# ALTON TOWN WARRANT

## State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Alton, in the County of Belknap, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following articles:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year and to elect a Selectman for three years, one Library Trustee for three years, one Water Commissioner for one year, one Fire Ward for three years, one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years.
2. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay all necessary charges of the Town for the ensuing year.
3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$6,864.00 for the purpose of rebuilding and resurfacing with Tarvia the town gravel roads, so-called, this sum to be raised by taxation.
4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs of highways and bridges for the ensuing year in addition to that required by law.
5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the removal of snow from the town highways for the ensuing year.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,625.00 for the purchase of Tarvia and the application of the same.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,774.19 provided the State will contribute the sum of \$11,827.96 for Class V roads, so-called.

8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow monies in anticipation of taxes.
9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Public Library.
10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for patriotic exercises on Independence Day.
11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the decpration of Soldiers' graves.
12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$934.56, which is 1/100th of 1% of the assessed valuation of the Town, to the Lakes Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town.
13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$934.56, which is 1/100th of 1% of the assessed valuation of the Town, for the support of the Huggins Hospital at Wolfeboro, New Hampshire. (Budget Committee recommended \$500.00)
14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the support of the Lakes Region General Hospital at Laconia, New Hampshire.
15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to be expended under State supervision for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.
16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,000.00 for the purchase of a new town truck.
17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,700.00 for the control of Dutch Elm Disease and Gypsy Moth.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,200.00 to the Alton—Alton Bay Chamber of Commerce for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town.
19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25,000.00 for the construction of an addition to the Gilman Historical Building and authorize the Selectmen to borrow the above sum of money against the credit of the town on long term notes. This building is to be amortized by interest received from the Trustees of the Gilman Fund.
20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$33,000.00 for the development of a town Mapping Program and authorize the Selectmen to borrow the above sum of money against the credit of the town on long term notes.
21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,475.00 for Parks and Playgrounds, including band concerts.
22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Civil Defense.
23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,750.00 for a heating system for the Community House in West Alton.
24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,615.00 for the Town's share in support of the Public Health Nursing Association. (Budget Committee recommended \$500.00)
25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,121.00 for the support of the Lakes Region Planning Commission.
26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the New Hampshire Humane Society.

**27. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell any property acquired by tax title.**

**28. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the purpose of adding to the Conservation Fund as authorized under the enabling Act RSA 36-A, Section 5.**

**29. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to give the Conservation Commission the authority to manage and control the so-called George Boudrealt land on Alton Mountain.**

**30. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for the purchase of a police cruiser.**

**31. To see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of \$1,000.00 from the Cemetery Savings Bank Account to the Municipal Improvement Fund.**

**32. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a committee of 5 to study the feasibility of the re-location of the Alton Bay Fire Station, and make a report at the next town meeting.**

**33. To see what action the Town will take on the following proposed amendments to the Building Regulations of the Town of Alton.**

**1. Amend Article 1, Section 5, line 4 by deleting the word "Appeal" and substituting in its stead the word "Adjustment."**

**2. Amend Article V as follows:**

**(a) Amend the title of Article V by deleting the word "Appeal" and substituting in its stead the word "Adjustment."**

**(b) Amend Article V, Section 1 in general by deleting the present wording and substituting in its stead "Alton Board of Adjustment shall have jurisdiction over all appeals and special exceptions from this ordinance."**

**(c) Amend Section 2, line 1, by deleting the word "Appeals" and substituting in its stead the word "Adjustment."**



(d) Insert a new subparagraph (d) to Section 2 as follows: "The Board of Adjustment shall have all powers and functions prescribed in Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 156 and any amendments thereto."

(e) Amend Section 2, Subsection by deleting the letter "d" and substituting in its stead the letter "e."

34. To see if the Town will vote to widen, re-construct and black top 1.5 miles of town road known as Stockbridge Corner Road in South Alton. Beginning at the end of the section now tarred and extending 1.5 miles to and including the Capone residence. To be completed in the year of 1971, and authorize the Selectmen to borrow the necessary sum against the credit of the Town on long term notes.

35. To see if the Town will vote to require that only phosphate free laundry detergents may be offered for sale in the Town of Alton after June 1, 1971.

36. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the amendments to the Alton Zoning Ordinance proposed by the Planning Board. (This Article is to be voted upon by printed ballots used for Town Officers and not at the Town Meeting. (See ballot for form)

37. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers hereinbefore mentioned chosen and to pass any vote relative thereto.

38. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT of the FOREST FIRE WARDEN and DISTRICT CHIEF

The 1970 forest fire season was a quiet one in this area, quiet in part because of your continued cooperation and favorable weather conditions.

Fires that did occur were, for the most part, caused by debris burning, children and smokers.

The elimination of these three causes of forest fires would drastically change this picture—to bring about this change we make the following suggestions.

1. When the ground is not covered with snow a permit to burn must be obtained from the Forest Fire Warden. This permit covers waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, as well as garden trash and brush burning such burning is restricted by regulation to 9:00 A. M. and after 5:00 P. M. with the following exceptions:

Commercial or industrial burning is permissible at any time under normal conditions but only with the approval of the District Chief and a written permit from the Forest Fire Warden.

2. Fires caused by children can be prevented only with the complete cooperation of parents in the supervision of their children, keep matches out of reach of children, this action will help to prevent fires and may save a life, the life of your child. Try to explain this to your child, won't you?

3. Forest fires caused by smokers can be reduced in number by the exercise of more care in the discarding of matches and smoking material whether from a vehicle or by a hiker. In all cases, make sure that the butt or match you discard is out, dead out. Smokey says, "Thanks for your help", and invites you to join with him in setting a good example for others in the prevention of fires and the protection of our environment.

## REPORT OF FIRE CHIEF

The year 1970 was a very successful period for the Alton Fire Department from the standpoint of all the volunteer firemen, who participated at the fires that occurred.

The department has held training sessions throughout the year, and nine men attended the Lily Pond Fire Training School in Gilford, N. H., also three men attended the Meadowbrook Training School at Fitzwilliam, N. H. We hope this number will be greatly increased at both schools this coming year.

The Fire Department is looking forward to the possibility of having our fire alarm system greatly improved, by going to a county wide central dispatch system. With this, and radio alarm to all individual firemen in the town, we will be able to extend the insurance coverage from two to three miles in any direction, by traveled way, from the fire stations. There are now twenty-four firemen that have the radio alarm receivers. Some of these receivers were purchased by individual firemen, and some were acquired through fund raising activities.

Fire inspection work was increased and our Fire Prevention program was expanded over last year. It is hoped that these activities may be further developed this coming year by visits to our school and with planned programs for local organizations.

Thirty-six alarms were answered involving structural property value in the vicinity of three hundred and sixty thousand dollars. The loss from fire to these properties is estimated to be sixty thousand dollars, which means that the fire department actually saved the town three hundred thousand in taxable property that could have been lost.

In closing this report here are some of the statistics regarding the largest fire in the town during 1970 - namely the Village Inn fire, estimated number of firemen involved including Mutual Aid - eighty; number of fire trucks - nineteen from twelve towns including Alton. Amount of water transported from Merrymeeting River to "Rural Hydrant Truck" so called - approximately 43,500 gallons, in addition to water supplied by the Alton hydrant system. No serious injuries were reported, and the fire department compliments the Alton Police Department, on their fine control of traffic and orderly conduct of spectators.

The Alton Conservation Commission was formed "... for the promotion and development of the natural resources, and for the protection of watershed resources ..." of the Town. It has met once every month since it was authorized a year ago.

In April the Commission purchased 1200 Autumn Olive seedlings from the State and distributed them without charge to residents who agreed to plant them to provide food for song and game birds.

In May the Commission accepted from the Town management of the abandoned railroad right-of-way extending from the old Mt. Major station to Minge Cove on the west side of the Bay. This has been designated a public winter snowmobile trail, and the Commission has posted signs marking the beginning and end of the trail.

In September the Commission, with help from several volunteers, removed a truckload of bottles, cans and other trash from the Merry-meeting River between the dam and the bridge at Alton Bay.

The Commission is acutely aware of the threat of pollution to our waters and the irreparable damage that will result if it is not controlled. The quality of our water resources continues to be one of the Commission's principal concerns.

The Commission is continuing its survey of the Town's natural resources, and plans to acquire through gift, bequest, easement or purchase, carefully selected land areas which can be preserved in their natural condition to make Alton a better, cleaner, more attractive place to live.

With a limited Conservation Fund, the Commission hopes that public-spirited land-owners will consider the idea of offering the Town presently undeveloped parcels of wild land which the Commission can manage for the benefit of all the residents of Alton. Gifts and bequests of this kind will be most welcome, or the Commission will accept management of such lands under the terms of a scenic or conservation easement. Woodland, marshes and land bordering waterways are especially desirable for conservation purposes.

The Commission has accepted with regret the resignation of George Jones Jr., and the Selectmen have appointed John D. Riordan to serve the remainder of his term.
