

SCHOOL REPORT

FOR THE YEAR ENDING FEBRUARY 15, 1898.

To determine the number of schools to be maintained during the year, and to provide suitable teachers for the same, so that the pupils of the district may receive the best school advantages possible for the money expended; is the most difficult part of the duties required of the school board.

We do not expect to perform this work satisfactory to all; often we are not able to satisfy ourselves. Yet we should be very glad to devise some plan whereby all of the schools could be brought to the standard of excellence attained by a few. In the main, the school work during the past year has been very successful, and the advancement made creditable alike to both teachers and pupils.

We wish to call attention to the decrease in the literary fund received from the state. We now receive less than one half the amount received three years ago, and there seems to be no prospect of an increase in the near future; this loss has in part been made good by an increase in the amount required to be raised by law. Should we continue the present arrangement of our schools, a small sum in addition to this amount will be required if the thirty weeks of schooling is to be maintained.

Considering the high, and yearly increasing rate of taxes, your committee feel that possibly some change from the present system could be made, which would result in reducing the cost of maintaining our schools, and possibly equally as good results be obtained.

Any radical change from the present system should be carefully considered, and voted upon at the annual school meeting.

Not being able to give the full list, the roll of honor is omitted and the table of statistics also.
