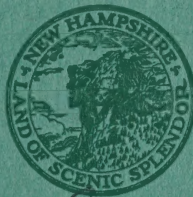

TOWN MEETING WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lisbon, in the County of Grafton, and the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs :

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Lisbon on Tuesday the 14th Day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, at which time the polls shall be open and shall not close earlier than nine o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects, all articles except Article 1 to be considered at seven-thirty o'clock in the afternoon :

Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To hear reports of agents, auditors, and special committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote in relation thereto.

Article 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges, the same being: Town Officers' Salaries and Expenses, Election-Registration Expenses, Expense of Town Hall and other town buildings, and make appropriation for the same.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,500.00 for the Police Department for the ensuing year.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,500.00 for fire protection for the ensuing year.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the Pine Blister Rust Control.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for Insurance for the ensuing year.

Article 8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the protection of health including the Health Officer's salary and expenses, and a sum of money to be equally divided between the Littleton Hospital and the Woodsville Hospital.

Article 9. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Lisbon District Nursing Association.

Article 10. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Vital Statistics for the ensuing year.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$800.00 for the purpose of maintaining the two dumps in the Town of Lisbon. The Selectmen to administer and be in charge of the funds so raised.

Article 12. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to plow the Town roads, and if so, to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,800.00 to light the streets in the Town of Lisbon under the same conditions as they were heretofore lighted.

Article 15. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to oil such roads in the Town as are already oiled, and to raise and appropriate \$7,500.00 for the same.

Article 16. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Libraries in addition to what is required by law, and to determine how same shall be divided.

Article 17. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Town Poor.

Article 18. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Age Assistance.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the proper observance of Memorial Day.

Article 20. To see how much money the Town will raise and appropriate for operation of the Lisbon Community Field.

Article 21. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the community Skating Rink.

Article 22. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the cemeteries in the Town of Lisbon.

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$485.40 (being 7/1000ths of 1% of the Town's 1958 equalized valuation) for the purpose of uniting with the 45 other towns in the White Mountains Region Association in the co-operative development and promotion of the North Country's economy.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,600.00 to defray the Town's share of the Federal Social Security Act.

Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as they deem necessary in anticipation of taxes, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,300.00 for interest on short and long term notes.

Article 26. To see if the Town will vote to accept Town Road Aid and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,167.52.

Article 27. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for the purpose of paying the Grader note due this year.

Article 28. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the purpose of paying the Loader note due this year.

Article 29. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,964.35 for the payment on the bridge bonds,—comprising the interest which will be due August 1, 1961; and the bond payment of \$5,000.00 and the interest which will be due February 1, 1962.

Article 30. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to pay the salary of the Clerk of the Lisbon Municipal Court.

Article 31. To see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to purchase a new police cruiser. The cost is to come from surplus and shall not exceed \$2,000.00.

Article 32. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to engage the State Tax Commission to revalue the Real Estate in the Town of Lisbon.

Article 33. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

REPORT OF LISBON POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT OF CHIEF — 1960

I submit the annual report of the Police Department for the year ending December 31, 1960, to you the Citizens of Lisbon.

Safety Program

During the year the Motor Vehicle Department presented the school with a program on bicycle safety.

Warnings

It is the policy of this department to issue a warning whenever possible. We are ever mindful that many people are in our town for a first time. We try to help them so they will want to return. We do the same for the local people.

Unlocked Doors

During the year this department has found a total of 156 unlocked doors. We have been able to secure most of them and inform the owner the next day. They were found in twenty-two places. One place was found unlocked 41 times, one, 18 times, one, 13 times, one, 20 times, and the others ranged 9 and under.

Fires Discovered

One fire was discovered in time to prevent a complete loss to a business establishment on Main Street. It was found while checking doors, Feb. 4, 1960, about 1:00 A.M.

Accidents

23 Accidents over \$50.00 damage.

4 Accidents under \$50.00 damage.

As a result of the 27 accidents, 8 persons were given medical attention by a doctor and 5 persons were taken to a hospital.

Juveniles

We have had several cases involving minors during the year, and all have been handled by the department in a way that only two were processed through the Probation Department.

Funerals

The department has covered all funerals in the whole town.

Special Events

We have tried to cover all special events, at schools, Churches, Weddings, etc., no matter what part of town they were in, as a public service.

These are cases only, which have been handled by this department. NO cases by State Police or the Sheriff's Department are included in the total as has been done in the past.

Conclusion

During the year, we have had complaints where someone has broken windows, stolen gas, or a break, these things require a lot of time investigating. Sometimes it will take several days to clean up a single complaint. We have been able to assist other departments and they have done the same for us.

It has been my policy during the past year to run the Cruiser only when necessary. I feel that by being on foot patrol that it has cut down a lot on speeding through our village Main Street section. During the busy season we cruised to the other sections of town, Sugar Hill, Streeter Pond, Pearl Lake, everyday, at least once, and also once a night to Sugar Hill. We have rendered every service possible.

When we are called on an accident, we never know how long it will take. If there is personal injury, it means probably a doctor, ambulance, or a trip to a hospital, later to get full information, a complete report to be made as still later the Insurance Adjuster will require all of our information, measurements etc. We do these things as fast as possible and return to street duty.

We have tried our best to do a good job, try to be courteous and helpful to everyone, and real firm when the occasion arises.

For awhile, we were having a lot of out of town boys hanging around, who were not interested in either going to school, or getting themselves some work. I talked to each of them and told them that I did not want them hanging around on the streets, in the stores and the restaurants, that they better stay in their own towns and not in our town after ten at night. I felt in handling this problem this way, it might prevent a wave of stealing and breaking. It has paid off.

Your police officers play a big part in public relations. To the outsiders an officer is usually the first person they come to for help or information.

I have had a pleasant year here in Lisbon, and am very happy. You have all been real nice to me and I only hope I have been able to satisfy most of you. In this position, an officer has to step on someones toes and thereby make a few enemies. These people should realize, that if they obeyed the laws everything would be just fine.

During the past year, I have had the full support of the Sheriff's Department, State Police, Motor Vehicle Department, and Judge Clark. We have worked together on many cases, gone into Court and received convictions.

I am indeed, grateful to Deputy Sheriff, Richard M. Knapp, Jr., for his assistance to me, also Robert Daniels, our new Trooper in town. It has been a pleasure to work with all law enforcement, and expect the fine co-operation to continue among us.

I have had a pleasant year working under our Commissioners, Victor Snell, Kenneth Rankin, and John Whitney, also the Selectmen, Reid Carr, Paul Boy, and Earl White. I know we will share the same co-operation in the year 1961. Thanks for your support and understanding during my first year in Lisbon.

A Certificate of Merit was received by me from the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles, Frederick N. Clarke.

At the annual meeting of the New Hampshire Chiefs of Police Association, held at Rye, in June 1960, I was elected to the Executive Board.
