ALTON TOWN WARRANT

State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Alton, in the County of Belknap, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, the seventh day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following articles:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year and to elect a Selectman for three years, one Library Trustee for three years, one Water Commissioner for three years, one Fire Ward for three years, one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years.
- 2. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay all necessary charges of the Town for the ensuing year.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$40,000.00 to be set aside in a Capital Reserve Fund toward the anticipated cost of the Sewerage system.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to be set aside in a reserve fund toward the purchase of a new fire truck.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,500.00 to rebuild the foundation, install a new cement floor and make other alterations as specified, to the Alton Bay Fire Station. Bids will be required and specifications met before payment is made. Supervision of this project to be under the direction and authority of the Fire Wards and the Board of Selectmen.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,000.00 to rebuild and resurface with Tarvia the Town gravel roads so—called, this sum to be raised by taxation.
- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs of highways and bridges for the ensuing year in addition to that required by law.

- 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the removal of snow from the Town highways for the ensuing year.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,800.00 for the purchase of Tarvia and the application of the same.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,667.51 provided the State will contribute the sum of \$11,116.70 for Class V roads, so-called.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,200.00 for the purchase of a small bucket loader and mower to be paid out of Highway Subsidy reim—bursement from the State of New Hampshire.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Select—men to borrow monies in anticipation of Taxes.
- 13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Public Library.
- 14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the decoration of Soldiers' graves.
- 15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for patriotic exercises on Independence Day.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,400.00 for Parks and Playgrounds, including band concerts.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,100.00 for the control of Dutch Elm Disease and Gypsy Moth.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to be expended under State supervision for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Civil Defense.

- 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the support of the Lakes Region General Hospital at Laconia, New Hampshire. (by request)
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the support of the Huggins Hospital at Wolfeboro, New Hampshire. (by request)
- 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,200.00 to the Alton-Alton Bay Chamber of Commerce for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town.
- 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$999.25, which is 1/100th of 1% of the assessed valuation of the Town, to the Lakes Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town. (by request)
- 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,064.00 for the support of the Lakes Region Planning Commission. (by request)
- 25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the support of the New Hampshire Humane Society. (by request)
- 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the purpose of adding to the Conservation Fund as authorized under the enabling Act RSA 36-A, Section 5. (by request)
- 27. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,260.00 for the purchase of a police cruiser.
- 28. To see if the Town will vote to transfer the sum of \$1,000.00 from the Cemetery Savings Bank Account to the Municipal Improvement Fund.
- 29. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,615.00 for the Town's share in support of the Public Health Nursing Association. (by request)
- 30. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell any property acquired by tax title.
- 31. To see if the Town will vote to take the sense of the

qualified voters whether the amendments of the Constitution proposed by the 1971 Session of the General Court shall be approved. (by ballot)

- 32. To see if the Town will vote to establish a three-member Refuse Disposal Planning Committee with duties as set forth in Section 1-5, Chapter 53-B, New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, to study the advisability of establishing a regional refuse disposal district, and in addition, to participate with the Lakes Region Planning Commission in the development of a Regional Disposal Plan. The Committee shall report its findings and recommendations to the Board of Selectmen for action by the 1973 Town Meeting. (by request)
- 33. To see if the Town will vote to designate the Powder Mill Road, so-called, starting at the Junction of the Old Wolfeboro Road to the New Durham Town line, a Scenic Highway, as set forth in New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated 253-17. (by request)
- 34. To see if the Town will vote to approve a quit claim deed from the Town to the Rochester First Federal Savings and Loan Association of any interest the Town may have in the property acquired by deed of Raymond C. Duncan, Tax Collector, dated October 27, 1969 and recorded in the Belknap County Registry of Deeds, Book No. 530, Page 340. (James L. and Muriel Cordoro) upon payment to the Town by said bank of all unpaid taxes, interest and cost, including reimbursement of the fees to Town counsel.
- 35. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a Committee of three to work with the Planning Board to develop plans for the future utilization of the Town Hall.
- 36. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the amendments to the Alton Zoning Ordinance proposed by the Planning Board. (This Article is to be voted by printed ballots used for Town Officers and not at the Town Meeting See ballot for form.)
- 37. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers hereinbefore mentioned chosen and to pass any vote relative thereto.

38. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE ZONING ORDINANCE

Section 226 Planned Unit Development

- a. Planned unit developments are permitted in the Rural (RU) zone only.
- b. The purpose of Planned Unit Development shall be to encourage a development which will result in:
 - A choice in the types of environment and living units available to the public and quality in both non-residential and residential land uses so that development will be a permanent and longterm asset to the town.
 - 2. Open space and recreation areas.
 - 3. A pattern of development which preserves trees, outstanding natural topography and geologic features and prevents soil erosion.
 - 4. An efficient use of land resulting in smaller networks of utilities and streets.
 - 5. A more desirable environment than would be possible through the strict applications of other sections of the ordinance.
- c. The area of the land to be developed shall not be less than 50 acres.
- d. The total number of dwelling units in a planned unit development may not exceed a density of one family per acre of land. Lot size, width, front yard depth, and side yard requirements may be waived; however, these waivers will be evaluated by the Planning Board and Board of Adjustment on their individual merit.
- e. Proposals for Planned Unit Development shall be submitted to the Planning Board who shall submit copies to the Zoning Board of Adjustment and the Board of Selectmen. The Planning Board and the Board of Selectmen shall, within 70 days of date of submittal, give their recommendation for approval or

disapproval to the Board of Adjustment. The Board The Board of Adjustment shall, within 90 days of the date of submittal, inform the applicant of the approval or disapproval of the project.

The material accompanying the proposal shall contain site plans showing all buildings, parking areas, signs and landscaping at a scale sufficient to permit the study of all elements of the plan. All utilities shall, also, be shown and described. Typical elevations and floor plans of all buildings may, also, be required. However, elevations for all signs shall be provided. In addition, the site plans shall show the adjacent buildings outlines and other outstanding features within 200 feet or as required by the Board.

f. The Board of Adjustment shall, after due public hearing, approve or deny the proposal. Approval by the Board of Adjustment, however, does not eliminate the necessity for Planning Board approval based on the subdivision regulations or the necessity of the Board of Selectmen to approve the provisions for the maintenance and upkeep of common or public land and facilities within the Planned Unit Project. Any development contrary to the approved unit shall constitute a violation of the ordinance.

Section 350 Rural (RU)

Section 351 Permitted Uses

- All uses permitted in the (L-R) Lake Shore Residential Zone and the (R-C) Residential Commercial Zone.
- b. The following uses, structures or conditions are designated exceptions in this ordinance. Upon application duly made the Board of Adjustment may, subject to appropriate conditions and safeguards, grant a permit for these exceptions and no others. In all cases a site plan of the proposal shall be presented to the Planning Board for approval and determination as to how the proposal relates to the Comprehensive Plan and other approved plans.
 - Light Industry.

- 2. Removal of sand, gravel, sod, loam, subsoil, or stone for commercial purposes.
- 3. Mobilehome or Trailer Parks and Camping Areas.
- c. Considerations governing granting of exceptions. In acting upon an application for an exception, the Board of Adjustment shall take into consideration whether:
 - 1. The specific site is an appropriate location for the proposed use or structure.
 - 2. The proposal is detrimental, injurious, obnoxious or offensive to the neighborhood.
 - 3. There will be undue nuisance or serious hazard to pedestrians or vehicular traffic.
 - 4. Adequate and appropriate facilities and utilities will be provided to ensure the proper operation of the proposed use or structure.

d. Additional Conditions

In approving an exception, the Board of Adjustment may impose such additional conditions as it finds reasonably appropriate, but never less than as provided for in this ordinance, to safeguard the neighborhood or otherwise serve the purposes of this ordinance. Such conditions may include, but not be limited to, the following:

- Lot area
- 2. Front, side, or rear setback
- 3. Height limitations
- 4. Screening, buffers or planting strips, fences or walls
- Modification of the exterior appearance of the structure
- 6. Limitation upon the size of buildings, number of occupants, method and time of operation, or extent of facilities.

Section 352 Restrictions Governing Use

The following shall govern permitted and all other uses:

- a. The minimum lot area shall be:
 - 1. Dwellings 1 acre/Family
 - 2. All other uses 1 acre
- b. Each lot shall have a minimum width of 150 feet front age at the street or highway line. Corner lots shall have a minimum of 150 feet frontage on each street or highway line.
- c. Setback, side, and rear to be as follows:
 - 1. All buildings shall be set back not less than 25 feet from the edge of the street or highway right—of—way; and not less than 10 feet from the side or rear property line.
- d. Buildings and structures shall not exceed 35 feet in height above mean ground level.
- e. Sewage drainage disposal facilities shall be available whether through septic tanks, dry wells, leaching fields or systems adequate under the rules and requilations of the New Hampshire Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission.

The preceding amendments as proposed by the Planning Board shall be presented to the voters of the Town by inclusion on the official ballot as prepared by the Town Clerk.

LEST WE FORGET - IT CAN HAPPEN HERE

Disastrous forest and brush fires that destroy hundreds of homes are more prevalant on the west coast with their dry seasons and strong dry hot winds but 25 years ago this fall is the anniversary of a disaster that devastated large areas of northern New England leaving villages in ashes with rows of cellar—holes and chimneys in a number of summer vacation home locations. Many lives were lost on that destructive day of October 23, 1947, nothing could stop the wind driven flames.

It is true that such conditions are unusual for New Hampshire but they happened once, they can happen again. The fuel for fires is all around us. All it takes is a fire—brand. Only by cultivating a habit of carefulness with fire at all times can we meet the challenge of protection when dry conditions prevail. Please let these reminders be your guide:

- Never, either when walking, riding or driving, discard a firebrand — a lighted match or a glowing cigarette.
- 2. Always obtain a permit for any outside burning. The burning of household rubbish is not permitted if your town has rubbish collection. Burning of grass or garden litter can be dangerous. See your warden first.
- 3. If you camp or picnic, be sure open fires are are allowed and if they are, put them dead out when leaving.
- 4. Most important Instruct your children in the danger of the lighted match. A lighted match and dry grass or forest litter is a dangerous combination which leads to destructive loss and can lead to tragedy.

The past year - 1971 was a favorable year for the control of fires. There were too many fire starts in some towns. We thank those who remembered and ask others to heed Smokey's message.

THE HAROLD GILMAN HISTORICAL MUSEUM

The Harold Gilman Historical Museum came into being at a Special Town Meeting in August 1967 when the bequest of the late Harold Gilman was accepted. His former residence, its contents and \$36,591.03 were included in the offer. The motion for acceptance was carried and provided that the Selectmen and a continuing committee of five additional members would oversee the project.

Since it was evident at this meeting that the project was to be conducted so as not to entail any expense to the town, the committed formed under the above motion waited until the estate was settled. Then, when the money was received, it was given to the Trustees of the Trust Funds to invest. In 1970 and again in 1971, after much thought and planning, it was decided to get the approval of the voters at the Annual Town Meeting to use the credit of the Town and to float a loan. This loan would be amortized from the money invested in the Trust Funds, thus costing the Town no money. This was voted in the affirmative in March 1971. Plans and a request for a building permit, with a variance, have been made. If granted, construction will begin in 1972.

ALTON – ALTON BAY CHAMBER OF COMMERCE Alton, New Hompshire INFORMATION BOOTH

The Information Booth has many functions. Contrary to common belief, its only purpose is not to find accommodations for vacationers or tourists. While every effort is made to assist people to this end, such requests constitute a very small percentage of the total number received from those seeking assistance and information.

Space does not permit mention of all the types of requests. They include, contacting a doctor, calling the police for a number of reasons, the desire for a plane or bus schedule, a good place to eat, tree surgeon, kennel for a dog, travel maps and attraction brochures, activity schedules and what to do on a rainy day.

Locating people, often an emergency, requires a great deal of time. Sometimes these requests are received by telephone. It is not unusual to find the people concerned in towns other than our own.

An occasional letter of appreciation for our efforts seems to make it all worthwhile.

Before the end of June, 6,000 activity schedules and 50 posters had been delivered to 58 places of business from Rochester to Laconia. Another 2,000 were distributed through the Information Booth and to radio stations and the newspapers.

Arrangements for the Boston Naval Base Band and the Organ Concerts are made by the Chamber of Commerce. Bus transportation and dinner for the band are requirements for their appearance.

These expenses, the charge for the organist, and public address system, is borne by the Lyceum Fund, otherwise it would not be possible for them to be included in the Chamber's sponsored events.

Printing activity schedules, mailing brochures and answering the great number of letters and cards requesting information and contacting the many sources available for material for the Information Booth, is costly.

In the 12 years the Chamber of Commerce has sponsored the Labor Day weekend fireworks, the total amount, \$600.00 instead of the usual \$500.00 each display, and the above mentioned items and activities has come entirely from paid memberships.

In view of the rising costs, how much longer this event can be continued, is questionable.

While the Town of Alton appropriates \$700.00 toward the expenses of the Information Booth, it is not sufficient to pay the operational costs of attendants, telephone, etc.

We are deeply grateful to the Town, members and others, who support the Chamber of Commerce in its efforts to promote the area and its attempt to be helpful to permanent residents and make the vacationers time spent here more enjoyable.

REPORT OF THE ALTON CONSERVATION COMMISSION FOR 1971

At the suggestion of the Commission and on petition of the Selectmen, the New Hampshire Department of Safety, on April 1, 1971, banned the use of motor boats on Gilman, Knights, and Bear Ponds in the Town.

The Commission purchased 1,000 Autumn Olive Seedlings for distribution free to the Town residents, for planting to provide wildlife food. Unfortunately, the severe winter made it possible to obtain but 100 plants.

At the request of the Commission, the Town voted \$2,000.00 additional to the Conservation Fund. The Members sincerely hope that this will grow through the years to an amount that will provide sufficient cash with which to purchase valuable lands for future generations. As a result of the foresightedness of the Townspeople and the generosity of Spaulding—Potter Fund, your Conservation Fund now amounts to \$5,271.91.

In conjunction with other conservation commissions in the Winnipesaukee areas, the Alton Commission collaborated in forming the Lake Winnipesaukee Association of Conservation Commissions. Various Members of your Commission attended five meetings of this Association during the year, in addition to several SOAR Meetings, and twelve regular meetings of your commission at the Town Hall.

During the year your Commission completed a study of the Merrymeeting River and Marsh — with the intention of preserving this fine natural resource — and sought the help of the Society for the Protection of New Hampshire Forests in attaining its aim. Later this same project was presented to the Ford Foundation for its financial help and guidance.

In April, Col. Roland H. Cipolla met with your Commission and stressed a cardinal point in relation to future Town development. His message: "Don't allow sewage to be put in the ground." In December your Members met with representatives of the Locke Alton Corp. to hear their plans for a large development of more than 800 acres in the Coffin Brook section of the Town. These men agreed to work with your Commission to preserve the ecology of the area.

The Boudreault property, so called, on Rocky Mt. committed

to the care of your Commission, was improved during the year under the direction of the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service. Five acres were weeded in 1971, and ten more committed for weeding in 1972. Cost to the Commission was \$16.00 for 1971. The balance from federal funds.

Your Commission has requested the Selectmen to place an Article in the Town Warrant, under the "Scenic Roads" Act. RSA 253:17, designating Powder Mill Road in East Alton as a "Scenic Road." This does not prevent improvement of the road but preserves its oldtime beauty and charm.

The Alton Conservation Commission mourns the passing of Carl L. Morgan. Always deeply cognizant of the fast disappearing natural state of our surroundings, and ever ready to help with locating and pinpointing the more remote forest and stream sections of the Town, Carl will be long missed by the Members of the Commission.

The need is great. The time is short. Again, your Commission appeals for grants of land and, or easements...so that tomorrow's men may say that to-day's did care.
