreational activities. The card holders are most appreciative of the discounts given by so many Exeter merchants.

We are still hopeful of setting up a job and volunteer program. Senior citizens are now volunteering in many areas as they wish to show their appreciation for what has been done for them.

Exeter Development Commission

To the Board of Selectmen and Citizens of the Town of Exeter.

The Development Commission, during 1975, became a duly constituted Voluntary, Non-profit Corporation under existing State Statutes.

The object for which the Corporation was established is to foster and promote growth and prosperity of the Town of Exeter, New Hampshire; to attract trade and industry to the Community; to relieve and reduce unemployment; to promote and provide for additional and maximum employment; to improve and maintain job opportunities; to carry on scientific research for the purpose of aiding the Community by attracting industry, and conquer aging. The development of, or retention of, industry in the Community; and to act in the public interest.

If and when the Commission is dissolved all assets of the Corporation shall become the property of the Town of Exeter.

Development of the 100 acre site began during the year as a result of Ideal Tape Co. purchasing approximately 20 acres of land and as this report is being written the first phase (10,000 sq. ft.) of their plant has been completed.

An access road, 750 ft. in length, has been completed along with the installation of all utilities.

The Commission is presently discussing this desirable location with other prospects.

Progress to date of this Development would not have been possible without the complete co-operation and support of the Board of Selectmen as well as other Boards and Commissions and the General Public.

We are forever grateful for this support and we will continue to make every effort to justify your continued confidence.
