HANCOCK 1979

Hancock's bicentennial year started off with a gala New Year's Eve party in the town hall. A buffet dinner was served at the John Hancock Inn and the Middle-Road Society band played music for everyone's listening and dancing pleasure.

In January, Cheryl Cass and Lenore and Linda Paquette were the winners in the bicentennial snow sculpture contest sponsored by the Sportsmen's Club.

At town meeting in March the annual budget of \$245,214, up 8.6%, was approved. The police department got a new cruiser, the highway department a new grader.

Fifth graders at Hancock Elementary made pariscraft figures portraying historical Hancock residents, complete with costumes, for Hancock's bicentennial.

About seventy-five people helped clean up Hancock's roadsides in early May.

The bicentennial committee hosted a commemorative service at the church. The Conval Chamber Chorus sang a repertoire which included a Shaker song, a Jewish song, a black spiritual, psalm 23, and a powerful rendition of Great Jubilation.

The Hancock Woman's Club, specifically Ginny Gleason, restored the antique stage curtain in the town hall. The town had the red velvet drapes cleaned and the bicentennial committee held a Spring Cotillion with music by the Middle Road Society.

Klaran Warner came to the rescue of the pee-wee baseball players. She coached 6-8 year olds with Aaron Blanchette, officially, and Andy Warner, unofficially, assisting her. Bob Reilly coached the farm team and Al Senechal and Chris Joseph coached the little leaguers.

The Historical Society presented three programs to fifth graders at Hancock Elementary. Mary Hibbard talked to the students about old farms in Hancock. Lewis Tuttle led a hike to the depot to talk about the railroad's fifty-six years in Hancock from 1878-1934. Dorothy Starratt told about the early church in Hancock.

The Harris Center and Conservation Commission sponsored a big tree contest. Mark and Philip Mathewson with Aric Blanchette entered a sugar maple that measured 17 feet 10 inches in circumference and an estimated 130 feet tall. The tree that stands outside the Mathewson's house was the winner in Hancock and went on to set a new state record.

Members of the church held a reception for the Rev. Alan Schroepfer on June 3. He terminated his pastorate on June 30.

At a recessed town meeting on June 29, voters approved \$65,000 for construction of a 3456 square foot highway garage building with five bays and remodelling of the existing building.

An enthusiastic crowd cheered Hancock firemen on to victory in a wet and muddy muster on the fourth of July.

Bob Strombeck, retiring after twenty years of volunteer service, was named Hancock Fireman of the Year.

The Depot Association held a spaghetti supper and auction on July 14, to help defray costs of moving the Depot.

An open house at the Felch House offered workshops on stencilling, agriculture in Hancock past and present, a tour with history of the Felch House, and a hike to Jack's Pond. Two hundred years of Hancock paraphenalia was exhibited in the barn.

The Second Hundred Years came off the press and was officially presented to the selectmen in July.

Valley Farm opened up its barns to display farm life in Hancock 200 years ago. Throughout the day there were demonstrations on windmill power, beehives, spinning and knitting wool, and solar drying of vegetables. There were also numerous animals to see close up.

Rain did not dampen the celebration of Hancock's 100th Old Home Day. Activities included a melodrama, parade, road race, water sports, the Buckfield Leather and Lather show, concert by Apple Hill Chamber Players, chicken barbecue, and block dance.

Work was begun on a bicentennial quilt containing 64 squares designed by Grace Way, Dorothy Starratt, and members of the Historical Society.

Philip Way won the bicentennial gold medal designed by Nancy Adams and Nancy Hill.

A Guild sponsored Harvest Supper was followed by the Razor Sharps, a barbershop quartet, entertaining in the church.

Mike and Lesley Cass became the new owners of the Hancock Cash Market.

The library received several contributions in memory of Louise Stearns.

The Hancock Depot building was moved approximately 200 feet onto a full foundation on Sept. 27.

A slide-tape presentation by Bob Fay entitled "Speak to the Earth: Man and Nature in the Grand Monadnock" was held Sept. 28.

The Community Chorus presented an evening of song in October.

Town clerk Howard Rogers read the town charter at a program commemorating the incorporation of Hancock in November, 1879. The Rev. Lloyd Yeagle, Elting Morison, Water Peterson, and J. Duane Squires shared historical anecdotes and facts.

The Rev. Hollis Hastings preached his first sermon as minister of the First Congregational Church of Hancock on November 18.

The Grange sponsored a Harvest Festival. Children heard the Pilgrims' story and sang harvest songs. They hunted for pine cones, bird feathers, acorns, etc. in a scavenger hunt.

The main lodge at Sargent Camp burned to the ground Dec. 20.

Bill and Elizabeth Weston celebrated their twenty-fifth anniversary at an open house in the Vestry.

The church music committee and the bicentennial committee put on a pageant telling the story of how Christmas celebrations developed. Eleanor Amidon directed and narrated.

Skating on Norway Pond around New Year's was the best it has been in fifteen or twenty years.

The bicentennial year ended the way it began, with a buffet dinner at the Inn and a gala ball in the town hall, sponsored, this time, by the Depot Association.

SUMMARY OF MINUTES 0F

1979 TOWN MEETING

Article 1: Parker Starratt and Harry Casler were elected as auditors for the year ensuing. Donald Lancey was elected, by voice vote, to be the Sexton for the year ensuing.

Article 2: The Town accepted the budget in the amount of \$237,333 for estimated Town expenses, and the necessary sums for County Tax, deduct the revenues and credits, and raise the balance by taxation.

Article 3: Ballot Vote: Yes 147, No 143 — Recount tally: Yes 147, No 142.

Article 4: Ballot Vote: Yes 105, No 194,

Article 5: Ballot Vote: Yes 235, No 58.

Article 6: Ballot Vote: Yes 204, No 57.

Article 7: Ballot Vote: Yes 90, No 178.

Article 8: Ballot Vote: Yes 238, No 60.

Article 9: The Town voted to accept \$8,498,80 in increased Municipal Highway Subsidy funds to be expended for reconstruction work on Longview Road.

Article 10: The Town raised \$1,106.05 to be supplemented by \$7,373.70 from the State for the Town Road Aid Program for this year.

Article 11: The Town raised \$6,500 for the purchase of a road grader.

Article 12: The Town voted a sum up to \$6,000 for the purchase of a new police cruiser and authorized the withdrawal of \$5,500 for this purpose from the Revenue Sharing account.

Article 13: The Town voted to appropriate the sum of \$3,381 for the Town's share of the repainting of the exterior of the Town Hall/Church and authorized the withdrawal of \$1,381 from the Revenue Sharing fund.

Article 14: The Town voted to appropriate the sum of \$5,000 to fund bicentennial events with the full expectation of replacement.

Article 15: The Town voted \$2,548 to support the services of the Monadnock Community Visiting Nurse Association, Inc.

Article 16: The Town voted to appropriate the sum of \$2,000 for the purchase of and reconditioning of one used road sander for the highway department.

Article 17: The Town voted NOT to initiate a pension plan for the Town emplovees.

Article 18: The Town voted to appropriate the sum of \$1,000 for the Library Improvement Reserve Fund.

Article 19: The Town voted to appoint a 5-member building committee to write final specifications and obtain quotations for the construction of an addition to the Town Highway Garage. The results of the recessed Town Meeting held June 29 authorized the Town to borrow up to \$65,000 to construct a new highway department garage and remodel the existing one.

Article 20: The Town voted NOT to become a member of the Southwestern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission.

Article 21: The Town voted to appropriate \$520 for the Monadnock Family Mental Health Service.

Article 22: The Town voted to appropriate \$254 for the support of the Monadnock Region Association.

Article 23: The Town voted to appropriate \$200 for the purchase of property for conservation by the Conservation Commission.

Article 24: The Town voted to have two sessions for the annual town meeting, the first session on a date specified by the State for choice of town officers and the other session to be on the following Saturday for transaction of other town business.

Article 25: The Town authorized the Selectmen to appoint a 3-member committee to oversee the landfill.

Article 26: The Town voted to designate as a scenic road Depot Street from the Kassarjian land to where the road is closed subject to gates and bars.

Article 27: The Town voted to discontinue the highway on tax map lot R-11-12 that runs northwesterly to lot R-11-7 (across Thelma Babbitt's property).

Article 28: The Town voted to rescind its action of the 1978 Town Meeting wherein "The part of Buswell Road formerly located between Tax Map Lots R-8-3 and 88 and Lot R-8-89" was discontinued and made subject to gates and bars.

Article 29: The Town voted to accept the names of the streets and roads as shown on the tax maps to be the official names of said streets and roads.

Article 30: The Town authorized the Selectmen to borrow in anticipation of taxes.

Article 31: The Town voted to accept the following Cemetery trust funds: Milton K. McLeod, Morris H. Tuttle, Alvah M. Wood and Frank A. Wood. Also, further funds were accepted for the Eustis Library Fund.

Article 32: The Town voted to accept the reports of the auditors and committees as printed in the Town Report.

Article 33: The Town voted to accept the following resolutions:

- (1) Be it resolved that the Governor and all State Legislators shall take notice of the vote of the residents of the Town of Hancock, in Town Meeting assembled and as notified in writing by the Selectmen to the effect that there should be no further reduction in any share of taxes returned by the State to the Town from taxes raised in the Town. Further to this resolution no new statutes shall be passed requiring expenditures of funds by the Town and School District without provision for funding from the State.
- (2) Resolved: The Town of Hancock hereby expresses its appreciation to Charles A. Gleason for serving as Water Commissioner for thirty-three years.
- (3) Resolved: The Town of Hancock wishes to thank Everett Adams for his service as Commons Commissioner. Everett has served Hancock in so many ways it is hard to imagine what the Town would be like without his efforts.

TOWN WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hancock in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Hancock on Tuesday, the 11th day of March next at 10 of the clock in the forenoon for ballot voting of Town Officers and all other matters requiring ballot vote; and, to meet at said Town Hall in said Hancock on Saturday, the 15th day of March next at one of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town is in favor of the adoption of the amendment to Article XII-B of the town zoning ordinance, as proposed by the Planning Board, pertaining to special exceptions to lot frontage requirements.
- 4. To see if the Town will accept and appropriate the sum of eleven thousand three hundred one dollars and sixty cents (\$11,301.60) in increased Municipal Highway Subsidy funds. This sum to be expended for reconstruction work on Longview Road, or take any other action relating thereto.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate and authorize withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 three thousand one hundred sixty-one dollars (\$3,161) for town office equipment and repairs and two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) for use as a setoff against budgeted appropriation for the Town Highway Maintenance, or take any other action relating thereto.
- 6. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate one thousand one hundred thirty-eight dollars and thirty-seven cents (\$1,138.37) to be supplemented by seven thousand five hundred eighty-nine dollars and sixteen cents (\$7,589.16) from the State for the Town Road Aid Program for this year, or take any other action relating thereto.
- 7. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate three thousand five hundred dollars (\$3,500) for the purchase of a chipper for the highway department, or take any other action relating thereto.
- 8. To see if the Town of Hancock, N.H. will raise and appropriate the sum of two thousand nine hundred eighty-one dollars (\$2,981) to support the services of the Monadnock Community Visiting Nurse Association, Inc. This local request for financial support is based on a \$2.20 per capita formula, or take any other action relating thereto.
 - $9.\ To\ see\ if\ the\ Town\ will\ raise\ and\ appropriate\ one\ thousand\ five\ hundred$

dollars (\$1,500) to defray the costs involved in planning the site and structure of a new fire house, or take any other action relating thereto.

- 10. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to join the Southwestern New-Hampshire Regional Planning Commission as provided for in New Hampshire RSA 36:45, and appropriate the sum of one thousand eighty-four dollars (\$1,084) as its membership assessment, or take any other action relating thereto.
- 11. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for the Library Improvement Reserve Fund. This sum to be allowed to accumulate from year to year or to be expended by the Library Trustees or to be added to by gifts of money, or take any other action relating thereto.
- 12. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate five hundred twenty dollars (\$520) to support the mental health program of the Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service, or take any other action relating thereto.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred seventy-one dollars (\$271) for the support of the Monadnock Region Association, or take any other action relating thereto. This sum is based on the formula of twenty cents per town resident according to the latest available census figures.
- 14. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200) for the purchase of property for conservation by the Conservation Commission. This sum to be allowed to accumulate from year to year or to be expended by the Commission, or take any other action relating thereto.
- 15. To see if the Town is in favor of having a genealogy of Hancock families compiled and published as a companion volume to the Second Hundred Years, or take any other action relating thereto.
- 16. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to appoint a Genealogy Committee and vote to appropriate the proceeds of the sales of the new town history the Second Hundred Years, The Prelude and the large maps for the use of the committee in preparing and publishing a genealogy of Hancock families as a companion volume to the Second Hundred Years, or take any other action relating thereto.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the short road between Longview and Shady Lane which divides the property belonging to Catherine L. Moore and Adella C. Eva, or take any other action relating thereto. (By petition)
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to designate as a scenic road under the provisions of RSA 253:17 the part of the King's Highway from the Old Dublin Road to the beginning of the hardtop at Hunt's Pond, or take any other action relating thereto. (By petition)
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to designate as a scenic road under the provisions of RSA 253:17 the Old Dublin Road starting at Main Street and continuing to the Harrisville line, or take any other action relating thereto. (By petition)

- 20. To see if the Town will vote to designate as a scenic road under the provisions of RSA 253:17 the Nelson Road starting at the Old Dublin Road and ending at Route 137, or take any other action relating thereto. (By petition)
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to prohibit the storage of radioactive materials and dumping of radioactive waste from nuclear power facilities within the town lines of Hancock, or take any other action relating thereto. (By petition)
- 22. To see if the Town will vote to prohibit the transportation of radioactive materials and radioactive waste from nuclear power facilities across Hancock town lines, or take any other action relating thereto. (By petition)
- 23. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, or take any other action relating thereto.
- 24. To see if the Town will accept gifts and legacies left in trust for the Town, or take any other action relating thereto.
- 25. To hear the reports of auditors and committees heretofore chosen or take any other action relating thereto.
 - 26. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT TO TOWNS REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND STATE FOREST FIRE SERVICE

Prevention and control of forest fires is handled through a cooperative effort between town/city fire organizations and the State Forest Fire Service.

Since 1903, when the first forest fire laws were passed by our Legislature, the State Forester has appointed someone in each municipality as a Forest Fire Warden and charged him with the responsibility of forest fire prevention and control within his town/city. This person may ask the State Forester to appoint as many Deputy Forest Fire Wardens as may be necessary to efficiently carry out his charge.

The State Forester has divided the State into ten forest fire districts with a full time District Forest Fire Chief in each district. The State organization is charged with assisting the municipal forest fire organization in any way possible.

State personnel conduct fire training schools, assist with forest fire suppression, fire cause investigation, prosecution of fire law violators and forest fire prevention programs. Forest fire suppression equipment is purchased through State bulk purchasing ability and sold to local forest fire organizations at one-half cost. Excess military property is obtained and turned over to town/city fire departments at no cost to local departments for conversion into fire suppression units. This cooperative arrangement between State and municipality has resulted in one of the best forest fire records in the United States with less than one-half acre of woodland burned in each fire reported.

HANCOCK ADVISORY COMMITTEE

During 1979, the committee held public hearings for the regular and the postponed Town Meetings. For the regular town meeting, all money articles were considered — 10 were recommended, 2 were not recommended. For the postponed meeting, which considered the construction of an additional building for the Highway Department, a hearing was held and the committee recommended approval as a result of careful analysis. The article passed and the building has been completed.

On request of the Selectmen, a review of Hancock's salary and wage scale was undertaken during the year. This review involved comparison with neighboring towns and other towns in the state. The report was turned over to the Selectmen in advance of budget reviews. Special credit is due members Heather Robinson and

Robert Lent.

Regular review of money items in the 1980 warrant has involved committee members, selectmen and town department people. Recommendations on these articles arising out of the hearing will be distributed to those attending Town Meeting.

THE 200th ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION OF THE TOWN OF HANCOCK, N.H.

Hancock's year-long observance of its 200th anniversary is over and we are pleased to review the happenings of the year just past.

The response and participation of all of you has been most gratifying to the Committee. The New Year's Eve buffet, concert and ball was a marvelous gala beginning to the year-long celebration. It has been a long time since a town event received such involvement by so many. The Sportsmens' Club assisted us with the snow-sculpture contest and the Committee presented a family film in January. The Harris Center directed a "Big Tree" contest and Arbor Day observance with enthusiastic Elementary School support, and the Con-Val High School Chamber Chorus came to Hancock for a joyous Sunday morning worship service in song. The silver ball sparkled again on dancers in the Town Hall, a Spring Cotillion with music by the new and talented "Middle Road Society" band, and the Girl Scouts directed a bicentennial balloon release the day after Memorial Day. John Smullen of the Elementary School addressed the card found the farthest distance away, in Concord, and was suitably rewarded.

The Women's Club, as a Bicentennial project, sponsored the restoration of the valuable Town Hall stage curtain by Virginia Gleason and it was duly displayed at the Cotillion. We are most appreciative for the rescue of a part of our heritage of native decorative art.

Hancock's 200th celebration continued with a Firemen's Muster July 4th at the old high school with the Auxiliary providing picnic fare for a day of family fun.

July 21st was a notable day at the Felch House and Harris Center. Memorabilia of several generations of Hancock families still in residence was displayed and talked of, and walks were conducted to historic places of interest in Hancock's growing. The Historical Society assisted greatly with this event along with Harris Center staff and Committee members.

The completed town history, "The Second Hundred Years" was officially presented to the town and went on sale. The day's festivities concluded with a concert of Monadnock Music that evening at the church.

July 28th, a Farm Fair was held at the Peabody Farm in conjunction with the bicentennial year; and August brought the 100th celebration of Old Home Days directed by the 1979 Old Home Day committee. The Bicentennial Committee was a part of the festivities, offering contemporary souvenirs of this birthday and showing mementoes and photographs of the celebration so far, and of celebrations of years past of the town. The winning ticket on the gold commemorative medal was drawn and it is now owned by Phillip M. Way, a resident of Hancock.

On September 28th, "Speak to the Earth", a slide-tape presentation of Man and Nature in the Grand Monadnock, was presented in the church and the audience visited and heard about areas in Hancock and the Monadnock Region. Special organ and piano music preceded the program and a Vestry reception followed.

October 12th was the Hancock Community Chorus Concert of semi-classical, contemporary, sacred and patriotic music, following the tradition of a community chorus that performed in town several decades ago.

Hancock has a number of talented craftspeople and they offered their products and gifts at a Bicentennial Bazaar in the Vestry in November. Also participating were the Committee, Girl Scouts, the Preschool Parents, the Hancock Depot Association and the Church Ladies Sewing Circle, with a satisfying response from the Christmas-shopping public.

Sunday afternoon, November 4th, was the official observance of the town's founding, a program which followed as closely as possible the celebration 100 years ago. Guest speakers were eminent historians and scholars Dr. Duane Squires, Elting Morison, and Walter Peterson, each addressing an aspect of Hancock's history in relation to the town, state and nation; Rev. Lloyd Yeagle repeated the Centennial address of 100 years ago and Town Clerk Howard H. Rogers read the town charter, as did his predecessor at that 1879 observance. The Community Chorus presented several anthems and the Women's Club hosted a reception to conclude the afternoon's events.

Another Bicentennial gift to the town was formally presented and dedicated in November at a morning church service, a lovely Yamaha Studio Grand Piano made possible by donations from private citizens and different functions of the

past year.

The Hancock Bicentennial year closed with the traditional Christmas Eve service in the church, a pageant this year which portrayed the birth of all the traditions and carols now a familiar part of our Christmas, up to and including the town Christmas tree. It was written and directed by Eleanor H. Amidon and a great many townspeople and children participated in the cast. Small lighted candles streamed from the church and down Main Street and spread throughout the village as people wended homeward, ending the 200th year, but promising another splendid 100 years to come.

There is a wealth of photographs and text assembled this past year, and in conclusion, we suggest a commemorative publication of Hancock's Bicentennial year would be an unusual project and most desirous. In researching both for the new town history and past town celebrations a great lack of information was evident.

The Committee is most grateful to the citizens of Hancock who so generously participated in our celebration; those previously mentioned organizations and individuals who have freely given their talents and time; to Nancy Adams and Nancy Hill, the designers of the Hancock Commemorative medal; Bob Danielsen, the designer of the layout and lettering of the T-shirts and license plates; and all of you who supported our efforts.

This truly was a fitting celebration of Hancock's first 200 years and a worthy

prelude to its next century.

REPORT OF THE HISTORY COMMITTEE

Hancock's bicentennial year saw the completion of a long-awaited history, The Second Hundred Years of Hancock, New Hampshire.

On a warm July day the book was presented to the town. The ceremony took place as part of a bicentennial open house and display of treasured articles from Hancock's past, held at the home of Eleanor Briggs. Richard Kerwin, co-chairman with Eleanor Amidon of the Bicentennial Committee, acted as master-of-ceremonies and distributed complimentary copies to all who had had a part in researching, writing, or both, as well as to the Hancock Town Library, the Selectmen and the Hancock Historical Society. Copies were also sent to the State Library and the New Hampshire Historical Society.

The book has sold well and received good reviews. At the bicentennial observance of the granting of the town charter by the state legislature, the well-known New Hampshire historian, J. Duane Squires, said that he had read every word of the new history and found it excellent.

From the first committee that started collecting material nearly a half century ago, members have included in their plans an updating of the genealogy, a most valuable part of Hayward's History of Hancock published in 1889. Special forms were printed. The 1938 committee left specific details stating which families, in their opinion, should be eligible. These were those in Hayward's volume whose descendants are still in the area, or have retained an interest in the town, and any others who have been residents of Hancock for at least five years and wish to be included.

The members of the history committee feel that a new genealogy, sister volume to the Second Hundred Years, could be handled in the same way in which the first one was done in 1889. That is, someone in each family could research his or her family tree and turn the results over to the committee for compilation. Short biographies, anecdotes and photographs could accompany each family story. We are fortunate that Sheilia Adams and Sarah (Weston) Hutchins, interested and capable members of two of Hancock's oldest families, have volunteered to compile the proposed genealogy. This book as it's being planned is not just a collection of family trees but would also include short and interesting biographies of the people involved in the life of the town.

One of the committee's greatest difficulties in writing the story of Hancock's second century was the problem of trying to include as many as possible of the people who have been a part of the town over a hundred year period and still keep the book within the four hundred page limit which had been planned. No one of the history's readers could be more aware of the book's deficiencies in this respect than the many who had a part in writing it. It has been our hope that the genealogy may serve to tell the stories of the people who lived here, filling in the gaps where individuals, either by unintentional oversight, lack of information or lack of space, were slighted or omitted in the 1979 volume.

It has been suggested that the townspeople may not be interested in a genealogy, and that the taxpayers should have a chance to decide whether or not they want this work begun. The Committee agrees. This will be a long and time-consuming project to complete. It will cost money to publish. We have, therefore, added two articles to this year's warrant. The first gives the town meeting an opportunity to vote on whether or not a history of Hancock's individual families should be written.

The second asks that if the vote for a genealogy is favorable any further money realized from the sale of the 1976 and the 1979 publications and the large maps be returned to the History Fund to gather interest and help defray the expense of publishing the second volume.

It was because of the foresight of Hancock citizens over a long period of time that the money was put away each year to accumulate interest under the watchful guidance of the Trustees of Trust Funds. When the time came to pay the publishers of the history, the accrued funds were enough to defray the entire cost of publication, even in a year of high inflation. If the Committee had had to go to the town meeting and ask for a sum of \$16,000, the history might not yet be printed. In some towns not too far from Hancock town histories have been written but are still waiting to be published because the towns have not been willing to vote the necessary funds. The money to have Hayward's History of Hancock printed in 1889 came from a group of dedicated private citizens. The town records indicate that they petitioned the town year after year to buy the unsold volumes and pay back what had been loaned.

Once again the Committee says, "Thank you," to all who spent so many hours researching, writing, photographing and advising. Without their efforts the book could not have been completed.

A special word of appreciation is also due the many who have purchased the history and have told of reading it with pleasure and recommending it to others. We thank you all.

CONSERVATION COMMISSION

A major issue handled by the Conservation Commission this year revolved around a study of the suggested cuttting of timber on town lands, proceeds bringing additional revenue to the town. The Commission, as guardian of these lands, analyzed them in relation to factors such as size of the area, accessibility, intent of the donor, quality of usable timber, and effect on natural beauty and natural balance involving the disruption of wildlife habitats. All Conservation lands with the exception of Juggernaut Pond were noted to be left untouched. The town water supply should be clear or clear to the prescribed distance from its banks, indicating the need for future study.

In conjunction with a state directive, the Commission has agreed to sponsor a booklet by Tom and Olive Rhines and Meade Cadot on Hancock's fauna and flora and to include maps, etc....

Review, inspection, and photographic study were made of the completed Moose Brook Dam site in addition to the setting out of some twenty duck box habitats by Tony Brown and the planting of young pine trees beside the new tennis court by George Lohmiller.

Commission members conducted the annual May litter clean-up day, continued the maintenance of the Moose Brook Park as a picnic area; sponsored two youths, Brad Fay and Russell Floren, to Camp Interlocken; treated unsuccessfully two Elm trees for Dutch Elm disease.

BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT

The following information is provided to make Board procedures more understandable to the general public and particularly to those who may make appeals. By law, the responsibility for correct preparation of the application and presenta-

tion at the public hearing rests with the applicant.

The Board of Adjustment is one of four functions required in a system of zoning. The Planning Board has the primary responsibility for proposing the ordinance and any amendments. The Town Voters, at the annual Town Meeting, enact and amend the zoning ordinance. The Selectmen, through the Building Inspector, enforce the ordinance. The Board of Adjustment hears appeals and administers special provisions of the ordinance. Each of these components has its own functions and may not perform those of any other group. As an example, the Board of Adjustment may not do anything which would have the effect of changing or amending the ordinance.

Most of the work done by the Board of Adjustment consists of hearing two types of appeals. The first type is the Exception. When the ordinance specifically provides for Exceptions, the Board must decide if they apply in a particular situation and if so, assure that provisions made by the voters are applied. Only the voters can establish Exceptions and related conditions. As an example, the Town permits light industry in the rural and agricultural zone under special conditions.

The other type of appeal is a Variance which is a relaxation of the strict interpretation of the ordinance if certain conditions are present. These conditions are quite specific but do not allow for Board judgement. In exercising this judgement, however, the Board must be particularly careful not to violate the

spirit and intent of the ordinance.

State law determines the manner in which appeals are to be handled and also provides guidelines for all Board action. Townspeople wishing to make either type of appeal should become acquainted with these rules and with the ordinance before applying. Board members are always willing to discuss these matters prior to any formal application and to supply relevant information. Once formal application is made, however, the Board must balance the request of the applicant with the wishes of the voters as expressed by the zoning ordinance.

TOWN LIBRARY TRUSTEES REPORT

In 1979 the trustees continued the regular monthly meetings which are held jointly with the staff to conduct all library business.

Our library is affiliated with the Statewide Library Development Program which affords many privileges including access to all State Library facilities in Concord, service of the Bookmobile and the right to issue and honor State Library Cards. Such affiliation requires that we meet statewide guide lines with a frequent review and revision of our Policy Statement. We did this in 1979 and the noteworthy revision was the establishment of the Hancock Town Library Memorial Fund. At present there are eighteen separate trust funds for the benefit of the library and it has seemed wise to consolidate future memorial gifts of relatively small amounts into one general fund to simplify accounting and improve efficiency. Accordingly, gifts of less than \$500 will be handled in this way, a careful and permanent record will be kept of the donors and the trustees will use this money for library purposes of enduring value. It is hoped that more people will take advantage of this ''living memorial'' method of remembering a loved one.

The trustees have a long range plan for the expansion of our library when the demand is sufficient and the money available. With this in mind they stress the importance of constantly increasing the Library Improvement Reserve Fund by small increments each year. In the meantime the trustees are endeavoring to keep informed regarding the constantly expanding requirements of bureaucratic rules and regulations for public buildings. Recently these regulations have emphasized the elimination of barriers to the handicapped and this year the trustees have revised the proposed expansion plan in order to comply with the new regulations. Included in the new plan is a ramp for wheelchairs, improved access to vestibule and toilet, also, at some future time, an elevator connecting the basement with the second floor.

The storage room in the basement which was improved in 1977 by the installation of a new concrete floor is being used as the repository for the 1,200 volumes of the new Town History, "The Second Hundred Years". We were pleased to provide this convenient arrangement for the History Committee.

Another much appreciated improvement is the large underground oil tank which was acquired in 1976. This was filled to capacity in the spring at a considerable saving compared to the later price of fuel oil. In December of this year we installed an additional 6-inch layer of fiberglass insulation over the entire ceiling. This will help our oil consumption and improve the comfort in hot weather. We are constantly aware that the old steam boiler in the basement is near the end of its useful life and may fail at any time. We are hopeful that our small savings account will ease the burden when the time comes for replacement.

Gifts of books or money are always welcome and gratifying. This year there were several of these items, chief among them was the memorial to Mrs. M. Louise Stearns and the continued generosity of the Jensen Foundation. In this era of spiralling inflation the Hancock Town Library is fortunate to have the resource of a considerable trust fund income. This is helpful in our efforts to maintain the usual good service with minimal expense to the Town.

Again this year our popular and efficient staff remains unchanged and faithful. The trustees have noted a marked increase in the book circulation for 1979 which is an indication that the library is improving its service to the community.

In the display case the librarians have arranged for a varied showing of interesting exhibits.

On Old Home Day we had our annual sale of old and discarded books and since then have also sold books from the table in the vestibule, making a total in all of \$270.75. These collections are used for the purchase of new books for adults and children.

The library is very grateful for the many gifts of excellent books and magazines from our patrons, and particularly for the books given for the sale on Old Home Day which made the sale so successful. We have also received a fine gift of fifteen excellent jigsaw puzzles which have circulated widely.

Story hours are well attended when the children come to the library with their teachers. Harriet Hampson reads to the preschoolers, and Doris Rogers and Harriet share the story hours with the grade school children.

We are very pleased that Frances Russ, a former library trustee, has agreed to prepare a news item for publication at various times regarding library items such as visits of the Bookmobile, new adult and children's books which have been acquired, and any other items of special interest to our library patrons.

COMMON COMMISSION REPORT

The Common Commission, consisting of Paul Trook, Russell Meikle and Merton Knowles, have completed the year 1979, doing the best they could to keep the town properties looking well-groomed and in good condition. The grounds around the common, church, vestry, fountain, and horse sheds have been kept mowed and trimmed. We have repaired the bandstand many times due to the vandalism that has taken place there.

The town flag pole has been painted and a new rope has been installed. Last spring we asked for contributions for a new town flag. The total amount received was \$229.70. The Commission bought a new acrylic flag, size 10x15, from the Jutras Sign and Flag Center for \$135.00, including two vinyl covered snaps (for \$5.30). We

now have on hand \$88.70 to go towards any flag needed in the future.

The fountain was cleaned and painted. In November the top was broken and the parts found along Main Street. We are having it welded. Two picnic tables have been repaired and painted. These will have to be replaced in the near future, due to rotting and hard usage.

The Common Commission has at its disposal about \$500.00 a year, which is used for lumber, paint, gas and oil for lawn mowers, also the employment of some of the

town boys at odd jobs around the common lands.

Town equipment consists of a Wheel Horse tractor, two old hand mowers and one new one. The Wheel Horse tractor and the new hand mower are in workable condition as of the present time. We do not use the two old mowers. May I say here that all work done by this committee was on a voluntary basis, and many thanks go to Russell Meikle and Paul Trook for their help over the past year.
