The records and accounts include those of the Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Trustees of the Trust funds, Cemetery Board and Library Trustees. ### TOWN WARRANT

TO THE INHABITANTS of the Town of Nelson, in the County of Cheshire, State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town affairs: YOU ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED to meet in the Town Hall in said Nelson on Tuesday, the 9th day of March, 2010, at 11:00 am to act upon the following articles:

Polls will open at 11:00 am and close at 7:00 pm.

Business Meeting will start at 7:00 pm.

### ARTICLES OF A GENERAL NATURE

1. To choose necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$286,600. to be raised by taxes. This is to defray Town charges for the year ensuing. The Selectmen recommend this appropriation.
3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$30,150 for support of the town library. (In 2009 the appropriation was \$30,329).  
 \$19,570 to be raised by taxes  
 \$10,580 income from library memorial fund and other sources.
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,478 for support of social service agencies which provide assistance to Nelson residents. The agencies chosen to receive funds are: Home Health Care (\$550), Monadnock Family Services (\$828), The Keene Community Kitchen, Inc. (\$1,500) and Southwestern Community Services (\$600). The Selectmen recommend these appropriations. (In 2009, these same agencies received contributions from the town in the amount of \$3426).
5. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$10,000 to be added to the Town Buildings Capital Reserve Fund. No withdrawals may be made from the fund except by vote of the town. The selectmen recommend this appropriation. The fund balance on 12/31/2009 was \$52,954.46. Selectmen recommend this article.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000 to repair the gate pillars and reset and repair the monuments in Section 1 of the Nelson Cemetery.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,985 to do a professional audit for this year. This was suggested by the Department of Revenue.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 to be added to the Milfoil Prevention and Treatment Expendable Trust Fund. The Selectmen recommend this article. The fund balance as of 12/31/2009 was \$12,334.24.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$680.40 used for hazardous waste collections for 2010 consisting of 12 collection dates. The Selectmen recommend this article.

### **ARTICLES DEALING WITH SERVICE AND PROTECTION**

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$11,242 as subsidy for ambulance service for the ensuing year, it being understood that residents will still be charged for individual calls. (The appropriation for 2009 was \$8,787). The Selectmen recommend this article.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$14,250 for the proper expenses of the Fire Department and Rescue Squad. (The 2009 appropriation was \$15,000).

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 for the purpose of fighting forest fires. This sum to come from reimbursement from the NH State Fire Warden and no amount will be raised through taxation. The Department of Revenue Administration recommends this method of accounting so as not to impact the Fire Department's operating budget.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25,000 to be added to the Fire Equipment Capital Reserve Fund, for the purpose of Fire Apparatus for the fire department. No withdrawals may be made from this Fund except by vote of the Town and upon recommendation of the Fire Chief. The fund balance as of 12/31/2009 was \$131,087.75. The Selectmen recommend this article.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500 for the proper expenses for Emergency Management.

15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$37,000 for the proper expenses of the Police Department. (The appropriation for 2009 was \$37,949).

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000 for the purpose of patrols performed by the Nelson Police Department for the State of NH, Cheshire County, Sheriff's Office and other authorized municipal entities. This sum to come from offsetting grants and no amount will be raised through taxation.

17. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Select Board to enter into a long-term lease/purchase agreement for a 2010 Ford Expedition in the amount of (\$28,861.02), and with payments of (\$9,620.34) payable in annual payments over the term of three years. This police cruiser will replace the 1993 Ford Crown Victoria that will be sold, with the proceeds from the sale to go back to the general fund.



## ARTICLES DEALING WITH ROADS

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$215,000 for the purpose of maintenance of highways and bridges for ensuing year's budget with \$38,753 coming from the Highway Block Grant with the remaining \$176,247 to be raised by taxes.
19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,000 to be added to the Road Equipment Capital Reserve Fund. It is understood that no withdrawals may be made from this fund for the purchase of road equipment except by vote of the town upon recommendation of the Road Equipment Committee. The Fund balance on 12/31/2009 was \$41,576.29. (The 2009 appropriation was \$20,000).
20. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the Salt Barn Capital Reserve Fund and any money left will go to the General Fund.

## ARTICLES DEALING WITH PLANNING & ZONING

21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$728 for dues to belong to the Southwest Region Planning Commission. (\$727 in 2009)

## OTHER ARTICLES

22. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the Fire Equipment, Expendable Trust Fund, created in 1979. This fund has a zero balance.  
This is a Warrant Article per request of the Department of Revenue Administration.
23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,840.00 to be added to the amount appropriated for the salary of the Town Clerk/Tax Collector in Article 2 in order to restore the salary to the amount appropriated for that office in 2006. (The amount raised in 2006 was \$18,306.00).  
This is a petitioned article.
24. To see if the town will rescind the authorization given to the selectmen at the 1994 Town Meeting, article 4 allowing the selectmen to convey title to tax deeded properties. This authority will revert to majority vote at Town Meeting.  
This is a petitioned article. Not recommended by the Selectmen.
25. To see if the town will direct the selectmen to put a Conservation Easement on tax map parcel 3-15-0 allowing for 1 house to be built not to exceed 5,000 square feet including garage, 1 dock not exceeding 6'x25', no subdivision, no clear cutting of trees. This Easement will be given to the Harris Center, or similar conservation organization. Exact wording to be worked out by the Selectmen and the receiving organization.  
This is a petitioned article. Not recommended by the Selectmen.

26. To see if the Town will vote to approve the following resolution to be forwarded to our State Representative(s), our State Senator, the Speaker of the House, and the Senate President.

Resolved: The citizens of New Hampshire should be allowed to vote on an amendment to the New Hampshire Constitution that defines "Marriage".

This is a petitioned article. Not recommended by the Selectmen.

27. Shall New Hampshire Congressional Delegation be instructed to pursue a new and independent investigation to address thoroughly all of the evidence and unanswered questions related to the events of September 11, 2001?







## REPORT OF THE SELECTMEN

Completion of the salt barn is a fine accomplishment, and Mike Tarr is to be congratulated for his leadership on this project. Thanks are also due to former selectman Charlie Lang, who worked diligently with Mike in planning the barn. The building was constructed with an overhang that provides a storage area for various pieces road equipment and related articles. In time, this area could be enclosed to protect the items from damage, especially by the elements.

Among the accomplishments of the summer was the cleaning up of the Geddes land on Silver Lake. Deeded to the town for nonpayment of property taxes, the land came with an abundance of challenges: twenty-two docks in various states of disrepair, twenty-six outhouses, two shacks in disarray and tons of debris that filled sixteen dumpsters. The work kept inmates from the county jail busy at the site for three months. The total cost of the cleanup was \$27,785.40. Fortunately, the town conservation commission gave the selectmen \$10,000 to help pay for it. The selectmen intend to recover these costs eventually.

The board of selectmen has been involved since the day the land was deeded to the town. In addition to authorizing the cleanup, the board had the property surveyed, visited by the county forester, toured by environmentalists, and studied and appraised by a specialist in land appraisals. Every step taken has been according to legal requirements. An informational meeting was held in July to which the public was invited. At that time, Jim Phippard of Brickstone Masons gave an illustrated presentation on the land and possible uses for it in the future. Everyone present received a written copy of his report.

A major undertaking, begun in July 2008, is the updating of our current land use records. It is imperative that people pay taxes on what they own and that mystery lots be eliminated. Since this is the first time in forty or more years that an update of the records has occurred, we have found the task to be much more difficult and time-consuming than expected. We are grateful to Judi Lang for the time and effort she has given to this project.

Perambulations of town boundaries have been a focus of selectman Margaret Schillemat. (Fortunately, she likes to hike!) According to RSA III, 512, perambulations are to be done once every seven years. However, it has been decades since all the boundaries have been walked with representatives of the abutting towns – Stoddard, Hancock, Harrisville, Roxbury and Sullivan. Once the Sullivan walk is completed, all data will be submitted to the State. The State will then post the documentation on a website, where it will be available for all to consult. Margaret says that the task has been arduous but enjoyable.

Keeping town buildings repaired is an ongoing challenge. This year, the town hall and connector were painted. The back wall of the Munsonville fire station was repaired and the building was painted. The unfinished shed attached to the Town Clerk's office (in a past life, the shed was the school outhouse) was weatherproofed and finished to provide much-needed new storage.

Looking ahead, the selectmen propose that major repairs and renovations be directed to the town hall, the connector and the library. The first project would be to deal with the water problem under the town hall. First, the main floor needs to be replaced. Then, a cellar hole should be dug deep enough so that the area can be finished off and used for office space. This will also eliminate the problem of standing, knee-deep water under the floor of the town hall, a situation which has been responsible for ruining the floor.



The basement of the library could be finished off, after twenty years of waiting to do that work. The heating system for the town hall, library and connector could then be relocated to the basement level of the connector. This would allow alterations to the town hall that would increase its functionality: namely, making the current furnace room a smaller area for storage and enlarging the hall itself for public use.

Understanding that this project will be a major investment of money, we recommend that a committee be formed to carefully plan the scheduling of the various phases and the interior design of the spaces, and to take the lead in raising private funds for half the cost of the work.

Business in the town offices increases every year. That is due to the increases in the number of requests for services offered by the town clerk/tax collector, and the number of requests for various permits from the town, zoning and planning board hearings, as well as the proliferation of issues requiring legal counsel. The addition of an executive secretary, Linda Boyle, has helped greatly to speed the flow of business activities.

On January 7, 2010, I am leaving the board of selectmen after first being appointed to fill an unexpired term in December, 1997. I have seen many changes in Nelson during the past twelve years. In fact, change has been constant. For the most part, I have absolutely loved the job. It has been a privilege for me to be able to render public service to the town. I am grateful for the support of many townspeople and employees, and I wish all of you the very best as our town continues to forge ahead in a new decade!

## REPORT OF THE NELSON FIRE CHIEF

As you can see by the fire log above, in 2009 two things happened with respect to our activity. First, there was a return to previous years' call levels. 2007 had a call listing of 55, the 2008 call listing was 27, and this past year's activity went back up to 54. Our average number of calls per year continues at around 40. Whatever the call level, rescue calls continue to dominate our activity.

We have made some changes in our reporting of calls. After a little bit of work we have finally gotten the high-speed Internet working correctly. As a result, we have become active participants in a new software program called FireHouse. All call information is recorded in this system, which is run by Southwestern NH Fire Mutual Aid. We have continued to update our skills throughout the year with this software, and we are now accustomed to entering information into the system after each call. This has proven quite helpful in dealing with the required reporting, especially with rescue calls.

This year has seen a review of our bylaws and an update to represent current operations. Also, we have developed an application form for those wishing to join the department. This provides a clearer process for potential new members. We continue to have a core group of people involved with the department but we are always looking for new individuals who would like to join. The department will support any training activity to assist those interested in joining.

We have worked with the police department to add a new capability in support of the townspeople. We have purchased, been trained in and now have in place a system called Care Trak. This is a radio direction finding system that can be used to locate people, such as adults who have Alzheimer's or children with autism, who have wandered from home and become lost. With this system, a person likely to wander would receive a bracelet containing a small transmitter. Then, if the person does wander, a radio tracking device allows the police and fire departments to locate him or her. Training has shown this to be an effective search tool.

Remember, check your smoke detectors and replace the batteries on a regular basis, at least annually. If you don't have a smoke detector, please purchase one or two. They may save your life some day. Also, be sure to call the town Forest Fire Warden, Bob West, or one of the Deputy Wardens – Bud French, Charlie Lang, Terry Mednick or myself – for a burning permit. They are required even if it is raining, unless there is an inch or more of snow on the ground.

I would like to thank all the Department's active members for their continued effort, support and hours of volunteer service. I'd also like to thank the surrounding towns for their mutual aid assistance when needed and our fellow townspeople for their support at the various emergency scenes. Remember, to report a fire or other emergency, **DIAL 911 or 352-1100.**

## EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT REPORT

This was a busy year for Emergency Management activities. Several key projects were either worked on or finished.

We finally completed our town's Local Emergency Operations Plan (LEOP). Southwest Region Planning Commission was the driving force behind this project, and a dedicated group of individuals worked hard during this past winter and spring to finish it. Finally, the plan was completed, the master copy signed off by the Selectmen, and it is now a part of our standard operation as needed. Each town department is familiar with the LEOP and will use it based upon the type of emergency involved.

We completed work with FEMA last spring on the 2008 ice storm. After the declaration by the federal government that parts of New Hampshire were disaster areas eligible for federal support, we set to work to get our share of those funds. We met with our FEMA representative, the Road Agent and town office personnel to assemble necessary information. Based on input from our FEMA rep, we concluded that most of the reimbursement would be for debris and tree removal, plus administrative costs. A second category of reimbursement was for the work done by the town during the storm emergency: clearing, sanding and salting roads, providing support for emergency and utility vehicles dealing with power outages, doing life safety checks and providing transportation to the emergency shelter. Even the cost of fuel to heat and provide electricity to the shelter was eligible for reimbursement. We turned in a request for around \$50,000.

Our emergency shelter was a tremendous asset during the storm and successfully supported basic needs for many Nelson residents. We learned from this first emergency and will be able to assist townspeople still more efficiently in any future emergencies. Also, during this past year our school has had a generator installed, which will further enhance our capabilities.

Our All Health Hazard Mitigation local POD (Point of Distribution) plan was completed and signed off by the Selectmen of the three towns involved. The POD is now known as the NSS (Nelson, Sullivan and Stoddard) POD and its point of distribution is at the Sullivan town hall. The POD was recently tested, courtesy of the H1N1 virus, and performed well. Both POD operational personnel and a good number of residents of the three towns turned out for shots. This sort of on-the-job training helps keep us prepared.

As in past years I would like to thank all of the townspeople who have helped this year in supporting our Emergency Management activities. As we move ahead, we will continue working to better prepare ourselves for any type of emergency.

## REPORT OF THE ROAD AGENT

As predicted in the last Road Agent Report, the ice storm of 2008 kept the Road Crew busy this past spring. With the need to remove many hazardous trees and the enormous amount of debris, the town needed to hire extra help for the job. The town hired three extra men with three additional chainsaws. It took a total of five men, with five chainsaws, three weeks to clean town roadsides, preparing for all of this debris to be hauled away. It then took a fourth extra man hired with a logging truck an entire week to haul everything to the Town Ball Field where it was later burned.

In order to keep roads passable, late spring to early summer, the Road Crew performed the usual grading of town roads and applying calcium chloride. To prepare the construction site for the newly approved sand and salt building, two older buildings needed to be dismantled and removed during these same months. To help keep costs down, the Road Crew did all the site work for the new building. By the middle of July, site excavation was completed. The first week of August found the crew from Center Hill Barns ready to start construction.

After three months of on and off work, the Center Hill Barns team wrapped up and completed construction of the new building in the first week of November. With it now later in the season and the usual stock pile not yet in place, we held our breath in hopes for no early storms. For once, the weather seemed to be on our side; we were able to fill the new building before any storms hit. For the past several years, the Town has saved up money for this building and it has paid off. The building is able to house all of the necessary materials used by the Highway Department along with supplying us with the extra needed space for storage of our smaller equipment. The layout of the building was designed for ease and efficiency and has been working out very nicely.

I would personally like to thank the Selectmen, members of the Road Equipment Committee, and the other Town Officials for all of their help and support. Thanks go to George, Jeff, and Bruce Warner along with Jim Russell for the hard work they put in on the massive clean-up project as a result of the December 2008 ice storm. And, many thanks also to Nick Barrett for his help and many hours of hard work this past year.

The Highway Department does appreciate updates on road conditions in your area. The Road Crew will respond to any problems in a timely manner.

## REPORT OF THE NELSON CEMETERY BOARD

### NELSON CEMETERY

General maintenance, including spring and fall leaf raking, and straightening of gravestones was conducted by the Nelson Cemetery Sexton, Al Struthers, with help from work session volunteers. A considerable number of headstones, about 124, need straightening and the front entry pillars also should be repaired. The selectmen recommended that an estimate for this work be obtained from a professional company who could complete all the repairs and repositioning in summer of 2010. Funding of the estimate will be voted on in March, at the annual town meeting.

There were four cremation burials and no full burials this year.

### MUNSONVILLE CEMETERY

The two slopes that were planted with junipers and bearberry have done well and are beginning to fill in the area. Lucy Daniels, who installed the original plantings, has continued maintenance work. Mowing has been under the direction of the Nelson selectmen. The cemetery board purchased a new lawn mower and a weed whacker to assist in this work.

The cemetery board has continued to work with Peder Schillemat on his Eagle Scout project of mapping the Munsonville Cemetery and compiling a list of gravestones and their locations, with a monument inscribed with a map to be placed at the entrance of the cemetery.

## REPORT OF THE CONSERVATION COMMISSION

In January, the Commission sent letters with summaries of the Comprehensive Shoreland Protection Act to all residents who own property on the lakes in town to inform them of the new regulations so that they can make informed decisions on their lakefront that falls within 250 feet of the shoreline.

The final report of the Great Meadow Corridor Project was completed in April by conservation ecologist Jeffrey Littleton. It is an ecological assessment of this important wetland and the adjacent landscape. Copies have been sent to various state agencies, the Harris Center, and the Nelson Planning Board. Copies are also available in the Rodham Library.

The Commission supported the cleanup of the Geddes property on Silver Lake by providing \$10,000 to help in the costs of the project. We commend the selectmen for taking the lead in returning this valuable property to its natural state. It was a remarkable transformation, one the whole town should be proud of. A well attended walkover was sponsored by the Commission in October for town residents to see the results of this effort and to give them a basis for forming a vision of the future use of this property.

A sum of \$4,000 was given to the Granite Lake Association as a matching grant to support the water quality study being undertaken by the Association to assure that the high quality of the lake water will be maintained. The milfoil prevention projects on Granite Lake and on Nubanusit Lake were also supported by grants of \$1,000 each.

Another successful roadside cleanup was held on the Saturday before Old Home Week with 35 volunteers participating. This earned the town an additional 800 daffodils, which were delivered and planted in the fall. Thanks go to the Highway Department for picking up the trash bags along the roads every year after cleanup.

Throughout the year the Commission holds regular monthly meetings to respond to conservation issues as they arise, makes site visits as needed to assist the DES where there are concerns, and is available to residents who have questions about conservation and land use. Please call any member of the Commission when information is needed.

## REPORT OF THE OLIVIA RODHAM MEMORIAL LIBRARY

The Olivia Rodham Memorial Library had a very busy year. Overall use of the library is up 20%, with a 25% rise in adult use, and a 59% increase of patrons coming in to use the wifi for computers. We attribute increased usage to the decline in the economy, a more consistent schedule of hours, an added two hours to the schedule (run by volunteers), a downloadable book program for audio books and the addition of high speed internet, available to the public. We still offer many of the favorite services we always have, including a fine selection of books, periodicals, audio books, videos and DVDs, adult programs and children's programs, interlibrary loan and the town website. A free library card is available to all Nelson residents so please come in, e-mail or call to find out more.

### CHILDREN'S LIBRARY PROGRAMS

During the summer the Nelson Library invited children to participate in the 2009 Summer Reading Program, "Summer Time and the Reading is Easy". Nelson children came to the library for summer reading books. Books read were tallied and prizes awarded, including a Toadstool gift certificate. This annual statewide program is sponsored by CHILIS (Children's Librarians of NH). Programs offered to children this summer included Hunt and Alison playing some exciting music, bookmaking with Anne Ames, and a bird walk with Julie Tilden. For our grand finale, Norman Ng came to perform magic during Old Home Week, for an audience of 112 people. This program was supported in part by a grant from the New Hampshire State Library and donations from the Bryne Foundation, CHILIS, Cogswell Benevolent Trust, and the NH Library Association. During the school year we have two programs: our weekly story time and the library enrichment programs. Story time includes a light snack and stories read by the librarian or a guest reader. This after school program welcomes Sara Shepherd, who volunteers to read and do an activity, and Sandy Ferguson, who gladly fills in during Sara's absence. Library enrichment programs at the library were offered four times this year to the Nelson school. The whole school attended in three groups to learn library skills.

### ADULT LIBRARY PROGRAMS

Every year the library presents a Forum with guest speakers. This year's calendar included *Raising Sheep in Nelson: Past and Present* by Ted Lenk and Susan Weave; *Rebellion, Emigration and Celebration: Selections from the Irish Songbook* by Rich Popovic; "*Murdered by His Wife*"; *Revolutionary Massachusetts' Most Extraordinary Murder* by Deborah Nava; and *Roads in Nelson: Today and in Yesteryear* by Rick Church. We thank John Cucchi for archiving these talks and making them available at the library on DVDs and CDs. Other programs were: *Slide Rules: How Stuff was Figured Out Before the Calculator*, two programs with tax experts to educate patrons in different tax areas, and the adult book group, which met once a month to discuss novels, memoirs and biographies.

### GRANTS

The Library received two grants in 2009. For our children's summer reading program, we received the Kids, Books and the Arts Grant, of \$200, for Norman Ng to perform (see above). With the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation Online Opportunity Hardware Grant we purchased one computer and peripherals this year, and covered the cost of supporting a public access computer in a public library for four years, including set-up, maintenance and tech support. The grant amount for 2009 was \$1950 and the required match was \$650. The grant amount for 2010 is \$1300 and the required match is \$1300. The Friends of the Library have agreed to pay the matching funds.

## COMPUTER

The Olivia Rodham Memorial Library continues to move ahead in the world of technology. As mentioned above, we received the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation Online Opportunity Hardware Grant, phase one. The Nelson website <http://townofnelson.com>, sponsored by the library, has all sorts of information and an events calendar covering the many activities in Nelson. We wish to thank our webmaster, Gordon Peery, and all the contributors, especially Rick Church for the Nelson history column and Betsy Street for school news and photo submissions. The website averages over 500 hits a month. With wireless high speed from WiValley, patrons may use either our public computers or their own laptops. A new addition this year is Downloadable Audio Books on the Overdrive website. On this site a patron can download both children's and adults' audio books and play them from a computer, on an MP3 player, iPod or burn them to a CD. The website is <http://nh.lib.overdrive.com>. Town residents may sign up for this service at the library.

## FRIENDS OF THE LIBRARY

The Friends of the Library continue to support the library in many ways. They provided funds for the new computer, through the Gates Grant program, \$650 in 2009 and \$1300 for 2010, as well as \$1,000 for new books, a sum which constitutes a third of the library's material budget. They support the summer reading program with refreshments and gift certificates. Their big fundraiser of the year is the Book Sale on Old Home Day in Nelson. In 2009 the sale generated a total of \$1,822.50, divided among memberships (\$820.25), books (\$989.25) and book bags (\$13.00).

## PERSONNEL

Kristine Finnegan is the librarian and Susan Hansel is the regular library substitute, with Jennifer Fraser filling in. Library volunteers perform many and varied tasks. Their contributions to the Library are immeasurable and are greatly appreciated by the library staff. Volunteer hours in 2009 totaled 404. Several volunteers who run programs were mentioned above. Susan Hansel has volunteered to cover keeping the library open two extra hours, and Martha Collins fills in for her. Patrons with overdue books are called twice a month by Kathy Schillemat. Regular volunteers are Pamela Tolman, Betsey Church and Susan Hansel. Terry Mednick has maintained our computers, and computer statistics programs are updated by Tom Buttrick. We also thank occasional volunteers Liza Constable, Jonathan Weis, Iva DeMartelly, Barbara and Jacqueline Roland and Elena Mednick, as well as Dublin School students. Library Trustees for this year were Linda Cates, Sue Meehan, Bruce McSheehy, John Zurich and Max Nunnemaker, who took over in November to fill out Lumina Greenway's term.

## DONATIONS

Donations to the library always play a large part in updating our collection. In 2009 we received monetary donations from Rotary Club members, The Friends of the Library, and George and Frances Alderson in memory of Bob and Hallie Robinson. Other library funds used to purchase items for the collection were the Celia Wiechart Memorial Fund, the Elizabeth T. Hatch Memorial Fund, the Hardie Shepard Children's Book Fund, the Henry Melville Fund, the Mary Fiske Elliot Fund for Garden Books, the Nelson White Fund, the Professor William Churchill Gerrish Special Fund, the Sidney Plant Special Fund and the Henry Melville Fuller Fund. Many donations are made of actual books, audio visual materials, and magazines. We welcome Max Nunnemaker who graciously volunteered to fill out the rest of Lumina's term.

The library has been most fortunate to increase its hours of operation when Susan Hansel volunteered to work two additional hours at no cost to the town.

The library has also been blessed to have the service of two extremely talented and dedicated specialists: Gordon Peery, creator of the town website and our own webmaster; and Terry Mednick, our on-call volunteer who has provided yeoman work in keeping the library's computers functioning at their peak.

Our Director, Kristine Finnegan, has done an exemplary job in hard times. With the downturn in the economy, library usage has increased over 20% from last year. (For a more complete breakdown, please see the Director's Report.) This has placed an extra burden on Kristine, her co-workers and her many volunteers, a burden they gladly assumed on behalf of the town and its citizens.

Finally, we are grateful and indebted to the many volunteers, donors, patrons and Friends of the Library who help keep the library operating and functioning at its high level of excellence, in spite of the increased usage by town folk.

2009 was most rewarding with all the programs offered by the library for both adults and young people. We look forward to an equally exciting year in which the library will continue to enrich the lives of all who live and work in Nelson

**REPORT OF THE OLIVIA RODHAM MEMORIAL LIBRARY  
NOTES ON THE 2009 TREASURER'S REPORT & 2010 BUDGET**

Use of the Library increased substantially during 2009 (see the Librarian's Report for full details), yet we were able to operate within our budget. In response to the difficult economic environment in 2010, we are requesting 5% less in funding from the Town than we received last year, \$19,570, down from \$20,600. This will lead to another challenging year at the Library, as we manage increased usage while containing costs.

In 2008, we were awarded a Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation two-year grant for the purchase of computer equipment for library patron use. In 2009, we received \$2,600 in Phase One. Of that, \$1,950 came from the Gates Foundation and \$650 came in matching funds from the Friends of the Library. We spent \$1,698 on a new computer, printer and related equipment. The grant also funds four years of computer supplies, repairs and maintenance. We have set aside the 2009 unspent balance of \$902 to cover future computer expenses.

In 2010, we will receive an additional \$2,600 in Phase Two of the grant, \$1,300 from the Gates Foundation and \$1,300 in matching funds from the Friends of the Library. We will use the funds to buy one or two additional computers for patron use.

During 2009, the Library received \$3,103 from the Henry Melville Fuller Fund, which is managed by the New Hampshire Charitable Foundation. This was substantially more than the \$2,000 we had expected, and more than we will receive from this fund in 2010. The Library budget also included \$1,000 for contingency expenses, none of which we were required to spend during the year. The additional income from the Henry Melville Fuller Fund, combined with no contingency expenses, allowed us to use less from the Library Memorial Funds than anticipated. We spent \$1,600 from our Memorial Funds in 2009, as opposed to the \$3,252 that was budgeted.

## GRANITE LAKE VILLAGE DISTRICT: SUMMARY OF MINUTES OF ANNUAL MEETING 2009

At 9:03, Moderator John Halter called the meeting to order and read the opening warrant paragraph: To the inhabitants of the towns of Nelson and Stoddard, NH, located in Cheshire County and those qualified to vote in the Village District, you are hereby notified of the annual meeting to be held at the Chapel-by-the-Lake, Munsonville, NH, on Saturday, April 25, 2009 at 9:00 a.m. to vote on Articles 1-9 and election of officers.

**Article 1.** To choose one commissioner for a term of three years and to see if the inhabitants of the district will elect for the office of Clerk, Moderator, and Treasurer, each for the term of one year. The following people are nominated: Phil Hamilton, Commissioner; Sally Ripley, Clerk; John Halter, Moderator; Barbara Ropiecki, Treasurer. *Article moved, seconded, and unanimously approved.*

**Article 2.** To see if the District will vote to authorize the Commissioners to borrow in anticipation of taxes. *Article was moved and seconded and after a brief discussion passed unanimously.*

**Article 3.** To see if the District will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2600.00 to defray Village District expenses for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same. *Article moved, seconded and unanimously passed without discussion.*

**Article 4.** To see if the District will raise and appropriate the sum of \$750.00 to purchase liability insurance to cover the District. *Article was moved and seconded. Discussion focused on the limits and type of insurance. The cost was questioned and the moderator responded that when the GLVD was formed about 16 years ago, it was in order to purchase insurance at a considerable savings as a municipality rather than a private association. The dam itself falls into the low-risk category. The vote in favor was unanimous.*

**Article 5.** To see if the District will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1500.00 to add to the capital reserve fund. *Article was moved and seconded. Barbara Ropiecki said she had spoken to the state, which had requested an amendment stating what the money would be used for. "Kevin" offered "capital reserve fund for maintenance and repairs of the dam," and the motion was formally made, seconded and the amendment opened for discussion. Points made: DRA requires that there must be a specific purpose for a reserve fund; not routine maintenance but major repairs or rebuilding. To take money out of a reserve fund, a warrant article is required. In response to a question about the present size of the reserve fund, Barb responded that it is presently \$1500 plus interest since December; it was set up with the fund agent for the trustees of trust funds in Stoddard, as a CD earning 2.72% interest. In response to a comment about the small size of the fund, she added that last year the GLVD withdrew the entire balance of the fund to pay for the dam project. The funds are not commingled with Stoddard's. The wording finally settled on was "Capital reserve fund for dam maintenance/ repair/ replacement of the dam established Dec. 2008". Votes on the amendment and Article 5 were both affirmative.*

**Article 6.** To see if the District will vote to pay off in full the construction loan balance of \$14,600.36 to avoid additional interest fees. *Motion was promptly moved and seconded, after which the moderator stated that the article must immediately be amended to read "raise and appropriate" to follow state regulations. The amendment was moved, seconded and voted in the affirmative. A detailed discussion followed. The major information offered included: This article will raise next year's tax bill by a factor of 3.2 for the Village District portion of the tax; after that the rate will go down again, barring a catastrophic problem. The initial cost of the repair was \$9,000 and Nelson paid half of that because their road crosses the box culvert. We had money left over in the*

old reserve fund and about \$39,000 is left. Barbara Ropiecki stated that paying the loan off rather than extending it for the full ten years would save \$3,032 in interest. It was suggested that given the coming need to reface the dam, it might be advisable to increase the reserve fund, perhaps by \$5000. The amended article was read: 6. To see if the District will raise and appropriate the sum of \$14,600.36 to pay off in full the construction loan balance to avoid additional interest fees. Motion was made and seconded. The vote was affirmative. Barb's hard work in getting the lowest rate possible on a construction loan was commended.

**Article 7.** To see if the District will accept funds from the Granite Lake Association, or from any other source, for dam maintenance, repair and/or replacement. Motion was moved and seconded. Phil Hamilton offered an amendment reading: "to see if the District will accept funds from the Granite Lake Association or any other source, to be put in the capital reserve fund for dam maintenance, repairs, and /or replacement". In response to a question about the allowable use of general fund money, the moderator said that general fund and reserve funds were for impoundment of water only. Further discussion ensued about the differences between the Granite Lake Association and the Granite Lake Village District, after which the amendment was moved and seconded. The moderator read the amended article and called for a vote, which was affirmative

**Article 8.** To see if the District will raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to pay for an updated hydrology study allowing the District to raise the dam planks up to 24 inches from 21 inches as needed. Motion was moved and seconded. An extended discussion developed about the implications of the raised plank level, the winter water level and the differing perspectives of DES, whose primary concern is dam safety, and Fish and Game, which emphasizes the lake ecosystem. It was pointed out that \$3000 will not be available until December, though the funds could be borrowed in anticipation of taxes. The article was voted affirmatively.

**Article 9.** To see if the District will vote to hold its next annual meeting on April 24, 2010 at 9:00 A.M. at the Chapel-by-the-Lake, Munsonville NH. In response to a question, it was noted that only if the fiscal year ended June 30 would it be possible to hold the meeting in the summer to accommodate people who do not arrive till then. Article moved and seconded. Vote was affirmative.

The moderator requested a motion to adjourn, which was moved, seconded and voted affirmatively. The meeting was adjourned about 10:15.

MARCH 10, 2009

It was a lovely day for Town Meeting. 176 Nelson voters cast their ballots, beginning promptly at 11 a.m. and continuing until 7:25 p.m. Mr. Richard Church, Town Moderator, opened the business portion of the meeting, and the Nelson Boy Scouts led those assembled in the Pledge of Allegiance. The Town Hall was filled to capacity. A lively, interactive community progressed through the warrant with humor, thoughtfulness, and creativity. It was a productive Town Meeting

2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$295,810 to be raised by taxes. This is to defray Town charges for the year ensuing. The Selectmen recommend this appropriation. *The article was accepted as read, and after a detailed explanation of the numbers by Tom Buttrick, Treasurer, was accepted by unanimous voice vote.*
3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$30,329 for support of the town library. (In 2008 the appropriation was \$28,387.)  
\$20,600 to be raised by taxes  
\$9,729 income from library memorial fund and other sources.  
*The article was accepted as read. With an explanation of the budget by Betsey Street, Library Trustee, it passed by voice vote.*
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,426 for support of social service agencies which provide assistance to Nelson residents. The agencies chosen to receive funds are: Home Health Care (\$550), Monadnock Family Services (\$826), The Keene



Community Kitchen, Inc. (\$1,500) and Southwestern Community Services (\$550). The Selectmen recommend these appropriations. (In 2008, these same agencies received contributions from the town in the amount of \$3376.) *The article was accepted as read and with no discussion was passed by unanimous voice vote.*

5. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$10,000 to be added to the Town Buildings Capital Reserve Fund. No withdrawals may be made from the fund except by vote of the town. The selectmen recommend this appropriation. (The 2008 appropriation was \$10,000.) The fund balance on 12/31/2008 was \$42,812. Selectmen recommend this article. *The article was accepted as read and was passed without discussion by voice vote.*
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000 to be added to the Milfoil Prevention and Treatment Expendable Trust Fund. The Selectmen recommend this article. The fund balance as of 12/31/2008 was \$9,303. The article was accepted as read. *After some discussion about the need for this money, the article was passed unanimously by voice vote.*
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$630 used for hazardous waste collections for 2009 consisting of 12 collection dates. The Selectmen recommend this article. *The article was accepted as read and after assurance that Nelson residents are included in the list of towns authorized to bring waste to Keene, it was passed by unanimous voice vote.*
8. To see if the Town will vote to establish an appointed position for a Site Plan Review Officer. This position will be funded by fees from the building permits and other related fees. This position will be responsible to the Board of Selectmen and would be filled upon passage of this article. *The article was accepted as read. After much discussion about what duties this position would include, the article was passed by voice vote.*
9. To see if the Town will allow the numerical tally of any of the selectmen's recorded votes to be printed in the town warrant next to the affected warrant article. *The article was accepted as read. An explanation by Selectman Michael Blaudschun indicated that this is a housekeeping article to authorize the Selectmen to indicate when support of a warrant article is not unanimous. The article passed by voice vote.*

## **ARTICLES DEALING WITH SERVICE AND PROTECTION**

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8787 as subsidy for ambulance service for the ensuing year, it being understood that residents will still be charged for individual calls. (The appropriation for 2008 was \$8071.53.) The Selectmen recommend this article. *The article was accepted as read, there was no discussion, and it passed by unanimous voice vote.*
11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15,000 for the proper expenses of the Fire Department and Rescue Squad. (The 2008 appropriation was \$15,000.) *The article was accepted as read, and with no discussion it was passed by voice vote.*
12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 for the purpose of fighting forest fires. This sum to come from reimbursement from the NH State Fire Warden and no amount will be raised through taxation. The Department of Revenue Administration recommends this method of accounting so as not to impact the Fire Department's operating budget. The article was accepted as read. *There was no discussion and the article was passed by unanimous voice vote.*

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25,000 to be added to the Fire Equipment Capital Reserve Fund, for the purpose of Fire Apparatus for the fire department. No withdrawals may be made from this Fund except by vote of the Town and upon recommendation of the Fire Chief. The fund balance as of 12/31/2008 was \$105,737.05. The Selectmen recommend this article. *The article was accepted as read. There was no discussion and the article passed by unanimous voice vote.*
14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500 for the proper expenses for Emergency Management. *The article was accepted as read. With little discussion the article was passed by unanimous voice vote.*
15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$37,949 for the proper expenses of the Police Department. (The appropriation for 2008 was \$37,949.) *The article was accepted as read. With no discussion, the article was passed by voice vote.*
16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000 for the purpose of patrols performed by the Nelson Police Department for the State of NH, Cheshire County, Sheriff's Office and other authorized municipal entities. This sum is to come from offsetting grants and no amount will be raised through taxation. *The article was accepted as read. With no discussion the article was passed by voice vote.*

#### ARTICLES DEALING WITH ROADS

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$215,000 for the purpose of maintenance of highways and bridges for ensuing year's budget with \$37,077 coming from the Highway Block Grant and the remaining \$177,923 to be raised by taxes. *The article was accepted as read. With little discussion, it passed by voice vote.*
18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,000 to be added to the Road Equipment Capital Reserve Fund. It is understood that no withdrawals may be made from this fund for the purchase of road equipment except by vote of the town upon recommendation of the Road Equipment Committee. The Fund balance on 12/31/2008 was \$21,505.94. (The 2008 appropriation was \$20,000.) *The article was accepted as read, and with no discussion was passed by voice vote.*
19. To see if the Town will vote to have the Auditor's position to be an appointed position not an elected position. This will become effective at the March 2010 Town Elections. The article was accepted as read. There was much discussion about the appropriateness of the appointment of this position by the Selectmen, and that an appointment would be done by the Supervisors of the Checklist according to law. *The article was defeated by voice vote.*
20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$169,658 for the construction of the Highway Salt Barn and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw \$169,658 from the Capital Reserve Fund for total expense of the Salt Barn and Storm-Water site work. The selectmen and the Road Committee recommend this withdrawal. *The article was accepted as read. Two amendments were placed before the Town. Both were defeated by voice vote. #1 offered by Terry Mednick: To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$169,658. for the construction of the Highway Salt Barn and to authorize the selectmen to withdraw up to, but not exceeding \$85,000 from the 2004 Salt Barn capital reserve fund for the town's share of the expenses of the Salt Barn and Storm Water site work. This work will only be done if at least half the costs are paid by non-town of Nelson funds. This amendment was defeated by voice vote. #2 offered by Tom Buttrick: To see if the Town will vote to raise and*

appropriate the sum of \$169,658 in Federal Stimulus funds to cover the cost of the Salt Barn and Storm-Water site work. If \$169,658 in Federal Stimulus funds is applied for and monies are received, authorize the Selectmen to withdraw, from the 2004 Salt Barn Capital Reserve Fund, the difference between the \$169,658 cost and the Federal Stimulus funds received. If no Federal Stimulus funds are received, authorize the Selectmen to withdraw \$169,658 from the 2004 Salt Barn Capital Reserve Fund to cover the cost of the Salt Barn and Storm-Site work. If the Selectmen do not apply for available Federal Stimulus funds, or do not apply within allowed timeframes, no monies are to be made available for the Salt Barn or Storm-Water site work. The original article was passed by voice vote.

21. This article is to discontinue the Salt Barn Capital reserve Fund and any money left will go to the General Fund. If warrant article #20 fails, this article will be passed over. *The motion to accept the article as read was withdrawn, and a motion to pass over the article was accepted, and passed by unanimous voice vote.*
22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$55,000 and not to exceed that amount, for the total expense of the comprehensive Nelson mapping program. This article is non-lapsing, and payments will be spread over a three year term. The first payment will not exceed \$18,333.34. The Selectmen recommend this article. *The article was accepted as read. Craig Nichols, from the Department of Revenue Administration, was introduced and spoke on behalf of the Selectmen. Mr. Nichols offered three alternate bids received by the Selectmen (see addendum attached). There was a great deal of discussion concerning the value of any appropriation. An amendment was offered by Terry Mednick and seconded "To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed \$3,000 for the expense of reviewing the past 10 years of Nelson's Registry of Deeds transactions and preparing the necessary updates for the mapper." After continued discussion the amendment passed by voice vote, and the article as amended was passed by raised hand vote 90 to 22..*

## ARTICLES DEALING WITH PLANNING & ZONING

23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$727 for dues to belong to the Southwest Region Planning Commission (\$727 in 2008). *The article was accepted as read, and with no discussion was passed unanimously by voice vote.*

## OTHER ARTICLES

24. To see if the town will vote to establish an Expendable Trust Fund under the provisions of RSA 31:19-A to be known as the Nelson Community Project Fund for the purpose of building town-wide consensus about the town's future and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10 for this fund.

The Nelson Community Project will:

1. Develop a town-wide, inclusive process for agreeing on common goals for Nelson.
2. Provide "seed money" for worthwhile projects identified by the process and
3. Be authorized to accept public, private and foundation support as additions to the Expendable Trust Fund.

It is understood that any money raised from foundations or private sources may be expended by the duly authorized representatives of the Nelson Community Project. This is a petitioned article. Not recommended by the Selectmen. *The article was accepted as read. Kathy Schillemat spoke to the article and offered an amendment to the article to read as follows: "To*



see if the town will vote in support of the Nelson Community Project known as Moving in Step. The purpose of the Project is to develop a town-wide, inclusive process for agreeing on common goals for the Nelson community." The motion was seconded. Moderator Richard Church indicated that this amendment significantly changes the intent of the original article. Passage of the amendment and passage of the article as amended would be taking a sense of the meeting only. There was a great deal of discussion about the committee and its goals. Ultimately the amendment passed by voice vote. Then the amended article was defeated by raised hand vote, yes-44, no-52.

25. To see if the town will vote to add an article to the Zoning Ordinance that states:

Pursuant to RSA 674:17 j, the town may establish buffer zones or additional districts which overlap existing districts and may further regulate the planting and trimming of vegetation on public and private property to protect access to energy systems. This provision is enforceable by the selectmen after conferring with the Highway Supervisor or appropriate power authorities. This is a petitioned article. *The Moderator indicated that on advice of Town counsel this article is not a legal article, since the legal process for zoning amendments was not followed. A motion to pass over this article was passed by unanimous voice vote.*

26. To see if the Town will vote to adopt an Ordinance that states:

"If the actions of any Board or Commission elected or appointed by the Town result in legal disputes, then any funds budgeted to or under the control of that Board or Commission by utilize first for legal costs prior to any town funds being utilized." This ordinance does not place any undue burden on any Board Member or Commission Member. However, it serves to insure that discretionary funds are utilized prior to any burden to the taxpayers of the Town. This is a petitioned article. *On advice of Town Counsel, this is not an enforceable article. A motion to pass over this article was accepted and passed by voice vote.*

27. To see if the Town will vote to limit the amount of revenue to \$1000 of the (Land Use Change Tax) revenue collected going to the Conservation Fund, pursuant to RSA 79-A:25 II, with any overage going to the General Fund. If adopted by the Town, the provisions of RSA 79-A:25 II, shall take effect in the tax year beginning April 1, following the vote and shall remain in effect until altered or rescinded pursuant to RSA 79-A:25 IV. (Provision was adopted in 2003, article 25) This is a petitioned article. *The article was accepted as read. Jane Kirk, Selectman, read from advice of Town Counsel recommending a clarification of the article to include the words "in any fiscal year". An amendment to include the words "in any fiscal year" after the word "year" was seconded and received approval by voice vote. Discussion centered on the pros and cons of depositing CUSE funds into a conservation fund as opposed to the town's general fund. After much discussion the article was defeated by voice vote.*

28. To see if the town will vote to establish an Expendable Trust Fund under the provisions of RSA 31:19-A to be known as the Nelson Community Project Fund for the purpose of building a town-wide consensus about the town's future and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10 for this fund and to see if the town will vote to appoint the selectmen as agents to expend funds from the Nelson Community Project Fund for the stated purpose of the fund.

The Nelson Community Project will:

1. Develop a town-wide, inclusive process for agreeing on common goals for Nelson.
2. Provide "seed money" for worthwhile projects identified by the process and



3. Be authorized to accept public, private and foundation support as additions to the Expendable Trust Fund.

It is understood that any money raised from foundations or private sources may be expended by the duly authorized representatives of the Nelson Community Project. This is a petitioned article. The selectmen do not recommend this article. *A motion to pass over this article was accepted and was passed by unanimous voice vote.*

**TO TRANSACT ANY OTHER BUSINESS OR DISCUSS OTHER WARRANT PROPOSALS AS MAY LEGALLY BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE MEETING.**

1. Moderator Richard Church acknowledged a book of photos taken in Nelson by Samantha Leigh French after the December 2008 ice storm which Ms. French presented to the Town. This lovely book will be kept in the Nelson Library to be available for all to see.
2. Bob Jones stood up to thank everyone who worked in any capacity toward the successful completion of the Safety Building.
3. Richard Pratt, Police Chief, presented a large frame, ready for hanging, containing all of the thank-you notes townspeople wrote after using the Safety Building during the 2008 ice storm power outage. These same thank-you notes are contained on the cover of the 2008 Town Report. The framed notes will be a nice memory of a time when the Nelson community pulled together during an emergency and helped one another.
4. Jane Kirk made presentations to the following for their service to the Town: Al Struthers, Cemetery Sexton; George Warner, Town Sexton; Bea Warner, Supervisor of the Checklist; and Sam Bouchie, retiring Selectman. Rita Schillemat came forward to praise the long and dedicated service of Bea Warner. Bea was a Supervisor for more than forty years. Each of the recipients received a framed copy of the 2008 Town Report cover, a book, and a gift certificate.

At 10:30 p.m. the meeting was adjourned.

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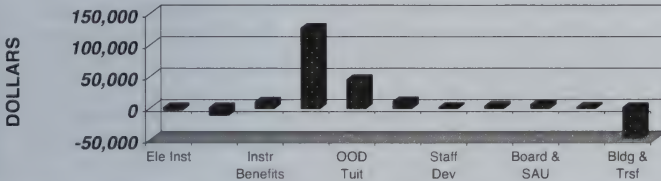

### **Nelson School District Meeting**

March 6, 2009

Richard P. Church, Moderator, called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. The meeting began with performances by 6 Nelson School Students, led by Music Teacher, Mike Dillon. The Kindergarten, First and Second Grade Students also performed a medley of patriotic songs led by their teacher, Cynthia Benner.

Moderator Church acknowledged the presence of SAU 29 officials, Wayne Woolridge, Co-Superintendent, and Tim Reuhr, Business Manager for Towns, as well as Sheila Vara, Nelson School Principal. He asked if those assembled would allow Mr. Woolridge and Mr. Reuhr to speak as needed. It was so moved and seconded.

**Article 1:** To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto. It was moved and seconded that the Article be accepted as read. Article 1 passed by voice vote.

**Article 2:** To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,548, 863 for the support of schools, for the salaries for school district officials and agents, and for the statutory obligations of the District, or to take any action in relation thereto.

It was moved and seconded that the Article be accepted as read. Kelly French, School Board Chair, outlined the details of the budget for the ensuing year. She mentioned that there will likely be a special School District Meeting in May to appropriate money from the Tuition Trust Fund for an anticipated tuition deficit. After some discussion, Article 2 passed by voice vote.

**Article 3:** To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate up to \$15,000 from its unencumbered funds, if any, remaining on hand at the end of fiscal year, June 30, 2009 to the Capital Reserve Fund established by the voters of the District at the March, 1972, District Meeting for the purpose of construction/ reconstruction of buildings and/or purchase of equipment, and/or the acquisition of land for school purposed, or to take any other action in relation thereto.

It was moved and seconded that Article 3 be accepted as read. Article 3 was passed by voice vote.


**Article 4:** To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate up to \$33, 000 for the purchase, installation, and related costs of installing a back-up generator capable of delivering power throughout the entire school building, and authorize the withdrawal of said funds, \$33,000 from the capital reserve fund created for the purpose of construction/reconstruction of buildings and/or purchase of equipment, and/or the acquisition of land for school purposes, or to take any other action in relation thereto.

It was moved and seconded that Article 4 be accepted as read. Kelly French explained that after the school's inability to operate after the December ice storm, the Board

determined that it would be wise to purchase and install a 30 Kilowatt generator. It was noted that there have been other times in the past when Nelson School has had to close due to loss of electricity and this purchase would prevent that situation in the future. After some discussion, Article 4 passed by voice vote.

**Article 5:** To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting. It was moved and seconded that the meeting be adjourned at 8:10 pm.



### Principal's Report 2009-2010

Nelson School opened its doors for the 2009-2010 academic school year with a total of 30 students in kindergarten through grade six. As the year unfolded two new families moved to the Nelson community, which increased our numbers to 33.

Once again this year Cindy Benner is teaching the K-2 classroom, Kristin Mullins is teaching the 3/4 classroom, and Jennifer Petrovich is teaching the 5/6 classroom. Joyce Foster continues in her 60 percent position as the Special Education teacher and works closely with Vicki Dowley, our inclusion tutor, who works with students in all classrooms. Due to Title grant funding, we were once again able to offer a Title I position. This position is held by Martha Silk, our most seasoned educator, who delivers supplemental services to students in grades K-6 in both reading and math.

Our specialists remain an integral part of the program that Nelson School offers and they bring the arts and wellness alive. Dan Durand, our physical education teacher, continues to enrich the physical education program with rock climbing and skating. His program also offers an Open Physical Education period where students of all ages are engaged in physical activity while interacting in multi-grade configurations. Marylise Reilly continues in her dual role of Art and French teacher. The school bulletin boards are adorned with student artwork as a result of her efforts, and staff from Keene Middle School and Keene High School report that Nelson School students excel in French. Our new music teacher, Jennifer Hed, has joined the Nelson team and works with students on Mondays. She has re-instituted All School Sing twice a month and is amazed with the musicality of Nelson students. Becky Kohler, our guidance counselor, works with students on Wednesdays. This year Becky organized a half-day Conflict Resolution training session designed for 6<sup>th</sup> grade students from Nelson School as well as for students at Wells Memorial. This training encouraged students to take a leadership role within the school. Becky also brought the highly acclaimed "TIGER Program" to the students at Nelson School. This leadership program's mission is to promote an affirming and safe environment for all children. Through the arts, T.I.G.E.R. helps children learn the skills necessary to navigate conflict and celebrate the uniqueness of each individual. Karen Nickerson, our school nurse, has enjoyed her second year of teaching the health curriculum to all students and is an extremely valuable resource to both parents and staff. This past year Karen has been instrumental in helping to refine Nelson School's emergency management plan and is a member of the Wellness Committee. Kim Keating, Nelson School's secretary and jack-of-all-trades extraordinaire, does everything necessary to make the school run smoothly. And last, but not least, our school is kept clean by Rachel Lakin, who continues to find ways to make us all smile and the school sparkle.

The annual School Board Retreat was held at the Harris Center in late August of 2009. The meeting began with a review of the school's progress in achieving their 2008-2009 goals. Brenda Finn, Assistant to Wayne Woolridge, Co-Superintendent, asked the group to identify long and short term goals for the 2009-10 year through reflective conversation guided by the following questions.

#### Short-term Goals

- What are the immediate goals we want to achieve in 2009-10 in working with the 30 students enrolled to date?

#### Long-term Goals

- What are our strategic goal(s) as we look five or more years ahead?
- Enrollment: What can we do differently?
  - Structure of day/week/year
  - Focused curriculum (community service, multiple intelligences, focused curricular areas, etc.)
  - Community involvement as we study enrollment issue: how, when, who?



In our quest to be accountable for student learning, comply with state mandates, and best meet the needs of Nelson students, the Nelson staff continually looks for professional development activities to provide us with the knowledge, skills, and strategies to make this happen. This year the Nelson School staff attended a two-day workshop on the Responsive Classroom in Washington, DC. This workshop allowed us to expand our understanding of the Responsive Classroom through implementation in shared spaces such as the lunchroom, hallways, multi-purpose room, bathrooms, and outside areas. To help improve our test scores in the area of writing, the staff explored the many and varied writing programs available and unanimously chose The Six Traits of Writing (idea, organization, voice, sentence fluency, word choice, and conventions) program to implement. To help us achieve this goal, the staff attended multiple workshops and worked with a Six Traits Writing consultant both of which were funded through grants.

In this age of teacher accountability and the expectation that students will meet prescribed benchmarks to demonstrate competency and proficiency, Nelson students earned the highest reading and math scores in the region. Although this is only one "snapshot" of how our children perform, it is an important one as it speaks to the expertise of Nelson teachers, as well as the programs that we use.

Each year the Nelson staff re-examines past practices, activities, and programs and collaboratively makes a conscious decision to establish, continue, modify, or discontinue previous practices based upon the activity's level of success and/or the ever-changing needs of our students and families. One of the year's biggest successes has been the addition of community breakfast. This year's four community fund raising breakfasts were held at Nelson School to help raise money for the annual sixth grade trip. Community member Charlie Lang, pancake and waffle chef extraordinaire graciously volunteered his time, resources, and expertise to make these fundraisers successful. Fifty guests, including parents, community members, and members of SAU 29 joined us on a cold, wintry December afternoon to sing Christmas carols and holiday songs. Everyone in attendance had a wonderful time and this will become one of Nelson's new traditions.

As a staff, we continue to recognize and embrace the importance of an inclusive community, and yet seek authentic ways to commend and acknowledge students for their outstanding achievements. With this tenet in mind, Nelson School held its first awards ceremony. Students were acknowledged in the following areas: Mathematics, Writing, Citizenship, Reading, Spelling, and Most Improved. As each student came forward, they were given a pin and the reasons for the award were shared.

The Nelson teaching staff continues to hold in high esteem the importance of community service. For the first time in Nelson School's collective memory, we had a 100 percent participation rate for Trick-or-Treat for UNICEF and raised \$241.00; and for the fourth consecutive year, staff members organized and participated in Casual Friday to raise money for charity.

Our affiliation with the Harris Center remains an integral part of our science curriculum. The Harris Center for Conservation Education is dedicated to promoting understanding and respect for our natural environment through education of all ages, direct protection and exemplary stewardship of the region's natural resources and programs that encourage active participation in the great outdoors. This year students in grades K/1/2 studied mammals, students in the 3/4 classroom participated in a unit on the white tailed deer, and the students in the 5/6 class turned their attention to vernal pools.

Collaboration with Nelson community, Moving In Step, Apple Hill, and area schools, have guided us this year. School events are posted in Moving In Step and Nelson School children designed the outside and inside covers of the local telephone directory. We have continued with the Town

Writing Rubrics Collaboration with teachers and principals from Wells Memorial School, Stoddard School, and the John Perkins School. Nelson School and Apple Hill are meeting to create a Strings Program to start in September of 2010, which will eventually be opened to students in surrounding towns. This would not be happening without the vision of Val Van Meir, Lenny Matczynski, and Sarah Kim. And finally, members of the Nelson staff are collaborating with teachers from other schools in developing a writing rubric to assess student work in kindergarten through grade six. The PTO has played a vital role in the tapestry of Nelson School. Due to their generosity, Monadnock Music's widely acclaimed, innovative outreach program "Lend an Ear" program was brought back to Nelson School. This program enriches the curriculum by exposing students to a variety of musical instruments played by top-level professionals. With funds from the PTO, students also traveled to the Colonial Theatre in Keene to watch Harold and the Purple Crayon and Mad Science CSI Live!

Thanks to the generosity of the Nelson PTO and the Trustees of the Olivia Rodham Library, Nelson students were once again able to further develop their library skills under the guidance of Kris Finnegan. Nelson School continues to be fortunate to have the help of Susan Hansel at the school library two days a week.

The sixth grade graduation was brought back to Nelson School this past year and held in the multi-purpose room. The multi-purpose room was magically transformed with streamers, flowers, and an archway. The small, intimate space worked quite well for the ceremony, which focused upon each student, their accomplishments, and our wishes for them as they continue their educational journey. Cindy Benner brought everyone to tears when she sang a solo to parents entitled "It's a Pleasure to Know You" that spoke to and said "good-bye" and "thank you" to every sixth grade parent in the room.

A school is only as strong as its community support, staff commitment, and volunteers. A heart-felt "thank you" to Jessica Bigaj, Joy Birdsey, Anna Philbrick, Candyce Fulford, Jessica Walker, and Cindy Benner for recognizing the need and importance of a vital parent teacher organization and working collaboratively to brainstorm and organize the Nelson Auction. The money raised was used to purchase a slide for the playground, a laminator for the teachers, and funded the rich and varied programs that benefit all children at Nelson School.

Nelson School remains a great place to teach and learn because of the staff, specialists, community members, school board members, parents, administration from SAU 29, and all others who have helped create this wonderful community of learners. Together we really make a difference for the children of Nelson. Once again, thank you for your support of the 2009-2010 school budget. This year your support allowed us to purchase a weeklong theatre residency for students, offer four six-week after school programs, install a generator, build a detachable shed for the storage of outdoor equipment, and purchase a new stove for the kitchen (75 percent funding from the stimulus package). Grant money this year was used to bring us further into the world of technology with the addition of Promethean Boards in every classroom. This same grant also allowed the music program to be expanded through the acquisition of xylophones and metallophones. These instruments will be used for improvisation, practice reading notes, and composition.



