## TOWN MEETING WARRANT

### The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lisbon, in the County of Grafton, and the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Lisbon on Tuesday the 11th day of March next, polls to be opened at nine o'clock in the forenoon, and will not close earlier than four o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

**Article 1.** To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

**Article 2.** To hear reports of agents, auditors, and special committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote in relation thereto.

**Article 3.** To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges, the same being: Town Officers' Salaries, Town Officers' Expenses, Election and Registration expenses, Expense of Town Hall, and other town buildings, and make appropriation for the same.

**Article 4.** To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Police Department for the ensuing year, including \$3,200.00 for a day policeman the year round.

**Article 5.** To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for fire protection for the ensuing year, including \$600.00 for the Sugar Hill Fire Department.

**Article 6.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the Pine Blister Rust control.

**Article 7.** To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Insurance for the ensuing year.

**Article 8.** To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the protection of health including the Health Officer's salary and expenses, and a sum of money to be equally divided between the Littleton Hospital and the Woodsville Hospital.

**Article 9.** To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Lisbon District Nursing Association.

**Article 10.** To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Vital Statistics for the ensuing year.

**Article 11.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the purpose of maintaining the Sugar Hill Dump. The Selectmen to administer and be in charge of the funds so raised.

**Article 12.** To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs of high-ways and bridges for the ensuing year.

**Article 13.** To see if the Town will vote to plow the town roads, and if so, to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

**Article 14.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,500.00 to light the streets in the Town of Lisbon under the same conditions as they were heretofore lighted, said streets to be lighted with electricity.

**Article 15.** To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to oil such roads in the Town as are already oiled, and to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

**Article 16.** To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Libraries in addition to what is required by law, and to determine how same shall be divided.

**Article 17.** To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Town Poor.

**Article 18.** To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Age Assistance.

**Article 19.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the proper observance of Memorial Day.

**Article 20.** To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the community Skating Rink.

**Article 21.** To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the cemeteries in the Town of Lisbon.

**Article 22.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$421.60 to the White Mountain Region Association for the purpose of advertising the Town of Lisbon, being 10¢ per thousand of the assessed valuation.

**Article 23.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$740.00 to defray the Town's share of the Federal Social Security Act.

**Article 24.** To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as they deem necessary in anticipation of taxes, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,400.00 for interest on short term and long term notes.

**Article 25.** To see if the Town will vote to accept Town Road Aid and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,172.53.

**Article 26.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to continue the repairing of the Storage Shed.

**Article 27.** To raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for the purpose of paying the Grader note due this year.

**Article 28.** To raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the purpose of purchasing twelve metal voting booths.

**Article 29.** To see if the Town will vote to pay the Road Agent at an hourly rate of \$1.50. The rate of other road employees to be from a minimum of \$1.10 to a maximum of \$1.35 per hour.

**Article 30.** To see if the Town will vote to relinquish all rights to a certain gravel pit in the Town of Franconia which it purchased from Arthur E. Streeter by deed dated June 10, 1927; and to authorize the selectmen to convey said gravel pit by quitclaim deed to the proper person, if the same becomes necessary, under condition in the Streeter deed.

**Article 31.** To see if the Town will vote to hold the annual business meeting in the evening instead of in the morning as heretofore held.

**Article 32.** To see if the Town will vote to reconstruct the bridge over the Ammonoosuc River, on School Street, in the Village of Lisbon, the State to furnish 40% of the cost under the laws of 1957; and to authorize the Selectmen to take such steps as necessary under the laws of the State of New Hampshire for that purpose.

**Article 33.** If the above vote is in the affirmative, to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$84,600.00, being the estimate of the Town's share (60%) of the cost, and for such purpose to authorize the Selectmen to borrow, upon the credit of the Town, a sum of money not to exceed \$84,600.00 and to issue serial notes, or bonds, of the Town for the cost not to exceed said sum; the dates, maturities, denominations, the interest or discount rate, the form and other details of said bonds or notes, and of providing for the sale thereof, to be delegated to the discretion of the Selectmen, in accordance with the laws of the State of New Hampshire; and to authorize the Selectmen to execute all papers and do all things necessary for the purposes of this article.

**Article 34.** To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase a 1958 Three-quarter ton Trojan Loadmaster and raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same. The money to be raised as follows: The first year \$4,000.00 and a note for the balance of \$4,000.00 in 1959, at such rate of interest as may be necessary.



**Article 35.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for the purpose of improving a portion of the Blake Road.

**Article 36.** To see if the Town will vote to establish a Planning Board of five (or seven) members with duties as set forth in Sections 1-15, Chapter 36, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, to make a study of the Town's development and report to the Town appropriate recommendations for the promotion and maintenance of the Town's best development. The Board members shall consist of one Selectman and four (or six) other citizens appointed by the Selectmen, as provided in Chapter 36, N. H. Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955.

**Article 37.** To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$700.00 for building a portion of a new sidewalk in Sugar Hill from the Homestead to the Community Church.

**Article 38.** To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

A Preliminary Estimate, showing the cost of constructing a new bridge on School Street, has been sent to you by Mr. F. M. Auer, Planning and Economics Engineer. This estimate is the basis for determination of the town share of cost which is to be considered at your town meeting in March.

Accompanying the estimate is an "Application for Construction" form which should be completed and forwarded to me as soon as possible after the necessary funds have been raised or appropriated. Upon receipt of this form a hearing will be called, as required by Law, to determine the necessity for construction. The selectmen, a member of the Governor's Council and a representative of this department constitute the hearing board.

After approval of the board we will then proceed with a survey and design of the structure and when the plans and estimate are completed they will be sent to you for your consideration and approval. Bids will then be requested and the contract awarded to the lowest responsible bidder. An engineer will be provided by this department during construction and this cost is included in the estimate already sent to you.

This review of the steps to be taken, before construction of the bridge, is sent as a background of information for town meeting. If you have any questions please call me.

REPORT FROM THE WHITE MOUNTAINS  
REGION ASSOCIATION

“Twenty Years of Progress” — 1938-1958

It is a pleasure to be able to report on the twentieth year of successful operation of your Region Association. Reaching this milestone shows a solid record of accomplishment and mutual co-operation between the towns and the Association.

For a long time nobody knew exactly how to prove that real hard cash was coming into the area from our efforts. However, for the last three years we've run an annual survey of people previously contacted in some way, to find out if they ever did come here and spend any money. Much as we've always believed in this work, we were still amazed at the extent of income indicated by the survey returns. Every time, just a few parties out of the survey sample would prove to have spent around three times as much in this region as the total of all the town appropriations. Careful estimates indicate over half a million dollars a year are being spent here by people contacted through Region publicity. If that sounds like baloney, remember that the whole state does a 210 million dollar vacation business.

Demands on our literature, in which every town is represented in every folder, have never been so heavy. To cite one example, our Fall Foliage promotion (remember those bright red 'leaves' you saw on the roads? We put 'em up) got attention from as far away as Texas and California, and we had to print up an extra 3000 foliage maps in a hurry. A card we had placed in Samsonite luggage stores across the country brought in another 3000 replies in addition to our usual requests for Region folders. All told we've sent out as usual around 100,000 pieces of material, plus pictures, news stories, radio and TV 'plugs'. We've helped all we could to promote community events here at home, while spending a good deal of time at shows and exhibitions in major cities (we are adding a new one this year, Cleveland).

The 4-H Awards Program continues to be successful and popular, and over 75 clubs throughout the region are helped and encouraged through it in this very worthwhile work by cash awards, trophies, and magazine subscriptions to clubs, members and leaders.

A lot of work has been done on transportation, a very serious situation here. Active work has been done trying to save what we can of our rail passenger service. Much correspondence and attendance at hearings have been aimed at improving the airline service. We have been working with the bus companies planning a campaign with them, since the rail situation seems to be so shaky. We have kept in close touch with the highway situation, hoping Region roads may receive necessary attention.

The items above are brief highlights, and there is much more going on continuously. This is a full-time, year-round effort aimed at benefiting you and your town—that's the only reason this Association exists, to bring about conditions that bring in money that eases the tax 'bite' on your pocketbook. Your support makes it possible, and we thank you for it.

## REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN

### Forest Fire Prevention is Everybody's Business

New Hampshire faces a continuing challenge in its forest fire problem — 97 percent of all our forest fires being man-caused and preventable — a serious indictment of interest in our own welfare and that of our neighbor. Both the State and the towns are striving diligently to effectively meet the challenge through education of the public to the threat fire presents to our woodlands; by maintaining a well trained corps of wardens and deputy wardens in every community and by providing ample opportunity for all who wish to dispose of unwanted waste materials. Carelessness and perverseness, however, continue to be the big hurdles.

Thoughtlessly discarded lighted cigars, cigarettes and matches from moving vehicles by hikers, hunters and fishermen; careless burning; improperly extinguished debris, camp and cook fires — all result in serious loss of property, disruption of industry and farm work and unnecessary expenditure of town and state funds.

To meet the challenge successfully, the state, your community and your local forest fire warden need YOUR thoughtful and cooperative effort. The rules are simple.

1. Don't burn at home, use your town dump and avoid all fire problems.
2. If you do burn, be sure to secure a written permit from your local forest fire warden when the ground is not covered with snow. Permits are required for open debris fires, home incinerators, outdoor fire places and camp fires. Your warden is instructed to permit burning if weather conditions, site and type of burning are safe.
3. Be sure that all lighted material; cigars, cigarettes and matches, are completely out before discarding them. Use ash trays in automobiles.
4. Make certain that your debris, camp and cook fires are completely out before leaving them.
5. Insist that others be careful and comply with burning requirements.
6. Call the warden promptly when fire is detected and aid him to extinguish it.

**REMEMBER** — The fire you prevent might be the one which could burn YOUR property.

**REMEMBER** — FOREST FIRE PREVENTION is EVERYBODY'S BUSINESS and our MOST IMPORTANT UNDERTAKING.
