RESULTS OF THE JACKSON TOWN MEETING MARCH 11, 1997

Polls were opened at 10:30 AM by Moderator Raymond Abbott Jr. and closed at 5:30 PM. The meeting was called to order by Raymond Abbott Jr. at 7:00 PM. The opening flag ceremony was conducted by Brownie Troop 116 and Junior Girl Scout Troop 2197. A prayer was then offered by Rev. Dr. Robert Abarno for the meeting. Pastor Bob thanked the town for his 10 ½ years being a resident. He has been called to another church in Pennsylvania and will be leaving early April.

The Moderator accepted a motion to dispense with the reading of the Warrant. ARTICLE 1. Results of the ballot voting were given:

ARTICLE 2. Voted to modify the Elderly Exemptions from property tax as prescribed under RSA-72:39b(c) as follows: for a person 65 years of age up to 75 years \$5,000.00 for a person 75 years of age up to 80 years of age \$10,000.00 a person 80 years of age and older \$20,000.00. To qualify, the person must have been a New Hampshire resident for at least 5 years. In addition the tax payer must have a net income of less than \$13,400.00 or if married a combined income of less than \$20,400.00 and own net assets not in excess of \$35,000.00.

ARTICLE 3. Voted to raise such sums as necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.

ARTICLE 4. Voted \$16,650.00 Town Officers Salaries. ARTICLE 5. Voted \$74,850.00 Town Officers Expenses.

ARTICLE 6. Voted \$156,450.00 Maintenance of Highways.

ARTICLE 7. Voted \$5,000.00 Reconstruction of Sidewalks. There was discussion of how much could be accomplished with this amount. Selectmen DiFruscio explained a balance of \$3,100.00 was previously set aside. Thom Perkins was recognized and announced that the Jackson Ski Touring Foundation will donate \$2000.00 for this purpose. It was hoped that most of the sidewalks in the center of town could now be repaired.

ARTICLE 8. Voted \$300.00 Street Signs.

ARTICLE 9. Voted \$69,600.00 Police Department

ARTICLE 10. To see if the town will vote to create a full time Fire Chiefs position and raise and appropriate \$31,724.10 for salary and benefits. The fire chief will be elected for an indefinite period of time by the members of the fire department subject to the approval of the Board of Selectmen. The chief will be technically qualified by training and experience and not removed without just cause and public hearing (Pursuant to RSA 154:5 and RSA 154.1.III). It was moved, discussed and brought to ballot vote. There were 196 votes cast with 67 in favor and 129 against; therefore, the article was defeated.

ARTICLE 11. Requested \$40,300.00 for the Fire Department. Selectmen DiFruscio asked for an amendment to increase this by \$2,500.00 for wages. The amended amount of \$42,800.00 was voted.

ARTICLE 12. Voted \$3,500.00 Emergency Communications. It was questioned what this was. It is the antenna on Thorn Mountain (Tyrol) used for fire and ambulance with Bartlett.

ARTICLE 13. Voted \$19,000.00 Solid Waste Disposal.

ARTICLE 14. Voted \$9,000.00 Maintenance of Town Property.

ARTICLE 15. Voted \$8,000.00 Maintenance of Town Park. This was increased as a new lawn mower has to be purchased and work needs to be done on the pond to prevent further damage from flooding.

ARTICLE 16. Voted \$4,500.00 Maintenance of Cemeteries.

ARTICLE 17. Voted \$8,500.00 Street Lighting.

ARTICLE 18. Voted \$44,000.00 Blue Cross/Blue Shield for employees.

ARTICLE 19. Voted \$21,000.00 Social Security, MT and N.H. Retirement System.

ARTICLE 20. Voted \$26,000.00 BC/BS Retirees and others. This amount is totally refunded by the people on it.

ARTICLE 21. Voted \$22,500.00 for Insurance General.

ARTICLE 22. Voted \$7,200.00 Town Library.

ARTICLE 23. Voted \$1000.00 Planning Board.

ARTICLE 24. Voted \$1,411.00 North Country Council.

ARTICLE 25. Voted \$4,000.00 Legal Expenses and Damages.

ARTICLE 26. Voted \$100.00 Civil Defense.

ARTICLE 42. Voted \$2,000.00 for State Aid Reconstruction Program; State of New Hampshire to appropriate \$4,000.00 on July 1, 1997.

ARTICLE 43. Voted \$10,000.00 for the AMBULANCE CAPITAL RESERVE FUND.

ARTICLE 44. Voted \$5,000.00 for the TRANSFER SITE CAPITAL RESERVE FUND as an expendable trust fund under RSA 31:19a.

ARTICLE 45. Voted \$20,000,00 for the expendable trust fund known as the BRIDGE REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE FUND.

ARTICLE 46. Voted \$11,000.00 for a new highway Sander and Dump Body. ARTICLE 47. Voted \$5,000.00 for NEW POLICE CRUISER CAPITAL

RESERVE FUND.

ARTICLE 48. Voted \$20,000.00 for TOWN ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE BUILDING CAPITAL RESERVE FUND.

ARTICLE 49. Voted \$1,000.00 for expenses that may be incurred by the Gray's Inn Committee in preparing an overlay plan for the property.

ARTICLE 50. To act upon other business. Bob Temple asked that a committee be formed with representatives of the fire department and the selectmen to work out problems. Selectman DiFruscio reported that they would be doing this.

Moderator Ray Abbott thanked the townspeople for the way the meeting was attended and handled tonight.

Mary Burack asked if the town meeting was going to be in the day time next year. The moderator and selectmen said that it would be. Scott Hayes asked if it could always be held at night to enable more working people to attend. As this was voted on in the past to alternate day and night meetings, this would not be possible.

There was no further discussion so a motion was made to dissolve the meeting at 8:55 PM.

JACKSON CONSERVATION COMMISSION

It used to be that the days, weeks, and months seemed to pass quickly with the changing of the seasons. Now it seems that the years also fly right off the calendar. Time for volunteer activities in the community becomes more limited but no less important. Our kudos of volunteer recognition go to Bill Hall of Green Hill for being the sole volunteer to step forward to stain the picnic tables which the Commission placed at Jackson Falls and Memorial Park last year. Others deserving recognition are those individuals and families who participated in our River Clean-up in May. All of your efforts reward the entire community by helping to maintain an important natural resource which contributes to the quality of our lives.

The Commission continued in its role of reviewing Dredge & Fill applications from the Town, the Jackson Water Precinct and private individuals. This work was performed in conjunction with the N.H. Wetlands Bureau, a reorganization of the NH Wetlands Board and the Natural Resources Conservation Service.of Conway. We also provided planning consultations and field visits to sites for proposed projects such as the Gray's Inn property. Long term planning will ensure that the proposed Municipal Center will work for the good of the entire community.

Perhaps the most involved activity of the Commission this past year was a review of the various conservation easements which have been donated to the Town of Jackson. In coordination with the Society for the Protection of N.H. Forests, the Commissioners familiarized themselves with the provisions of the various easements, visited sites, and interviewed land owners to monitor compliance with the terms of the easements. These easements, along with the efforts of smaller landholders, are the single most important means of preserving the rural character of our community.

There are a number of activities which may have an adverse effect on the character of Jackson. Some have been reflected in the headlines as news items in surrounding towns. There are currently a number of applications awaiting approval by the FCC for installation of radio transmission/cellular communication towers. These towers will become permanent fixtures on our skylines. We've had helicopters in Jackson over the years but there appears to be an increase in their activity level and Jackson has no ordinance to address this activity. There has been a proliferation of boom-boxes on wheels which has been brought to our attention by local citizens. With the increase in population due to development has come a marked increase in the number and intensity of exterior lighting. A few years ago there was a citizen petition proposed to develop an ordinance to regulate exterior lighting. It was considered a bit over the edge at the time, but

when you realize that you can no longer see stars down to the treeline because of the glow in the sky, perhaps this effort was ahead of its time.

Some of these issues can only be addressed politically. Contact the Board of Selectmen for more information or to express your concerns. Other concerns may be addressed on an individual level. We can reduce the number of lights and the wattage of lights in use so that safety concerns are addressed adequately. There's no need to have lighting intensities that will allow one to read the small print in a contract. Lights can be put on a timer or a motion-sensing switch. All of these efforts will reduce costs and, collectively, enhance the quality of our lives.

We have a pretty full slate of activities planned for 1998. The stocking program sponsored by North Country Angler will continue at Memorial Park. They stock the pond for children aged 10 and under in exchange for use of the pond as an outdoor classrom for fly fishing classes. All of their catches are released back into the pond. The Commission urges that close parental supervision be the rule. The annual River Clean-up Day is scheduled for May 16, 1998 and we are proposing a Trails Day on July 18, 1998. We will be exploring the possibility of an extension of the popular River Walk with the Jackson Eastside Walk Foundation to create a 3/4 mile loop. We continue to support Hazardous Waste Collection Day in September. Another activity we would like to promote is the annual Audubon Bird Count. More information on these programs will be forthcoming as the dates draw near. Become involved.

Finally, the Wildcat River Commission has developed a Comprehensive River Management Plan as an addendum to the existing Plan adopted by the town upon designation of the Wildcat River as a National Wild and Secenic River in 1988. This plan has been developed with the framework of existing regulations and will be reviewed for adoption during the coming year. Meetings are open to the public and are held at the Jackson Grammar School on a regular basis. Become involved.

The Jackson Fire Department would like to thank the community for all the donations and help with the annual Chicken Barbecue fundraiser. Special thanks to Edward Milan for his generous donation. The money was used to purchase a special air compressor to recharge airpack tanks. In addition, a battery conditioner, which will increase the life of batteries for radios, pagers and hand light batteries was also purchased.

The Jackson Fire Department had sixty calls in 1997. These calls consisted of the more serious types such as structural fires, both in town and out of town, carbon monoxide alarms, and smoke filled houses. Over 50 % of the vehicle accidents responded to required the use of the extraction tools.

It is recommended that everyone purchase a carbon monoxide detector as well as a smoke detector. Batteries in these units should be checked and or changed twice a year. People appear to be having more trouble with gas appliances, this may be due to the age or lack of maintenance of the appliance.

I would like to thank the people of Jackson, the Selectmen, and the members of the Fire Department, for their support in 1997.

REPORT OF THE TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN & STATE FOREST RANGER

To aid your Forest Fire Warden, Fire Department and State Forest Ranger, contact your local Warden or Fire Department to find out if a permit is required. Violations of RSA 227-L; 17, the fire permit law and the other burning laws of the State of New Hampshire are misdemeanors punishable by fines of up to \$2,000.00 and/or a year in jail. Violators are also liable for all fire suppression costs.

There are ten Forest Rangers who work for the New Hampshire Division of Forests and Lands, Forest Protection Bureau. State Forest Rangers are available to assist communities with forest fire suppression, prevention and training programs as well as the enforcement of forest fire or timber harvest laws, please call our office at 271-2217.

There are 2400 Forest Fire wardens throughout the state. Each town has a Forest Fire warden and several Deputy Wardens who assist the forest rangers with forest fire suppression, prevention, and law enforcement. The 1997 fire season was a safe period for wildland and firefighters with no major injuries reported. The drought conditions experienced during the early summer months were a significant factor resulting in the total number of fires reported during this season.

The State of New Hampshire operates 15 fire towers, 2 mobile patrols and 3 contract aircraft patrols. This early detection and reports from citizens aid in the quick response from local fire departments. This is a critical factor in controlling the size of wildland fires and keeping the loss of property and suppression costs as low as possible.

At that time a permit will be required prior to burning. Your cooperation will be greatly appreciated by your warden, deputy wardens and the Jackson Fire Department. In 1997 we responded to 332 calls for service, this is 25 percent over last year.

In 1999 we will be looking to replace our ambulance with a new one. At that time ours will be 10 years old. Repairs and down time is getting more frequent. North Conway Ambulance has let us take one of their units on more than one occasion at no cost to the town. We will be going through the specification phase this year and presenting our request to the taxpayers next March.

Gordon Lang has retired this year from the ambulance service after 15 years of service to the towns of Jackson and Bartlett. Experienced personnel are very hard to replace in any organization. He will be missed.

We have now been in our new station for over a year. It's great! We have running water, real heat, a meeting room, and other amenities. If anyone has not been in the new station and would like to, please feel free to contact anyone on the Ambulance Service or the Fire Department for a tour. This is your station.

Our expenditures this year were more than expected, with a twenty five percent increase in calls, we were able to cover the costs. Some of the large items were:

NORTH COUNTRY COUNCIL ANNUAL REPORT - 1997

The Council continues its commitment to serving community and regional needs. The transportation committee has spearheaded the Route 16 Corridor Protection Project for the North Country. Two working groups from the 14 towns lining the highway have begun looking at some of the potential actions that can be taken along the corridor and will be working towards guidelines and recommendations over the coming year. A scenic evaluation element and design guidebook will be helpful for local planning boards. In addition, the Route 2 planning assessment and the Portland Natural Gas Pipeline right of way have been the basis of recommendations for funded projects.

The Council is the catalyst for the federally funded Economic Development Administration and in the past twenty five years has brought \$33 million to projects to the North Country including the recently completed wastewater treatment plant in North Conway. In order to receive funding, projects must be included in the North Country Regional Overall Economic Development Program (OEDP) which is preapred by the Council. The Carroll County advisory meeting is scheduled for March 24th at the North Conway Sheraton and everyone interested in the economic viability of our region is urged to attend.

The Council continued its work representing the interests of the communities on the Connecticut River and the region as a whole in the Fifteen Mile Falls Hydro Relicensing project. The negotiated operating agreement insures that present access and use will continue and recreation activites and local tax revenue potential will be equivalent to present conditions.

The Council adopted a plan for the Regional By-Ways and submitted a proposal to the Federal Highway Administration to have the designation on the Kancamagus Highway expanded. Work continues on the Connecticut River in cooperation with Vermont and Massachusetts.

The Community Design Program provided design assistance to Jackson in the preparation of a long range plan for the Gray's Inn property. G.I.S mapping continued for the entire North Country and support of public involvement in community decision making was provided to several towns through survey projects and local forums.

Our grant-writing and engineering staff worked with many boards and councils on ordinances, plans, drainage projects, transfer stations, master plans, assessment, road improvements, handicapped access to name but a few.

The Council is here to serve you and dedicated to supporting individual towns and promoting regional unity in the North Country.

- Implemented the Business Visitation program in the Valley. 240 businesses were targeted for 1997.
- Established a Revolving Loan Fund. Two loans made in its initial year. Both loans made to local businesses.
- Developed a One Stop Business Resource Center in the Council office. The Council is joined by Anne Getchell of USDA and a newly formed SCORE chapter. The SCORE chapter and USDA provide free Business counseling to valley entrepreneurs.
- Established a monthly business leaders breakfast called Eggs & Issues.
 Governor Jeanne Shaheen keynote speaker for first breakfast. Breakfasts provide networking opportunities for business owners as well as present speakers of interest.
- Council forms partnership with local school districts to implement School to Work Program.
- Produced the Rural Technology Summit in mid September.

In the coming year, the Council will continue to work to strengthen the economies of the twelve towns we represent. We ask your support in our effort and invite your participation. We encourage your comments and ideas and hope you will join us in 1998 and make a real difference for the people of the valley.
