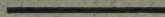

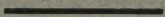

## Warrant for Annual Town Meeting.

### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

{ L. S. } *To the inhabitants of the town of Lebanon, qualified to vote in town affairs:—*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said town, on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

*First.* To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

*Second.* To choose three Selectmen, Overseer of the Poor, Collector of Taxes, Highway Agent, and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

*Third.* To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

*Fourth.* To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to repair highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

*Fifth.* To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the construction and repair of sewers and sidewalks for the ensuing year.

*Sixth.* To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the improvement of the cemeteries of the town, or act thereon.

*Seventh.* To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the proper observance of Memorial Day, or act thereon.

*Eighth.* To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three hundred dollars to provide a free bed at the Mary Hitchcock Memorial Hospital for the ensuing year, or act thereon.

*Ninth.* To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of the Lebanon Public Library, or act thereon.

*Tenth.* To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise towards defraying the expenses of publishing a catalogue of the Lebanon Public Library, and pass any vote relating thereto.

*Eleventh.* To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to purchase and erect signs with the names of the streets thereon, in the villages of Lebanon, and pass any vote relating thereto.

*Twelfth.* To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of brass bands, or act thereon.

*Thirteenth.* To see if the town will vote to adopt Chapter 29 of Session Laws of New Hampshire, passed in 1899, as the method of repairing highways in said town, and pass any vote necessary to carry out the provisions of said act, or act thereon.

*Fourteenth.* To see if the town will vote to accept as a gift from the Ladies' Piano Association, the piano, now in the Town Hall, with the provision that all local societies shall have the use of the same, free of charge.

*Fifteenth.* To determine the division of the School money.

*Sixteenth.* To hear the report of the Auditors and the town School Board.

*Seventeenth.* To see what action the town will take to enable it to secure the benefits of the provisions of, "An act to provide for State Aid, and for the permanent improvement of main highways throughout the State." Approved, February 24th, 1905, or act thereon.

*Eighteenth.* To see if the town will vote to appropriate a sum not exceeding one hundred dollars, for the purchase of crockery and tables for use in the Court Room, or act thereon.

SELECTMEN OF LEBANON,

DEAR SIRS:

At the annual meeting of the Lebanon Center Village Fire Precinct for 1904, the following by-laws were adopted: "That the Firewards and two others to be chosen by this meeting, be, and are hereby constituted a committee, and are instructed to immediately make an inspection of all buildings enumerated in SECTION I, Chapter 116, of the Public Statutes of New Hampshire, that are situated in the Lebanon Center Village Fire Precinct, and where any of said buildings are not provided with reasonably safe and adequate means of escape for the occupants, in case of fire, said Committee shall at once order the owner, owners or managers of said building to provide said building with ample, safe and adequate external means of exit for the occupants thereof in case of fire, and shall prescribe the time and manner in which such changes and additions shall be made.

SECTION I of Chap. 116 P. S., is as follows: "Towns and Village districts may make by-laws requiring factories, hotels, tenement houses,



public halls, schoolhouses and other buildings used as places of public resort in their towns, to be provided with ample means of escape in case of fire, and adequate facilities for entrances and exit on all occasions, and be so erected as not to endanger the health and safety of persons who may occupy them; and they may provide thereby for the inspection of such buildings."

In accordance with said vote, E. Findley Phelps and Edwin P. Hyde, were elected with the Firewards as such Committee of Inspectors.

Said Committee have made inspection as above directed, of a building, managed by you, known as the Town Hall, situated on North Park Street, and have decided that the safety of the occupants require that additional means of escape should be provided in case of fire. The Committee would appoint the 7th day of May, at 1 o'clock in afternoon, on premises, at which time we will confer with you on any changes that may be proposed or ordered. If you cannot meet us on that date we will try and arrange upon a date that will be satisfactory.

Number of deaths, males 42, females 30; total 72. Ages between 70 and 80, 11; between 80 and 90, 10; over 90, 1. Diseases: Consumption, 2; Pneumonia, 8; Cancer, 3; Heart Diseases, 12; Old Age, 12; Brights and other kidney diseases, 8; Accidents, 2, by falling and drowning; No deaths by what are classed as contagious diseases, Small Pox, Diphtheria, Membraneous Croup, Scarlet Fever, Typhoid Fever and Measles.

The precinct water has given the public some anxiety but in spite of all that has been said against it the town has been unusually free from Typhoid Fever and other so-called "water bred" diseases. We would urge upon all, the necessity for cleanliness about the premises, allowing no animal or vegetable matter to accumulate and decay to become a source of danger to health.

### Memoranda of Small Pox Outbreak 1904.

On Jan. 24, 1904, Guy A. Cutting was found to be a victim of small pox at Sargent's Hotel, West Lebanon. On the same day he and his wife were isolated and quarantine established. They were released some time during the month of February following. On April 28, Miss Lina Urquhort and Robert Stevens were placed in quarantine with the same disease and Miss Dutcher of Concord, a graduate nurse was secured to care for them. On May 8, Ed. Manley was added to the list, he having come down with the disease. May 14, Miss Urquhort and the nurse were released. May 22, Ed. Manley was released and May 24 Robert Stevens was released. May 13, Ed. Manley's family (5 persons) were placed in quarantine at their home and were released May 28. On June

5 it was discovered that Ethel Woods, Everett Woods and Mabel Woods had small pox and they were accordingly quarantined with the remainder of Chas. Wood's family (9 persons). Two days later Chas. Woods came down with the disease. On June 19 while intoxicated Wm. Bishop entered the house where Chas. Woods and his family were quarantined. The following day he was apprehended and placed in quarantine with the Wood's family. On the night of June 29 Wm. Bishop broke quarantine and up to the present time his whereabouts are unknown. The boards of health of adjoining towns and of other towns where it was thought he might have gone were notified of his escape. July 2 three of the members of Chas. Wood's family were released and July 9 the remaining 6 members were allowed to go.

Total number of cases 8; whole number in quarantine 21.

### The Report of the Superintendent of Glenwood and the Village Cemeteries.

The season of 1894 was the first summer which a man was employed all the time. The cemeteries to-day are not what the Committee would like to have them. Those who have followed the work can appreciate something of the work that has been done. At that time the best lots sold for only \$10, and people would pay \$100 for lots in private cemeteries in preference to buying them. For the season of 1894, there was collected \$62.58 for the care of lots. For the season of 1904, there has been collected over \$200; and there is about \$50 due that can be collected later. In Glenwood Cemetery, we cared for about five times as many lots as we did in 1894. The coming season there should be new fence built in the Village, Glenwood, Old Pine and the South Cemetery. The East Lebanon Cemetery should have a thorough cleaning up.

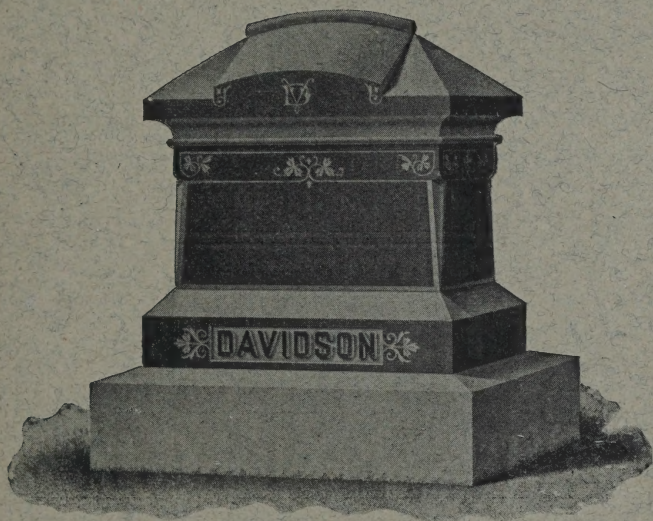
