

The Selectmen submit the following report of work done by them in regard to Bridges and other improvements for the year ending, Feb. 13, 1909.

We have placed two new Steel Bridges across the North Branch, one jointly with the city of Keene. It was placed there by the United Construction Co. at a cost of \$437.00; City of Keene paying one-half.

The other was constructed for and placed on the abutments by the Canton Bridge Co. at a cost of \$470.00.

We have placed Guide-boards at nearly every junction of roads in town.

You are hereby notified to meet at the town hall in said town on the second Tuesday of March next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- I—To choose by ballot a town clerk.
- 2—To hear the report of the selectmen or officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
