

## Warrant for Annual Town Meeting.

### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

*To the inhabitants of the town of Lebanon, qualified to vote in town affairs:—*

L. S.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said town, on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects :

*First.* To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

*Second.* To choose three Selectmen, Overseer of the Poor, Collector of Taxes, Highway Agent, and all other necessary town officers, for the ensuing year.

*Third.* To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

*Fourth.* To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to repair highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

*Fifth.* To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the construction and repair of sewers and sidewalks for the ensuing year.

*Sixth.* To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the improvement of the cemeteries of the town, or act the

*Ninth.* To see what action the town will vote to take in reference to an Andrew Carnegie Library, pass any vote in relation thereto, or act thereon.

*Tenth.* To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of the Lebanon Public Library and the West Lebanon Library, or act thereon.

*Eleventh.* To see what action the town will take to enable it to secure the benefits of the provisions of, "An act to provide for State Aid and for the permanent improvement of main highways throughout the State," Approved February 24th, 1905, or act thereon.

*Twelfth.* To determine the division of the School money.

*Thirteenth.* To hear the report of the Auditors, and the Town School Board.

*Fourteenth.* To see if the town will vote to give a discount on taxes paid on or before July first, or act thereon.

*Fifteenth.* To see if the town will vote to have Liquor Agents for the ensuing year.

*Sixteenth.* To see if the town will vote to establish the nine hour day for all engaged in work on highways.

The falling off in the receipts during the year is traceable to the large number of "free" and "local" low rate rentals and the very few outside or high rate rentals. It has become almost impossible to rent to any first-class attraction, owing to our poor stage arrangements and accommodations. This is also a source of expense in the care of the building, as it has been necessary to let down and examine the scenery, cordage and fixtures very often as a precautionary step to avoid serious accidents. This could and should be remedied, as a comparatively small expenditure of money would make this one of the best stages in the state. The switch board which controls the hall and stage lights is not proper and should also be changed.

## CEMETERY REPORTS.

### The Report of the Superintendent of Glenwood and the Village Cemeteries.

The usual care was given to the cemeteries. A part of the road leading to Glenwood Cemetery was graveled with the best gravel obtainable for the purpose. The W. M. Kendall lot in the Glenwood Cemetery and the P. E. Davis lot in the Village Cemetery were added to the perpetual care lots during the past season. It is not good judgment to erect a fine monument and leave nothing for the care of the lot as the following incident, taken from "Perpetual Care" in American Cemeteries will illustrate. "I heard of a case not long since where the owner of a lot, who was possessed of a large portion of this world's goods, stipulated in his will that twenty-five thousand dollars should be spent in the erection of a suitable monument on his lot. The executors faithfully carried out the provision of the will, and the 'suitable monument' was erected, and the remaining portion of the estate, after paying sundry bequests to charitable institutions, was distributed among the heirs. Nothing was left for the Perpetual Care of the lot and the monument, and in an incredible short time the heirs failed to pay any attention to the matter and the twenty-five thousand dollar monument was surrounded by a hay field, which was fortunate as it prevented passers by from seeing that the grave of the one whose money paid for a 'suitable' monument, was badly sunken and neglected."

There are only a few small bills against the Cemeteries, but there are quite a number of bills due the Cemeteries for care of lots and labor that are good.
