The State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the town of Milton in the County of Strafford in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said town on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers.
2. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairing highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Trunk Line and State Aid Highways in said town and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.
4. To see what method the town will vote to adopt for breaking roads the coming winter, raise and appropriate a sum of money not exceeding four thousand dollars (\$4,000) to pay for the same and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.
5. To see if the town will vote to raise or appropriate a sum of money, not to exceed three hundred dollars, to receive an appropriation from the State, the joint sum to be expended on the road leading from Farmington to Middleton in said town.
6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money necessary to secure State Aid for the permanent improvement of highways under the

provisions of Chapter 35, laws of 1905, and amendments thereto, the joint sum to be expended on the highway leading from Milton Village, past the Nute High School, to Farmington town line.

7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise or appropriate for Maintenance of the Fire Department for the ensuing year and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of street lights the ensuing year.

9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay note and interest.

10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not exceeding two hundred dollars (\$200) for Memorial Day expenses.

11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed three hundred dollars (\$300) for the benefit of the Free Public Library at Milton Mills and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

12. By petition of Allie J. Laskey and nine others: To see if the town will vote to discontinue the highway leading from east side highway at a point near the Town Farm Hill to a point opposite the south-easterly side line of land of Emma F. Hunt Estate.

13. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire on notes of the town a sum of money necessary for the current expenses in anticipation of taxes of 1931 and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay town expenses and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for improvements and maintenance of its Parks and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

16. To see if the town will vote to purchase one or both of the Traffic Signals now located in the two villages, raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed six hundred dollars (\$600) to pay for and maintain the same, and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

17. By petition of Moses G. Chamberlain and nine others: To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed seven hundred dollars (\$700) to purchase and install a Fire Siren and pass any other vote relative thereto.

18. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

To the School Board of Milton:

I have the honor to submit to you, and through you to the citizens of the town, my twelfth annual report as superintendent of the schools of Milton. It is followed by the report of the headmaster of Nute High School and the report of the school nurse.

Comparing this table with that in my last report, it will be seen that our per cent of attendance has been

raised from 93.52 to 96.30. The average of the state was 95.50. Our record in this respect is very creditable. However, there was an unfortunate increase in the number of instances of tardiness. I urge the assistance of parents in correcting this fault.

Miss Laura H. Williams, who had served faithfully and efficiently in the Primary School at Milton for twenty-three years, decided to retire at the close of the year last June. We were sorry to lose this faithful teacher. I am sure that the best wishes of all citizens in the community go with her to her well-earned vacation from the duties of the schoolroom.

Miss Williams is succeeded by Mrs. Ethelyn Bickford, a graduate of Plymouth Normal School.

Miss Lover also withdrew from school work at the close of last year. She is succeeded by Miss Marion J. Atwood, a graduate of Keene Normal School.

At Milton Mills Mrs. Manora T. Clayton has taken the place of Mrs. Thurston, who has moved from town. Mrs. Clayton is a graduate of Salem Normal School with years of successful experience.

By vote of the last annual meeting of the District, the union school district at South Milton was dissolved. The pupils of that locality are being transported to the village schools at a cost of less than one-half what it cost the District to run the South Milton School last year.

It will be necessary to dispose of the school property at South Milton; but, owing to the present condition of the real estate market, it would seem best not to place this property on sale at this time.

The wisdom of deepening the well at Milton was fully demonstrated during the long drought last fall. If we had been dependent upon the water supply of former years, we should have been seriously troubled. With the abundant supply of the new well we can feel confident of no further embarrassment from the lack of water in this building.

During the past summer, the building at Nute Ridge has been thoroughly renovated. A new chimney has been built and a jacketed heater has been installed. The windows have been equipped with metal weather-strips. The furniture has been refinished. The building is now in excellent condition.

REPORT OF HEADMASTER OF NUTE HIGH SCHOOL

*To the Superintendent of Schools and the Members of
the Board of Trustees:*

The school year opened September 2 with an enrollment of seventy-one. Seven registered later and five have withdrawn making the present enrollment seventy-three. We now have twenty-five tuition pupils. The enrollment by classes is as follows: twelve seniors, twenty-one juniors, seventeen sophomores, and twenty-three freshmen.

The addition of two new typewriters, a mimeograph, and a duplicator keeps our commercial equipment up-to-date.

A blanket tax of twenty-five cents a month to support the different extra-curricular activities has been instituted. This tax is collected and banked under the supervision of the commercial department giving experience to the members of that department in keeping an accurate and business like record of all transactions.

The general business course has been broadened by the introduction of general mathematics and the addition of Latin as an elective.

New books have been purchased to replace old and obsolete books and reference books have been added where the state requirements have made it necessary.

The attendance has been very good in spite of the bad storms and poor roads.
