TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lee, in the County of
Strafford in said State, qualified to vote in Town
Affairs: (L. S.)*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Lee on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of highways.
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for fire protection.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) to be expended in cooperation with the New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Commission for the opening and maintaining of trails and roads for forest fire protection. The New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Commission to provide a matching sum not in excess of \$25.00 for this purpose.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appro-

priate the sum of three hundred and fifty dollars (\$350.00) for the Old Age Assistance and Relief.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00) for the Lee Hook Road. The state to contribute balance to finish the road.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred and forty-three dollars and eighteen cents (\$543.18) for the construction of Class V highways under the provisions of the T. R. A., so called. The state will contribute the sum of three thousand six hundred and twenty-one dollars and twenty-one cents (\$3,621.21).

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) for Little River bridge on the Tuttle Road.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) to be deposited with the Town Trustees of the Trust Fund as a capital reserve for equipment for the Fire Department.

11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department.

12. To raise and appropriate for the economic advancement of the Town through publicity and promotional services of the Seacoast Regional Development Association, in cooperation with other regional communities, a sum not exceeding one one-hundredth of

one per cent of assessed valuation, namely sixty-five dollars (\$65.00).

13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the Town Dump.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of approximately two thousand nine hundred dollars (\$2,900.00) to defray the cost of its share of the Strafford County Government.

15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Planning Board to prepare a master plan and a draft of a zoning ordinance for the Town of Lee and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) to defray the cost of said work.

16. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Buildings Regulation Ordinance.

17. (Petitioned by Nehemiah R. Snell and nine others, registered voters of the Town of Lee.)

To see if the Town of Lee will vote to continue the construction of the Garrity Road to the Snell Road from the Five Corners to the Hayes Road on Newtown Plains.

18. (Petitioned by Fernand Laroche and nine others, registered voters of the Town of Lee.)

It is hereby resolved that the Town of Lee raise and appropriate the necessary money for and have paved the Wednesday Hill Road from Mast Road in Lee to the Durham line running towards the Packers Falls

Road; and also the Jenkins Road running from the said Wednesday Hill Road to Packers Falls Road, these to be done on the completion of the paving of Garrity Road.

19. To see if the Town will vote to request the State Tax Commission to reappraise improved lands and buildings in order to equalize all assessments within the Town on a proportional basis.

20. To see what action the Town will take on storing of the Town records.

21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

22. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

You Can Help Prevent Forest Fires

Twenty-five percent of all forest fires in New Hampshire are caused from careless debris burning—brush, paper, leaves, grass, etc. Most of them are started without the required permit from the local forest fire warden. The cost of extinguishing these fires annually runs into large sums of money.

According to law, responsible parties must pay the cost of putting them out. In addition, violators may

be subject to court prosecution with fines running as high as (\$200) two-hundred dollars.

In the interest of fire prevention why not eliminate burning at home? Use your town dump. It has been set up for your personal convenience. It provides a suitable place for the disposal of dangerous inflammable waste material and other useless items which accumulate around the home and local stores; brush, etc. cut on your property. Eliminate the hazard of burning yourself. It will be easier for you—personally and financially.

If, however, you do burn on your premises:

1. Secure a permit from your local forest fire warden—the law requires it.
2. Be sure to properly supervise your burning. Don't leave it.
3. Make certain your fire is DEAD OUT before leaving it.

Save yourself much possible difficulty. Use your town dump.

During the calendar year of 1958 twenty-eight (28) building permits were issued, making a total of 70 since the Buildings Regulations Ordinance was passed March 13, 1956.

The permits issued during 1958 included:

- 9 New dwellings
- 10 Remodeling of dwellings
- 3 Poultry buildings
- 1 Ice cream stand
- 1 Camp
- 1 Milk room

- 1 Cellar for trailer
- 2 Storage buildings

The ordinance specifies that permits shall be secured before any construction is started. Many fail to do so.

The inspection of outstanding permits is progressing. It would help the building inspector if holders of permits would notify him when the building is ready for inspection.

Experience indicates that there is need for revising some parts of the ordinance.

REPORT OF PLANNING BOARD

In June 1958 the Lee Planning Board met with the State Assistant Planning Director who pointed out the various duties of a Planning Board and discussed ways of carrying out these duties.

Since that time the Planning Board has met nine times and discussed some of the town problems.

The problems discussed were:

1. Enlargement of the Center Cemetery, way in which the addition should be laid out, and the price that a plot would have to cost to permit perpetual care.

2. The location of the town boundary markers and the suggested replacement of those that are very hard to locate.

3. The location and development of a community park on the site of the town wood lot as proposed by the Laymen's League of the Community Church.

4. Revision of the present town building codes and building permits.

It was decided to appoint a Board of Appeals in case of any controversy that might arise over the enforce-

ment of the building codes. This board is composed of the following members:

AMENDMENTS TO BUILDING REGULATION ORDINANCE EFFECTIVE MARCH 13, 1956

Strike out all of paragraph 3 of said ordinance and insert in place thereof the following:

"3. No application for a permit required by this ordinance shall receive action by the Building Inspector unless made in writing. All applications for a permit to build, construct, alter or remodel any building shall be accompanied by a sketch or plan of the proposed building or alterations, and a statement of its intended use when built, constructed, altered or remodeled. A fee of .50 per \$1,000 based on a fair estimate of the total cost of construction or alteration shall be paid, but in no case shall the fee be less than \$2.00. A building permit shall become void unless operations are commenced within six (6) months from date of approval, unless such time is extended by the building official. The building, construction, alterations or remodeling authorized by the building permit shall be completed within one year from the date of

issuance of the building permit unless the time for completion is extended by the Building Inspector. The Building Inspector may, in his discretion, upon application in writing, grant one or more extensions of the period during which the construction may be completed, such periods not to exceed six (6) months each. The Building Inspector shall be immediately notified when construction is completed."

Amend section 5 a. of said ordinance by striking out the words "walls and partitions" in the 4th line and inserting in place thereof the words "walls, partitions and ceilings" so that said subparagraph shall read as follows:

"5 a. *Commercial building.* No building intended or designed to be used for industrial, commercial, or other public use shall be erected, altered, or used for any purpose which does not provide non-combustible walls, partitions and ceilings between its component parts."

Amend section 5 f. of said ordinance by adding the words "or fireplace hearth" after the word "chimney" in the 7th line so that said subparagraph shall read as follows:

"5 f. *Chimney construction.* No chimney shall be built, erected, or altered below the roof unless containing a tile lining and with an iron cleanout door at or near its base, and shall extend at least three feet above the roof. No chimney shall be built, erected or altered below the roof having wood or other combustible materials within one inch of the chimney and no chimney or fireplace hearth shall have its base resting upon any floor or beam of combustible material."
