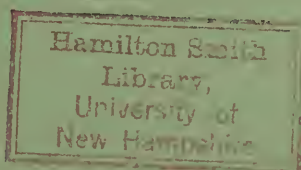

WARRANT FOR ANNUAL TOWN  
MEETING 1912.

---

[L. S.] THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

*To the inhabitants of the Town of Haverhill qualified to vote  
in town affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on the second Tuesday of March next at nine of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following matters:

ARTICLE 1. To choose a town clerk.

ART. 2. To choose three delegates to the convention to revise the constitution of this state to be holden at Concord in the County of Merrimack on the first Wednesday of June, A.D. 1912.

ART. 3. To choose three selectmen.

ART. 4. To choose a town treasurer.

ART. 5. To choose one or more highway agents.

ART. 6. To choose one or more auditors.

ART. 7. To choose one library trustee.

ART. 8. To choose one member of the board of cemetery commissioners for the term of five years.

ART. 9. To see if the town will vote to elect tax assessors; and if so, to determine the number of assessors and choose the same.

ART. 10. To choose all other necessary town officers.

ART. 11. To hear the reports of the selectmen, treasurer, cemetery commissioners, and other town officers, heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

ART. 12. To see if the town will vote to observe this year the one hundred and fiftieth anniversary of the settlement of the town, and choose a committee to arrange

for such observance, and also raise money for the same as authorized by chapter 310, Session Laws of 1911.

ART. 13. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of the poor.

ART. 14. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to retire three thousand dollars of town bonds and to pay interest on bonds outstanding.

ART. 15. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for laying out, building and repairing highways, and for building and repairing bridges.

ART. 16. To act upon the question of applying for state aid.

ART. 17. To determine what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the town libraries.

ART. 18. To determine what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for Decoration Day.

ART. 19. To see if the town will vote to erect a soldiers' monument, to choose all necessary committees for that purpose, to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be needed, and to pass any vote in relation thereto.

ART. 20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding three hundred dollars for a free hospital bed at Cottage Hospital in Haverhill for the period of one year.

ART. 21. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for other town charges.

## REPORT OF THE SELECTMEN.

---

*To the Citizens and Taxpayers of Haverhill:*

The selectmen submit herewith their report for the year ending February 15, 1911-12.

You will note that the valuation of the town has been increased some \$18,000. All allowable bills that have been presented to date have been paid. The \$3,000 voted by you at last March meeting for the payment of the three bonds maturing December 1, 1911, as well as the interest on the bonded debt has been paid the treasurer. The bonded debt is now \$18,000 and the net debt \$13,263.56, a decrease of \$6,466.17 during the past year.

As predicted at the last March meeting it was found necessary to hire some \$8,000 from the Woodsville National Bank to use for the road building work until money was available from the state. This loan in addition to the interest has been paid as reported under the head of miscellaneous.

Owing to the increased work required by the state tax commission in the assessing of the taxes this spring it has seemed advisable to insert in the warrant an article providing for the election of a board of assessors to aid the incoming board of selectmen.
