TOWN WARRANT  
THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Langdon, County of Sullivan, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Langdon on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, at twelve of the clock noon until six p.m. Regular business meeting will be held at seven p.m.

Article 1. To choose all necessary officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To see if the town will appropriate and authorize the Selectmen to use the income, estimated to be \$40,450, from:

a. Filing Fees and Permits	\$ 100.
b. Interest on Taxes and Deposits	4,500.
c. Dog Licenses	350.
d. Motor Vehicle Permits	30,000.
e. Yield Taxes	500.
f. State of N.H. Grant	5,000.

To defray Town Charges estimated to be \$85,955. Town harges to include, but not limited to:

a. Town Officer's Salaries	\$ 3,400.
b. Town Officer's Expenses	7,000.
c. Election and Registration	400.
d. Police Department	4,000.
e. Damage by Dogs	500.
f. Legal Services	2,500.
g. Ambulance	1,720.
h. Fire Department	6,000.
i. Insurance	22,000.
j. Planning and Zoning	2,500.
k. Town Poor	1,000.
l. Cemeteries	800.
m. Interest-Tax Anticipation	6,500.
n. Solid Waste	21,100.
o. Maintenance of Town Hall and other buildings	2,500.

- Article 3. To see if the Town will appropriate the sum of \$80,000. for the maintenance of highways and bridges. The State of New Hampshire to furnish approximately \$32,000. in State Aid. The Town to raise the balance. (Approximately \$48,000).
- Article 4. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000. for the Capital Reserve Fund previously established for the purchase of highway equipment.
- Article 5. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of 2,500. for the Capital Expenses of the Fire Department.
- Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the Capital Expenses of the Police Dept.
- Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the Town the benefits of Title II of the Federal Social Security Act (Old Age, Survivors, Disability and Health Insurance) as authorized by Chapter 101 of the Revised Statutes Annotated amended by Chapter 302 and 322 of the Laws of 1955 and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,200., to defray the Town's estimated share of the cost thereof.
- Article 8. To see if the town wishes to exclude from the Federal Social Security Act services in any class or classes of positions filled by popular election.
- Article 9. To see if the Town wishes to exclude from the Federal Social Security Act any class or classes of positions the compensation for which is on a fee basis.
- Article 10. To see if the Town wishes to exclude from The Federal Social Security Act services performed by election officials or election workers for a calendar year in which the remuneration paid for such service is less than \$100.00.

- Article 11. If a plan for Social Security coverage is adopted, to see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to execute on behalf of the Town the necessary agreement with the State of New Hampshire to carry into effect the plan and to see if the Town will designate the Selectmen's secretary as the officer to be responsible for the administration of the plan.
- Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15,000. for site improvements to Town highway land on Route 12A.
- Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to accept Trust Funds for the perpetual care of Cemetary Lots.
- Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue a portion of Currier Road, also known as Durling Road, in the Town of Langdon, County of Sullivan and State of New Hampshire, to wit: commencing at the intersection of said Currier Road and Winch Hill Road and running thence northerly and westerly along the said Currier Road and terminating at the parking lot on the premises of Pierre D. Martinet, 1650 feet from the boundary between land of Herbert and Joan Stratemeyer and land of Pierre D. Martinet, which portion of the road to be discontinued lies upon land of Herbert and Joan Stratemeyer and land of Peirre D. Stratemeyer, all pursuant to New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated Chapter 231.8 \*
- Article 15. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell property acquired by Tax Collector's Deed.
- Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000. for renovations to the Town Hall.



Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000. to be used to fund the completed reevaluation of property in 1990. (This money is needed in addition to the \$19,040. we raised last year, due to the larger number of parcels of property due to continuing sub-divisions.)

Article 19. To see if the town will vote to amend the Building Code by adding to #1, letter E under the General Provisions the words "or alterations" so as to read:

"A permit to be issued by the Road Agent for permanent or temporary access or alterations to and from Town roads or public right-of-ways will be required."

Article 20. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Article 21. To allow accounts.

Article 22. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000 for the Home Health Care & Community Services. \*

Article 23. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$250. for the Sullivan County Hospice, Inc. program.\*

LIST OF APPROPRIATIONS--TOWN MEETING 1988

Business meeting was called to order at 7 p.m. with the reading of the Town Warrant by Moderator, Donald Malcolm. Action was then taken on various articles as follows:

Article 2. To see if the Town will appropriate and authorize the Selectmen to use the income, estimated to be \$44,200 and defray Town charges estimated to be 76,309.

VOTE -- Yes

Article 3. To see if the Town will appropriate the sum of \$80,000. for the maintenance of highways and bridges. The State of New Hampshire to furnish approximately \$32,787. in state aid. The Town to raise the balance (approximately 47,213.). VOTE -- Yes

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,000. for the Capital Reserve Fund previously established for the purchase of highway equipment. VOTE -- Yes

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000. for the Capital Expenses of the Fire Department. VOTE --Yes

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000. for the Capital Expenses of the Police Department. VOTE -- Yes

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, for use as set-offs against appropriations on the amounts indicated or take any other action hereon:

Appropriation	Amount
Capital Expense of Police Dept.	2,000.

VOTE -- Yes

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to accept Trust Funds for the perpetual care of Cemetary Lots. VOTE -- Yes

Article 9. To see if the Townwill vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes. VOTE -- Yes

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell property acquired by Tax Collector's Deed. VOTE -- Yes

Article 11. "Shall we adopt the provisions of RSA 80:58-86 for a real estate tax lien procedure? These statutes provide that tax sales to private individuals for nonpayment of property taxes on real estate are replaced with a real estate tax lien procedure under which only a municipality or county where the property is located or the state may acquire a tax lien against land and buildings for unpaid taxes." VOTE -- Yes      Ballot Vote 60 yes 6 no

Article 12. To see if the town will vote to amend the income and/or net worth provisions of the Expanded Elderly Exemption which now is: Expanded exemptions of real estate which provides for a resident 65 years of age up to 75, a \$5,000 exemption; a resident 75 years of age up to 80 a \$10,000 exemption; a resident 80 years of age or order, a \$20,000 exemption. Provided that resident owns a real estate individually or jointly with another or his spouse with whom he has been living for at least 5 years as man and wife; said resident had a net income of less than \$7,000. or a combined income with spouse of less than \$9,000 and owns assets of any kind, tangible or intangible, less bona fide encumbrances, not in excess of 50,000.

Amended to read "expanded exemptions of real estate which provides for a resident 65 years of age up to 75, a \$5,000 exemption; a resident 75 years of age up to 80, a \$10,000 exemption; a resident 80 years of age or older, a \$20,000 exemption. Provided that resident owns the real estate individually or jointly with another or his spouse with whom he has been living for at least 5 years as man and wife; said resident had a net income of less than \$10,000 or combined income with spouse of less than \$15,000 and owns assets of any kind, tangible or intangible, less bona fide encumbrances, not in excess of \$100,000."

VOTE on amendment -- Yes

VOTE on article as amended -- Yes

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$19,040 for a complete reevaluation of all property in Town by the Property Appraisal Division of the State of New Hampshire Department of Revenue Administration. VOTE -- Yes

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to adopt RSA 31:105 which reads: "indemnification for Damages. A city, town, county, village district or precinct, school district, supervisory union, or any other municipal corporation or political subdivision may by a vote of the governing body indemnify and save harmless for loss or damage occurring after said vote any person employed by it and any member or



officer of its governing board, administrative staff or agencies including but not limited to selectmen, school board members, city councilors and alderman, town and city managers and superintendents of schools from personal financial loss and expense including reasonable legal fees and costs, if any, arising out of any claim, demand, suit, or judgement by reason of neglect or other act resulting in accidental injury to a person or accidental damage to or destruction of property if the indemnified person at the time of the accident resulting in the injury, damage or destruction was acting in the scope of his employment or office. VOTE -- Yes

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to ask the Planning Board to hold a public meeting to discuss the advantages and disadvantages of a moritorium and its plans to regulate and bring the growth under control, to maintain the rural character of Langdon. VOTE -- Yes

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to increase the salary of the Building Inspector by \$150., from \$150. to \$300. VOTE -- Yes

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to change the position of Road Agent from elected to being appointed by the Selectmen. Such change to become effective January 1, 1989. VOTE -- Yes

Article 18. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting. Community Club quilt raffle winner was drawn. Winner -- Ginger Cheeney (again!).

Lucien Beam presented both the Town and the Community Club with checks for \$2,500. from the profits of the bicentennial celebration which was held in July. The remainder of the money is being kept in the committee's account for expenses which are still owed plus the possibility of an "Old Home Day" celebration and a material donation to the Town. Also, thanks were given to Frank and Karen Sellers for the many hours of time they donated to the Town History. Also, Anne Newcomb was mentioned for getting the idea of the Bicentennial started 15 years ago.

Bob Cunniff expressed the thanks of the Town to Fred Roentsch for the 15 years of service he has given to the Town as Selectman.

Pete Toner expressed concern that some towns are beginning to restrict Class 6 roads from use by ORV's. Wanted the sentiment of the Town. The Selectmen assured him that legally the use of these roads can't be restricted. Fred Roentsch noted that there is money in this years budget for clerical help for the Planning Board, Board of Adjustment, and Selectmen. If anyone is interested in this position, please contact the Selectmen.

Article 23. To allow accounts: R. Cunniff - \$600., F.  
Roentsch - \$751., B. Cheeney - \$600. VOTE -- Yes

Meeting was adjourned at 9:33 p.m.

## 1988 REPORT OF THE PLANNING BOARD

Again, the Planning Board has spent a very busy year. We now have, in addition to our regular monthly meeting, a full work meeting, held during the middle of the month. This meeting is only a work session and our time is spent working on the New Master Plan and Future Capital Improvement Program, both required by the State statute. Our regular monthly session is held at 7:00 on the last Wednesday of each month.

The Planning Board has developed and printed a full handout listing all rules and regulations required for subdivisions. A copy can be purchased at the Town Hall for a small fee of \$3.00.

We have just completed a questionnaire which was handed out or mailed to all residents of Langdon. This is the first step in renewing our Master Plan, which should be completed by March of 1990, along with the Proposed Capital Improvements Program. These will be developed with the help of the Selectmen, Road Agent, Police Chief, Fire Chief and members of the Board of Adjustment.

The Board held a public meeting with regard to the request of the Town's residents concerning a moratorium. The meeting was held on June 22, 1988. This was well attended. Lake Sunapee Representative, Bruce Bender told the Town that we were working toward a good Master Plan and there was no reason for a moratorium.

During the year we held 15 Preliminary Discussions, 13 Public Hearings and approved 13 subdivision requests.

The Board wishes to thank the Town's people for their support, attendance at our meetings and for answering and returning our recent questionnaire.

I wish to thank the rest of the board and recorder, Jean Davis for all the hard work they have done this year.

REPORT OF TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN  
AND  
STATE FOREST RANGER

Between July 1987 and June 1988, we experienced more fires than normal. The three leading causes of forest fires were again children, fires kindled without written permission of a Forest Fire Warden and debris burning. All causes are preventable, but only with your help.

Please help our town and state forest fire officials with forest fire prevention. Contact your Forest Fire Warden for more information.

Enforcement of a state timber harvest regulation is the responsibility of State Forestry officials. Our state has excellent timber harvest regulations; however, your assistance is needed.

If you know of a logging operation and suspect a state timber harvest law may be violated, call your Forest Fire Warden, Concord Forest Protection Headquarters at (603) 271-2217, or local Forest Ranger.

On January 1, 1989, the Deceptive Forestry Business Practices Law (RSA 224:54) goes into effect. This law, in summary, states that a person is guilty of a misdemeanor if, in the course of buying or selling a forest product, uses a false weight or measure for falsely determining any quality or quantity of a forest product. For more information, contact one of the persons mentioned above.
