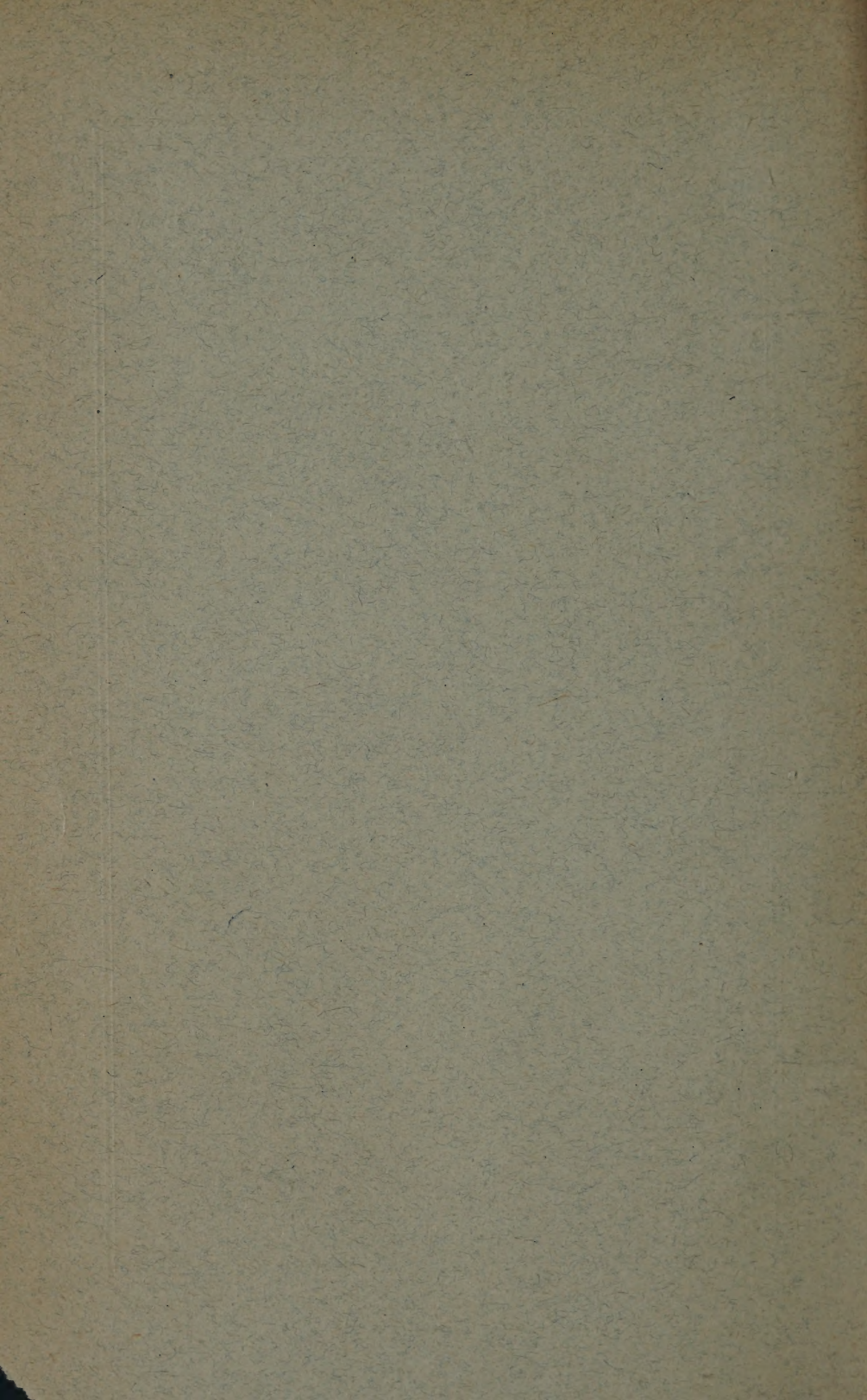

## Warrant for Annual Town Meeting.

### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

*L. S.* } *To the inhabitants of the town of Lebanon, qualified to vote in town affairs:—*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said town, on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

*First.* To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

*Second.* To choose three Selectmen, Overseer of the Poor, Collector of Taxes, Highway Agent, and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

*Third.* To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

*Fourth.* To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to repair highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

*Fifth.* To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the construction and repair of sewers and sidewalks for the ensuing year.

*Sixth.* To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the improvement of the cemeteries of the town, or act thereon.

*Seventh.* To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the proper observance of Memorial Day, or act thereon.

*Eighth.* To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three hundred dollars to provide a free bed at the Mary Hitchcock Hospital for the ensuing year, or act thereon.

*Ninth.* To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of the Lebanon Public Library, or act thereon.

*Tenth.* To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of the West Lebanon Library, or act thereon.

*Eleventh.* To see what action the town will take in regard to the enlargement of the cemetery at West Lebanon, raise money therefor, or act thereon.

*Twelfth.* To see what action the town will take to enable it to secure the benefits of the provisions of, "An act to provide for State Aid, and for the permanent improvement of main highways throughout the State." Approved Feb. 24th, 1905, or act thereon.

*Thirteenth.* To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to provide a suitable building for the use of the highway and sewer departments, for storage purposes, raise money therefor, or act thereon.

*Fourteenth.* To determine the division of the School money.

*Fifteenth.* To hear the report of the Auditors and the town School Board.

*Sixteenth.* To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to extend Colburn street in a southeasterly direction, one hundred feet, more or less, to a junction with Eldridge street, or act thereon.

*Seventeenth.* To see if the town will vote to discontinue nine and one-half feet of the width of Craft avenue, on the easterly side, in the village of West Lebanon, or act thereon.

*Eighteenth.* To see if the town will vote to discontinue the highway from the Fresh place, so called, to the Hanover line, or act thereon.

*Nineteenth.* To see if the town will vote to have liquor agents for the ensuing year.

### Report of the Board of Health.

Number of marriages, 66. Number of births, 131; males 67, females 64; 4 stillborn; leaving 127 living. Number of deaths, 78; males 41, females 37; their ages: under 6, 20; between 70 and 80, 15; between 80 and 90, 7, over 90, 3, their ages 90, 97 and 99; the number over three score and ten, the allotted age of the race, is 25, which testifies plainly the healthfulness of the town.

Some of the diseases which have prevailed: two reported to have died of Pulmonary Consumption. Under recent instruction two should be added to this number, making 4. Ten are reported to have died of Heart Disease. The reports are very indefinite; as heart failure, heart trouble, and so forth; only one gives a definite cause, Hypertrophy of left ventricle; three died of Pneumonia, a much less number than some years. Meningitis, 6, a fatal disease consisting of inflammation of the membranes of the brain, for which no certain cure has as yet been devised. Cancer and cancerous diseases, 6; yearly this disease takes its toll of the human race, and seems to excite no anxiety, and no serious efforts are made to

arrest its depredations. I believe that it is both hereditary and communicable, of this last quality, I have certain evidence. A wife dying with a cancer, desired her husband to kiss her, naturally and innocently enough, he had what is termed a cold sore on his lip, and very soon died of cancer. A father who died of cancer, left three children, two sons and a daughter, the two brothers died of cancer, and the daughter has been operated upon for that disease.

There is the following ancient legend: Cadmus in his wandering found a dragon whose diet was human flesh, Cadmus caught him in the act and killed him, thus freeing his country of a most revolting scourge. We long for the appearance of a modern Cadmus, who will destroy this disease which actually preys more than any upon human flesh.

Some notes upon Pulmonary Consumption in Lebanon fifty years ago. Rev. Phineas Cook, pastor of the Congregational church for twenty years, kept a record of deaths in the town, from his records I copy the following; Deaths in 1835, 24, of which 4 died of consumption; 1836, 24 deaths, 4 of consumption; 1840, 20 deaths, 4 of consumption; 1841, 21 deaths, 4 of consumption; 1842, 22 deaths, 5 of consumption; 1844, 20 deaths, 4 of consumption; 1845, 10 deaths, 1 of consumption.

In 1905 out of 78 deaths, 2 died of consumption. It should be kept in mind that in the early periods, the population was less than one-third of what it is today. These facts teach that the dread disease is manageable and under control, and we may hopefully labor to stay its ravages. The number of deaths the past year was about fifteen to the thousand, which represents a healthy town.

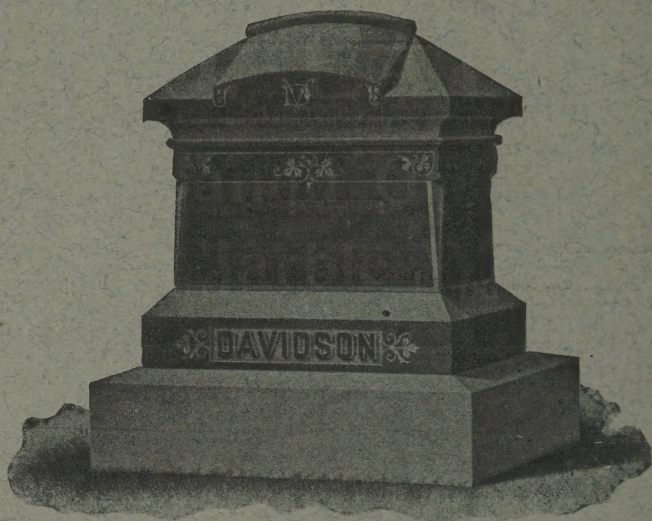

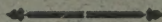
