TOWN MEETING WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lisbon, in the County of Grafton, and the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Lisbon on Tuesday the 10th day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, at which time the polls shall be open and shall not close earlier than nine o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects, all articles except Article 1 to be considered at seven-thirty o'clock in the afternoon:

Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To hear reports of agents, auditors, and special committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote in relation thereto.

Article 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges, the same being: Town Officers' Salaries, Town Officers' Expenses, Election and Registration expenses, Expense of Town Hall, and other town buildings, and make appropriation for the same.

Article 4. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Police Department for the ensuing year, including \$3,500.00 for a day policeman the year round.

Article 5. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for fire protection for the ensuing year, including \$600.00 for the Sugar Hill Fire Department.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the Pine Blister Rust Control.

Article 7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Insurance for the ensuing year.

Article 8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the protection of health including the Health Officer's salary and expenses, and a sum of money to be equally divided between the Littleton Hospital and the Woodsville Hospital.

Article 9. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Lisbon District Nursing Association.

Article 10. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Vital Statistics for the ensuing year.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the purpose of maintaining the Sugar Hill Dump. The Selectmen to administer and be in charge of the funds so raised.

Article 12. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to plow the town roads, and if so, to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,500.00 to light the streets in the Town of Lisbon under the same conditions as they were heretofore lighted, said streets to be lighted with electricity.

Article 15. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to oil such roads in the Town as are already oiled, and to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Article 16. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Libraries in addition to what is required by law, and to determine how same shall be divided.

Article 17. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Town Poor.

Article 18. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Age Assistance.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the proper observance of Memorial Day.

Article 20. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the community Skating Rink.

Article 21. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the cemeteries in the Town of Lisbon.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$424.31 to the White Mountain Region Association for the purpose of advertising the Town of Lisbon, being 10¢ per thousand of the assessed valuation.

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$800.00 to defray the Town's share of the Federal Social Security Act.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as they deem necessary in anticipation of taxes, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for interest on short term and long term notes.

Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to accept Town Road Aid and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,168.46.

Article 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to continue the repairing of the Storage Shed.

Article 27. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for the purpose of paying the Grader note due this year.

Article 28. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the purpose of paying the Loader note due this year.

Article 29. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$700.00 to continue the re-building of the sidewalk on Sugar Hill.

Article 30. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to purchase a new truck, and to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Article 31. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,255.00 for the payment on the bridge bonds,—comprising the interest which will be due August 1, 1959; and the bond payment of \$5,000.00 and the interest which will be due February 1, 1960.

Article 32. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 to continue improvement of the Blake Road.

Article 33. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to repair the bulldozer.

Article 34. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the portion of the Crane Hill Road from the property of Henry C. Burt to the property of Seldon Hannah, formerly known as the Kenneth Murray place.

Article 35. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

You Can Help Prevent Forest Fires

Twenty-five percent of all forest fires in New Hampshire are caused from careless debris burning—brush, paper, leaves, grass, etc. Most of them are started without the required permit from the local forest fire warden. The cost of extinguishing these fires annually runs into large sums of money.

According to law, responsible parties must pay the cost of putting them out. In addition, violators may be subject to court prosecution with fines running as high as (\$200) two hundred dollars.

In the interest of fire prevention why not eliminate burning at home? Use your town dump. It has been set up for your personal convenience. It provides a suitable place for the disposal of dangerous inflammable waste material and other useless items which accumulate around the home and local stores; brush, etc., cut on your property. Eliminate the hazard of burning yourself. It will be easier for you—personally and financially.

If, however, you do burn on your premises:

1. Secure a permit from your local forest fire warden—the law requires it.
2. Be sure to properly supervise your burning. Don't leave it.
3. Make certain your fire is DEAD OUT before leaving it.

*Save yourself much possible difficulty.
