

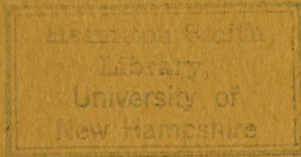

# The State of New Hampshire

---

*To the inhabitants of the town of Milton in the County of Strafford in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said town on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers.
2. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairing highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Trunk Line and State Aid Highways in said town and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.
4. To see what method the town will vote to adopt for breaking roads the coming winter, raise and appropriate a sum of money not exceeding four thousand dollars (\$4,000) to pay for the same and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.
5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000) to be expended on the highway leading from the Town House toward "New Bridge" (so-called), and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.
6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed one thousand dol-

lars (\$1,000) to be expended on the highway leading from Milton Mills Village to Wakefield town line, known as the Jug Hill Road, and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money necessary to secure State Aid for the permanent improvement of highways under the provisions of Chapter 35, laws of 1905, and amendments thereto, the joint sum to be expended on the highway leading from Milton Village, past the Nute High School, to Farmington town line.

8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise or appropriate for Maintenance of the Fire Department for the ensuing year and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of street lights the ensuing year.

10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not exceeding two hundred dollars (\$200) for Memorial Day expenses.

11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed two hundred dollars (\$200) for the benefit of the Free Public Library at Milton Mills and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

12. To see if the town will vote by petition of Dr. Guy E. Chesley and nineteen others: The signers to this petition respectfully represent that there is a public demand and need for a highway to be laid out on the Easterly side of Town House Pond along the contemplated street now known as St. James Avenue. That said St. James Avenue has been constructed. That



the public demand requires that a highway be laid out along said contemplated street known as St. James Avenue.

13. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire on notes of the town a sum of money necessary for the current expenses in anticipation of taxes of 1932 and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay town expenses and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100) for improvements and maintenance of the lots in front of the station and pass any other vote or votes relative thereto.

16. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

I recommend that the voters, at the annual meeting, authorize the School Board to dispose of the school-house and shed at South Milton by either private sale or auction. Such a vote will not obligate the Board to sell this property at too great a sacrifice but will give them the authority to dispose of it, if in their judgment it seems best to do so. While the present time may not be the best of times for selling real estate, it must be remembered that this property will not improve with age and that it might become an item of expense to the District by demanding repairs.

#### FINANCIAL

In these days of business depression it is essential that no unnecessary expenditures be made. This



fact is fully appreciated by the School Board and Superintendent. We have not intended to expend any more than is needed to keep our schools at a reasonable standard of efficiency. As a result we find that, last year, of the 243 districts in the state, only 33 expended less per pupil for scholars' supplies than did Milton. We also find that the total local cost of our schools, including the appropriations given to the high school, based upon the cost per \$1,000 of the equalized valuation of the town, places Milton ninety-ninth among all the districts of the state. Only ninety-eight districts have been able to maintain their schools at a lower cost per \$1,000 of the equalized valuation of the town. Our schools are economically administered.

The report of the headmaster of Nute High School and the report of the school nurse will follow.

You will note that the nurse is planning a toxin-anti-toxin clinic for children of the pre-school age. I hope that this will be extended to include the school children. This treatment is said to be a sure protection against diphtheria and can probably be obtained free of cost for all children under the age of twelve years.

## REPORT OF HEADMASTER OF NUTE HIGH SCHOOL

---

### To the Superintendent of Schools and the Members of the Board of Trustees:

The forty-first school year of this institution opened September 1, with an enrollment of seventy-four pupils. Others registered later bringing the enrollment to eighty-one. Some withdrew, leaving the present registration of seventy-seven, divided as follows: Seniors 20, Juniors 15, Sophomores 14, Freshmen 28. There are twenty-four tuition pupils.

A new oil burner, thermostat controlled, has replaced the old furnace and insures good steady heat. The entire basement has been whitewashed. A new shower-bath room with continuous hot water, and dressing rooms for athletic teams have been built by caretaker Tetherly assisted by the headmaster and several boys.

The entire building has been painted or varnished, including the boys' and girls' rest rooms where lavatories, paper towels and soap have been placed for the pupils' disposal.

In keeping with modern trends in education, intelligence tests have been given in an attempt to place children of equal ability together.

Several new books have been purchased as a foundation for a school reference library in Economics.

The Athletic Association has purchased and presented to the school one set of ten volumes of a Doubleday Encyclopedia and one Century Dictionary in two volumes.

To date the school has no outstanding bills and each class has a bankbook in the Rochester banks showing a surplus.

The attendance has been excellent, the average to date showing better than ninety-eight per cent.

Deputy Inspector Leavitt of the State Board of Education visited us and at the completion of his stay congratulated the school on its cleanliness, discipline and attitude.

I am planning to have a toxin-anti-toxin clinic in Milton in the spring for the pre-school children. This clinic will be under the supervision of the State Board of Health. This is not the same thing as the administration of anti-toxin for the cure of diphtheria but is a protection from diphtheria by the harmless and relatively painless administration of toxin-anti-toxin. I hope that a large number of parents will take advantage of this.

We were able to have dental clinics at both villages last spring, ninety-two pupils having their work done at a minimum price. I wish to thank the local organizations and parents for helping with our dental clinic for the past six years and hope that they help to make them possible again this year.

The pupils in each school are weighed each month and inspected for pediculosis, skin and contagious diseases. Any pupil found with pediculosis, skin disease or symptoms of contagious diseases are excluded at once.

I wish to thank you for your co-operation and interest during the past year.
