Warrant for Annual Town Meeting.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

L. S.

To the inhabitants of the town of Lebanon qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said town, on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

First. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

Second. To choose three Selectmen, Overseer of the Poor, Collector of Taxes, Highway Agent, and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Third. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

Fourth. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to repair highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

Fifth. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the construction and repair of sewers and sidewalks for the ensuing year.

Sixth. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the improvement of the cemeteries of the town, or act thereon.

Seventh. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the proper observance of Memorial Day, or act thereon.

Eighth. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three hundred dollars to provide a free bed at the Mary Hitchcock Memorial Hospital for the ensuing year, or act thereon.

Ninth. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of the Lebanon Public Library, or act thereon.

Tenth. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of fifty dollars to provide markers for the graves of all Revolutionary soldiers buried in town.

Eleventh. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of brass bands, or act thereon.

Twelfth. To see if the town will vote to let the town halls to local organizations for entertainments, in cases where the net proceeds are for the benefit of such organizations, at the same rates which are fixed for religious societies.

Thirteenth. To hear the report of the committee appointed last year, to consider the advisability of making an addition to the Memorial building for the enlargement of the Public Library, or act thereon.

Fourteenth. To determine the division of the school money.

Fifteenth. To hear the report of the Auditors and the Town School Board.

Sixteenth. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to cause a highway map to be prepared, in accordance with Chapter 133 of the laws of the State of New Hampshire passed January session, 1903.

Seventeenth. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray the expense of observing Old Home Week.

Report of the Board of Health.

The number of deaths in the town exceed those of 1902 by 11; the number of males being 28 in each year, that of females being 44 in 1903. Classed by age we find 1 over 90, 94; between 80 and 90, 5; between 70 and 80, 12. Those dying under 6 numbered only 7. A very remarkable fact, not a case of cholera infantum reported.

Classed according to prominent diseases, 15 died of pneumonia, cancer 8, apoplexy 5, consumption 2. Upon finding only two cases of the disease which is accounted the greatest destroyer of human life, it was thought a mistake must have been made, and a recount was had with the same result. There was only one death charged to diphtheria. The disease, under treatment by anti-toxin, has assumed a very mild type, and is no longer to be greatly dreaded. Pneumonia assumed unusual prominence in the death-rate the past year. A careful study was made of its prevalence, and it was found to be in the months of January, February and March; but no deaths occurred in the months of April, May, June, July, August and September, but returned in October and continued to the end of the year, enforcing the need of greater care during the rougher months of the year. In the month of April there was but one death, and that of a person who had well passed his three score and ten. His age was 77 years; a stranger.

The number of deaths the last year exceeded the number in 1902, yet leaving the town a fairly healthy one, about fourteen in a thousand.

The construction of the sewer on Mechanic street makes provision for needed drainage.

Many complaints of nuisances were heard, and the nuisance abated, especially the hog nuisance on the river.

One of the rarest of diseases made its appearance in the town this last year, known as Addison's Disease. One of its characteristics is that the complexion of the patient becomes blue. It has never occurred in the town before.

CEMETERY REPORTS.

VILLAGE CEMETERY.

The cemetery was kept in good order during the past season. A good substantial gate, with stone posts, was placed in position at one of the entrances. About one-half of the fence was painted; the remainder of the fence should be repaired and painted the coming season.

GLENWOOD CEMETERY.

The road leading to the cemetery was improved. A shed for storage was partly built.

In order to have a cemetery present a good appearance, it is necessary to have rules for the grading and care of lots. The following, taken from *The Park and Cemetery*, is, in part at least, applicable to Glenwood Cemetery:

The modern cemetery — in other words, a cemetery conducted on the lawn plan — necessarily calls for more stringent adherence to the requirements of that method of treatment than the old style of burial ground, where every lot owner dwelt under the impression that he could improve his lot just as he saw fit. The modern cemetery demands that each lot shall be treated as a part of the whole, and is so treated; so that infringements of rules by lot owners, covering the question of decoration or improvement, become a damage not only to the lot so affected, but to every lot within the view.

This condition of the lawn plan, therefore, requires that rules and regulations devised for its maintenance shall be, within reason, arbitrarily enforced. From the right point of view this means that every lot in the cemetery shall be treated with a view to the beauty of the whole cemetery, and, it follows of course, to its own best interests. The modern cemetery can also be said to oppose most radically the Sunday funeral, for it is the Sunday funeral with its attendant crowds that mar the grounds to an incalculable extent, besides robbing the funeral of its sacred character. If we are to have beautiful cemeteries, and they should be beautiful, appropriate and beneficial rules and regulations must be enforced, and the question of arbitrariness does not enter into the discussion.

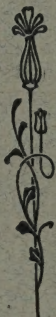
