## School Report.

While our schools, in some respects, compare favorably with other years, some of them, and some features of all of them, have been far from satisfactory.

Four schools, Clough Hill, Parker Hill, Tinkerville and Pond, have been maintained. The few scholars living outside the limits of these schools have been provided for elsewhere.

The teacher who would win must needs give their whole soul to the work, with a burning interest for every individual pupil, and with an enthusiasm which knows no defeat.

Ninety-five text books have been purchased this year at a cost of \$16.28.

Cyr's Primer, Stickney's Word by Word Speller, and Blaisdell's Physiology, "How to Keep Well," have been introduced, being a wise selection.

Less than six percent of the scholars are reported as having studied physiology. We would, therefore, call the attention of the school board and teachers to Chapter 92, Sections 6 and 7, Public Statutes.

As this town has adopted the verticle penmanship, we would suggest to teachers, desiring to teach here, to qualify to write and teach this system.

We would also suggest to the school board that they require their teachers to properly fill out their registers. It is almost impossible to make the annual report to the town, required by the law, from the registers in their present condition.
